Happy March and finally the start of Spring! Spring training is underway, and Opening Day is March 26th!

The County Planning Department accepted the Preliminary Plan of Subdivision for Hospital (Cheverly) Hill. Please join us on Thursday, March 5th at 6:30pm at the William Eley Building and on Zoom/phone to hear from the developers and share your opinions on the residential, retail and community options. Separately, we continue to work on annexing the property into Cheverly and should be able to complete that process this summer.

Last month, we hosted a public meeting with the developers of 5801 Annapolis Road to facilitate direct engagement. We also extended invitations to the Town of Bladensburg and neighboring unincorporated areas. We will provide further updates as plans and applications proceed.

Budget season is underway, and difficult spending and revenue choices lie ahead. The town began this fiscal year with \$5.14 million in unrestricted funds; a projected \$400,000 deficit would bring that balance to approximately \$4.74 million. Please join us at our first FY27 budget discussion on Thursday, March 19th at 6:30pm at Town Hall and on Zoom/phone.

I'm happy to announce that our Town Administrator secured an additional \$650K in federal funding for the Kenilworth Avenue bike trail. Last year he secured the first \$450K federal dollars for this important project. I'm grateful for his work and look forward to finally making this trail a reality.

Due to continued contractor delays, the William Eley Building is now scheduled to open in May. We share your frustration regarding these delays and continue to hold the contractor accountable. We look forward to hosting an open house once the facility is ready.

The late January snow and ice storm made pedestrian, bike and vehicular travel nearly impossible for over a week across the DMV including in Cheverly. First, I want to thank our public works and police staff for tirelessly battling the snow and ice, often for days at a time without going home or tending to their families. They put their safety and health at risk in order to serve Cheverly, and we appreciate their dedication. Second, I want to acknowledge that we didn't meet your high expectations in all areas. We are committed to improving our processes, and the Town Administrator is preparing a post-action report to guide future execution.

In March, your Mayor and Council will meet on the 12th and 26th at 7:30 pm in person at Town Hall and on Zoom/phone. I'll hold Mayor's Hours on Wednesday, March 18th from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm at Town Hall and on Zoom/phone. All of our meetings feature ASL interpretation.

We're only two months away from the start of the Cheverly Community Market's season! Cheverly Day and Parade are Saturday, September 26th, but because we'll be celebrating our 95th birthday, volunteer and community groups are

trying to expand to a week-long celebration. Please start planning how your group and neighbors can sponsor an event, and visit www.cheverlyday.org.

Please contact me directly if your organization is having a community event that I can plug here in April!

Lastly, as the mayor of a small American town, I want to address the unacceptable militarization, chaos and lawfare being enforced by the federal government on American cities and towns (most famously Minneapolis.) First, I want to ensure you that Cheverly Police Department officers use body-worn cameras at all times, identify themselves by name, and wear Cheverly Police uniforms. Our officers work hard to earn your trust, please always call 911 to report any emergency and ask for a Cheverly officer to respond. Every day your police department lives and breathes integrity, fairness, fidelity to the Constitution and adherence to the rule of law. Second, our town code prevents Cheverly from cooperating with federal immigration enforcement, but Cheverly officers also

cannot and won't interfere with federal immigration enforcement. Third, your town government won't infringe on any rights or protections afforded by national, state and local law, including freedom of assembly, association, speech, petition and habeas corpus, regardless of where you're from, who you love, what God you worship, what documents you have, or what political candidate you support. No government in the United States at any level should kill, maim and beat Americans in the street nor lock up children as leverage. Normally, my job is to improve your quality of life through reliable trash services, infrastructure maintenance, etc., but I believe it is important that each resident know, I am also here to ensure that each neighbor can thrive in our community. These are perilous times, even for a small town, and by sticking together, I know as a community we will all be better for it.

If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a Town Residential Business License. Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George’s County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

The yearly business license fee is \$20.





Mondays (East Side) Trash Pick Up
Tuesdays (West Side) Trash Pick Up
Wednesdays (Town Wide) Recycling Pick Up
Thursdays (East Side) Trash Pick Up, including Bulk Trash Pick Up
(3 Items Limit)



Fridays (West Side) Trash Pick Up, including Bulk Trash Pick Up **(3 Items Limit)**

Note: Bulk Trash is limited to 3 items and only on the days listed above.

