Call 301-773-0248 to leave a message for the Mayor. The Mayor's door at the Community Center is open to visitors on **Monday evenings** from 7:30 to 9:30 PM, except holidays or if otherwise posted.

Wal-Mart: For the past three televised Town Meetings, three Worksessions and one public special meeting, the Mayor and Council have been dealing with the issue of a proposed 142,000 square foot Wal-Mart store at the Capital Plaza Mall. The Nellis Corporation, the owner of the shopping Center, has signed a long-term lease with Wal-Mart, and expects that, with this anchor store committed to the project, redevelopment of the entire site will now be possible. Other than normal building permits required for any construction project, Wal-Mart does not need any special exception to build a facility at this location.

There is unanimity on the Council, and I believe in the Cheverly Community, for redevelopment of the Capital Plaza Mall. Wal-Mart is another matter however. At the Town meetings, there have been several groups and many individuals who oppose any Wal-Mart in our community because of some of their labor and business practices. There have also been many individuals who have approached Council in support of a Wal-Mart at Capital Plaza.

Below is A PROPOSED resolution, which was introduced by a 4-2 vote at the June Worksession just before this newsletter went to press. This resolution is based on several concessions or agreements that Wal-Mart representatives have made *verbally* to Council at our Town meetings such as no firearms or liquor sold at this location, sufficient security and lighting in the parking lots, etc. The resolution also includes issues that have been discussed with but not yet agreed to by Wal-Mart, that are equally important such as consulting with the Town on the exterior design features of the facility, giving priority to local, qualified applicants in hiring, to name a few. Council feels that we need these agreements in writing before any resolution in support

of the Wal-Mart could be considered. The resolution also deals with community standards issues such as livable wages and affordable health benefits that are important to our community.

Again, this is a **DRAFT** resolution that will be discussed and voted on at the July Town Meeting.

**DRAFT RESOLUTION R-04-05
OF THE MAYOR AND
TOWN COUNCIL
OF CHEVERLY, MARYLAND**

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheverly has consistently supported efforts for improved economic development in our broader community including committing the Town's own resources to reverse decline and support economic revitalization; and

WHEREAS, truly vibrant communities require not only appropriate shopping and other amenities but also local employment opportunities for community residents that pay livable wages and affordable health benefits; and

WHEREAS, the security and long-term economic success of Cheverly and her neighboring communities are directly linked to the success of Capital Plaza and the retail establishments therein; and

WHEREAS, Capital Plaza Shopping Center has the potential to be a thriving commercial retail center for the entire region surrounding Cheverly; and

WHEREAS, the owners of Capital Plaza have worked diligently for years to find a large retail tenant and have recently secured a lease from Wal-Mart for a large store there; and

WHEREAS, Wal-Mart has agreed that no firearms and ammunition of any kind, including hunting rifles and ammunition, will be sold at the Capital Plaza facility; and

WHEREAS, Wal-Mart has agreed that no alcoholic beverages will be sold at the Capital Plaza facility; and

WHEREAS, Wal-Mart has agreed that the Capital Plaza store will not operate its business for more

than 19 out of 24 hours each day; and

WHEREAS, Wal-Mart has agreed, as allowed by law, to give local, qualified residents priority in hiring; and

WHEREAS, Wal-Mart previously agreed with County officials and others that in order to protect existing food service jobs, the Capital Plaza store will not have a grocery store component; and

WHEREAS, Wal-Mart has agreed to consult with the Town as to the exterior design features of the Capital Plaza store and has committed to constructing a facility that will improve and enhance the community; and

WHEREAS, Wal-Mart has agreed to work with the Nellis Corporation to help bring quality dining establishments to the revitalized Capital Plaza Shopping Center; and

WHEREAS, Wal-Mart has agreed to provide sufficient parking lot lighting and security as well as long-term daily external maintenance of the Capital Plaza facility as well as quality space for ongoing civic uses, such as meeting space for community groups; and

WHEREAS, Wal-Mart must and will be in full compliance with all laws and rights as it relates to union organizing and representation.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Cheverly, Maryland in regular session assembled that the Mayor and Council, but only according to the above provisions, welcome and support the construction and operation of a Wal-Mart store at Capital Plaza Shopping Center; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council call upon the County Executive and the County Council to enact legislative safeguards to prevent lease agreements or similar measures that allow retail properties to remain vacant for extended periods of time in order to stymie competition at the expense of the local community; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor

and Council call upon elected State and County officials to protect the community by requiring that any publicly-provided subsidies, set-asides or tax benefits to Wal-Mart and other big box retailers be fully and publicly justified, and to assess appropriate penalties in the event of early abandonment; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council call upon the County Executive, County Council and our elected State representatives to take whatever actions are deemed appropriate to effect all the improvements in the County that community standards will bring including, but not limited to, legislation that would ensure livable wages and affordable healthcare benefits for retail and all workers; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately; and that the Town Administrator will forward copies of this resolution to Cheverly's representatives in the United States Senate, the United States House of Representatives, the Senate of Maryland, the Maryland House of Delegates, the Office of the Prince George's County Executive, and the Prince George's County Council and to relevant officials in all neighboring communities and their organizations.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

INTRODUCED by the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Cheverly, Maryland, at a Regular Meeting on June 23, 2005, at which meeting copies were available to the public for inspection.

NOTICE FROM THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT



Town-Wide Clean Up Day **MONDAY, JULY 25**

On **Monday, July 25th** the Department of Public Works is asking all residents to participate in a town-wide cleanup day. On **July 25th only**, all bulky trash placed for collection at the curb will not cost the Town of Cheverly a penny at the landfill scales. This is a one-time-one-day permit, which upon request, was granted to the town of Cheverly by the Prince

George's County Department of the Environment.

