Happy November! Huge thank you to the incredible Cheverly Day team for making October 4th an enormous success! Our dedicated volunteers and Town staff made an incredible day possible. Our 95th anniversary parade and celebration will be Saturday, September 26, 2026, so please start planning today!

Recognizing the serious negative impact that recent federal staffing cuts and furloughs have had on our community, we will host a resource fair and get-together on Tuesday, November 4th, at 12:30 p.m. at Town Hall. This is a great opportunity to expand our individual support networks. Please join us!

Underscoring the priority we place on public safety, we will hold a public safety forum on Tuesday, November 18th, at 7:00 p.m. at Town Hall, so that members of our community can speak with and hear from our police department.

You may have heard that Chief David Morris was involved in a fatal shooting outside of the town limits on September 30, 2025. Chief Morris is doing well but obviously emotionally impacted. During the mandatory independent investigation, his duties will be restricted, but he remains our chief. Deputy Chief Jennifer Krauss is our acting chief of police. Per standard protocol in all officer involved shootings, an independent investigation is being conducted, in this case by the Maryland Attorney General’s office. Any further information about the investigation must be released by that office. We will update you as we are able.

We expect to obtain a use-and-occupancy permit for the Eley Building, your new multimillion-dollar public works and public meeting space, during the second half of November. I’m optimistic that we can hold an open house in mid-December to show you your new building!

We’re close to finalizing the automated vehicle gate at Boyd Park so that this important community asset is safe for all our residents.

Reminder that the town is closed on Tuesday, November 11th, for Veterans Day, and on Thursday and Friday, November 27th and 28th, for Thanksgiving and staff appreciation day. Adjustments to town service schedules will be publicized ahead of time.

I hope you’re tracking that PEPCO has requested an electricity rate increase from the state Public Service Commission, which, if approved, would become effective in August 2026. Learn more at pepcoc.com/rates.

Your mayor and council are meeting in November on the 13th at 7:30 p.m. We will hold a work session on Thursday, December 4th at 7:30 p.m.

I’ll hold Mayor’s Hours at the holiday market on Saturday, November 22nd, from 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at Town Hall and on Zoom with ASL interpretation. The market runs from 8 a.m. to noon.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

The yearly business license fee is \$20.



The Town of Cheverly is proud to join the Maryland Municipal League (MML) in celebrating **Municipal Government Works Month** this November!

Yard Waste and Recycling should not be put in plastic trash bags. **Electronics will no longer be picked up with Recycling on Wednesdays. They will be picked on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.**

Please help the Public Works crew out by **not** parking in front of the yard waste, trash, recycling, and bulk trash. The picture shows how difficult it can be for the crew when there's a vehicle parked.

CARING FOR CHEVERLY EAST PARK'S FOREST

Since Spring of 2025, the Clean Water Partnership has been removing invasive plants from the forested areas around Red Maple Run in M-NCPPC's Cheverly East Park and nearby Town-owned land. This effort supports the recent Red Maple Run stream restoration project and is focused on protecting the native oak canopy along the stream and throughout the park's wooded areas. Work will be limited to forested sections of the park. No invasive species management

will take place near the playground or play equipment.

This two-year effort is supported in part by a National Fish and Wildlife Foundation Chesapeake Bay Program Small Watershed Grant.

PUBLIC WORKS: LEAF SCHEDULE 2025-2026

No Vacuum Collections on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Town Holidays.

If using a service for leaf collection, please circulate this list and clear instructions to the company.

Leaves must be at the curb no later than 7:00 AM on the day of collection.

Leaves not at the curb will not be collected and must be bagged or pushed back from the collection area

Make sure that leaves are not obstructed and visible from the street. Do not block sidewalks or the streets with leaves.

Leaves with stones, branches, and other hard materials will damage the machine and result in delays to the schedule, please remove them.

Please follow the News and Announcements for updates. Wet or damp leaves will not be collected and will cause delays to the schedule.

Missed areas will be collected at the end of each cycle with no exceptions.

If delayed due to equipment failures, inclement weather, or other schedule changes, weekly updates will be provided on the Town's website under News and Announcements.

Please note that the schedule is in reverse order from the previous year.

TREE EVALUATION PROGRAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS




Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?

To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov, complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form, and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will be cashed upon receipt.

TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION

Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

Report Street Light Problems to Pepco

If you are having any problems with street lights (they are out, blinking on and off, etc.) you can contact Pepco directly. Go to www.pepco.com, go to Outages, and click on Report a Street Light Outage. Enter either the address or pole number. A map showing the street lights in the area will appear. Click on the street light you wish to report. You will be directed to enter information about the light and your contact information.

