ONE MILLION \$\$\$ FOR GLADYS NOON SPELLMAN SCHOOL- Great News! County Councilmember David Harrington has informed the Town that he has secured \$1 Million in funding for the Gladys Noon Spellman Elementary School here in Cheverly. These funds are earmarked for much needed improvements to the facilities.

Town Councilmembers have attended meetings concerning the future of Spellman and Cheverly's other school, The Judith P. Hoyer Early Childhood center as well as Bladensburg High School and we will be scheduling meetings at worksessions this spring. Again, our sincere thanks to Councilmember Harrington for his commitment to our schools!

IMPROVEMENTS AT THE HOWARD JOHNSON & REDUCTION IN CRIME Prior to, and immediately after being annexed into the Town, the Howard Johnson Gateway Motel here in Cheverly showed dramatic improvements, once the "No Tell Motel" owner Bill Conway of Sharcon Management invested millions of dollars in improvements and became a great corporate partner for the Town. However, for the past two years, Council and Chief Buddy Robshaw were distressed to see an increase in crime and criminal activity in and around the motel culminating in a drug related murder in the parking lot approximately 1 1/2 years ago. Patrons of the Exxon on Route 202, including a number of Cheverly residents were often victims as this activity spilled over into that property as well. Cheverly police spent a great deal of time and manpower trying to stem the crime but it became obvious the situation called for more than just police presence and enforcement—fundamental changes in the operations needed to happen.

We approached States Attorney Glenn Ivey's office for assistance. He assigned Special Assistant to the State Attorney, Albert L. Reed to work with the Council, Chief Robshaw and Sharcon's management to institute changes at the motel. A number of things contributed to the crime including renting to Hurricane Katrina victims during the non-tourist season which may have decreased normal tourist traffic. Chief Robshaw had identified renting to local patrons as a major contributing factor to illegal activity and drug traffic, including, I am sorry to say, some of our own Cheverly young residents. Having two entrances to the parking lot, one on Route 202 and a second on Route 450 allowed for too easy access late at night and security at the motel office needed upgrading.

A number of changes were undertaken. Sharcon installed a gate across the parking lot which is closed to thru traffic late at night. All patrons must show two forms of ID, including a picture ID as do their guests. There is better lighting in the parking lot and increased security and cameras in the motel lobby. Management meets with Chief on a regular basis and our officers continue to patrol on a regular basis, but we are not spending a disproportionate amount of manpower at this location as we once were.

I am delighted to report that crime is not only down, it is virtually non-existent and Bill Conway and Sharcon are as delighted as the Town. Our thanks to State Attorney Glenn Ivey, Special Assistant Albert Reed, Sharcon and of course Chief Robshaw for great success story and a job well done.

Message from the Chief Buddy Robshaw

CRIME AT A GLANCE IN 2007 – Despite the fact that the Cheverly Police Department was undermanned for parts of the year, crime results for 2007 showed a positive trend downward. This is the second year in a row that the Department and our citizen partners have worked diligently to keep crime on the downward slope. Total crime was down 5%, but more importantly, violent crime was down 24% over the previous year. In particular, robberies were down almost 47% and B&E's and vandalisms were down 28% and 25% respectively. In other crime news, there were no homicides in Cheverly in 2007; there was one arson (arrest made); carjackings and sex offenses remained unchanged (2/2); and, thefts and assaults had very small increases.

Not all the crime news is good, however, as vehicle thefts rose some 70% over the previous year (39/67). While there was no particular pattern for vehicle theft, there were some general observations about this crime. For example, the majority of vehicles stolen were older model cars and trucks (Chryslers and Jeeps were a favorite) and more than half were recovered in Washington, DC. While many of the vehicles were taken for transportation, a growing number of these vehicles were stolen with the specific intent to be used in other crimes (i.e., robbery). An emerging pattern appears to be the fact that a group of suspects travel together (probably in another stolen vehicle or by way of the Cheverly Metro) and steal several vehicles at one time.

To counter this trend, the Department is developing new patrol techniques and is working closely with the Metro Transit Police and the Metropolitan Police Department. Residents are encouraged to be particularly watchful at night for suspicious vehicles and persons, and to call these suspicions in quickly to the police. If you believe you are watching a potential crime in progress, please dial 9-1-1. In addition, all residents are encouraged to purchase and utilize "The Club" anti-theft device that the Department sells for cost. **THERE HAS NEVER BEEN A VEHICLE STOLEN IN CHEVERLY WHEN "THE CLUB" WAS PROPERLY DEPLOYED.**

FREE HOME INSPECTIONS – Several members of the Department have received intensive training at various schools specifically designed to teach officers how to perform residential security and safety inspections. These inspections are free for any Cheverly resident and all you have to do is telephone for an appointment. Please call today at (301) 341-1055.

