DID YOU GET TICKETED FOR PARKING IN THE WRONG DIRECTION???

If you received a COUNTY ISSUED parking ticket for parking facing the wrong way on or about July 18-20th, bring your ENTIRE TICKET into the Cheverly Police Station to have the ticket voided. Recently the County's Parking Authority hired new employees who mistakenly started ticketing inside Cheverly's boundaries. Chief Robshaw quickly contacted Bob Parker at the County Authority who apologized for the mistake and asked Chief to collect all the tickets so they can be voided. Please bring them in to Chief as soon as possible so all tickets can be handled at one time.

Parking enforcement in Town is handled by our Code Enforcement Officer or our Police officers. Inside of Town they only ticket for the "wrong way parking" (parking facing traffic) on Cheverly Avenue where it is specifically prohibited in our Town Code. However this is County and State law elsewhere so be forewarned when you park on Cheverly Avenue or outside of Town. Many residents often park facing the opposite way depending on which direction they are coming from and were surprised that this is a violation. Chief says that generally speaking it is always safer to park with the driver's side to the street but only Cheverly Avenue wrong way parkers will be cited by our officers. NEW ENVIRONMENTALLY CONSCIOUS POLICE CARS

The Police department just took possession of 3 new police cruisers as part of our recently passed CIP budget. The new cruisers are Dodge Chargers which are a new type of police vehicle for the Town. For years, our department like many in the country, used the 8 cylinder Crown Victoria. In an attempt to get better gas mileage, our last vehicles purchased were the smaller, lighter, Chevy Impalas. However for a number of reasons, these weren't satisfactory. The new Chargers are 4/8 cylinder cars and around town they operate on 4 cylinders saving gas and reducing pollution. For higher speeds or long distance driving, they automatically shift to the more powerful 8 cylinder. Chief and Council are also considering energy saving policy changes such as turning off the engines rather than idling when making traffic stops. In years past, this interfered with radio contact but advances in technology have made this a non-issue. The new cars are also less expensive --- an added bonus!

WHAT ISN'T IN THE FY09 BUDGET— A YOUTH COORDINATOR

Somehow rumors get started in Town and recently a number of residents have referred to the “fact” that the Town is hiring a \$75,000-\$85,000 Youth Coordinator. There is no position like this in the budget for this year at \$75,000 or any other salary. What is in the budget is \$4,000 for getting a proposal for a business plan or outline for a youth program here in Town. The plan would help the Council determine what type of program the Town wants, what is feasible, what it would cost and, equally important, whether it could be substantially grant or self-funded. The plan would also have to take into account the Town’s limitations with money, space and facilities.

CONGRATULATIONS TO CHIEF FOR RECEIVING A \$12,000 GRANT FOR NEW RADIOS

At the July Town Meeting, Chief announced that he had received a grant for his very innovative Police/Citizen Volunteer program he has instituted here in Town. Neither Chief nor the Council knows of a program quite like this and congratulations to Chief on creating the program, as well as pursuing and receiving the grant to fund it.

Message from the Chief

Shooting and Reward – On July 4, 2008, at approximately 11:00 PM, an unknown assailant fired up to 7 shots from a handgun at Cheverly police officers that were conducting a field interview in the vicinity of the 6300 Blk of Landover Road. The officers and the local youth that they were talking to immediately took cover, and then started a pursuit of the suspect as he fled up between the front and back sets of apartment buildings located there. At that time, the suspect fired 2 more rounds at the officers before sight of the suspect was lost. Fearing for the safety of local residents, the officers did not return fire and showed outstanding constraint in the face of this violent act. Fortunately, no one was injured in this incident. In response to this shooting, the Mayor and Council of Cheverly have provided a \$2,000 cash reward for any information leading to the arrest of this suspect (or related conspirators). Anyone providing such information will be assured confidentiality.

“Cheverly Watch” Program – The Cheverly Police department recently obtained a \$12,000 grant from the State of Maryland for an innovative radio enhancement program. The grant monies pay for the purchase and installation of an upgraded, more powerful Town radio system, to include a repeater system that boosts the signal generated to the police station and each police vehicle. In addition, the grant pays for twenty (20) new portable radios and accompanying desk chargers that are also compatible with the Town radio system. The first enhancement will boost the transmission capabilities of the Department and help to eliminate a number of “dead spots” within the Town, thus producing a much clearer signal. The second part is really the gem of the system. The 20 portable radios will be distributed to various residents throughout the Town in any effort to make real-time crime reporting a reality. From the comfort of the homes, residents will be able to talk directly to patrol officers and report suspicious circumstances, crimes in progress, and have access to criminal lookouts contemporaneous to the original event. In addition, these radios can be used to report emergency situations, accidents, and other situations requiring a police or fire department response. Resident participants will be chosen upon central criteria – location of residence or apartment, how often the resident is home, and interest level. Training will accompany the issuance of these radios, to include, basic radio communications skills and etiquette, radio signal codes, general response capabilities, eyewitness identification procedures, police radio rules and regulations, and confidentiality. Participants will be strictly volunteers, must pass a routine background check, and must be willing to participate on a regular basis. Information on participants shall remain strictly confidential. Anyone interested should immediately contact the Department at (301) 341-1055.