MAKE SURE THAT THE BROKEN CAN/BIN IS ALL PLASTIC WITH NO METAL PARTS AND THAT IT IS CLEARLY LABELED WITH A SIGN SAYING "DISPOSE OF BIN OR CAN." THEN PUT IT AT THE CURB FOR PICKUP.

PARKING COMPLIANCE

According to Code Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5



Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

REMINDERS FOR SPECIAL EVENT NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTY

1. **Canvas everyone in the neighborhood to find a date that works best.** Visit each neighbor to inform them of your plans and get feedback from them at least before you are tentatively scheduled to host the event. Complete a block party survey. Keep your neighbors informed as the event date approaches and make sure they understand they are a part of celebration. A block party letter and neighbor survey can be obtained at the Town office.
2. **Obtain necessary permits if you block off your street.** Permits must be obtained 30 days in advance for block parties. A Block Party Permit is required to block off any of a residential street for neighborhood block party purposes
3. **Remind your neighbors 1 week before the party that**

the street will be closed. It is important to keep your neighbors informed.

4. **Place the “No Parking” signs 24-48 hours prior to the party at each end of the street with the date and time of the street closure.** Town Hall can supply “No Parking” signs once the event is permitted.
5. **We recommend that you communicate with your neighbors a week prior to the Block Party.** Communicating with your neighbors help to ensure all are notified and remember not to park on the street.
6. **Your street must be clean and open to traffic no later than 10 PM.**

LEAF COMPLIANCE

- Burning of leaves and yard waste is prohibited
- Leaves should be placed out in “Paper” yard waste bags
 - o Yard waste is picked up in Mondays
 - o If you intend to rake them out for the leaf collection crew:
 - o Please refer to the schedule in the newsletter or town website

Be mindful of not blocking the street, gutter or sidewalk.

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of

Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00.

Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.



RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING

2026 Residential ZONE parking permits are available. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle. There is a maximum of two guest passes per residence.

The first guest pass is free and the second guest pass may be obtained for a \$2 fee. (Note: ONLY two guest passes per address.)

Applications can be downloaded from the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov under the Form and File tab.

- RO: 6500 & 6600 blocks Oak Street, 6500 block Maureen Court, 3132 & 3200 block Hillside Avenue
- SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to park on the odd side of the 2200 block of Cheverly Avenue in order to utilize the METRO



- Residential Parking Permits are to be displayed on the back Left Bumper area.
- If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.
- Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.
- Citation may be Issued to ANY Vehicle not in compliance with Town Code 27-5.1 Residential Zone Parking

SNOW COMPLIANCE

TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS



Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day). Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.

SNOW EMERGENCY PARKING



Snow Emergency Parking – Please Read and Prepare

WINTER

**TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—
Parking**

When snow reaches **1 inch or more**, the Town of Cheverly declares a **Snow Emergency**.

If the 1-inch accumulation happens after **11:00 PM**, restrictions begin at **7:00 AM** the next morning.

The Snow Emergency **remains in effect until your street has been plowed**.

To allow snow plows and emergency vehicles to safely clear the streets, parking is restricted as follows:

During a Snow Emergency

DO NOT park:

- In any cul-de-sac
- In any court
- On the even-numbered side of most streets

- Exception: On the following streets, do NOT park on the odd-numbered side:

- ◊ 59th Avenue
- ◊ 3200 block of Tremont Avenue
- ◊ Inwood Street (between Cheverly Ave & Belleview Ave)

- Anywhere except at the curb – no double-parking or blocking travel lanes

You MAY park:

- Where parking is normally legal and not otherwise posted
- On the odd side of most streets
- On the even side only of the three streets listed above

Important Additional Notes:

- Existing No Parking zones still apply.
- The Town will not eliminate all parking on a street. If one side is already “No Parking,” the other side will remain available.
- Streets with a median or divider are exempt from the side-based rule, but vehicles must still be parked so plows can pass.

Why it matters:

Keeping vehicles on the correct side of the street ensures:

- Faster and safer plowing
- Emergency vehicle access
- Reduced risk of tickets or towing

Thank you for helping keep our streets clear and safe during winter weather!

NOTE: The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

Colder Weather Is Coming: A Reminder About Vehicle Safety and Idling

As the crisp autumn air turns into the chill of winter, we know that many residents are tempted to warm up their cars before hitting the road. While it may seem harmless, leaving your vehicle running unattended, even just to warm it up, is both illegal and dangerous, and we want to take a moment to remind our community of a few important laws and safety tips.

It's Illegal to Leave Your Vehicle Running Unattended

According to Maryland Vehicle Law §21-1101, it is unlawful to leave a vehicle unattended while the engine is running unless specific safety precautions are taken (such as locking the ignition, removing the key, and engaging the brake). Leaving a vehicle idling and unoccupied increases the risk of:

- Vehicle theft: unattended, running cars are easy targets.
- Accidental rollaway: especially on hills or uneven ground.
- Violations resulting in citations and penalties up to \$70.00 and one point.

