**TRAFFIC ON 63<sup>rd</sup> AVENUE AND KILMER STREET**

Council has continued to work with residents on solving the traffic problems and dangerous driving on 63<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and Kilmer Street near Saint Ambrose and Spellman Schools. Several public hearings have been held to give residents ample time to be informed and express their opinions and concerns. Director of Public Works Juan Torres is conducting a study to identify possible stop sign and speed bump locations to go along with the traffic study already done by Police Chief Robshaw. Stop signs have been ordered and Vice Mayor Vince Ford and Councilmember Mike Callahan will have met with the officials at Spellman and Saint Ambrose by the time this newsletter goes to press. ## ODDS AND ENDS

The Pointe at Cheverly continues to move forward and we hope that sales of these condominiums will start later this spring.

Council and I have continued to work on an agreement with Douglas Development concerning the Town's concerns about density, open and recreation space, traffic and other issues at the Addison Row development project. This contract must be reached prior to the next M-NCPPC hearing on February 7<sup>th</sup> but given the progress already made, we fully expect to reach an agreement.

The opening of the Wal-Mart at Capital Plaza has been delayed to March due to construction issues. Council and I continue to work with the developer to bring restaurants and other retailers to the center.

### *Message from the Chief*

**CRIME IN CHEVERLY IN 2006** – A final review of crime statistics for 2006 indicates an overall reduction in total crime of about 13% from the year before and the lowest yearly total of crimes since 1997. There were 358 reported criminal incidents in 2006, with specific reductions in stolen autos (-60%), assaults (-20%), thefts (-25%), and carjackings (-60%). There was also a slight reduction in sex offenses from 3 to 2 (both cases closed by arrest) and increase in homicides from 0 to 1 (Howard Johnson Motel). On the down side, there were considerable rises in citizen robberies and breaking and enterings (+60% and +40% respectively), problems that also continue to be regional issues.

A careful analysis of these statistics showed that crime was down 9 out of 12 months in 2006, however, there was a substantial rise in robberies during the months of July, August, and September and a similar rise in breaking and enterings in August. These summer months, when school is typically out of session, may help to explain why juveniles were the principal perpetrators of Cheverly crime although juveniles accounted for approximately 75% of all violent crime throughout the year. What is particularly disturbing is that Town youths and/or former resident juveniles committed the vast majority of the robberies and breaking and enterings last year. The Cheverly Police Department charged a number of these juveniles as adults for these robberies, a move that substantially increases the potential penalty for these crimes.

On top of these crime issues, the Department also had a roughly 50% turnover in experienced personnel as 6 veteran officers moved on to larger police agencies or other opportunities during the year. The Cheverly Police Department has such an excellent reputation that, unfortunately, we are frequently "raided" by larger organizations looking for experienced police officers. To

counter these losses, the Department put 2 new recruit officers through a 6-month police certification school sponsored by the Maryland Police Training Commission and these officers recently graduated near the top of their class. The Department has also recently hired 2 new experienced police officers as well.

**YAHOO GROUPS** - There are a number of ways that Cheverly residents can be active partners with their police. First, I encourage every resident to join the C-PACT (Cheverly – Police And Citizens Together) website (<http://groups.yahoo.com/group/CheverlyPact>) to keep up with the latest community news. Second, I encourage every resident to visit Cheverly Police Lookouts ([http://groups.yahoo.com/group/CheverlyPD\\_Lookouts](http://groups.yahoo.com/group/CheverlyPD_Lookouts)) to obtain lookouts for suspects and/or vehicles involved or used in local crime.

**MEET THE CHIEF** – I regularly meet with citizens and business groups and I am always available to speak with small groups of residents whether affiliated with any organization or not. If you and a couple of your neighbors want to meet to discuss crime issues, please feel free to call me to schedule a visit. I can be contacted at 301-773-8362.

**REWARD MONEY** – The CPD is committed to using every means necessary to close out open investigative cases. In line with this, the Town is offering rewards up to \$1,000.00 for information that leads to the identification of any person committing a crime in Cheverly, with particular attention to the crimes of robbery, burglary, and theft from auto. Please call the office or leave a message on the answering machine – your confidentiality is assured.

**WOMEN'S SELF DEFENSE CLASS #2 REMINDER** – This class is currently scheduled for Saturday, April 21, 2007, from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM in the Gym. Please call Janet or myself (301-773-8362) in the office to indicate your desire to attend. The cost is \$20.00 per person, with the Department and C-PACT paying the difference (\$30.00).

**CAMERAS** – As you may remember in early 2006, I looked into the possibility of seeking a grant to purchase some type of camera system to cover all of the entrances/exits of Cheverly as a means of deterrence and as a method of solving crimes through the identification of suspect vehicles. I was unsuccessful, principally because the project was too extensive and my window of opportunity was relatively short, but also because I was not sufficiently knowledgeable about these systems to make an informed decision. I have since learned that there may be a number of interested and knowledgeable Cheverly residents who may be able to assist the Department in this cause. Any interested residents are encouraged to contact me at the office (301-773-8362) so that I can set up a meeting date to discuss this important issue.

**RIDE-ALONGS** – As many of you know, the Department regularly schedules enforcement actions several times a month to address various problems around the Town. As part of these actions, I encourage residents to ride-along with their police officers to act as a second set of eyes and to use their local

knowledge to identify problem areas. Please call the office (301-773-8362) if you would be interested in helping the Department out. C-PACT members can ride-along as often as they like.

# WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

## **TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking**

A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more. The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed.



**PARKING RESTRICTIONS:** During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
- On any courts,
- On the even-numbered side of all streets,
- (exception) On the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belleview Avenue.

**NOTE:** The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

**PRIORITIES:** The snow removal operations work under the following priorities: 1.) Cheverly Avenue 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valleyway, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive; 3.) all other streets.

**SAFETY REMINDER:** We ask residents to remember that your neighbors who walk to Metro, or children walking to school, and the hard working Mail Carriers are exposed to dangerous conditions when sidewalks are not cleared in a timely manner. Failure to comply with Town Code could result in fines.

## **TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS**



Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day). Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.