Cheverly Public Safety Day – In lieu of the Department’s regular participation in National Night Out, the Cheverly Police Department will be sponsoring its first **Public Safety Day on Monday, September 22, 2008, from 6:00 PM to 8:30 PM.** Outback Steakhouse will continue to be the major corporate sponsor, but other sponsors are participating as well. In addition, officers from various local police and fire departments will be on hand with a number of displays and exhibits. The theme of this year’s PSD is “local unity.” Please come and bring your appetite with you. More news to follow!

Theft From Autos – Theft from auto crimes around Town continue to be the number one criminal incident type. While some may be the result of an attempt to steal the vehicle first, the vast majority are brought on by the easy observation of valuables left in plain view within the vehicle. Recent theft reports have listed televisions, installed and portable radios, Ipods, jewelry, and currency as items stolen. Please, please make every effort to secure all valuables in your trunk or glovebox, or take them with you into your house when leaving your vehicle.

Vehicle Donations – You can donate your used vehicle to the Town of Cheverly and receive the same tax ramifications as any other charity. Solicitors – In lieu of the recent incidents and arrests for soliciting without a permit (i.e., Platinum Security), all residents are encouraged to call the police whenever a solicitor confronts them. Solicitors in Cheverly are required to display a permit issued by the Town (rarely are such permits issued) and they are required to leave private property immediately when told to do so by a homeowner.

HAZARDOUS WASTE DUMPING

(paint, computers, oils, etc.) **Thursday, Friday & Saturday** 7:30AM - 4:00PM for County residents at the **Brown Station Road Landfill**, 11611 White House Road, Upper Marlboro. They take **Household Hazardous Waste (301-883-5045)**, and up to 5 tires per year. This is also an electronics recycle site (computers). No Commercial Vehicles.

Free residential dumping days have changed.

Free Disposal Days are now - Mon-Sat. 7:30 - 3:30. **CLOSED SUNDAY.**

Yard Waste - is accepted Saturdays ONLY.

There is a fee for brush and yard waste disposal .

Yard Waste is not accepted Monday-Friday.

SPECIAL TRASH VS. YARD WASTE

Once again, there seems to be a misunderstanding when it comes to special trash versus yard waste collection.

Special trash is furniture, rugs, lamps, etc. These items are picked up on Thursday and Friday **ONLY**. 3-4 items are collected per special trash day. Please remember that cans over 32 gallon are **NOT ACCEPTABLE**. **Empty** Latex Paint Cans are acceptable, Oil based Paint cans are **NOT ACCEPTABLE**.

Yard Waste is anything that **GROWS** in your yard. This would include, grass, leaves, tree limbs, sticks, branches, etc. These items are picked up **ONLY** on Monday.

The Public Works Department is on a schedule during the week; trash collection, recycling and yard waste. When residents do not adhere to these collection days, the town's appearance suffers. If you have questions about what is collected on which side or what day, please call the Public Works Department.

We are here to serve you.

We still have MULCH Public Works has fine grade mulch, ground from leaves and yard waste brush, etc. **Contact the PUBLIC WORKS OFFICE to schedule a mulch delivery.** They are open Monday-Friday from **7:30AM to 4:00PM**. **The fee is \$20 per delivery.** **The Maximum for one delivery is two (2) scoops of the bulldozer.** If you have any questions call **301-773-2666**.

Public Works will keep a large mound of the mulch at the Town Park parking lot (near the ballfields) for residents to help themselves.

Public Works can only deliver mulch where there is a driveway or a safe place to back their dump truck and tip the load on the lawn.

REMINDER: If you leave mulch on the lawn for very long—it will kill the grass beneath.



TAMING THE "TIGER"

Summer is here and so is the "Asian Tiger". **REMINDER:**

Check your yard for ANY containers that can hold water. Even the smallest amount of standing water (1 Tbsp.) can serve as a breeding site for the tiger mosquito. The 'Tiger' lays its eggs in these sites and they hatch within a few days of being flooded. Even small containers such as drinking cups can produce mosquitoes.

Spray sheltered areas in your yard with an insecticide labeled for adult mosquitoes.
