## Message from the Chief ~ 2004 Annual Crime Report



Total reported criminal incidents in the Town of Cheverly for the year 2004 took a significant downturn from 2003. There were 379 reported criminal incidents in 2004 and 444 in 2003. This represents an approximate 15% drop in crime from last year. Over the past year the police department employed a number of different strategies to reduce the number of stolen autos occurring in the town. Our efforts resulted in lowering the number of stolen autos from 107 in 2003 to 84 in 2004. This represents a 22% decrease in stolen autos. This is remarkable in light of the fact that

stolen autos remain a major problem in Prince George's County. We will continue to make this reduction a priority. We have employed a number of strategies to combat the stolen auto issue. One of the strategies that I believe has had a major impact is residents employing the use of the "club" vehicle anti-theft device. The club is for sale at the police department for \$10.00. Also our Cheverly Neighborhood Watch participation played a part in causing a reduction. Neighbors noting juveniles "casing" a vehicle and then stealing it immediately notified the police, which enabled several arrests for stolen vehicle.


As you can see from the chart the crimes of assault and robbery also took a downward turn. Burglaries were down from 54 in 2003 to 47 in 2004. The police department has made several arrests for breaking and entering throughout the year thanks to the tireless efforts of Detective Randy Green. The crime of theft was also down from 148 incidents to 130. The majority of thefts were from vehicles. This crime in particular is difficult for the police department to solve without the help of neighbors with watchful eyes.

The new record management

system that the police department received through a grant from the State has been up and running for 2 years now. This system acts primarily as our crime database and allows the police department to do crime mapping as well as other applications that aid in the development of strategies to combat crime. However, the most vital element to fighting crime is the participation of the community in this effort. The essence of "Community Policing" is the partnership between the community and their police department. The Town of Cheverly has a neighborhood watch program, which serves as the vehicle to develop this relationship. We meet the second Monday of every other month. The next meeting will be March 14, 2005 at 6:30 PM at the Town Hall. Please participate and support this program.

I would also like to bring to your attention the fine work that the men and women of the Cheverly Police Department have done over the past year. Criminal arrests were up significantly over last year and we wrote over a 1000 more citations (the majority for speeding) than in 2003. Their diligence helps to keep us all safe and secure.

Lastly, a reminder that the police department conducts home and business security surveys. Please call the administrative offices at **301-773-8362** between 9:00AM and 5:00PM and make an appointment for your security survey.

### *Out-of-State Registration Enforcement Campaign*

The Cheverly Police Department has recently begun a campaign to bring Cheverly residents with out of state registration plates into compliance with Maryland law and the town code. The law requires that Maryland residents register their motor vehicles with the Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) within sixty (60) days. Failure to comply with the law may result in a fine of \$275.00 under the Maryland Transportation Article, and/or a fine of \$100.00 under the town code. Additionally, the town code allows for the issuance of fines for vehicles parked in violation of this code every ten (10) days.

There are currently several exemptions allowable under law. For example, active military personnel with current registration plates from their home state are exempted. Currently enrolled students may be exempted if their home state grants the same exemption to Maryland residents, their vehicles are insured in compliance with Maryland law, and they obtain a nonresident permit in accordance with MVA regulations. In addition, there are certain exemptions for diplomats, members of Congress, and certain types of vehicles.

If you have any questions relative to Maryland law or registering your vehicle, please contact the **Maryland MVA at 1-800-950-1682**, or visit online at [www.marylandmva.com](http://www.marylandmva.com). If you believe that you are entitled to an exemption, please contact the **Cheverly Police Department at (301) 773-8362**.

Once a notice is left on your vehicle or given to you personally, your vehicle information will be recorded. At the end of the 60 day notification period, Cheverly police officers will begin enforcement of the above described violations. Do not wait until the last minute to obtain Maryland registration plates.

Maryland law also requires residents to obtain a Maryland driver's license during this same 60 day period. Enforcement of both statutes will be conducted concurrently. In addition, vehicles that are identified through this program with multiple unpaid parking tickets may be subject to impound under the town code. If you have any outstanding parking tickets on your vehicle, regardless of the current state of registration, make every effort to pay these tickets or request a court appearance before the vehicle becomes subject to impound.

**REMINDER:** If you have not renewed your parking sticker yet, please do so as soon as possible to avoid parking tickets. The 2005 stickers are available at the **POLICE DEPARTMENT**.

Bring the current **REGISTRATION** for any cars you are getting stickers for. Your car must be registered at your Cheverly address. **The parking stickers cost \$1.**

- ⇒ a registered voter of Cheverly,
- ⇒ a resident of Cheverly for not less than 6 months, and
- ⇒ a resident of the ward from which they are elected (at least 45 days before the date of the election).

**FILING INSTRUCTIONS:** Filing forms may be obtained at the Town Office during normal business hours (Monday-Friday, 9AM-5PM) Call 301-773-8360. Completed forms must be returned to the Town Office **no later than 5:00PM, Friday, March 18, 2005.**

**NOTE: Pictures & Profiles of Candidates** are run in the April Newsletter. They must be submitted with the nominating petition or by the filing deadline (**March 18**).

- ⇒ **Candidate Profiles must be brief (no longer than 350 words)**. Profiles will appear as written. They will not be edited or corrected; however, if the profile is too long, staff will have to shorten it by cutting it off at the paragraph closest to the limit.
- ⇒ **Picture should be a closeup**—will be cropped to about 2"x2"

If possible, please submit the profile and the picture on a disk. Please save them as separate files; the profile as a WORD document and the picture as a JPEG file, if possible. Contact the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 if you need further information.