OUT OF STATE REGISTRATION PLATES AND DRIVER’S LICENSES– The Department will be initiating out of state registration enforcement in the next several weeks. Residents of Maryland, including homebuyers, people leasing apartments or homes, or anyone residing in Maryland for more than 60 days must obtain Maryland registration plates and a driver’s license or face stiff penalties and/or vehicle impoundment. In addition to observation, tax records and rental license agreements will be used to determine how long a person has resided in Maryland. Please make every effort to conform to the law within those 60 days.

VEHICLE DONATIONS – If you were not aware, vehicles can be donated directly to the Cheverly Police Department. The donor receives the same tax savings as a similar donation to any charity, and you get to see the results if the Department is able to sell the vehicle. To date, we have purchased TASERS, radar units, holsters, and other equipment from funds derived directly from donation sales. In the near future, the Department would like to upgrade our current duty pistols and we are looking for funding methods to accomplish this.

WE NEED BOOKS – The Cheverly Police Department has several library units in its conference room and is in need of law and/or law enforcement-related books and materials. Any donations are greatly appreciated and are tax deductible. Reference books are used quite regularly around the Department to research enforcement and investigative methodology, case law, and to help a number of officers who are currently attending college. Thank you in advance.

RIDE-ALONGS – As many of you know, the Department regularly schedules enforcement actions several times a month to address various problems around the Town. As part of these actions, I encourage residents to ride-along with their police officers to act as a second set of eyes and to use their local knowledge to identify problem areas. Please call the office (301-341-1055) if you would be interested in helping the Department out. C-PACT members can ride-along as often as they like.

NOTICE to Rental Property Owners

- Eviction Law Changes Prince George's County Council passed CB-26 into law, which made changes to the eviction process in Prince George's County. The Eviction Law Changes took effect on August 11th for single-family rentals.

The new law prohibits the placement of tenant's property in a public right-of-way or on any public property. For most evictions, this law will require the owner of the property to either rent a dumpster and dump all of the tenant's property in the dumpster after removing it from the house, or hire someone to haul the tenant's property out of the house and bring it immediately to the dump or transfer station.

In any case, property owners **MAY NOT** leave the tenant's property at the curb. In addition, the law also states that if the tenant is present at the time the eviction is executed, the owner of the property must give the tenant a reasonable period of time (not to exceed four hours) to remove his/her property.

IS YOUR STREET LIGHT OUT?

If there is a street light out in your neighborhood, contact, PEPCO at 1-877-737-2662. Please have the pole number and location (closet address or intersection) of the pole available when you call. You can also go on line at www.pepco.com. Follow the directions to the lights out web area and answer all the questions.

PEPCO recently cleaned several of the utility ROW's in town. Please do not block these ROW's with yard waste, fences or any other structures.

PUBLIC WORKS UPDATES

1. Refuse must be on the curbs and/or inside trash cans and for those receiving backdoor service - no later than 7 AM. (Quite often phone calls are received after the truck and/or the backdoor collector has finished the daily task, stating that the trash collector failed to collect and/or go to the back of the property.)
2. Yard waste - leaves - clippings - Christmas trees - brush sticks, need to be at the curb by 7:00 AM on Monday's (if Monday is a holiday—then the following day) yard waste needs to be tied and bundled and/or in containers - Yard waste should not be placed by the curb any other day.
3. The leaf collection equipment has been damaged several times because residents rake & mix the leaves by the curb with - big sticks - rocks - bricks - glass and pieces of metal as well as other similar hard debris.
4. Per street address, vacuuming of leaves will end on Feb. 7, 2008. Thereafter, leaves should not be raked to the curb as they may block a nearby storm drain. After the 7th, leaves need to be containerized and/or placed in plastic bags that can be purchased at Public Works and/or Town Hall for \$5.00 (We will be fine cleaning curbs—parks and bump outs until the 19th)
5. The Public Works Staff thanks all the residents for their expressions of appreciation received during the recent holiday season. Thanks for the - cookies - cakes - food and the cards received wishing us well.

WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking

A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more.



The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed.

PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
- On any courts,
- On the even-numbered side of all streets,
- **(exception)** On the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belleview Avenue.

NOTE: The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

PRIORITIES: The snow removal operations work under the following priorities: 1.) Cheverly Avenue 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valleyway, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive; 3.) all other streets.

TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS

Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.



SAFETY REMINDER: We ask residents to remember that your neighbors who walk to Metro, or children walking to school, and the hard working Mail Carriers are exposed to dangerous conditions when sidewalks are not cleared in a timely manner. Failure to comply with Town Code could result in fines.
