Message from the Mayor

I would also like to congratulate our new Council. Whether new or returning, it is a sacrifice to serve, and the community is grateful for the Council's efforts.

As we know, June is always a busy month. CAACO will be hosting events for Juneteenth. What is Juneteenth? Juneteenth is now a federal holiday in the United States commemorating the emancipation of enslaved African Americans. It is also often observed to celebrate Black culture. Originating in Galveston, Texas, it has been celebrated annually throughout the United States. The Fourth Ward Civic Association started celebrating Juneteenth formally in Cheverly and CAACO has taken events to new heights with presentations from the Buffalo soldiers and other notable groups. Of course, June is also Pride Month. Riots and spontaneous demonstrations by members of the gay community in response to a police raid that began in the early morning hours of June 28, 1969, at the Stonewall Inn in the Greenwich Village neighborhood of Lower Manhattan in New York City are often seen as the catalyst for the creation of Pride Month. Pride Month was created to commemorate the continued work of equal justice for the LGBTQ community and celebrates the accomplishments of LGBTQ individuals. The event that catalyzed the gay rights movement occurred June 28, 1969, at the Stonewall Inn in New York City.

As I travel throughout Maryland for work, I see more and more counties and municipalities celebrating Pride; some for the first time in history. Be sure to join us for the flag-raising and proclamation reading here in town. And check out other local celebrations as well.

There are several awareness months celebrated in June — though the five that often get the most attention include LGBTQ+ Pride Month, Men's Health Awareness Month, Gun Violence Awareness Month, Alzheimer's Awareness Month, and Immigrant Heritage Month. Try to see if you can bring awareness to all these issues in little ways if possible. I know I will be harassing the men in my life to go to the doctor for

RESIDENTIAL BUSINESS LICENSES


If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a Town Residential Business License.




Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George’s County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

The yearly business license fee is \$20.

CODE COMPLIANCE

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

GRASS, WEEDS AND OVERGROWTH



Obstructions:

1. Residents are reminded that with the nice weather more and more residents are out walking. Please keep the walkways and sidewalks clear of overgrowth, obstructions and hanging limbs.
2. If the tree obstructing the sidewalk or roadway is in the planting box, please contact the Department of Public Works.

3. Keep vegetation from obstructing the view near intersections.

Lot Maintenance:

1. Residents are reminded to make sure your grass is cut before it reaches 8 inches in height.
2. Also, the planting strip between the sidewalk and the street is your responsibility to maintain
3. If you are going on vacation, make sure you make arrangements to have your grass cut for you.

Be sure to take into consideration that the weather can be unpredictable, but the grass still needs to be cut.

SIDEWALK AND ROAD OVERGROWTH

Spring is here and the days are getting nice. With the nice weather, and rising gas prices, more and more residents are out walking. Whether they are out for a weekend stroll or headed down to the Metro for a train ride to work, they are using our sidewalks and walking paths.

The warmer weather also marks the start of the growing season. As trees and other vegetation grow, they tend to encroach upon the public right-of-way (sidewalks, streets, or alleys). This overgrowth of vegetation or low hanging branches can obstruct view, creates tripping hazards or otherwise impede the public's ability to use the streets and sidewalks. This encroachment has been deemed a public nuisance in the Town Code and constitutes a hazard, which impedes the free movement of pedestrians or vehicles. As such, residents are required to ensure that public right-of-way abutting their property are kept free of overgrowth and intersections are obstruction free.

Trees located within the first (11) feet of the curb are the responsibility of the Town. Please call if you have a question or notice any condition that may pose a hazard to the community.

CODE COMPLIANCE

RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING



2023 Residential ZONE parking permits will be available December 15th. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle. There is a maximum of 2 guest passes per residence. The first guest pass is free and the second guest pass may be obtained for \$2 fee. (Note:

ONLY two guest passes per address.)

Applications can be downloaded from the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov under the Form and File tab.

