Happy July, Cheverly! I'm holding Mayor's Hours on:

- Saturday, July 5, from 9:30 am to 11:00 am at the Tucker Pavilion and on Zoom during the Community Market.
- Wednesday, July 23, from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm at Town Hall and on Zoom. Both sessions will include ASL interpretation.

In June, your Mayor and the Council adopted a budget for FY26 that projects \$14.147 million in revenue and \$14.531 million in expenses, leading to a deficit of \$384K. I anticipate that we'll finish FY25 with about \$5.25 million in the bank. If we actually end up with a budget deficit for FY26 of approximately \$384 million, our unrestricted fund balance would be around \$4.86 million at the end of FY26.

Property tax rates remained the same in FY26 as in FY25 – \$0.005799 per \$100 of assessed value for individual residential properties and \$0.0075 per \$100 of assessed value for multi-unit apartment buildings. You may still end up paying the Town more in property taxes in FY26 than you did in FY25 because your home's County assessment is rising. For example, if the County assessed your home at \$400,000 for FY26, you'll pay Cheverly \$2,319 in property taxes. But, if your home was assessed at \$390,000 for FY25, you'll pay the Town about \$58 more in FY26 than you paid in FY25. You can find FY26 and recent Town Budgets on the website (www.cheverly-md.gov) under Government / Town Charter and Code / Budgets.

The Mayor and Council will meet on July 10, July 24, and July 31. We'll discuss Keller Construction finishing the Eley Building, WMATA and SHA, changes to the Ethics code, the Green Infrastructure Committee, Cheverly Day budget, election supervisors and rules, and public education in Cheverly, including the Hoyer building. Stay tuned to Town announcements for schedules and agendas.

The Eley Building, your multi-million-dollar replacement for the public works facility, that will include better and more meeting space for community group use, will open for public and Town government use soon, hopefully in August. Please join us next to the Town Park ballfields for the ribbon-cutting and celebration, date and time to be determined. Watch this space for info on how community groups can reserve meeting space in the Eley Building.

We expect any day now to receive the Preliminary Plan of Subdivision (PPS) for Cheverly Hill (a.k.a. Hospital Hill) and the Council will respond to Park and Planning by that deadline (probably 30 days) with Town feedback. I hope that we can have a public discussion of the PPS, but either way, please be in touch with your Council Member and me – before and after the PPS is released – about what you want to see on

I want to address rumors that your police department cooperates with federal law enforcement on immigration. Let me be absolutely clear – Cheverly Police do not cooperate with ICE. Cheverly Police follow state and local law, which prohibit them from enforcing federal immigration law. Our sole focus, 24/7, is protecting Cheverly residents, their homes, and their property, regardless of immigration status. Furthermore, Chapter 28 of the Town Code, your Non-Intervention statute, remains controlling Town law;

the Town has no intention of modifying that statute and will defend that statute as necessary.





Neighbors,

Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George’s County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

CARING FOR CHEVERLY EAST PARK'S FOREST

Starting in spring 2025, the Clean Water Partnership will begin removing invasive plants from the forested areas around Red Maple Run in M-NCPPC's Cheverly East Park and nearby Town-owned land. This effort supports the recent Red Maple Run stream restoration project and is focused on protecting the native oak canopy along the stream and throughout the park's wooded areas. Work will be limited to forested sections of the park. No invasive species management will take place near the playground or play equipment.

This two-year effort is supported in part by a National Fish and Wildlife Foundation Chesapeake Bay Program Small Watershed Grant.

Yard Waste and Recycling should not be put in plastic trash bags. **Electronics will no longer be picked up with Recycling on Wednesdays. They will be picked on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.**

Please help the Public Works crew out by **not** parking in front of the yard waste, trash, recycling, and bulk trash. The picture shows how difficult it can be for the crew when there's a vehicle parked.

TREE EVALUATION PROGRAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS




Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?

To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov, complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form, and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will be cashed upon receipt.

TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION

Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

Report Street Light Problems to Pepco

If you are having any problems with street lights (they are out, blinking on and off, etc.) you can contact Pepco directly. Click on the street light you wish to report. You will be directed to enter information about the light and your contact information.

Message from the Chief and Assistant Chief of Police

The Cheverly Police Department would like to extend our sincere thanks to the community for the incredible turnout at our recent **Public Safety Day**. Your enthusiastic participation and continued support make events like this possible and truly successful.

Important Reminders:

To help prevent thefts and other crimes in our community, we urge all residents to stay vigilant and report any suspicious or unusual activity. Please remember to **lock your vehicles, homes, sheds, and garages** to help deter theft.

If you require police assistance, **call 911**, identify yourself as a **Cheverly resident**, and request a **Cheverly officer** respond. The Cheverly Police Department is committed to delivering a level of service that exceeds expectations. Your awareness and prompt reporting can make a significant difference in keeping Cheverly safe. **If you see or hear something suspicious, don't hesitate, say something. Call 911.**

Code Enforcement has observed an increase in complaints regarding parking violations throughout the town. As a reminder it should be noted that **Sec. 27-5. - Parking and driving restrictions**. It shall be unlawful, within the corporate limits of Cheverly to:

(c) Park any vehicle in the same place on any street, road or highway longer than seventy-two (72) consecutive hours without a permit issued by the town administrator.