Public works crews start pick ups at 7:30 AM. Regular Trash, Bulk Trash, Yard Waste and Recycling need to be at the curb before 7AM. Yard Waste and Recycling should not be put in plastic trash bags. **Electronics will no longer be picked up with Recycling on Wednesdays. They will be picked on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.**

Please help the Public Works crew out by **not** parking in front of the yard waste, trash, recycling, and bulk trash. The picture shows how difficult it can be for the crew when there's a vehicle parked.

CARING FOR CHEVERLY EAST PARK'S FOREST

Since Spring of 2025, the Clean Water Partnership has been removing invasive plants from the forested areas around Red Maple Run in M-NCPPC's Cheverly East Park and nearby Town-owned land. This effort supports the recent Red Maple Run stream restoration project and is focused on protecting the native oak canopy along the stream and throughout the park's wooded areas. Work will be limited to forested sections of the park. No invasive species management

will take place near the playground or play equipment.

This two-year effort is supported in part by a National Fish and Wildlife Foundation Chesapeake Bay Program Small Watershed Grant.

TREE EVALUATION PROGRAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS



Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?

To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov, complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form, and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will be cashed upon receipt.

TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION

Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

Report Street Light Problems to Pepco

If you are having any problems with street lights (they are out, blinking on and off, etc.) you can contact Pepco directly. Go to www.pepco.com, go to Outages, and click on Report a Street Light Outage. Enter either the address or pole number. A map showing the street lights in the area will appear. Click on the street light you wish to report. You will be directed to enter information about the light and your contact information.

MAKE SURE THAT THE BROKEN CAN/BIN IS ALL PLASTIC WITH NO METAL PARTS AND THAT IT IS CLEARLY LABELED WITH A SIGN SAYING "DISPOSE OF BIN OR CAN." THEN PUT IT AT THE CURB FOR PICKUP.



REMINDERS FOR SPECIAL EVENTS and NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTIES

1. To submit a request to host a block party or other large event on Town Property, visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/1683/Special-Events> and fill out a Special Event Permit Request Form. Submit your Special Event Permit Request 90 days prior to your planned event. There is a \$10 fee for Public Works to deliver blockades to the applicant's home before the event and pick them up after the event.
2. When planning a neighborhood block party, canvas everyone in the neighborhood to find a date that works best. Inform your neighbors of your plans, brainstorm

- potential dates, and ensure your block is in agreement. It is important your neighbors are aware that there will be temporary barriers placed on your street during the time of your event.
3. Please do not announce your event until you have received a signed and approved copy of the Special Event Permit form. Upon receiving this, Town staff will schedule your blockade delivery and pick-up date and you are free to advertise the official event to your neighbors and friends.
4. As your event approaches, consistently remind your neighbors that the street will be temporarily blocked off. Please note, roads can only be officially closed for

emergency purposes. Your neighbors should be able to access their driveways during the event if necessary.

5. At the conclusion of your event, return the blockades to the applicant's home for smooth pick up on the scheduled date. Please make sure to clean roads entirely. Roads must be restored to their original appearance and open to traffic flow no later than 10:00 PM on your scheduled event date.

PARKING COMPLIANCE

According to Code Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5



Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

LEAF COMPLIANCE

- Burning of leaves and yard waste is prohibited
- Leaves should be placed out in "Paper" yard waste bags
 - Yard waste is picked up in Mondays
 - If you intend to rake them out for the leaf collection crew:
 - Please refer to the schedule in the newsletter or town website

Be mindful of not blocking the street, gutter or sidewalk.

SNOW COMPLIANCE

TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—
SIDEWALKS



Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day). Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.

SNOW EMERGENCY PARKING

Snow Emergency Parking – Please Read and Prepare
TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking



When snow reaches **1 inch or more**, the Town of Cheverly declares a **Snow Emergency**.

If the 1-inch accumulation happens after **11:00 PM**, restrictions begin at **7:00 AM** the next morning.

The Snow Emergency **remains in effect until your street has been plowed**.

To allow snow plows and emergency vehicles to safely clear the streets, parking is restricted as follows:

During a Snow Emergency

DO NOT park:

- In any cul-de-sac
- In any court
- On the even-numbered side of most streets
- Exception: On the following streets, do NOT park on the odd-numbered side:
 - ◊ 59th Avenue
 - ◊ 3200 block of Tremont Avenue
 - ◊ Inwood Street (between Cheverly Ave & Belleview Ave)
- Anywhere except at the curb – no double-parking or blocking travel lanes

You MAY park:

- Where parking is normally legal and not otherwise posted
- On the odd side of most streets
- On the even side only of the three streets listed above

Important Additional Notes:

- Existing No Parking zones still apply.
- The Town will not eliminate all parking on a street. If one side is already "No Parking," the other side will remain available.
- Streets with a median or divider are exempt from the side-based rule, but vehicles must still be parked so plows can pass.

