Happy August, Cheverly! The Eley Building, your multi-million-dollar replacement for the public works building that will include expanded public meeting space, is nearly complete, and I'm cautiously optimistic that the Town will get the keys early this month. I hope to have a public ribbon-cutting in September, and we're going to work hard to get the public meeting spaces up and running as soon after as possible. To help beat the summer heat, Public Works will begin trash and recycling pickups at 7:00 a.m. each day. Please have your receptacles on your curb by 7:00 a.m. on your assigned days.

The Town fiscal year started July 1st. In October, we swing back into budget season to review FY25 as well as FY26 first quarter financials.

Your Council met three times in July and meets again on Thursday, August 14th at 8pm. I'll appoint one election supervisor. On September 11th, we'll dedicate a portion of the regular Town Meeting to a public discussion with District 5 County Council Member Shayla Adams-Stafford. Please join us and ask a question!

Also, mark your calendar for the September 17th Education Roundtable at 7:00 pm with our School Board Member Aimee Olivo. Keep an eye out for a ribbon-cutting to celebrate the significant improvements to the Boyd Park playground. Lastly, we hope to announce soon a public meeting with WSSC to discuss sewer replacements in Wards 5 and 6.




RESIDENTIAL BUSINESS LICENSES

If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a Town Residential Business License.



Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George’s County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

The yearly business license fee is \$20.

CARING FOR CHEVERLY EAST PARK'S FOREST

Starting in spring 2025, the Clean Water Partnership will begin removing invasive plants from the forested areas around Red Maple Run in M-NCPPC's Cheverly East Park and nearby Town-owned land. This effort supports the recent Red Maple Run stream restoration project and is focused on protecting the native oak canopy along the stream and throughout the park's wooded areas. Work will be limited to forested sections of the park. No invasive species management will take place near the playground or play equipment.

This two-year effort is supported in part by a National Fish and Wildlife Foundation Chesapeake Bay Program Small Watershed Grant.

Public works crews start pick ups at 7:30 AM. Regular Trash, Bulk Trash, Yard Waste and Recycling need to be at the curb before 7AM. Yard Waste and Recycling should not be put in plastic trash bags. **Electronics will no longer be picked up with Recycling on Wednesdays. They will be picked on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.**

Please help the Public Works crew out by **not** parking in front of the yard waste, trash, recycling, and bulk trash. The picture shows how difficult it can be for the crew when there's a vehicle parked.

TREE EVALUATION PROGRAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS




Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?

To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov, complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form, and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will be cashed upon receipt.

TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION

Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

Report Street Light Problems to Pepco

If you are having any problems with street lights (they are out, blinking on and off, etc.) you can contact Pepco directly. Go to www.pepco.com, go to Outages, and click on Report a Street Light Outage. Enter either the address or pole number. A map showing the street lights in the area will appear. Click on the street light you wish to report. You will be directed to enter information about the light and your contact information.

MAKE SURE THAT THE BROKEN CAN/BIN IS ALL PLASTIC WITH NO METAL PARTS AND THAT IT IS CLEARLY LABELED WITH A SIGN SAYING "DISPOSE OF BIN OR CAN." THEN PUT IT AT THE CURB FOR PICKUP.

Message from the Chief and Assistant Chief of Police

The Cheverly Police Department (CPD) has recognized a notable rise in domestic violence (DV) incidents within our community. Disturbingly, many of these cases have involved escalated levels of physical violence, and in several incidents, violence has been directed toward responding law enforcement officers.

This pattern not only places survivors at serious risk but also presents growing dangers for first responders. CPD is increasing coordination with regional partners and crisis intervention teams to address this alarming trend.

Understanding Domestic Violence

Domestic violence is a pattern of abusive behavior in any relationship that is used by one partner to gain or maintain control over another. Abuse can be:

- **Physical** (hitting, shoving, choking)
- **Emotional or psychological** (manipulation, isolation, verbal attacks)
- **Sexual** (coercion, assault)
- **Financial** (withholding money, controlling employment or access to resources)
- **Technological** (monitoring, stalking via devices or social media)

Abuse does not discriminate. It affects all age groups, races, socioeconomic statuses, and relationship types, including spouses, dating partners, cohabitants, and domestic partners.

Myths vs. Truths About Domestic Violence

- **Myth:** Domestic violence is rare.
Truth: It affects an estimated 1 million people annually in the U.S., with 85 percent of victims being women. DV is also severely underreported.

