PROFILES OF CANDIDATES FOR TOWN COUNCIL



MICHAEL CALLAHAN (WARD 1)

Serving the town for three years has been my great pleasure. Together, the council and citizen groups have worked to; implement a new Montessori education program at Hoyer, fought a concrete plant zoning request on Sheriff Road (still pending), im-

plemented a camera to detect the “Cheverly Booms”, and stopped WSSC from installing a cell tower in Ward 1.

If re-elected I’ll focus my efforts on:

Influence outside development: While the economy has affected the progress of the *Pointe@Cheverly* and *Addison Row*, these projects will ultimately occur. In the meantime, the council also needs to develop plans that improve the 202, 450 and Tuxedo corridors. These plans should focus on bringing revenue and needed services to our community.

Provide excellent service & improve infrastructure: Cheverly is lucky to have outstanding individuals heading up our administrative offices, and counsel needs to continue to support them. We also need to focus on the town’s infrastructure, developing programs to improve; roads, the tree canopy, and storm water going to the Anacostia.

Foster Community: Volunteering is the lifeblood of our community. Organizations such as the Recreation Council, B&G Club, FLBD, Garden Club and CPRC have long provided glue for our community. Recently new organizations such as the Farmer’s Market, Green Infrastructure Committee, Tree Commission, Cheverly Advocates for Public Schools (CAPS), as well as a reconstituted Planning Board have added new vitality to the community. The council needs to assist these organizations in achieving their goals. I ask that everyone find an opportunity to participate because it is through these and other organizations that “our town becomes a community”.

Financial Responsibility:

In these difficult times it is incumbent on the council to carefully manage our budget. As a member of the council Finance Committee I have worked hard to identify savings and revenue opportunities. It may not be possible to keep taxes flat, but we are trying.

Communication: We’ve made progress; allowing community organizations greater access to the Newsletter, and we replay council meetings twice a day. I will continue to communicate to Ward 1 citizens and work to make improvements to the website and cable channel.



MICAH WATSON (WARD 2)

Our Town remains a great place to live and work. I’m proud to have contributed to that success over the past five years as your Council Member. I’m running for a third full

term because much work remains to be done, and the Town needs experienced and dependable leadership to keep us moving in the right direction. During my tenure, I’ve tried to use your input and advice to make the right decisions. Last year we leveraged State grant money to purchase the

“palm reader” house at 5811 Landover Road, and in February I supported funding the demolition of the house as required by that grant. Over the next two years, the Town will engage residents to design the permanent green space on that site.

Also last year, I worked with Mayor Mosley and State and County officials to install a video-only camera on the roof of the Chev-Tux Fire Station, to try to locate the source of the “booms” that have hit our homes for years. Now, when you call Town Hall to report a boom, the County reviews the tape for evidence of a flash. Since the camera’s installation, very few if any booms have been reported. Ending the booms remains one of my top priorities.

There is always more work to do. Town staff continue to provide excellent services with little increase in departmental budgets, however, Town finances continue to be tight. Three positions, or about eight percent of our entire workforce, remain unfilled to save money. We cannot delay capital investments like road improvements forever, so more hard choices for the Finance Committee (on which I sit) are on the horizon. Despite that reality, I continue to support the Council’s inclination NOT to raise property taxes this year. I want to continue representing Ward Two because I believe Cheverly can be a stronger community and a better place to put down roots. If you care about these issues and share my optimism, then I ask you to vote for me, Micah Watson, at Town Hall on May 4.



JOHN LeGLOAHEC (WARD 2)

My name is **John LeGloahec** and I am running for Town Councilmember for Ward 2. I moved to Cheverly a little over two years ago from Montgomery County and have found

Cheverly to be a wonderful, welcoming community, full of concerned people that want to do the best for their town. I work as an Archives Specialist for the National Archives and Records Administration in College Park, a position I have held for three years. 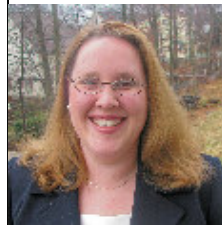

NOTE: The Maximum for one delivery is two (2) scoops of the bulldozer. The fee is \$20 per delivery. If you have any questions you can call 301-773-2666.

Public Works can only deliver mulch where there is a driveway or a safe place to back their dump truck and tip the load on the lawn.

REMINDER: If you leave mulch on the lawn for very long—it will kill the grass underneath.