Why it matters:

Keeping vehicles on the correct side of the street ensures:

- Faster and safer plowing
- Emergency vehicle access
- Reduced risk of tickets or towing

Thank you for helping keep our streets clear and safe during winter weather!

NOTE: The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.

OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of

Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00.

Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.



RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING

A Message from the Chief & Deputy Chief of Police

Vehicle Registration Compliance

As part of our ongoing commitment to public safety and community partnership, we would like to remind our community about Maryland's vehicle registration requirements under Maryland Transportation Article Title 13.

Maryland law requires individuals who reside in the state to properly title and register their vehicles with the Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration within the timeframe established by law. Proper registration ensures vehicles meet Maryland's safety, insurance, and emissions standards and that all motorists contribute fairly to the maintenance of our transportation system.

In 2025, the Maryland Department of Transportation submitted a report to the Governor examining the issue of vehicles owned by Maryland residents but registered out of state. The report highlighted that this practice results in millions of dollars of lost revenue that supports our roads, bridges, and public safety programs. It also identified challenges related to insurance compliance, automated enforcement systems, and equitable cost-sharing among Maryland motorists.

Key concerns highlighted in the 2025 MDOT report include:

- **Significant Numbers of Improper Registrations:** Data over recent years showed tens of thousands of vehicles with Maryland addresses registered out-of-state, particularly in Virginia, rather than in Maryland, contrary to state requirements. While exact figures vary by dataset, this pattern indicates a persistent issue across jurisdictions.
- **Lost Revenue for Marylanders and the State:** Vehicles that are not registered in Maryland result in lost state revenue tied to titling and registration fees, excise taxes, and vehicle emissions inspection program contributions, all of which fund critical

transportation infrastructure and public safety services.

- **Incentives and Enforcement Challenges:** The report explored why some Maryland residents register vehicles elsewhere, including differences in fees, insurance requirements, and administrative rules, and found that current enforcement mechanisms are limited once a vehicle is titled out-of-state.
- **Public Safety and Regulatory Compliance Impacts:** Improper registrations can also undermine enforcement of traffic safety laws, automated enforcement programs, and vehicle insurance compliance, shifting costs to Maryland motorists and complicating law enforcement efforts statewide.

These findings reinforce the importance of ensuring that all community members who reside in Maryland register their vehicles in accordance with state law. In response to these concerns, the Maryland General Assembly introduced Senate Bill 115, which seeks, in part, to address improper out-of-state registrations and strengthen compliance.

Our goal in Cheverly is education and voluntary compliance. We recognize that registration requirements can sometimes be confusing, particularly for new residents or those who have recently relocated. We also recognize that there are exceptions to the registration requirements, e.g., military members, out-of-state students attending Maryland colleges and universities, or those who may be temporarily working or visiting Maryland.





CHEVERLY HILL

On January 26 the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee and Cheverly Planning Board held a joint meeting with the Cheverly Hill development team. This project is the biggest to come before the town in years and for the foreseeable future, and our interest as engaged town residents is reflected in the attendance at the meeting, with 47 participants, including three members of our Town Council.

The meeting reviewed the Preliminary Plan of Subdivision before the county accepted it for review by the county Planning Department.

A plan of subdivision divides a piece of land into parcels and addresses the adequacy of public facilities to serve new development. It covers design of streets and utilities as well as their relationship to those of the larger community.

Architecture, landscaping, stormwater management, woodland conservation, parking facilities, sighting, and signs should be covered in the detailed site plans to come later.

Questions covered timelines for planning and construction, open-space uses, tree conservation, bird-strike avoidance, stormwater management standards, air quality, a noise study, housing types, ownership versus rental, retail, transportation, trails, solar energy, building standards, and communication with current residents.

The plan divides the 44-acre property into 16 building parcels, two for an office building and parking garage, seven as multifamily housing, two as condos, two garages, one community center, and one open space. Eight further parcels are designated as open space, stormwater management, and private alleys.
