B&E SUSPECT & SUSPECT VEHICLE

LOOKOUT: Wanted for questioning in a number of recent Cheverly residential B&Es: a Black Male, 40-50 years of age, 6'1, approximately 230 lbs., dark complexion, and a bald head. The suspect was operating a white older model Saturn bearing Maryland registration plates 1DH-J62. These plates are reported as stolen from a Buick back in June 2010. Any person seeing a possible suspect or the described vehicle is urged to call 9-1-1 immediately.

COPS HIRING GRANT: The Cheverly Police Department recently received a Federal grant for \$257,000 to hire a new police officer. This grant pays the salary and benefits for this officer for the first three years, with the Town obligated for the fourth year. This was the only grant position under the COPS Hiring Package to take place in Prince George's County. In addition to this Federal grant, the Department also received a State grant for \$26,000 to buy six (6) new Toughbook computers for the Town's police vehicles. These computers are particularly suited for the rigors of police work and the touch screen is much quicker to operate than standard mouse/screen-driven models.

C-PACT/CHEVERLY WATCH RESIDENT RADIO PROGRAM MEETING – There will be a joint meeting of C-PACT (Cheverly – Citizens and Police Together), Cheverly's Neighborhood Watch Organization, and the Cheverly Watch Resident Radio Program on Tuesday, November 9, 2010, at 7:00 PM in the Police Department Conference Room.

REMINDER...REMINDER...REMINDER: Effective as of 10-01-10, it is illegal in the State of Maryland to use a cell telephone without a hands free device while operating a motor vehicle. This law pertains to all drivers 18 years of age or older, since a driver under 18 years is already prohibited from using any cell telephone. Exceptions are allowed for calls placed to 9-1-1, an ambulance, hospital, fire, or a law enforcement agency. There is a law enforcement exception, but members of this Department are restricted from making such calls except those directly related to an on-duty function. The first offense calls for a fine of \$40, and all subsequent offenses are \$100. Texting is already against the law in Maryland and carries a fine up to \$500.

LEAF COLLECTION PROCEDURES

Vacuum Leaves:



- Rake leaves between the curb and sidewalk - not on the street or sidewalk
- Please do not rake your leave too early. 2 days prior to your collection day is permitted. Be considerate of your neighbors who have bagged their leaves. Remember the wind plays havoc with loose leaves.
- Keep leaves free of twigs, branches, metal, concrete and other debris that can jam or damage the equipment.
- Please do not park cars on the street on the assigned collection day.

Bag Leaves: Yard waste is collected on **MONDAYS**. Put bags at the curb on Sunday evening. Use **CLEAR PLASTIC BAGS** only (sold at Town Hall or Public Works - \$5 for 50 bags). Yard waste includes leaves, grass, brush, twigs, etc. Do not put any dirt, rocks, or other trash/debris in these bags.

Bamboo is collected on Thursday or Friday w/bulk trash. Tied and bundled in 4' lengths.

History of Veterans Day:

Veterans Day, formerly known as Armistice Day, was originally established as a National holiday to honor the end of World War I, which officially took place on November 11, 1918. In legislation that was passed in 1938, November 11 was "dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be hereafter celebrated and known as 'Armistice Day'."

In 1954, after having been through both World War II and the Korean War, the 83rd U.S. Congress -- at the urging of the American Legion -- amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting the word "Veterans." With the approval of this legislation Nov. 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

NOTE: Veterans Day is to honor living veterans while Memorial Day (formerly known as Decoration Day, May 30th) is a day of remembrance for veterans who died in our nation's service.

Remember the American Legion's motto continues to be "For God and Country".
