**Let's Talk Trash:** First, let's give our Public Works team a big hand for the outstanding job they do. The one comment I hear from residents every week is "what a great job the Public Works does".

However, you should all know that many of our rules are governed by what Prince George's Cnty allows in their Landfill. While Cheverly Staff and Cheverly Trucks pick up our solid waste we bring all of that waste (with the exception of electronic recycling) to county facilities.

Therefore, Cheverly residents must adhere to county recycling rules, county yard waste rules and county hazardous waste rules. If you want to find out more about Prince Georges' County Solid Waste Facilities you can go directly to their website:

However, what every resident needs to know is that changes at the county have mandated changes here in Cheverly, so please read the following two items.

**Leaf Season is Here, No Plastic Bags:** Last Fall the County mandated that they would no longer accept any yard waste in plastic bags. This meant that Cheverly Public Works could no longer pick-up your yard waste in plastic bags. We appreciate everyone's cooperation throughout the year but please remember: Leaves will not be picked up in plastic bags.

Please check the back of this newsletter for this year's leaf pickup schedule.

**No More Opaque Plastic Bags on Recycling Days:**

Recently the county alerted municipalities that the recycling coming into the County Landfill was becoming increasingly contaminated with non recyclable items. Apparently some municipalities have as much as a 30% contamination rate, which causes County Staff to perform special processing increasing costs and handling times. The problem is becoming so significant that the county informed municipalities that recycling privileges could be revoked if this trend continues.

While I don't believe that Cheverly residents are contributing to this issue, Town Staff took appropriate measures to address the problem. Public Works staff has been instructed to no longer pick up any recycling that has been placed into non see through bags. The rationale for this is simple: if town staff cannot see what is in the bag we cannot guarantee it is recyclable.

So please use the plastic bins supplied by the Town, any open container, or clear plastic bags to dispose of recycling. More importantly, please don't sneak regular trash into your recycling buckets.

Thank you so much for your cooperation. If you would like to get a new recycling bucket please call the Public Works Department at 301-773-2666.

As an aside, a number of nearby communities have reduced the number of trash pickups to once a week as a cost savings item. We as a council have discussed this possibility, but have never pursued it because the savings are relatively small. However, I think the incentive to use recycling for normal trash increases when there are fewer trash days available. This may be one of the causes of the county's contamination problem.

**The Cheverly Police Department is Ahead of the Curve:** As I read the October 16<sup>th</sup> Gazette article regarding police officers wearing vest cameras, I reflected how fortunate Cheverly is to have such innovative leaders in the Public Safety and Public Works Departments.

Chief Robshaw was on the leading edge of the vest camera initiative. Chief Robshaw believed strongly that vest cameras ensure that both parties in a police encounter are incented to act with the utmost civility, when they know the encounter is being recorded.

Cheverly Police have been wearing vest cameras since early 2013. Since that time the number of citizen complaints regarding police encounters has dropped. More importantly, when a complaint is made both the Police Officer and the citizen can review the encounter and come to a better resolution.

Given the recent national discussions about negative police encounters and the value of these vest cameras, it is nice to know that our Chief was a leading proponent of this technology. Additionally, it is great to know that the Town Council was supportive of the initiative.

**Welcome to Cheverly:** Teresa Williams, in tandem with the Cheverly Community Market, has brought back the tradition of welcoming new neighbors with a basket. Teresa has worked with a number of local businesses and the Town to provide new residents with information about town services and coupons for local businesses.

**Walmart Applies to Become a Super Walmart:** Recently, the Walmart at Capital Plaza submitted a Special Exception application to MNCPPC for the purpose of expansion. Walmart is hoping to expand and begin to offer groceries.

Cheverly has worked with neighboring towns and community organizations since the Walmart was first opened, to develop Community Standards that Walmart should adhere to. These Community Standards addressed areas such as: no gun sales, limited food sales, maintenance of the site, etc. It is the opinion of the alliance that Walmart has fallen short of meeting these commitments.

