Happy February as we celebrate Black History Month!

Budget season is underway! We started the current fiscal year with \$5.14 million in our unrestricted fund, and our projected \$400,000 deficit would take that fund balance to approximately \$4.74 million. Our first budget meeting will be on March 19th. Difficult spending and revenue decisions are ahead, so please stay in touch with your Council Member and me.

We held a public hearing in January on the draft charter amendment to annex into the Town’s corporate limits the Hospital Hill (Cheverly Hill!) property east of the B-W Parkway. Please continue to share your input with your Council Member and me. We’re proceeding very slowly and will probably vote on the annexation in early summer. I continue to believe that annexing this County-owned land into the Town is in our best interest.

The William Eley Building, your multi-million-dollar public works and public meeting complex, is nearly complete! We look forward to hosting an open house in the near future.

Your Mayor and Council will meet in February on the 12th and 26th at 7:30 pm, in person (hopefully in the Eley Building) and on Zoom/telephone. Please join us! I’ll hold mayor’s hours on Tuesday. February 10th from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm in person and on Zoom/telephone with ASL interpretation.

Town offices are closed, and collections suspended, on Monday, February 16th for Presidents’ Day. Town-wide trash and lawn waste will be collected on Tuesday, February 17th.

Cheverly Day and the Parade are Saturday September 26th, but because we’ll be celebrating our 95th birthday, volunteers and community groups are trying to expand to a week-long celebration. Please start planning how your group and neighbors can sponsor an event, and visit www.cheverlyday.org

If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a Town Residential Business License. Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George’s County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

The yearly business license fee is \$20.




Mondays (Town Wide) Yard Waste Pick Up
Mondays (East Side) Trash Pick Up

Wednesdays (Town Wide) Recycling Pick Up
Thursdays (East Side) Trash Pick Up, including Bulk Trash Pick Up
(3 Items Limit)



Fridays (West Side) Trash Pick Up, including Bulk Trash Pick Up **(3 Items Limit)**

Note: Bulk Trash is limited to 3 items and only on the days listed above.

Public works crews start pick ups at 7:30 AM. Regular Trash, Bulk Trash, Yard Waste and Recycling need to be at the curb before 7AM. Yard Waste and Recycling should not be put in plastic trash bags. **Electronics will no longer be picked up with Recycling on Wednesdays. They will be picked on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.**

Please help the Public Works crew out by **not** parking in front of the yard waste, trash, recycling, and bulk trash. The picture shows how difficult it can be for the crew when there's a vehicle parked.

CARING FOR CHEVERLY EAST PARK'S FOREST

Since Spring of 2025, the Clean Water Partnership has been removing invasive plants from the forested areas around Red Maple Run in M-NCPPC's Cheverly East Park and nearby Town-owned land. This effort supports the recent Red Maple Run stream restoration project and is focused on protecting the native oak canopy along the stream and throughout the park's wooded areas. Work will be limited to forested sections of the park. No invasive species management

will take place near the playground or play equipment.

This two-year effort is supported in part by a National Fish and Wildlife Foundation Chesapeake Bay Program Small Watershed Grant.

TREE EVALUATION PROGRAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS



Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?

To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov, complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form, and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will be cashed upon receipt.

TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

Report Street Light Problems to Pepco

If you are having any problems with street lights (they are out, blinking on and off, etc.) you can contact Pepco directly. Go to www.pepco.com, go to Outages, and click on Report a Street Light Outage. Enter either the address or pole number. A map showing the street lights in the area will appear. Click on the street light you wish to report. You will be directed to enter information about the light and your contact information.

DO THOSE OLD BROKEN-DOWN TRASH CANS AND RECYCLING BINS HAVE YOU IN A DUMP?



IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO DISPOSE OF AN OLD AND/OR DAMAGED RECYCLING BIN OR TRASH CAN, REQUEST A PICKUP USING SEECLICKFIX ON THE TOWN WEBSITE OR DOWNLOAD THE APP. YOU CAN ALSO CALL THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AT (301) 773-2666 TO SCHEDULE A PICKUP.

MAKE SURE THAT THE BROKEN CAN/BIN IS ALL PLASTIC WITH NO METAL PARTS AND THAT IT IS CLEARLY LABELED WITH A SIGN SAYING "DISPOSE OF BIN OR CAN." THEN PUT IT AT THE CURB FOR PICKUP.

PUBLIC WORKS: LEAF SCHEDULE FEBRUARY 2026

No Vacuum Collections on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Town Holidays.

If using a service for leaf collection, please circulate this list and clear instructions to the company.

Leaves must be at the curb no later than 7:00 AM on the day of collection.

