Please remember that our children are out of school & can be frequently found walking to the Pool. So drive safely, stop at Stop signs & obey the Cheverly Speed Limits.

PEPCO Tree Trimming: Pepco attended the June 14th Town Council meeting to discuss their plans for Tree Trimming in Cheverly. As discussed in previous newsletters, Pepco is mandated by law to trim our trees & much of the criteria is defined by law (how far from a wire, where on the branch the tree is to be cut). The Town Council expressed clearly that in the last round of tree trimming (four years ago) Pepco successfully improved reliability, and that we expected trimming to be much less intrusive. The Town will be involved in most of the planning due to the proximity to the wires of many of our Town Street Trees. However, Pepco will be dealing directly with homeowners IF you have private property trees that are near wires. *In the meeting it became clear that as a property owner you have the ability to deny Pepco the ability to cut down a tree if you wish.*

If you have been contacted by Pepco, you should go to the Town Website to watch a replay of the Pepco portion of the June 14th meeting. This should only take 15 minutes and should be helpful in your conversations. Also please feel free to email me to discuss.

Town Passes FY16 Town Budget: In the June Town Meeting the Town Council passed the FY16 Budget. There was only one change made by the Council to the previous explanations here in the Newsletter. The Town Council agreed to make a \$4,000 donation to the Kentland Volunteer Fire Department to assist them in purchasing a new Fire Engine. The Kentland Fire Department had two Fire Engines destroyed in a recent fire.

While the Town Council agreed to keep the Tax Rate flat, you may see an increase in your taxes due to the recent increase in your assessments.

Thank You / Welcome: In the May Town Council meeting, we had the opportunity to welcome two new Cheverly Town Council Members: Maurielle Stewart and Megan Daly. They were recently elected in May and have already made an impact with their insightful questions and natural curiosity of how things work. Every new person changes the way the Council operates and with two very dynamic personalities I look forward to working with this new council.

Of course it is very sad to say Good Bye to two individuals who gave selflessly to the town through their service on the Council: Carolyn Cook and David Thorpe. Carolyn and David were excellent Council Members who always looked out for the good of their constituents. They will be missed. On behalf of the Council and the entire Town of Cheverly, I want to say Thank You for your service.

SUMMER CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Please note; if you are doing construction on your home and a PG county permit is required, then you must also obtain a permit from the Town of Cheverly.

If you are replacing a 4' fence, PG County does not require a permit, but the Town of Cheverly does. Also note: FRONT YARD FENCES OF ANY TYPE ARE NOT PERMITTED.

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE

Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, Town Park & play areas of all other parks.

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY:

Residents planning to be away for vacations should call the Cheverly Police (**301-341-1055**) to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Valuables should be stored, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Lights inside the house should be set on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Shades and drapes should be drawn.
- Cars left in the driveway should be locked.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- All windows and doors should be locked.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

A cell telephone with the above number is maintained by Cheverly Police officers working the streets of Cheverly daily, from 5:00 PM until 5:00 AM, and who are not currently on other calls for service. If you do not receive an instant answer, call other numbers listed below.

This cell telephone can be contacted for the following reasons:

1. To report a suspicious person, vehicle, or circumstance;
2. To report an emergency situation (traffic accident, tree or wire down, fire);
3. To report a solicitor;
4. To obtain a vehicle impound release when the office is closed; or,
5. To provide a tip about a previous crime, a wanted person, or criminal activity (rewards are available).

This telephone shall not be called for the following:

1. To report a violent crime in-progress – Dial 9-1-1
2. To report a routine call for service or a call requiring a report only;
3. To seek information about an outstanding case or obtain a copy of a report;
4. To seek legal advice or general assistance.

Note: The non-emergency telephone number for routine calls for service is 301-352-1200 and the number for the Department’s daytime hours is 301-341-1055.

HOLIDAYS? Public Works crews DO NOT work on Federally observed holidays. Collections on holidays are **CANCELLED**.

When Holidays occur on Yard Waste Day (Monday), yard waste is picked up on the following day. If Holiday occurs on Wednesday, Recycling will be picked up on the following day.

RESIDENTIAL BUSINESS LICENSES

If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a **Town Residential Business License**.

Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form. *The yearly business license fee is \$20.*

CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a **Cheverly Rental Housing License**. Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Enforcement Office at 301-341-1055 for an application. *The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00*

NOTE: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine.

Village Voices -

Cheverlians look toward a Cheverly Village

A saying I found on a birthday card reads, "How old would you be if you did not know how old you are?" That question gives me pause. My age reveals that I am a senior, but that is not how my busy body feels. I still volunteer for a therapeutic horseback riding program and serve on its board, as I have for over thirty years; help to lead Progressive Cheverly and the Cheverly Village Planning Committee; distribute Meals on Wheels and get involved in other things along the way. I am also my own little "village" in that I am available for friends who need transportation to appointments. My forty-year career as a physical therapist certainly underlies my propensity for being a service provider. In sum, I find it difficult to think of myself as needing a village. That is, of course, complete denial of reality; time marches on. The recent Cheverly Village survey made me pause for a reality check. I saw that I am already requiring help with certain things, such as hoisting a heavy container of kitty litter for my sweet cats. As I made my way through the survey, I began to realize more strongly that I would like to live in Cheverly as long as possible. I must acknowledge that it is only in the past ten years that I have become very much a part of the Cheverly community, even though I have lived in Cheverly since 1978. With all the great relationships I had in my work in the Prince George County School system and all the meaningful social and community relationships that my late husband and I had outside of Cheverly, we never considered living here in retirement. We were going to spend most of our time in Egypt, my husband's home country, and our time in the States was to be in Washington DC or with my Minnesota family. The establishment of a village would certainly be an appealing reason to continue to live in Cheverly. A membership in our village would facilitate staying involved with the various social activities. It is too easy to become a "home body" when living alone. The architectural barriers in my home and the town's difficult topography also make me anticipate that Cheverly Village services may be needed to facilitate my stay in this community... along with my cats. -- Clareen Heikal