Previous Cheverly Town Councils have passed a resolution in support of these Community Standards, and the current Town Council has agreed to continue this support. Therefore, the Cheverly Town Council will continue to work against the expansion of the Walmart.

The Capital Plaza Property Owners have asked that Cheverly support the Special Exception, and they insist that once the Walmart expands other businesses will locate at Capital Plaza. While this rationale makes sense, this is the same rationale that was used when Walmart first opened at this site.

The Community Alliance has asked that the Property Owners come to the table with a more comprehensive plan for economic development at the plaza prior to agreeing to the expansion. At this time Walmart is continuing forward without a more comprehensive economic development plan, so Cheverly will continue in opposition.

**Coming Soon to a Shopping Center Near You:** The signs are up, and soon the doors will open. Please welcome a new business (Ledo's Pizza) and an old friend (The Landover Carryout) when they open in the next month. We are very happy to have them in our community and I for one look forward to having a Pizza Parlor so close to home.


**Bam-BOO:** Oh heck, I couldn't resist given the proximity to Halloween. The Town Council continues to discuss approaches to resolve the encroachment of running bamboo onto both public and private property. While we are still far from coming to a conclusion we are taking an initial look at legislation that has been passed in Cambridge, Md. This legislation requires residents who have running bamboo on their property to contain it on their property, and to ensure it does not encroach onto neighboring properties.

The primary topic being discussed is how to handle situations where running bamboo already exists on a resident's property. In many instances the running bamboo on an existing property was planted by a previous resident or came from a neighbor. The Cambridge Legislation specifies that any property owner with running bamboo must stop it from encroaching on a neighbor's property, no matter how it originally came upon their property.

**WHY YOU NEED A HOME SECURITY**

**SURVEY:** During a number of recent visits with residents, I took the opportunity to ask them why they had not committed to a survey. I expected the standard response – statistically, there is a greater chance I won't be burglarized then I will – for which I usually counter with the fact that target selection by burglars is usually varied and so unsystematic that no part of the Town is immune from this crime. The other answers were more problematic:

1. I won't be burglarized because I really do not have anything worth taking.
2. I have a safe for my valuables, no money lying around to speak of, and I have only costume jewelry.
3. I have an alarm.
4. I have a big dog.
5. My house is a mess, I need the Survey done on the weekend, and I probably can't afford to make the improvements anyway.

Now, let me take a minute to debunk these reasons as well, so that they should not be impediments to have a free Home Security Survey performed at your residence.

1. Very, very few burglars have inside knowledge as to what a particular residence contains prior to deciding to enter said residence. More homes are entered based upon ease of entry and probability of discovery than on what assets could be found inside. In addition, the damage from a forced entry by a burglar is frequently greater than the value of anything removed from within.
2. Money is only one of the assets a burglar is looking for and very few burglars take the time to evaluate the authenticity of jewelry or other valuables in the few moments they spend inside a residence. In addition, safes are frequently stolen because of the enticement they present rather than the contents they hold.
3. Alarms, generally, do not prevent burglaries but report crimes that would otherwise not be discovered until the homeowner gets home. Most burglars are not deterred by alarms but limit the amount of time they spend within a residence to that which they believe (with some justification) is less time than it ultimately takes for the alarm company to notify the police.

4. Dogs have not traditionally been a very good deterrent to burglars, principally because, most home pets are not sufficiently aggressive enough to deter a determined burglar.

5. We do not care what your house looks like, only your windows, doors, other places of entry, locks, and lighting look like. We also perform Surveys day or night, weekday or weekend.

So, there you go. There are now no excuses for why Home Security Surveys are not a top priority in Cheverly!

