Unfortunately, this prominent oak tree is dying and while our Public Works Department is attempting to prolong its longevity it may only survive another year or two. The Town Council is aware of the prominence of this location and has been thinking about how best to replace it. Recently, some residents have requested that the Town consider a tree carving in the same vein as those found at Town Hall. The Town Council is considering this suggestion, but is also considering planting more canopy trees in this location. If we plant canopy trees (oaks, elms, etc) then a tree carving would be hidden from view and the roots of the old tree will affect the growth of the new trees.

How Do I Contact the Police: I am frequently asked “What phone number do I use to contact the Cheverly Police?”

Emergency Situations: In any emergency situation use 911. All 911 calls terminate at the County Dispatcher and are routed to an available Police Officer. While most emergency calls are routed directly to a Cheverly Police Officer, if there is no officer on duty or the officer is on another call the 911 call will be routed to a County Police officer. This ensures the most rapid response.

Non-Emergency Business Hours: The Cheverly Police Office number is 301-341-1055. Please call this number with any questions Monday thru Friday from 9:00am to 5:00pm. The office will direct any service call to the officer on duty.

Non-Emergency Non Business Hours: If you wish to contact the Cheverly Police Officer on duty regarding a suspicious situation or even a noise violation please call 301-789-5090. Please do not use this number for normal administrative questions as this number terminates to the officer on duty. Please also note that if the officer is busy on another call they will not be able to answer. Therefore, do not use this number in an emergency or during business hours.

Raised Crosswalks at Forest Road and Lake Ave: Yes, the Town Council is well aware that the raised crosswalks originally installed at this location were a little high and caused some inconvenience to residents in the area. The contractor installed the raised crosswalks to county standards and not to the standards requested by Public Works. Unfortunately, it took us three weeks to get the raised crosswalks retrofitted. Fortunately the raised crosswalks were retrofitted to the Cheverly specifications on September 19th and all is well again.

As we repave roads throughout town, we will continue to implement raised crosswalks at busy intersections as a method of encouraging drivers to stop at Stop Signs to increase pedestrian safety.

The large crowd witnessed some exciting demonstrations by the Greenbelt City Police Department, K-9 Unit, the Bomb Squad from the Prince George’s County Fire Department, displays from Prince George’s County, Homeland Security, various police vehicles from many jurisdictions, and great food prepared and served by the Cheverly American Legion. The CPD would also like to thank the County Police, Special Operations Division, officers from PGPD’s District I (Hyattsville) station, DJ music from K&S Productions, Pepsi, and the Metropolitan Police of the District of Columbia (MPDC) for their helicopter fly-over. We hope everyone enjoyed the obstacle course which will be even bigger and better next year.

PLEASE CONTINUE TO USE OUR NIGHTTIME/WEEKEND CELLULAR PHONE NUMBER (301-789-5090) FOR ASSISTANCE: I have talked to a few residents lately who have complained that they do not always get a response when calling the CPD’s nighttime/weekend cell phone. Please be patient while we are upgrading our service and bear in mind that new changes in prisoner processing have doubled the amount of time that our officers are at processing facilities and away from the cellular phone. Because a police officer does not immediately answer the phone does not mean that CPD officers are not working. It means they are on other calls or performing other duties. If you do not get a response, and it is an emergency, please dial 9-1-1. If it is not an emergency call, please try our telephone number again or call the County’s dispatch line at 301-352-1200. A recorded message indicating that you have reached the CPD telephone comes on after 5-6 rings, however, you cannot leave a message or text to this phone. Thank you.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH IN MARYLAND: October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month in Maryland, as celebrated in 30 U.S. states and Canada. As part of this awareness, the Cheverly Police Department is requesting that residents display a purple light (symbolic of domestic violence awareness) on their porch or that may be seen through a front window. Purple bulbs should be lit every night for the entire month and may be purchased from Home Depot, Target, or Walmart. As residents of Cheverly, let us show others that domestic violence has no place in our Town.

September was “Preparedness Month” - a month in which emergency preparedness was emphasized. Nonetheless, preparation for emergencies needs to be a year round effort to us all.

The question we all must answer is a simple one yet perhaps a little complicated. Am I, is my family; are we ready for an emergency?

Although there are many templates; these templates are just Recommendations and each of us must adjust them to our needs, our household; the specific changing needs we might be facing.

Visiting the websites of the American Red Cross www.redcross.org and the Department of Homeland Security (Ready.gov) www.ready.gov/america.getakit can give you the “springboard” for your specific plans. Now don’t wait for the last minute to visit these websites. Take time before an emergency to visit, become acquainted with the sites and make the preparations that will meet your needs.

Perhaps you don’t have access to the internet and/or a computer; no problem. Here are some recommendations that may help you as you tailor them to your needs.