Note A. The town administrator may grant a temporary permit for a vehicle not meeting the above requirements to park on a specific street, so long as the permit is not valid for more than seven (7) days, a resident of the town makes proper application to the town administrator and the town and the town administrator determine that the certain criteria are met. The vehicle must meet all

applicable federal, state, county and town legal requirements and regulations.

During the most recent town meeting, the Chief emphasized that the Cheverly Police Department does not enforce immigrations laws. For more information, we invite residents to review the Chief's comments by visiting the Town website.

The Cheverly Police Department received an invitation to attend the FBI National Academy (FBINA), Session 296. Sergeant Blount will be the first Cheverly Police Officer to attend!

The FBINA was created in 1935 in response to a 1930 study by the Wickersham Commission. The Commission recommended the standardization and professionalization of law enforcement departments across the United States through centralized training. With the support of the International Association of Chiefs of Police and with authority from Congress and the Department of Justice, the "FBI Police Training School" was created. Courses at that time included Scientific Aids in Crime Detection, Preparation of Reports, Criminal Investigation Techniques, and Administration and Organization. During World War II, courses were added in Espionage and Sabotage. The NA is a comprehensive 10-week residential program of accredited instruction for law enforcement leaders from all over the world. The FBI National Academy has long been a vital element in the continuing improvement of law enforcement standards, knowledge, and cooperation throughout the world.

We appreciate and value your ongoing support and cooperation as we build a safer community together.



CODE COMPLIANCE

PARKING COMPLIANCE

According to Code Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5



Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

REMINDERS FOR SPECIAL EVENT NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTY

- 1. Canvas everyone in the neighborhood to find a date that works best.** Visit each neighbor to inform them of your plans and get feedback from them at least before you are tentatively scheduled to host the event. Complete a block party survey. Keep your neighbors informed as the event date approaches and make sure they understand they are a part of celebration. A block party letter and neighbor survey can be obtained at the Town office.
- 2. Obtain necessary permits if you block off your street.** Permits must be obtained 30 days in advance for block parties. A Block Party Permit is required to block off any of a residential street for neighborhood block party purposes
- 3. Remind your neighbors 1 week before the party that the street will be closed.** It is important to keep your neighbors informed.
- 4. Place the “No Parking” signs 24-48 hours prior to the party at each end of the street with the date and time of the street closure.** Town Hall can supply “No Parking” signs once the event is permitted.

- 5. We recommend that you communicate with your neighbors a week prior to the Block Party.** Communicating with your neighbors help to ensure all are notified and remember not to park on the street.
- 6. Your street must be clean and open to traffic no later than 10 PM.**

SIDEWALK AND ROAD OVERGROWTH

Spring is here and the days are getting nice. With the nice weather, and rising gas prices, more and more residents are out walking. Whether they are out for a weekend stroll or headed down to the Metro for a train ride to work, they are using our sidewalks and walking paths.

The warmer weather also marks the start of the growing season. As trees and other vegetation grow, they tend to encroach upon the public right-of-way (sidewalks, streets, or alleys). This overgrowth of vegetation or low hanging branches can obstruct view, creates tripping hazards or otherwise impede the public's ability to use the streets and sidewalks. This encroachment has been deemed a public nuisance in the Town Code and constitutes a hazard, which impedes the free movement of pedestrians or vehicles. As such, residents are required to ensure that public right-of-way abutting their property are kept free of overgrowth and intersections are obstruction free.

- Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.

OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of

Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00.

Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.





RETURN OF THE RAIN CHECK REBATE

The county's budget for Fiscal Year 2026 had

suspended the Rain Check Rebate program and the Stormwater Stewardship Grant program.

We are happy to report that the final budget reinstates funding for the programs. Details are not yet available, but stay tuned to find out more.

The Rain Check Rebate program returns your Clean Water Act fees to you to help you pay for rain barrels, rain gardens, removal of impervious pavement, installation of permeable paving, and now, conservation landscaping.

Your Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee, along with other Cheverly organizations and the Town itself, petitioned the County Council to save the program.

Since 2014 the Rain Check Rebate program has helped Cheverly residents, install 84 rain barrels and 33 rain gardens. Residents have replaced 8635 square feet of impervious pavement with 6338 square feet of permeable pavement. In addition, they installed one cistern, and a conservation landscaping project of 824 square feet is in the works. The total funded towards Cheverly residents' projects is \$170,164.86.

These practices keep from running off into the streets and our streams. They reduce the town's expenses for wear and tear on our roads and maintenance of streets and storm drains, and prevent erosion of stream banks, and thus the eventual expense of large-scale stormwater management projects.

The Stormwater Stewardship Grant program provided \$121,833 for green stormwater infrastructure in Boyd Park and \$54,954 for a rain garden in Town Park, helping stretch the town's budget as well as forwarding its environmental goals as recommended in the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Plan and Approved Greater Cheverly Sector Plan.

If you aren't sure if you have an invasive shrub, you can send pictures to a number of plant identification apps like iNaturalist or contact us directly. If you have a shrub you think is invasive but is not on this list, ask us. We'll be happy to let you know.

Please keep in mind:

- Only two free shrubs per home regardless of how many invasives are removed.
- Invasive shrubs must be removed and disposed of in the trash (i.e. don't give it to a friend and do not put it in your yard waste where it will be ground into mulch that will spread the seeds to other yards).