Leaves not at the curb will not be collected and must be bagged or pushed back from the collection area

Make sure that leaves are not obstructed and visible from the street. Do not block sidewalks or the streets with leaves.

Leaves with stones, branches, and other hard materials will damage the machine and result in delays to the schedule, please remove them.

Please follow the News and Announcements for updates. Wet or damp leaves will not be collected and will cause delays to the schedule.

Missed areas will be collected at the end of each cycle with no exceptions.

If delayed due to equipment failures, inclement weather, or other schedule changes, weekly updates will be provided on the Town's website under News and Announcements.

Please note that the schedule is in reverse order from the previous year.

William Eley Jr. Public Works Building Construction

Town Park, the field, and parking lot (including the EV chargers) is an active construction zone and may be subject to inaccessibility. Please observe any posted signs as a safety precaution. We are working towards maintaining access to the park and field throughout construction via foot-traffic.

Holiday Tree Disposal Information

Curbside live tree pick-up will begin Monday, January 5, 2026, and continue through Monday, February 9, 2026. Please check the Town News & Announcements for holiday schedule changes.

Please do NOT dispose of live trees as yard waste.

Artificial trees should be disposed of on bulk trash days.

Please note that 'Bulk Trash' is limited to three (3) items, including any artificial Christmas Trees.

CODE COMPLIANCE

REMINDERS FOR SPECIAL EVENT NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTY

- 1. Canvas everyone in the neighborhood to find a date that works best.** Visit each neighbor to inform them of your plans and get feedback from them at least before you are tentatively scheduled to host the event. Complete a block party survey. Keep your neighbors informed as the event date approaches and make sure they understand they are a part of celebration. A block party letter and neighbor survey can be obtained at the Town office.
- 2. Obtain necessary permits if you block off your street.** Permits must be obtained 30 days in advance for block parties. A Block Party Permit is required to block off any of a residential street for neighborhood block party purposes
- 3. Remind your neighbors 1 week before the party that the street will be closed.** It is important to keep your neighbors informed.
- 4. Place the "No Parking" signs 24-48 hours prior to the party at each end of the street with the date and time of the street closure.**

CODE COMPLIANCE

Town Hall can supply “No Parking” signs once the event is permitted.

- We recommend that you communicate with your neighbors a week prior to the Block Party.** Communicating with your neighbors help to ensure all are notified and remember not to park on the street.
- Your street must be clean and open to traffic no later than 10 PM.**

PARKING COMPLIANCE

According to Code Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5



Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

LEAF COMPLIANCE

- Burning of leaves and yard waste is prohibited
- Leaves should be placed out in “Paper” yard waste bags
 - Yard waste is picked up in Mondays
 - If you intend to rake them out for the leaf collection crew:
 - Please refer to the schedule in the newsletter or town website

Be mindful of not blocking the street, gutter or sidewalk.

SNOW COMPLIANCE

TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—
SIDEWALKS



Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day). Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.

SNOW EMERGENCY PARKING

Snow Emergency Parking – Please Read and Prepare

TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking



When snow reaches **1 inch or more**, the Town of Cheverly declares a **Snow Emergency**.

If the 1-inch accumulation happens after **11:00 PM**, restrictions begin at **7:00 AM** the next morning.

The Snow Emergency **remains in effect until your street has been plowed.**

To allow snow plows and emergency vehicles to safely clear the streets, parking is restricted as follows:

During a Snow Emergency

DO NOT park:

- In any cul-de-sac
- In any court
- On the even-numbered side of most streets
- Exception: On the following streets, do NOT park on the odd-numbered side:
 - 59th Avenue
 - 3200 block of Tremont Avenue
 - Inwood Street (between Cheverly Ave & Belleview Ave)
- Anywhere except at the curb – no double-parking or blocking travel lanes

You MAY park:

- Where parking is normally legal and not otherwise posted
- On the odd side of most streets
- On the even side only of the three streets listed above

Important Additional Notes:

- Existing No Parking zones still apply.
- The Town will not eliminate all parking on a street. If one side is already “No Parking,” the other side will remain available.
- Streets with a median or divider are exempt from the side-based rule, but vehicles must still be parked so plows can pass.

Why it matters:

Keeping vehicles on the correct side of the street ensures:

- Faster and safer plowing
- Emergency vehicle access
- Reduced risk of tickets or towing

Thank you for helping keep our streets clear and safe during winter weather!

NOTE: The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

CODE COMPLIANCE

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of

Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00.

Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.



RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING

2026 Residential ZONE parking permits are available. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle. There is a maximum of two guest passes per residence.

