Back to School – Drive Carefully: On behalf of all the school children of Cheverly, the Town Council and the Cheverly Police Department we ask everyone to please drive carefully. Please leave home just one minute earlier so that you can drive the speed limit and stop at all stop signs. As the sign says: Drive as if your children lived here.

Cheverly Sector Plan: After a brief hiatus, work on the Cheverly Sector Plan continues. Over the summer Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission continued work on the Sector Plan. MNCPPC assembled an advisory board of local community leaders, & business leaders to assist them in reviewing the initial drafts of Sector Plan. These meetings have been valuable in getting a good cross section of input. Please remember that the eventual document will simply be a guideline for how the community would like to see the surrounding area develop. Neither the town nor the county has the resources to actually do the development. Instead we must seek interested investors in these projects.

Free Trees: As the summer heat bears down on us, it's time to consider our fall projects around the home. You can get a head start on those projects with a simple call to our Public Works department (301) 773-2666. Please give them a call to order a free tree for your front or back yard.

Cheverly's Tree Canopy: 2016 has been a very difficult year for our tree canopy. Public Works had to remove at least 5 mature Ash Trees at the intersection of Greenleaf and Crest Ave and the recent derecho caused the removal of another 5 trees. Losing these mature trees as well as others due to disease and old age has caused us to lose a significant portion of our tree canopy. Additionally, the Bellamy Oak located at Cheverly Ave and Forest Road may well have to be removed soon. The Council will review options for re-planting that can jumpstart the replenishment of the canopy. Of course, every resident can help us by requesting a new free canopy tree from Public Works (301) 773-2666.

Cheverly Avenue - Coming Soon: WSSC finally has begun speaking with our Public Works department about completing the paving of Cheverly Avenue. While there is no firm schedule it is hoped that repaving will begin at the end of September or early October. Again, thank you for your patience during this long and disruptive project and please remember that while this project has frustrated many of you it has saved the town of Cheverly approximately one million dollars.

What's Happening at 6301 Kilmer? So far very little has happened at this site. In the short term it is the Town's intention to simply open the site. However, funds were needed to take down the building, cover the well and ensure other potential hazards were ameliorated. The Town Council allocated the required funds in the most recent budget (effective July 1st) and we should begin to see progress at the site. The Town continues to discuss with the Prince George's school system synergistic opportunities that may be available on this property. However, at this time no opportunity has been identified or is being actively pursued. We hope to have the property open to residents by the end of the fall.

Capital Plaza Walmart: Here's a topic that just keeps going. While the Planning Board approved the DSP for the expansion of the Walmart, the expansion is to be reviewed by the County Council serving as the District Council. The District Council will determine whether to move forward with the Planning Board's approval or to reject the project on September 12th. There are currently two other planned projects in various stages of design at Capital Plaza. A Royal Farms Gas Station / Store / Car Wash is currently being reviewed by the planning board. The Royal Farms is being planned for the area near the Toyota Dealer. A Pollo Campero is planned for the space between the Royal Farms and Capital One Bank site.

CHEVERLY PUBLIC SAFETY DAY SEPTEMBER 15, 2016:

The 9th Annual Cheverly Public Safety Day is scheduled for Thursday, September 15, 2016, from 5:30 to 8:00 PM at the Town Park located adjacent to Public Works. This year's version promises to be the best so far, with plenty of demonstrations and vehicles, free food, and lively music. Prince George's County's "Air One" police helicopter will be on site, as well as police horses, K-9 dogs, motorcycles, and a wide assortment of police tactical vehicles. Dinner will be served between 5:30 and 6:30 PM. This year's events also includes a "dunk tank," a children's coloring area, plenty of handouts, and all kinds of bake sale items. In addition, there will be a bigger and more competitive obstacle course that will feature a large score board designed to publicize team names and scores. Green Infrastructure Committee- Meeting- Tues, Sept 6, - *New date due to Labor Day-* 7:30-9:00 p.m. Large Conference Room. Monthly meeting to report progress on Cheverly greening efforts and plan next steps and new initiatives. In implementing the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Plan, your Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee is working on projects in education, planning, and research.

Where Does Our Water Come From? Where Does It Go?

Incoming- The water we use for drinking, cooking, watering lawns, and all other household needs is brought from the Rocky Gorge or Triadelphia Reservoirs in the Patuxent River watershed, or from the Potomac River. The Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (www.wssc.com) has the responsibility for the water system.

Outgoing- The used water from your sink and bathtub drains and your toilets runs through sewer pipes to treatment plants. Since the sewer pipes were laid to take advantage of gravity, they are found in the lowest areas, often parallel to our streams. The sewer system is also the responsibility of the WSSC.

Water from the heavens- You may have read about communities, such as the District of Columbia, where both wastewater (sewage) and stormwater are directed into the same system, called a combined sewer system. Cheverly does *not* have a combined sewer system. Here the sewage and stormwater systems are separate. Rainwater, sometimes called stormwater, is directed from our roofs into gutters and downspouts. From there it flows into our rainbarrels, into our yards, or often through pipes into the streets. There it joins stormwater flowing from sidewalks, driveways, roads and other impervious surfaces to storm drains. You can keep rainwater on your property to reduce the amount entering the storm drain system. Along the way it picks up soil, leaves, trash, oils and other pollutants. The water heats up from the streets and gains speed as it moves downhill through the storm system pipes. *In Cheverly, these pipes direct the stormwater into our streams.* The speed of the stormwater helps cause stream erosion, and the heat may make stream life impossible. The trash and pollution further threaten the living creatures that depend on the streams. Around town you will find that the storm drains are marked to remind you never to use them to dispose of oils, paints, and other pollutants. The storm drain decals were a project of the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee. For maps, photos, and more about our streams, go to www.greencheverly.org.