All town residents are being asked to ensure that on **July 25th** the bulky trash collected from the Town's curbs is and was generated within our corporate limits. Bulky trash from elsewhere, (family, friends, businesses, and contractors) will exceed the town's capabilities and unnecessarily burden our equipment and personnel. This day is for the bulky trash of the residents of Cheverly only.

All the rules of Special Trash Collections apply. Materials that **WILL NOT** be accepted for collection: **APPLIANCES** (fee for disposal); **AUTO PARTS, BRICKS, CONCRETE, ROCKS, etc., CAST IRON, CONSTRUCTION and/or DEMOLITION DEBRIS, HAZARDOUS WASTE.**

However, on **Monday, July 25th**, the permit will **allow us to pick up car tires** and dispose of them for free at a facility operated by Prince George's County. This is the same place that is open on weekends and accepts from county residents tires and other refuse that the trash truck cannot collect in the packer for disposal.

Please keep in mind that our regular trash collection schedule will continue during this special trash pickup day. If you have any questions regarding this cleanup day call us at Public Works (301-773-2666) Monday through Friday between 7:30AM and 4:00PM.

WE STILL HAVE MULCH

Contact the **PUBLIC WORKS OFFICE** to schedule a mulch delivery. The office is open Monday-Friday from **7:30AM to 4:00PM**.



NOTE: The Maximum for one delivery is two (2) scoops of the bulldozer. The fee is \$20 per delivery. If you have any questions you can call **301-773-2666**.

Public Works can only deliver mulch where there is a driveway or a safe place to back their dump truck and tip the load on the lawn.
REMINDER: If you leave mulch on the lawn for very long—it will kill the grass underneath.

The Town DOES NOT provide wood chip mulch for residents. Any mounds of wood chips in the parks IS FOR THE PARKS and is not available for residents to take.



Message from the Chief Buddy Robshaw

In the coming weeks, the Cheverly Police Department will be instituting an anti-burglary program that promises to have a great impact on this type of crime in Cheverly. The thrust of this program is three-fold. First, continued emphasis will be placed on protecting Cheverly homes against intrusion and the resultant damage of forced entry. Damage through forced entry can frequently be more costly than the loss of personal items from within the home and can typically be reduced through the implementation of simple prevention techniques.

Second, with the assistance of the police department, residents will be encouraged to properly mark items of personal property and record serial numbers on those items that display same. Remember, many items have serial numbers displayed on nothing more than flimsy stickers or tags that can easily be removed. Marking your property with your Maryland driver's license number (soundex number), never your social security number, can be the best way of ensuring the successful return of stolen items.

And third, after the police perform a security survey at your home, and you substantially complete the recommendations of the survey within practical fiscal limits, the police department will re-inspect your residence and affix a newly designed anti-burglary outdoor plaque that indicates you have met the requirements of this program. The cost of the plaque

will be paid for by the town. The police department will be accepting appointments for security surveys starting July 1, 2005. All residents who have previously had a survey performed at their homes will be required to resubmit to a new survey. Please remember:

- 95% of all burglaries in Cheverly occur between the hours of 8:00 AM and 3:00 PM, Monday through Friday.
- In every burglary case in the last 4 years, no one was home when entry was made.
- Only 20% of Cheverly residents were able to provide serial numbers for items that were stolen from their homes.
- If you are on vacation or away from your residence for several days, notify the police department so that a house check can be performed. Homes are checked by the police at various times during the day and at night until residents return.

NON-LETHAL WEAPONS COMMITTEE: The Police Department is considering the purchase of non-lethal weapons enabling officers to have a broader choice of response in certain situations. We are looking to form a committee of citizens interested in meeting with officers to discuss the options of non-lethal weapon usage. If interested please contact the department at **301-773-8362**.

Off-Road Vehicles are now required to be licensed and registered:

The County Executive recently signed into effect amendments to County Code, Subtitle 26, Vehicles & Traffic, Division 19, which took effect April 1, 2005, which require the following vehicles to be licensed



and registered:

- **All-Terrain Vehicles;**
- **Off-Road Vehicles;**
- **Miniature Scooters;**
- **Miniature Motorcycles (pocket bikes); and**
- **Off-Road Motorcycles (dirt bikes).**



The new amendments also stipulate the following legal use for Off-Road Vehicles:

- An Off-Road Vehicle cannot be driven or operated on any public street or sidewalk in Prince George's County;
- An Off-Road Vehicle cannot be driven on any private or publicly owned property, unless the driver has with him written permission from the owner;
- An Off-Road Vehicle may only be operated on private property between the hours of 7AM and 8PM.;
- Any person under the age of 16 years must be supervised by a parent or guardian while operating an Off-road Vehicle; and
- While the vehicle is being operated, helmets must be worn at all times by the drivers and passengers.

Christmas in April April 29, 2006 will mark the 18th year of the Christmas in April program. Thousands of volunteers provide home repair services to elderly and physically challenged Prince George's County homeowners on that date.

Most of the work is done on that last Saturday in April. The scope of work ranges from yard work to interior painting to replacing old appliances and installing smoke detectors. Over the past 17 years we have repaired 1,575 homes, last year repairing 93 homes. The work is done free of charge to the homeowner.

Our program is designed to keep homeowners living in their homes in a more comfortable and secure environment. Because we make all the repairs in one 6-8 hour day, we can only make repairs that are related to the safety of the homeowner, and repairs related to necessities. Homeowners who apply with structural damage to their homes will be referred to the County's Housing Department where they may qualify for a "rehab" loan.

To ensure that we preview as many qualified applicants as possible, we need your help reaching eligible homeowners. Applicants must be elderly or disabled, of low to moderate income and own and live in the home to be repaired.


