

Message from the Chief Buddy Robshaw (policechief@cheverly-md.gov)

TASK FORCE OPERATIONS – Task Force operations throughout the Town have started and I have completed the schedule for April and May. The Department is in need of ride alongs to supplement regular patrol for the next 3-4 months or longer. Please consider a ride along with your police officers as a genuine community service. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

C-PACT/CHEVERLY WATCH RESIDENT RADIO PROGRAM MEETING – There will be a joint meeting of C-PACT (Cheverly – Citizens and Police Together), Cheverly’s Neighborhood Watch Organization, and the Cheverly Watch Resident Radio Program on Tuesday, May 12, 2009, at 7:00 PM in the Police Department Conference Room. We will discuss the Task Force, update our outstanding grants, and plan for Cheverly Day.

PEDESTRIANS ON CHEVERLY AVENUE – The Department has received a number of complaints lately about pedestrians, joggers, school children, parents pushing strollers, and others walking on Cheverly Avenue or crossing at locations other than at intersections. Maryland law prohibits pedestrians on such roadway except those crossing at intersections. Please confine activities to sidewalks unless you are crossing the street at an intersection. Thank you in advance.

TWO NEW ADDITIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT – The Cheverly Police Department is proud to announce the addition of two new certified police officers to the force. The first, Officer Catrina Davis, is a veteran officer originally from the Seat Pleasant Police Department. And the second, Officer Earl Stone Jr, is a recent graduate of the Southern Maryland Criminal Justice Institute. Both officers are currently assigned to the Task Force as part of their Field Training requirement.

Public Works keeps a large mound of the mulch at the Town Park parking lot (near the ballfields) for residents to help themselves.



Contact the **PUBLIC WORKS OFFICE** to schedule a mulch delivery. They are open Monday-Friday from **7:30AM to 4:00PM**.

NOTE: The Maximum for one delivery is two (2) scoops of the bulldozer. The fee is \$20 per delivery. If you have any questions you can call **301-773-2666**.

Public Works can only deliver mulch where there is a driveway or a safe place to back their dump truck and tip the load on the lawn.

REMINDER: If you leave mulch on the lawn for very long—it will kill the grass underneath.