- **Myth:** Abusers lose control or act out of anger.
Truth: Abuse is not about losing control. It is about maintaining control. Many abusers are deliberate and calculated in their actions. Outbursts are often used strategically to instill fear and compliance.
- **Myth:** If it was serious, the victim would leave.
Truth: Victims often stay because of fear, financial dependence, concern for children, lack of support, or threats to their life. Leaving is the most dangerous time in a violent relationship.

The Role of CPD and Community Response

CPD officers are trained in trauma-informed response and are committed to:

- Ensuring the immediate safety of victims and children
- Documenting and investigating DV incidents thoroughly
- Connecting survivors to support resources at the scene when possible
- De-escalating volatile situations to protect all parties involved, including officers

However, several recent calls have escalated to officer assaults, further underscoring the volatility of these incidents. CPD is working with county, state, and nonprofit partners to implement preventative outreach, victim advocacy, and legal protections.

CODE COMPLIANCE

PARKING COMPLIANCE

According to Code Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5



Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

REMINDERS FOR SPECIAL EVENT NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTY

- 1. Canvas everyone in the neighborhood to find a date that works best.** Visit each neighbor to inform them of your plans and get feedback from them at least before you are tentatively scheduled to host the event. Complete a block party survey. Keep your neighbors informed as the event date approaches and make sure they understand they are a part of celebration. A block party letter and neighbor survey can be obtained at the Town office.
- 2. Obtain necessary permits if you block off your street.** Permits must be obtained 30 days in advance for block parties. A Block Party Permit is required to block off any of a residential street for neighborhood block party purposes
- 3. Remind your neighbors 1 week before the party that the street will be closed.** It is important to keep your neighbors informed.
- 4. Place the "No Parking" signs 24-48 hours prior to the party at each end of the street with the date and time of the street closure.** Town Hall can supply "No Parking" signs once the event is permitted.
- 5. We recommend that you communicate with**

your neighbors a week prior to the Block Party. Communicating with your neighbors help to ensure all are notified and remember not to park on the street.

- 6. Your street must be clean and open to traffic no later than 10 PM.**

SIDEWALK AND ROAD OVERGROWTH

Spring is here and the days are getting nice. With the nice weather, and rising gas prices, more and more residents are out walking. Whether they are out for a weekend stroll or headed down to the Metro for a train ride to work, they are using our sidewalks and walking paths.

The warmer weather also marks the start of the growing season. As trees and other vegetation grow, they tend to encroach upon the public right-of-way (sidewalks, streets, or alleys). This overgrowth of vegetation or low hanging branches can obstruct view, creates tripping hazards or otherwise impede the public's ability to use the streets and sidewalks. This encroachment has been deemed a public nuisance in the Town Code and constitutes a hazard, which impedes the free movement of pedestrians or vehicles. As such, residents are required to ensure that public right-of-way abutting their property are kept free of overgrowth and intersections are obstruction free.

Trees located within the first (11) feet of the curb are the responsibility of the Town. Please call if you have a question or notice any condition that may pose a hazard to the community.

- Permits can only be issued to vehicles registered to a Cheverly address
- A copy of your vehicle registration must accompany the application
- Cost of the Permit is \$5 per vehicle | 1 guest parking pass is allowed **per address** at no cost
- The maximum number of guest passes is 2 per address. This includes one free pass and ONE guest for a \$2 fee.

If you live in one of the following areas, you will need a Parking Permit: Please check the zone that applies.

- Zone 1: State St, 61st & 62nd Ave, as well as the 1800 block of 64th Ave
- Zone 3: 22-2400 block of Cheverly Avenue

- Zone 5: 2300 block of Belleview Avenue
- Zone 6: Benton Rd & 23-25 Lake Avenue
- Zone 7: 2400 block of Valley Way
- Zone 8: 3300 Belleview Avenue; Medical Terrace **(Eliminated)**
- RO: 6500 & 6600 blocks Oak Street, 6500 block Maureen Court, 3132 & 3200 block Hillside Avenue
- SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to park on the odd side of the 2200 block of Cheverly Avenue in order to utilize the METRO



- Residential Parking Permits are to be displayed on the back Left Bumper area.
- If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.
- Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.
- Citation may be Issued to ANY Vehicle not in compliance with Town Code 27-5.1 Residential Zone Parking

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of

Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00.

Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.




