SECOND UNSOLVED HOMICIDE –

On 08-29-09, at approximately 10:47 PM, Abdul Barrie was shot and killed in front of his residence in the 6300 block of Landover Road. The shooter, a B/M wearing a black ski mask, fled the scene in a green Ford Windstar van with its license plates removed and was also occupied by other B/M's. This incident appears to be unrelated to the Morris case, although it too appears to be a targeted crime and not a random act of violence. If anyone has any information in reference to this crime, please contact Detective Mark Rimkus at PGPD Homicide at (301) 772-4925 or the Cheverly Police Department at (301) 341-1055. CrimeSolvers is offering a \$25,000 reward for information that leads to an arrest in this case.

TIP OF THE DAY – Burglaries in Cheverly could be reduced by as much as 40% if all residents would ensure that all doors are properly locked and secured when the home is unoccupied. In 40% of Cheverly burglaries, the suspect(s) entered through an unlocked door or easily manipulated non-deadbolt type locks to gain entry.

CFL BULB RECYCLING PROGRAM

At all The Home Depot store locations, residents can bring in any expired, unbroken CFL bulbs, and give them to the store associated behind the returns desk. The bulbs will then be managed responsibly by an environmental management company who will coordinate CFL packaging, transportation and recycling to maximize safety and ensure environmental compliance.

HAZARDOUS WASTE and TIRES

Town residents often call Public Works regarding the disposal of **paint, hazardous materials, unknown chemical compounds and vehicle tires**. The County charges extra for accepting these materials from the Town. And, unfortunately, we do not have the equipment and facilities to handle or dispose of these materials. None of these materials should be placed out for collection with your regular garbage or bulky trash pickups. They can become a hazard to the collector, our trucks, our roads, and our immediate environment.

EVERY Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 7:30am until 3:30pm there is **FREE DUMPING** at the Prince George's County Brown Station Landfill, 1611 White House Road, Largo. There is also a **FREE DROP-OFF of hazardous materials and tires on these days (same hours)**. This is for personal vehicles only—(No commercial vehicles).

LEAF COLLECTION PROCEDURES



Vacuum Leaves: Every street in Cheverly is scheduled for at least 2 vacuuming sweeps.

Rake leaves between the curb and sidewalk - not on the street or sidewalk.

- Keep leaves free of twigs, branches, metal, concrete and other debris that can jam or damage the equipment.
- Please do not park cars on the street on the assigned collection day.

Bag Leaves: Yard waste is collected on

MONDAYS. Put bags at the curb on Sunday

evening. Use **CLEAR PLASTIC BAGS** (sold at Town Hall or Public Works \$5 for 50 bags). Yard waste includes leaves, grass, brush, twigs, etc. Do not put any dirt, rocks, or other trash/debris in these bags.

Residents should leave trash at the curb 7:00PM the day before your pickup. Trash must be placed in cans with tight fitting lids to ward off rodents

ELECTRONICS are picked up on **Wednesday** with recycling. (TV's any size, computers, monitors, keyboards, etc.)

APPLIANCES - Washers, Dryers, stoves, dish-washers, microwaves (any size) and air conditioners. \$20 fee for removal, contact office for schedule.