Evacuation Backpack: Flashlight with fresh batteries (LED’S last longer) or hand crank; Emergency radio, fresh batteries and/or hand cranked, Extra batteries, Water, water bottle with filtering cartridge, water bottles, Sealable plastic bag with list of prescriptions, prescriptions and non- prescription medicines, First aid kit, dry and canned food, hand crank can opener, sealable plastic container with copies of important papers such as wills, vehicle titles, insurance, DD214 and/or as needed, germicidal based wipes for general cleaning, Reusable plates, heat resistant pot, cups, utensils, Whistle, Change of clothes, Water proof shoes/boots, socks and poncho, foldable paper map, compass.



Auto/Office: Flashlight with fresh batteries (LED’s last longer) or hand crank, kitty litter and/or bag of sand for vehicle traction, water, water bottles, small shovel, ice scrapper, first aid kit, dry food, emergency foil thermal blanket, jumper cables, vehicle fluids, electronic device charger, cigarette lighter DC to A/C power converter, fuse or electronic road flares, triangles, office/vehicle **Evacuation bag.**

Pets: Water/Food, travel bowls for food and water, leash, kennel, toys as per pet, sealable bag for prescriptions and medications, pet first aid kit, plastic bags and gloves for pet clean up.

At Home Housekeeping: Manual tool kit and if possible battery operated power tools, chain saw, fuel and bar oil for chain saw, hand bow saw with razor teeth, clippers for the removal of downed trees, earth friendly ice melting compound, leather, water, proof, thermal work gloves, large contractor strength plastic bags, large waterproof tarp, battery operated carbon monoxide and smoke and fire detectors.

Residents should place trash at the curb after 7:00PM the day before your pickup.

Trash must be placed in cans with tight fitting lids to ward off rodents.

BAMBOO is picked up with Thursday/Friday Special Trash. Tied up and bundled no longer than 4’

ELECTRONICS are picked up on Wednesday with recycling . TV’s (no console models), computers (remove hard drive), monitors, keyboards, etc. Place these items next to your recycle bucket.

APPLIANCES - Washers, dryers, stoves, dishwashers, refrigerators/freezers (remove doors) microwaves (any size), A/C units (any size) - \$20 for removal, contact Public Works at 301-773-2666

HOLIDAYS? Public Works crews DO NOT work on holidays. Collections on holidays are **CANCELLED**

Send your leaves to mulch school - The town will have your leaves mulched and make the mulch available in the Spring. For information on the leaf collection schedule, leaf bagging, and mulch delivery, see the town newsletter or the town web site. Place leaves in large brown paper yard waste bags or trash cans. The Cheverly Public Works Department suggests leaving the lid off the yard waste can and placing the can separate from the regular trash can. That will reduce confusion on collection day.

For residents, the biggest benefit to backyard composting is it will help you monitor and then reduce your **food waste losses estimated at between \$1,350 & \$2,275 per household** each year.*

You'll also help the Town save money.

EnviroWorld compost bins are available to Cheverly residents for only \$20. The low cost is made possible by the Town of Cheverly and BackyardComposting.org, which cover the rest of the bin cost and shipping.

You can purchase a bin by going to the Community Center to pay and then pick up your bin at the Public Works Department (9am to 4pm weekdays). Bins may also be sold at some Community Markets.

Learn more and download the 3-page Composting Guide at: www.backyardcomposting.org

This is a comprehensive plan to encourage all residents to compost. We achieved our initial goal of 25%, 400 households out of 1,600, composting their food scraps and soiled paper waste at home. Please participate and help us increase that number.

The Composting Program is reducing Town tipping fees by about \$5,900 each year. Around 100 tons (200,000 lbs.) of food scrap and soiled paper waste (paper towels, napkins, tissues, pizza boxes, etc.) are being composted by residents each year.

Of course, you'll also produce up to \$50 of great compost each year to amend your garden or mulch around bushes.

Who We Are

The American Legion is a Not for Profit, Community Based, Non-Partisan, Patriotic, Veterans Service Organization that was founded and Chartered by the United States Congress in September of 1919. We are comprised of some 14,000 American Legion Posts located in all 50 States, the District of Columbia, France, Mexico, the Philippines and Puerto Rico.

LEAF COLLECTION PROCEDURES

Vacuuming Leaves: Every street in Cheverly is scheduled for at least 2 vacuuming sweeps.



Rake leaves **between** the curb and sidewalk - not on the street or sidewalk.

- Keep leaves free of twigs, branches, metal, concrete and other debris that can jam or damage the equipment.
- Please do not park cars on the street on the assigned collection day
- Be considerate of your neighbors. Only rake to curb when your pick up day is imminent. Raking too early, allows the leaves to blow into your neighbors yard.

Bag or Container Leaves: Yard waste is collected on **MONDAYS**. Put bags or containers at the curb on Sunday evening. Place your leaves in **Paper Bags or a Trash can only**. Yard waste includes leaves, grass, brush, twigs, etc. Do not put any dirt, rocks, or other trash/debris in these bags.
