Message from the Mayor

Happy June, Cheverly! Last month, you elected a new Mayor and Town Council, and we are humbled by your trust and confidence. Congratulations to Council Members Garces, Fry, Bryner, Wade, Legloahec, and Tansey on your election! Your mayor and council were sworn in on May 8 and elected Ward 3 CM Nicole Bryner as our Vice Mayor. I want to thank Mayor Munyeneh and CM Dalaker for their dedicated service to our community.



By the time you read this, I hope we can celebrate a successful Public Safety Day on May 30th (thank you police department and volunteers!) and a wildly entertaining Rec Council pickleball tournament on May 31st!

At the Town Meeting on Thursday, June 12th, at 8pm, your mayor and council will adopt the Fiscal Year 2026 Town Budget including the property tax rate and the capital improvement plan. The budget ordinance is available on the website and was discussed at two meetings in May. We're currently projecting a \$400K deficit (about 2.8%) and we're not planning to raise property tax rates (0.005799). If your phased-in assessment for 2026 is \$450K, you'll pay Cheverly about \$2,610. Please join us June 12th and share your concerns! The fiscal year starts July 1st.




RESIDENTIAL BUSINESS LICENSES

If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a Town Residential Business License.



Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George’s County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

The yearly business license fee is \$20.

CARING FOR CHEVERLY EAST PARK'S FOREST

Starting in spring 2025, the Clean Water Partnership will begin removing invasive plants from the forested areas around Red Maple Run in M-NCPPC's Cheverly East Park and nearby Town-owned land. This effort supports the recent Red Maple Run stream restoration project and is focused on protecting the native oak canopy along the stream and throughout the park's wooded areas. Work will be limited to forested sections of the park. No invasive species management will take place near the playground or play equipment.

This two-year effort is supported in part by a National Fish and Wildlife Foundation Chesapeake Bay Program Small Watershed Grant.

Note: Bulk Trash is limited to 3 items and only on the days listed above.

Public works crews start pick ups at 7:30 AM. Regular Trash, Bulk Trash, Yard Waste and Recycling need to be at the curb before 7AM. Yard Waste and Recycling should not be put in plastic trash bags. **Electronics will no longer be picked up with Recycling on Wednesdays. They will be picked on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.**

Please help the Public Works crew out by **not** parking in front of the yard waste, trash, recycling, and bulk trash. The picture shows how difficult it can be for the crew when there's a vehicle parked.

TREE EVALUATION PROGRAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS




Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?

To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov, complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form, and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will be cashed upon receipt.

TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION

Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

Report Street Light Problems to Pepco

If you are having any problems with street lights (they are out, blinking on and off, etc.) you can contact Pepco directly. Go to www.pepco.com, go to Outages, and click on Report a Street Light Outage. Enter either the address or pole number. A map showing the street lights in the area will appear. Click on the street light you wish to report. You will be directed to enter information about the light and your contact information.

MAKE SURE THAT THE BROKEN CAN/BIN IS ALL PLASTIC WITH NO METAL PARTS AND THAT IT IS CLEARLY LABELED WITH A SIGN SAYING "DISPOSE OF BIN OR CAN." THEN PUT IT AT THE CURB FOR PICKUP.

According to Code Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5



Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

REMINDERS FOR SPECIAL EVENT NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTY

1. **Canvas everyone in the neighborhood to find a date that works best.** Visit each neighbor to inform them of your plans and get feedback from them at least before you are tentatively scheduled to host the event. Complete a block party survey. Keep your neighbors informed as the event date approaches and make sure they understand they are a part of celebration. A block party letter and neighbor survey can be obtained at the Town office.
2. **Obtain necessary permits if you block off your street.** Permits must be obtained 30 days in advance for block parties. A Block Party Permit is required to block off any of a residential street for neighborhood block party purposes
3. **Remind your neighbors 1 week before the party that the street will be closed.** It is important to keep your neighbors informed.
4. **Place the “No Parking” signs 24-48 hours prior to the party at each end of the street with the date and time of the street closure.** Town Hall can supply “No Parking” signs once the event is permitted.

5. **We recommend that you communicate with your neighbors a week prior to the Block Party.** Communicating with your neighbors help to ensure all are notified and remember not to park on the street.
6. **Your street must be clean and open to traffic no later than 10 PM.**

SIDEWALK AND ROAD OVERGROWTH

Spring is here and the days are getting nice. With the nice weather, and rising gas prices, more and more residents are out walking. Whether they are out for a weekend stroll or headed down to the Metro for a train ride to work, they are using our sidewalks and walking paths.

The warmer weather also marks the start of the growing season. As trees and other vegetation grow, they tend to encroach upon the public right-of-way (sidewalks, streets, or alleys). This overgrowth of vegetation or low hanging branches can obstruct view, creates tripping hazards or otherwise impede the public's ability to use the streets and sidewalks. This encroachment has been deemed a public nuisance in the Town Code and constitutes a hazard, which impedes the free movement of pedestrians or vehicles. As such, residents are required to ensure that public right-of-way abutting their property are kept free of overgrowth and intersections are obstruction free.

Trees located within the first (11) feet of the curb are the responsibility of the Town. Please call if you have a question or notice any condition that may pose a hazard to the community.