**PESDESTRIAN SAFETY:** There are now pedestrian warning lights at the intersections of Cheverly Avenue and Kilmer Street and Cheverly Avenue and Forest Road. These warning lights are not traffic control signals, but are designed to simply warn motorists that pedestrians have the right of way over vehicles when these pedestrians are in a marked crosswalk anywhere or in an unmarked crosswalk at an intersection. Having stated that the pedestrian has the right of way over a motor vehicle while crossing in a crosswalk does not relieve the pedestrian, however, from crossing safely. Maryland Transportation Law 21-502 (b) specifically states that a pedestrian may not suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of an approaching vehicle that does not have the time to yield to such a pedestrian. Safety is an obligation for both pedestrian and motorist!

**SECOND NOTICE – WOMEN'S SELF-DEFENSE CLASS** - The Cheverly Police Department has sponsored several women's self-defense classes over the years that have been well attended and useful for community members. I have been asked several times lately about offering another such class and I am looking for community interest. If you are a woman and are interested in attending such a class, please contact the Cheverly Police Department at (301) 341-1055 and express your interest. We will take your name and telephone number and contact you directly with further details of a future class. Thanks ladies!

**ELDERWATCH** – The CPD regularly visits the Town's elderly and infirmed in an effort to keep this important segment of the community up to date on crime issues and neighborhood events. These 10-15 minute visits are designed, not only for information sharing, but also to socialize. If any Cheverly resident knows of any elderly or infirmed persons living alone whom they believe would benefit from such contact, please notify the police station (301-341-1055).

# Free recycling can be cancelled



Does the title of this article get your attention? Hopefully it does; free recycling can be cancelled for the Town of Cheverly. Recent changes at the MRF, (**Materials Recycling Facility**) the County facility where the recyclables are taken, may put an end to the Town's years of free dumping. Last year, from January to December, 577 tons of materials were recycled by the Town of Cheverly; a little over \$34,000 saved. Free recycling cannot be jeopardized.



There are some residents that are using the recycling collection for refuse collection. Large containers and dark plastic bags are loaded with refuse and placed for collection next to recyclable containers for Wednesday's collection. This is unacceptable; as it is the bagging, hiding, or placement of other non-recyclable items such as Styrofoam. These actions, of the few, will jeopardize the Town's excellent relationship at the MRF.

The Town has an outstanding refuse collection program. Twice a week refuse is collected by the Town's crews. If you are recycling, as required by Town's ordinance, there should not be a reason for anyone to use the Wednesday recycling service for refuse collection.

Currently, as the refuse trucks enter the MRF, the managers have installed two individuals to inspect that which comes out of the recycling trucks. When these individuals find dark colored bags or refuse mixed with recycling they write a negative report which is given a value. When this value reaches 50% the load will be rejected. Rejected loads will be downgraded, and will result in a charge for handling, disposal and clean up and any other associated costs. During the last two weeks of September the Town was up to 30%.

You must recycle in either the Town provided container and/or in a CLEAR plastic bag; black, white or colored bags that are not see-through are not acceptable. Colored bags have a negative value even if they are full of recyclables; the recyclable items must be seen.



As you read this article please know that the Town's crews have been directed to leave behind any recyclable that can be construed as refuse and/or found in a bag that is not see through.

The Town still offers the best deal in clear bags; fifty clear bags for five dollars. A Town office, either public works or Town Hall, where the bags can be purchased, is open between the hours of 7:30AM until 5:00PM Monday Through Friday except federal holidays.

Let's keep recycling free for Cheverly.

# LEAF COLLECTION PROCEDURES

**Vacuuming Leaves: Every street in Cheverly is scheduled for at least 2 vacuuming sweeps.**

Rake leaves **between** the curb and sidewalk - not on the street or sidewalk.

- Keep leaves free of twigs, branches, metal, concrete and other debris that can jam or damage the equipment.
- Please do not park cars on the street on the assigned collection day
- Be considerate of your neighbors. Only rake to curb when your pick up day is imminent. Raking too early, allows the leaves to blow into your neighbors yard.

**Bag Leaves:** Yard waste is collected on **MONDAYS**. Put bags at the curb on Sunday evening. Use **Paper Bags or Trash cans only**. Yard waste includes leaves, grass, brush, twigs, etc. Do not put any dirt, rocks, or other trash/debris in these bags.
