#### Write-In Candidates:

Anyone who missed the petitioning deadline still has the opportunity to run as a certified write-in candidate. Application forms to file as a write-in candidate for mayor or council may be obtained at Town Hall or downloaded from the Town's website.

The submission deadline for this application is 5 pm on **Friday, May 2, 2025.**

#### Information for Voters

To be eligible to vote in the Town election, you must be **registered to vote** with either Maryland or the Town of Cheverly:

1. Register to vote with the state of Maryland **before April 4, 2025**. Already registered? Make sure your registration reflects your current Cheverly address: [voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/votersearch](http://voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/votersearch)
2. Register to vote with the Town of Cheverly. This option is available to any Town resident who cannot or has not registered in Maryland (examples: non-US citizens or

active military with legal residence in another state) and who meets the eligibility requirements. Register to vote at Town Hall during business hours on any weekday up to and including Election Day or at an upcoming Voter Registration Drive.

#### Voter Registration Drives

If you are at least 16 years old and a Cheverly resident for at least 30 days as of election day, you may be eligible to register to vote with the Town. Come to Town Hall, 6401 Forest Road, during business hours or at the events listed below. Bring a photo ID and proof of residence.

**April 7, 6:30 pm – 8:30 pm**

**April 26, 8 am - 12 pm and 1 – 5 pm**

#### Mail-In Voting



Any registered voter may **request a ballot to be mailed to them** or to be picked up in-person at Town Hall if they choose not to vote in person. The form can be found in this newsletter, in hard-copy at Town Hall, on the Town's website, or you use the QR code here to fill out and submit the form online.

**The deadline to request a mail-in ballot is April 28, 2025.**




## TREE EVALUATION PROGRAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS




**Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?**

To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at [www.cheverly-md.gov](http://www.cheverly-md.gov), complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form, and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will be cashed upon receipt.

## TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION

Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

\*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.



## CODE COMPLIANCE

### PARKING COMPLIANCE

According to Code Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5



Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

### REMINDERS FOR SPECIAL EVENT NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTY

- 1. Canvas everyone in the neighborhood to find a date that works best.** Visit each neighbor to inform them of your plans and get feedback from them at least before you are tentatively scheduled to host the event. Complete a block party survey. Keep your neighbors informed as the event date approaches and make sure they understand they are a part of celebration. A block party letter and neighbor survey can be obtained at the Town office.
- 2. Obtain necessary permits if you block off your street.** Permits must be obtained 30 days in advance for block parties. A Block Party Permit is required to block off any of a residential street for neighborhood block party purposes
- 3. Remind your neighbors 1 week before the party that the street will be closed.** It is important to keep your neighbors informed.
- 4. Place the “No Parking” signs 24-48 hours prior to the party at each end of the street with the date and time of the street closure.** Town Hall can supply “No Parking” signs once the event is permitted.

- 5. We recommend that you communicate with your neighbors a week prior to the Block Party.** Communicating with your neighbors help to ensure all are notified and remember not to park on the street.
- 6. Your street must be clean and open to traffic no later than 10 PM.**

### SIDEWALK AND ROAD OVERGROWTH

Spring is here and the days are getting nice. With the nice weather, and rising gas prices, more and more residents are out walking. Whether they are out for a weekend stroll or headed down to the Metro for a train ride to work, they are using our sidewalks and walking paths.

The warmer weather also marks the start of the growing season. As trees and other vegetation grow, they tend to encroach upon the public right-of-way (sidewalks, streets, or alleys). This overgrowth of vegetation or low hanging branches can obstruct view, creates tripping hazards or otherwise impede the public's ability to use the streets and sidewalks. This encroachment has been deemed a public nuisance in the Town Code and constitutes a hazard, which impedes the free movement of pedestrians or vehicles. As such, residents are required to ensure that public right-of-way abutting their property are kept free of overgrowth and intersections are obstruction free.

Trees located within the first (11) feet of the curb are the responsibility of the Town. Please call if you have a question or notice any condition that may pose a hazard to the community.

## VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

## OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

## SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of

Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

## CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00.

**Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.**



## RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING

2024 Residential ZONE parking permits are available. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle. There is a maximum of two guest passes per residence.

The first guest pass is free and the second guest pass may be obtained for a \$2 fee. (Note: ONLY two guest passes per address.)

- RO: 6500 & 6600 blocks Oak Street, 6500 block Maureen Court, 3132 & 3200 block Hillside Avenue
- SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to park on the odd side of the 2200 block of Cheverly Avenue in order to utilize the METRO



- Residential Parking Permits are to be displayed on the back Left Bumper area.
- If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.
- Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.
- Citation may be Issued to ANY Vehicle not in compliance with Town Code 27-5.1 Residential Zone Parking



## **GREEN @ HOME – ENGLISH IVY, AN AGGRESSIVE INVADER**

English Ivy has been widely used as an ornamental plant and ground cover. In fact it is an aggressive invader that threatens our forests and open areas. It grows along the ground and into the forest canopy. Vines grow up the tree trunks and spread out into the branches. They block the sunlight from reaching the tree's own leaves. Without that energy the tree will die. The added weight of the vines also makes trees susceptible to blowing over during storms. Among the many benefits of a healthy forest is this – a healthy forest is the best form of stormwater management.

Volunteer groups and individuals in Cheverly have been working for many years on removing English Ivy and other invasive vines from our natural areas and our own yards.

We will soon get help from a Clean Water Partnership project to remove invasive vines in the woods of



## FRIENDS OF LOWER BEVERDAM CREEK (FLBC)

### **Meadow plantings and cleanups, but first the Bottle Bill!**

Single use beverage containers, especially plastic bottles, are a large portion of the litter and trash along the roadways around Cheverly and much of the county. They are also a major scourge for our waterways from Quincy Run and Lower Beaverdam Creek to the Anacostia and Potomac Rivers, and the Chesapeake Bay.

Despite ambitious recycling programs, *less than a quarter* of the 5.5 billion beverage containers purchased each year in Maryland are recycled. Yes, more than 4 BILLION of these containers end up on roadsides, in waterways, in landfills or incinerators each year. We could change this dramatically with a Bottle Deposit Program, which after years of effort is within reach in Annapolis. But industry lobbyists are making an all-out effort to defeat this sensible consumer-friendly measure. Voices of those fed up with litter, trash and waste are needed to push passage NOW before the legislature adjourns Monday, April 7 at midnight.
