
If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a Town Residential Business License.




Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George’s County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.



Note: Bulk Trash is limited to 3 items and only on the days listed above.

Public works crews start pick ups at 7:30 AM. Regular Trash, Bulk Trash, Yard Waste and Recycling need to be at the curb before 7AM. Yard Waste and Recycling should not be put in plastic trash bags. **Electronics will no longer be picked up with Recycling on Wednesdays. They will be picked on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.**

Please help the Public Works crew out by not parking in front of the yard waste, trash, recycling, and bulk trash. The picture shows how difficult it can be for the crew when there's a vehicle parked.

Curbside Recycling: 37.23 TNS (\$27/TN) = \$ 1,005.21

Yard Waste: 102.99 TNS (\$25/TN) = \$ 2,574.75

MAKE SURE THAT THE BROKEN CAN/BIN IS ALL PLASTIC WITH NO METAL PARTS AND THAT IT IS CLEARLY LABELED WITH A SIGN SAYING "DISPOSE OF BIN OR CAN." THEN PUT IT AT THE CURB FOR PICKUP.

TREE EVALUATION PROGRAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS

Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?



To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov, complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form, and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will be cashed upon receipt.

TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION

Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

TOWN OF CHEVERLY NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF CHARTER AMENDMENT CAR-1-24 REDISTRICTING

On May 9, 2024, the Council of The Mayor and Town Council of Cheverly (the “Town”) voted on Charter Amendment CAR-1-24 § C-6(A) of the charter adopted pursuant to the authority of Article XI-E of the Constitution of Maryland § 4-304 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition, as amended), to modify town boundaries pursuant to the most recent census data.

CHARTER AMENDMENT CAR-1-24§ C-6(A) OF THE CHARTER ADOPTED PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY OF ARTICLE XI-E OF THE CONSTITUTION OF MARYLAND § 4-304 OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND (1957 EDITION, AS AMENDED), TO MODIFY TOWN BOUNDARIES PURSUANT TO THE MOST RECENT CENSUS DATA.

A Charter Resolution of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Cheverly adopted pursuant to the authority of Article XI-E of the Constitution of Maryland and §4-301 *et-seq.*, Local Government Article, Annotated Code of Maryland as amended.

The charter amendment shall be and become effective on Friday, June 28, 2024 (50 days), unless a proper petition for a referendum hereon shall be filed by Tuesday, June 18, 2024 (40 days), and a fair summary of the Amendment shall be posted at Town Hall for forty days following its adoption.

PARKING COMPLIANCE

According to Code Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5



Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

SIDEWALK AND ROAD OVERGROWTH

Spring is here and the days are getting nice. With the nice weather and rising gas prices, more and more residents are out walking. Whether they are out for a weekend stroll or headed down to the Metro for a train ride to work, they are using our sidewalks and walking paths.

The warmer weather also marks the start of the growing season. As trees and other vegetation grow, they tend to encroach upon the public right-of-way (sidewalks, streets, or alleys). This overgrowth of vegetation or low hanging branches can obstruct view, creates tripping hazards or otherwise impede the public's ability to use the streets and sidewalks. This encroachment has been deemed a public nuisance in the Town Code and constitutes a hazard, which impedes the free movement of pedestrians or vehicles. As such, residents are required to ensure that public right-of-way abutting their property are kept free of overgrowth and intersections are obstruction free.

Trees located within the first (11) feet of the curb are the responsibility of the Town. Please call if you have a question or notice any condition that may pose a hazard to the community.

GRASS, WEEDS AND OVERGROWTH



Obstructions:

1. Residents are reminded that with the nice weather more and more residents are out walking. Please

keep the walkways and sidewalks clear of overgrowth, obstructions, and hanging limbs.

2. If the tree obstructing the sidewalk or roadway is in the planting box, please contact the Department of Public Works.
3. Keep vegetation from obstructing the view near intersections.

Lot Maintenance:

1. Residents are reminded to make sure your grass is cut before it reaches 8 inches in height.
2. Also, the planting strip between the sidewalk and the street is your responsibility to maintain
3. If you are going on vacation, make sure you make arrangements to have your grass cut for you.

Be sure to take into consideration that the weather can be unpredictable, but the grass still needs to be cut.

REMINDERS FOR SPECIAL EVENT NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTY

1. **Canvas everyone in the neighborhood to find a date that works best.** Visit each neighbor to inform them of your plans and get feedback from them at least before you are tentatively scheduled to host the event. Complete a block party survey. Keep your neighbors informed as the event date approaches and make sure they understand they are a part of celebration. A block party letter and neighbor survey can be obtained at the Town office.
2. **Obtain necessary permits if you block off your street.** Permits must be obtained 30 days in advance for block parties. A Block Party Permit is required to block off any of a residential street for neighborhood block party purposes,
3. **Remind your neighbors 1 week before the party that the street will be closed.** It is important to keep your neighbors informed.
4. **Place the "No Parking" signs 24-48 hours prior to the party at each end of the street with the date and time of the street closure.** Town Hall can supply "No Parking" signs once the event is permitted.
5. **We recommend that you communicate with your neighbors a week prior to the Block Party.** Communicating with your neighbors help to ensure all are notified and remember not to park on the street.
6. Your street must be clean and open to traffic no later than 10 PM.