The first guest pass is free and the second guest pass may be obtained for a \$2 fee. (Note: ONLY two guest passes per address.)

Applications can be downloaded from the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov under the Form and File tab.

**Message from the Chief
& Deputy Chief of Police**

As we enter a period of frigid and potentially dangerous temperatures, I would like to share several important public safety reminders to help keep you, your family, and our community safe.

During extreme cold weather, vehicle thefts and “jump-ins” historically increase throughout Prince George’s County. Please remember never to leave your vehicle running unattended, even for a brief moment. Always lock your car, remove valuables, and remain alert to your surroundings. These simple steps can significantly reduce the risk of becoming a victim.

Cold temperatures also present serious personal safety and health risks. Limit time outdoors whenever possible, and dress appropriately when you must be outside. Wear multiple layers, including hats, gloves, scarves, and insulated footwear. Exposed skin can quickly develop frostbite, especially in windy conditions.

Residents should be aware of the warning signs of hypothermia, which include uncontrollable shivering, slurred speech, confusion, fatigue, poor coordination, and a slow or weak pulse. Hypothermia is a medical emergency and can be life-threatening if not treated promptly. Cold weather can also worsen chronic medical conditions such as heart and respiratory illnesses. If you or someone else exhibits signs of

cold-related distress, seek immediate help.

Please take extra precautions inside your home as well. Use space heaters safely by keeping them at least three feet away from flammable materials, never leaving them unattended, and ensuring they are in good working condition. Never use ovens, grills, or generators indoors to heat your home, as this can cause deadly carbon monoxide poisoning. Ensure smoke and carbon monoxide detectors are functioning properly.

We also encourage residents to check on neighbors, particularly older adults, individuals with disabilities, and those who may not have adequate heating. A simple call or knock can make a significant difference during extreme weather.

The Cheverly Police Department remains on duty and committed to protecting and serving our community during these challenging conditions. We appreciate your continued cooperation and support.

If you need assistance, encounter an emergency, or observe suspicious activity, please call 911 immediately.

Thank you for working with us to keep Cheverly safe and resilient. Stay warm and stay safe.

Monthly meeting to report progress on Cheverly greening efforts and plan next steps and new initiatives. In implementing the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Plan, your Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee is working on projects in education, planning, and research.

GREEN NEW YEAR

The Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee started the new year by submitting two recommendations to the town. We suggested the town support a state bill offering ways to reduce beverage container trash. The "Bottle Bill" will help keep our streams clean. We asked the town to ensure that the exterior lighting on the new Eley building is dark-sky compliant. Lighting the ground, not the sky, protects birds and other wildlife, prevents the nuisance of unwanted glare, and even avoids deleterious health effects.

The calendar quickly filled with events and tasks that challenge us to learn, educate and advise on environmental planning and related issues.

Together with the Cheverly Planning Board, we planned a review with Urban Atlantic/HomeTeam 5 of the plans for the Cheverly Hill development.

The townhouse project at 5801 Annapolis Road came up for review.

We researched revived plans for a concrete batching plant at 1301 Claybrick Road, in the industrial area adjoining Cheverly's Old Ward Four.

The Maryland Department of the Environment hosted a "listening session" on its revised stormwater regulations.

Creating a Local Environmental Action Network for Lower Beaverdam Creek and Quincy Run (Project C.L.E.A.N.), a project of the Anacostia Riverkeeper, Ecologix, and Cheverly EJAT kicked off on January 29th with a Research Summit. The project will use existing research on industrial pollution in our streams

to improve community understanding of water quality in local streams and associated health concerns.

On the fun side, the Green Infrastructure Committee with other town groups, began planning our environmentally-forward contribution to the Cheverly Day parade!

CHEVERLY DISCUSSION GROUP

I started this group about a year ago, observing that people are becoming more and more isolated. Our worlds are getting smaller. Between work and home responsibilities, extensive screen time, politics and health issues and growing older, we have lost the skill and willingness to spend time interacting personally with one another. It was my intention to gather neighbors in a non-partisan and friendly atmosphere to share experiences, knowledge and opinions.

It's not about the coffee we bring, or the snacks we share or even the discussions that spontaneously arise; it's about bringing neighbors together and exercising our waning interactive skills . . . and it's working. Our attendance is slowly increasing and we occasionally draw some people from outside of Cheverly.

While we first focused on older folks, we have expanded to include all ages and even encourage teenagers to come and share their points of view or just listen for some wisdom.

No dues, no minutes, no committees, no commitments,

I urge everyone to join us in friendly conversations – sometimes serious, sometimes frivolous, often funny and occasionally personal.