CODE COMPLIANCE



Cheverly Residential Zone Parking Permit Application

Applications can be submitted at Town Hall, online, via US Mail, or placed in the permit box located on the left-side wall of the main entrance at Townhall

- Permits can only be issued to vehicles registered to a Cheverly address
- A copy of your vehicle registration must accompany the application
- Cost of the Permit is \$5 per vehicle | 1 guest parking pass is allowed **per address** at no cost
- The maximum number of guest passes is 2 per address. This includes one free pass and ONE guest for a \$2 fee.

If you live in one of the following areas, you will need a Parking Permit: Please check the zone that applies.

- Zone 1: State St, 61st & 62nd Ave, as well as the 1800 block of 64th Ave
- Zone 3: 22-2400 block of Cheverly Avenue
- Zone 4: Arbor Street & Crestlawn Avenue (22-2300 block Parkway Eliminated)
- Zone 5: 2300 block of Belleview Avenue
- Zone 6: Benton Rd & 23-25 Lake Avenue
- Zone 7: 2400 block of Valley Way
- Zone 8: 3300 Belleview Avenue; Medical Terrace (Eliminated)
- RO: 6500 & 6600 blocks Oak Street, 6500 block Maureen Court, 3132 & 3200 block Hillside Avenue
- SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to park on the odd side of the 2200 block of Cheverly Avenue in order to utilize the METRO



- Residential Parking Permits are to be displayed on the back Left Bumper area.
- If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.
- Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.
- Citation may be Issued to ANY Vehicle not in compliance with Town Code 27-5.1 Residential Zone Parking
- If you have any questions, please contact the Office of Code Compliance at 240-770-7647

To apply for a Residential Zone Parking Permit by mail, please provide the following information **AND a copy of your *vehicle's registration**. Return this form to Residential Parking at the Town of Cheverly with the payment.

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of

Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00.

Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.



RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING

2025 Residential ZONE parking permits are available. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle. There is a maximum of two guest passes per residence.

The first guest pass is free and the second guest pass may be obtained for a \$2 fee. (Note: ONLY two guest passes per address.)

Applications can be downloaded from the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov under the Form and File tab.

Please drop completed applications in the Permits Box located at Town Hall or mail to: Code Enforcement, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785.

**ORDINANCE 2025-3
BUDGET ORDINANCE
FOR THE 2026 FISCAL YEAR**

An Ordinance whereby the Town of Cheverly adopts a Budget for Fiscal Year 2026 which begins on July 1, 2025, and ends on June 30, 2026.

(Uncodified)

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section C-23A(2) of the Charter of the Town of Cheverly grants to the Mayor and Council the power to appropriate and expend funds for any purpose deemed to be public; and

WHEREAS, each fiscal year of the Town commences on July 1 and ends by the following June 30, pursuant to Section C-32 of the Charter of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Town Council have, prior to each fiscal year, adopted a budget to govern the appropriation and expenditure of funds for the next fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, after numerous discussions and meetings, the Mayor and Town Council have prepared a budget for fiscal year 2026 containing anticipated revenues and proposed appropriations and expenditures for said fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, said budget, as discussed at numerous public meetings by the Mayor and Council, is attached hereto as Exhibit A;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of Cheverly in regular session assembled that the budget for fiscal year 2026 containing anticipated revenues and proposed expenditures of the Town, which budget is attached hereto as Exhibit A, and is hereby incorporated by reference, be and hereby is adopted for the fiscal year 2026 to take effect July 1, 2025, until June 30, 2026.

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this budget shall govern the expenditure of funds by the Town during the fiscal year 2026;

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Mayor and Town Council may, from time to time, during the fiscal year amend this budget by motions made, discussed and carried so long as any action regarding this budget is taken at a public meeting after notice and a public discussion and the amendments to the budget for entire fiscal year do not increase the total expenditures by more than ten percent (10%) of the total expenditures figure appearing on attached Exhibit A;

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall take effect on July 1, 2025; however, provided that a fair summary of the ordinance is published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Town of Cheverly.

Monthly meeting to report progress on Cheverly greening efforts and plan next steps and new initiatives. In implementing the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Plan, your Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee is working on projects in education, planning, and research.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE WOODS?

This Spring, the Clean Water Partnership will begin a two-year project to remove invasive plants from the forested areas around Red Maple Run in M-NCPPC's Cheverly East Park and nearby Cheverly town-owned land. The effort supports the recent Red Maple Run stream restoration project. Laura Connelly of the Low Impact Development Center and Sonya Williams of CISolutions, project manager, presented the project at the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee's May meeting.

The park boasts native oak trees, whose seedlings will be encouraged to add to the population. Removal of invasive vines will help protect the woodland. A healthy forest offers the best stormwater management. Saving the nine-acre park's trees will sequester over 81 tons of carbon to help our climate. Fourteen species of invasive plants have been identified, including Japanese knotweed, porcelain berry, burning bush, vinca and English ivy. Interpretive signs will explain the project and identify the invasive species.

Hand-pulling will be the preferred method of removal. Vines will not be pulled from the trees, but after cutting will be allowed to dry and fall on their own. Any necessary herbicide application will be directed at leaves, not sprayed into the air. Signs will be posted before and following any herbicide application. There will be no herbicides applied at the play area.

The project is intended to complement the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Plan and the Greater Cheverly Sector Plan. It is considered a pilot for habitat enhancement as part of CWP projects.