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of

Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00.

Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.



RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING

2024 Residential ZONE parking permits are available. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle. There is a maximum of two guest passes per residence.

The first guest pass is free and the second guest pass may be obtained for a \$2 fee. (Note: ONLY two guest passes per address.)

Applications can be downloaded from the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov under the Form and File tab.

Please drop completed applications in the Permits Box located at Town Hall or mail to: Code Enforcement, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785.

CODE COMPLIANCE



Cheverly Residential Zone Parking Permit Application

Applications can be submitted at Town Hall, online, via US Mail, or placed in the permit box located on the left-side wall of the main entrance at Townhall

- Permits can only be issued to vehicles registered to a Cheverly address
- A copy of your vehicle registration must accompany the application
- Cost of the Permit is \$5 per vehicle | 1 guest parking pass is allowed **per address** at no cost
- The maximum number of guest passes is 2 per address. This includes one free pass and ONE guest for a \$2 fee.

UPCOMING DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS – ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

4711 Lydell Road, Kenilworth Industrial Park. The owner plans a warehouse on the northern half of the lot, replacing existing trees with new native species landscaping. Stormwater management will be an underground structure, with excess seepage directed into Tributary 1. The southern portion of the lot was clear cut in 2010. The county Planning Department is investigating whether the tree removal was permitted. The Preliminary Plan of Subdivision will be heard by the county Planning Board on June 6th.

4801 Viewpoint Place, Industrial Park. Tree cover has increased since 1984. The owners plan to add paving to the existing parking/storage area, removing about 77% of the trees. Stormwater management will include a bioretention area and underground structure. The Site Development Concept Plan, submitted to DPIE, is under review with no public input.

Both plans follow the requirement of 10% tree cover on industrial property. The Cheverly Green Infrastructure Plan recommends 25% by 2035.

5801 Annapolis Road, zoned commercial, general, office. 31 townhouses are proposed. What is the best use of the property? What may we expect of the new project? Native plantings, EV chargers, solar roofs? A Preliminary Plan of Subdivision will be submitted to the county Planning Department and a neighborhood meeting scheduled for May 17, 2024. – *Report May 10, 2024*

COMMUNITY NATIVE PLANTING PROJECT

National Pollinator Week is June 17-23 this year, so why not celebrate all month long – or even all year? After all, one out of every three bites of food is thanks to pollinators! They are central to our ecosystem, over 75% of flowering plants depend on pollinators, AND they aren't just bees. They include a bunch of cuties, like birds, bats, butterflies, moths, beetles, small mammals, and more!


There are so many easy ways to support pollinators. Our top five favorites are:

1. Plant native plants! They are hosts for - and food sources to - a slew of pollinators.
2. Don't use mosquito spraying companies. There is no such thing as a "mosquito-cide" and the chemicals kill other insects, butterflies, and even some bigger critters. Use BTI dunks instead.
3. Leave the Leaves, Stems, and Seeds (LESS) in your gardens during the fall and winter. LESS is More Habitat!
4. Remove invasive plants! These crowd out the natives – and some even attract the bugs you don't want, like mosquitos and ticks.
5. Volunteer with CNPP! All we do is for the pollinators.

This Summer Enjoy Our Trees and Green Space

This Father's Day go for a walk in the woods. On the Woodworth Park Trail. Or check out Red Maple Run (at the corner of Joslyn Place and 63rd Place), the Kilmer Street Arboretum and, of course, Boyd Park.

These natural areas all have new trees thanks to the efforts of Friends of Lower Beaverdam Creek (FLBC) and partners.

Cheverly's green hubs and connecting corridors – key parts of Cheverly's Green Infrastructure Plan -- help make this a soothing and livable community within this highly developed major metropolitan area. The shade and cooler microclimates provide relief from the heat-absorbing concrete and asphalt covering so much of the area. And the natural landscaping and the growing number of rain gardens and pervious walks and driveways are increasingly important to reduce stormwater runoff and flooding, and for wildlife.

In the past two years, 164 trees have been planted in Cheverly by the GreenWorks team at Joe's Movement Emporium and their partner Casey Trees, including 60 street trees. FLBC had a major hand in funding and organizing these efforts worth nearly \$40,000, and coordinating with the town and its arborist. These trees are in addition to the Town's admirable planting and tree care efforts in recent years.

Now, water your young trees -- and all those new native shrubs and plants from CNPP and the Garden