Exceptions:

There are limited exceptions to this law. Specifically, the law does not apply to a person who:

- Uses a remote keyless ignition system - If you start your vehicle remotely and it operates unattended for up to 5 minutes, it is not a violation, provided the vehicle is not in motion.
- It is not open to the public on private property - You may run your locked vehicle unattended for up to 5 minutes on private property that is not open to the public.

While these exceptions allow for limited idling, we

encourage residents to use them responsibly and not as a routine habit.

Limit Engine Idling to 5 Minutes

Under Maryland's Anti-Idling Law (COMAR 26.11.14.06), it is prohibited to allow a vehicle to idle for more than 5 minutes, except under specific conditions (e.g., emergency vehicles, traffic congestion, or temperature control in commercial vehicles). This regulation applies year-round but is especially relevant in cold weather when idling is more common.

Why It's Dangerous:

- Environmental Impact - Vehicle idling emits harmful pollutants, including carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, and fine particulate matter. These contribute to air pollution, worsen respiratory conditions like asthma, and negatively impact our local environment.
- Wasted Fuel & Increased Wear - Idling wastes gas and leads to unnecessary engine wear. Modern engines are designed to warm up more efficiently while driving, not while sitting still.
- Public Safety - Running cars left alone, even in driveways, can attract the attention of criminals looking for an easy opportunity. We've seen past incidents of vehicle theft in colder months for exactly this reason.

Cheverly Police Are Here to Help

While the law permits officers to issue warnings or citations to enforce these laws, our primary goal is to educate our community to keep Cheverly safe, clean, and beautiful. If violations are observed, officers will be encouraged to stop and speak with vehicle owners to raise awareness, so everyone can make safer, more environmentally conscious decisions.

Learning that the two lots were available at tax sale, Gabe Horchler, FLBC trail manager, took the initiative of bidding on the land. He was successful. Gabe now fully owns the land, and is offering it to the town at cost. The hope is that the town will agree to protect the land in its natural condition in perpetuity.

Acquisition of this property helps fulfill a recommendation of the Green Infrastructure Plan adopted as town policy, the addition of land to our natural areas.

These properties provide connections between two town-owned parks, Woodworth Park on the east and

Magruder Park on the west. The latter includes Magruder Spring, a designated historic site. The trail built by Friends of Lower Beaverdam Creek runs in part through these properties and connects the two parks, providing a continuity of green space for all Cheverly residents managed by volunteers as an environmental education area.

Leave the Leaves! Rather than raking and bagging, leave your leaves in garden beds provide habitat for caterpillars and other insects over the winter. For grassy lawn areas, shred leaves with your lawnmower to add nutrients to the soil. Trim perennial stems about 12 inches from the ground. Stem centers provide places for native bees to overwinter.

CHEVERLY VILLAGE Helping Solo Agers Thrive

AARP defines "Solo Agers" as people 50 and older who aren't married, don't have living children, and live alone. According to the US Census Bureau, about 8% of adults 55 and older are solo agers. Women living alone make up the largest proportion of solo agers.

As we shift our focus to the Thanksgiving Holiday, we hope you will support the CPRC Thanksgiving Donation Drive between November 2 through 15. A 2023 survey showed that only ¼ of the solo agers have someone who they can rely on to help cook, clean, go grocery shopping or help with other household tasks. Only 41% had a living will or an advance treatment directive. (<https://tinyurl.com/HarvardHealth2025>)

Half the solo agers said that living alone can give one the feeling of freedom and independence. Yet, they fear being unable to stay in their current home and worry about needing help with daily activities. Solo agers may have a period of declining health that occurs without them being aware. Mild cognitive impairment is often diagnosed when a live-in partner or child notices changes. As older adults age alone, they may have health issues that go unnoticed, such as ministrokes or times of forgetfulness.

It is vital to develop a support system if you live at home. Gerontology specialists recommend these strategies:

1. Set up a buddy system – arrange with a neighbor or friend to call each other once a day
2. Stay in touch with loved ones – set up a regular schedule for short calls
3. Combat isolation –
Join a community group or take classes.
Speak regularly with your neighbors
4. Use senior programs – Maryland has a variety of programs for older adults (<https://aging.maryland.gov/pages/programsandservices.aspx>)

One of the best strategies is to join your local Village! We help solo agers with a variety of social events and educational programs. In 2025 we had 6 programs on elder planning around financial and health issues. Check out our website under “Events” for more information! We invite you to join us to live your best life.