Please drop completed applications in the Permits Box located at Town Hall or mail to: Code Enforcement, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785.



Cheverly Residential Zone Parking Permit Application

Applications can be submitted at Town Hall, online, via US Mail, or placed in the permit box located on the left-side wall of the main entrance at Townhall

- Permits can only be issued to vehicles registered to a Cheverly address
- A copy of your vehicle registration must accompany the application
- Cost of the Permit is \$5 per vehicle | 1 guest parking pass is allowed **per address** at no cost
- The maximum number of guest passes is 2 per address. This includes one free pass and ONE guest for a \$2 fee.

If you live in one of the following areas, you will need a Parking Permit: Please check the zone that applies.

- Zone 1: State St, 61st & 62nd Ave, as well as the 1800 block of 64th Ave
- Zone 3: 22-2400 block of Cheverly Avenue
- Zone 4: Arbor Street & Crestlawn Avenue (22-2300 block Parkway Eliminated)
- Zone 5: 2300 block of Belleview Avenue
- Zone 6: Benton Rd & 23-25 Lake Avenue
- Zone 7: 2400 block of Valley Way
- Zone 8: 3300 Belleview Avenue; Medical Terrace (Eliminated)
- RO: 6500 & 6600 blocks Oak Street, 6500 block Maureen Court, 3132 & 3200 block Hillside Avenue
- SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to park on the odd side of the 2200 block of Cheverly Avenue in order to utilize the METRO



- Residential Parking Permits are to be displayed on the back Left Bumper area.
- If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.
- Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.
- Citation may be Issued to ANY Vehicle not in compliance with Town Code 27-5.1 Residential Zone Parking
- If you have any questions, please contact the Office of Code Compliance at 240-770-7647

They will be picked up on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.**

Please help the Public Works crew out by not parking in front of the yard waste, trash, recycling, and bulk trash. The picture shows how difficult it can be for the crew when there's a vehicle parked.

TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION

Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov, complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will not be deposited until after the inspection report is completed.

Message from the Chief

Home Improvement Scammers

This month I would like to mention a long-standing problem in every community I have policed, commonly known as “Home improvement Scammers.” This is the busy time of the year for scammers as they begin to target unsuspecting folks, seeking odd jobs or projects around your home. Scammers targeting homes may start with a knock on the door or a mobile phone call, a flyer, or an advertisement. The contractor may offer a low price and/or a short completion time frame. Another common hook is when the scammer claims to be working in your neighborhood on another project and has left behind supplies. Driveway seal coating is the most prevalent home improvement scam. Each year, unlicensed home improvement contractors defraud Maryland, homeowners of millions of dollars, by cheating and stealing.

Here are a few tips to help prevent you from being scammed:

- Watch Out for Red Flags – Contractor claims no Maryland Home Improvement License is Required.
- Be aware of existing laws such as Maryland Code 8-101 – a person may not act or offer to act as a contractor in Maryland for home improvement work unless the person has a home improvement license, and they may not sell, or offer to sell a home improvement unless the person has a home improvement license or salesperson license.
- Ask to see a Maryland Home Improvement License (check Maryland.Gov website - Home Improvement Scams and Home Improvement Commission site)
- Before hiring any home improvement contractor, contact the MARYLAND Home Improvement Commission to ensure the contractor is licensed. To verify a license, call Maryland Home Improvement Commission at (410) 230-6309 Monday-Friday 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM.
- Elderly homeowners are the favorite targets of unlicensed contractors.
- As a rule of thumb, if the proposed work and price

do not sound right, it probably isn’t legitimate.

- Ask for references
- Favorite Scams: extra material, working in the area and mentioning a special price, the job is much bigger than originally agreed upon; need extra money, if you pay cash a special price, and charging for new material – despite installing used or stolen materials.

CHEVERLY POLICE DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Cheverly Police Department Announcements will highlight positive and internal events, concerns, and issues. We believe for our department to be successful in improving safety and the quality of life in Cheverly, we must work together to address issues directly.

Speed Management Ordinance

The Cheverly Town Council overwhelmingly approved a Cheverly-specific Speed Management Ordinance that will allow an opportunity for speed management devices along State Route 202 and County Road Columbia Park Road. The Speed management devices will be installed after approval from both regulated government entities. We anticipate and hope to have proven traffic safety devices in place within the next two to three months.

Parking at /Near Cheverly Station Apartments

The Cheverly Police Department along with Cheverly Code Enforcement has and will continue to monitor/enforce both state laws and Town codes/ordinances. CPD will continue to patrol the area and take appropriate enforcement action.

Partnership with Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority

Cheverly Police Department reached an agreement with Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority to provide force multiplier uniform high-visibility deterrent/protection at the Cheverly Metro Station during rush hour operations. CPD has been working at the Cheverly Metro since March 2023 and will continue until at least June 2023.

Both WMATA -Police and Cheverly Police Department will assess and determine whether to continue this joint public safety initiative, very soon.

Hiring

CPD hired two recruits/candidates attending Prince Georges County Municipal Academy with an anticipated graduation date in November 2023 (Candidate Maria Bernal and Candidate Hytham Gabala).

Recruitment

Cheverly Police Department is partnering with XXX for the upcoming Juneteenth Celebration. We will have a Recruiting table at the event. The FY-24 Cheverly budget allows for an increased workforce. Please help recruit/retain both sworn and civilian members for the Cheverly Police Department. We currently have X positions open.

Officer Training

ture Committee is working on projects in education, planning, and research.

The Cheverly Green Infrastructure Plan

It must be Spring, because a little bird has told me that not everyone in Cheverly knows that the town has a Green Infrastructure Plan. Heck, yes, we do have a Green Infrastructure Plan, and a Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee to help implement it. The Cheverly Green Infrastructure Plan, adopted by the Town of Cheverly in 2011, designates a network of natural area hubs and potential corridors connecting them. The plan establishes a framework for managing the individual natural areas. It makes recommendations related to water, vegetation, wildlife, and land use. The plan envisions acquisition of land to connect and extend the natural areas.

Where can you see the Cheverly Green Plan at work? Just look around. Following one of the plan's recommendations, the town has a plan to increase street tree canopy. The town now has a consulting arborist. Yup, another Green Plan recommendation. Do you host a Purple Air quality monitor? The Green plan envisions an air quality monitoring network.

Have you added native plants to your garden? The Green Plan makes that recommendation as well. Maybe you have taken advantage of the town's tree planting program. The trees available are mostly local natives, following the Green Plan recommendation to give preference to natives.

Where can you find the text of the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Plan? Just head over to www.greencheverly.org to read both the long version and the executive summary. Right there on the same site you will find practical hints about rain gardens, native plants, even listings of Life in Cheverly – plants, birds, and other animals.

Hello, passionate plant people! We love seeing your enthusiasm for native plants and hope that you'll continue to stock your garden with these pollinator-attracting, hearty, and beautiful species!

It's time again for our annual 2-for-1 Trade in which we give away two gorgeous native shrubs in exchange for residents removing one invasive one from their yards. We are currently signing people up for our waitlist: <http://tiny.cc/nativeplants>.

We will officially open up registration for the **2-for-1 Trade** in June/July and the shrubs will be available for pickup in September.

The list of invasives eligible for the program include Honeysuckle bush, Nandina, Barberry, Rose of Sharon, Burning bush, Butterfly bush, Privet, Multiflora rose, and Wineberry. Have a question about another invasive shrub? Ask us or check out one of the plant identification apps, like iNaturalist.

Please keep in mind:

- Only two free shrubs per home regardless of how many invasives are removed
- Invasive shrubs must be removed and disposed of in the trash (i.e., don't give it to a friend and do not put it out with yard waste, where it will be ground into mulch that can spread the seeds to other yards)
- Have any questions, reach out to us!


