#### *Message from the Mayor*

I encourage everyone to consider getting their flu shots and COVID boosters to stay healthy as we move into the colder months.



Though Cheverly is a peaceful and charming town, domestic violence can affect anyone, regardless of how serene a place may seem. Family violence does not discriminate based on socio-economic status or location. As part of Domestic Violence Awareness Month, let's remember to stay vigilant and offer support to those who may be suffering in silence. The National Domestic Violence Hotline (1-800-799-SAFE) is available for anyone who needs safety planning and shelter resources. In an emergency, always dial 911.

October is also Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Month. Recently, there has been significant discussion surrounding childless women, and I find much of the rhetoric harmful. Decisions about having children are deeply personal, and it's crucial to respect that our bodies are our own, and we each have the autonomy to make our own choices. After watching a dear friend suffer multiple miscarriages, I now have the joy of being a godparent, but many in our community silently carry the grief of losing a child. This month reminds us to create spaces where people can safely share their experiences and receive support without judgment.

World Mental Health Day on October 10th carries the theme "Mental Health is Health." It's a powerful reminder that mental health is just as important as physical well-being, and we must continue to break the stigma surrounding mental health discussions.

### RESIDENTIAL BUSINESS LICENSES

If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a Town Residential Business License.



Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George’s County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

*The yearly business license fee is \$20.*

Note: Bulk Trash is limited to 3 items and only on the days listed above.

Public works crews start pick ups at 7:30 AM. Regular Trash, Bulk Trash, Yard Waste and Recycling need to be at the curb before 7AM. Yard Waste and Recycling should not be put in plastic trash bags. **Electronics will no longer be picked up with Recycling on Wednesdays. They will be picked on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.**

Please help the Public Works crew out by **not** parking in front of the yard waste, trash, recycling, and bulk trash. The picture shows how difficult it can be for the crew when there's a vehicle parked.

Curbside Recycling: 34.17 TNS (\$27/TN) = \$ 922.59

Compost: 223.15TNS (\$25/TN) = \$ 579.25

Refuse: 140.07 TNS (\$70/TN) = \$ 9,804.90

IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO DISPOSE OF AN OLD AND/OR DAMAGED RECYCLING BIN OR TRASH CAN, REQUEST A PICKUP USING SECLICKFIX ON THE TOWN WEBSITE OR DOWNLOAD THE APP. YOU CAN ALSO CALL THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AT (301) 773-2666 TO SCHEDULE A PICKUP.

MAKE SURE THAT THE BROKEN CAN/BIN IS ALL PLASTIC WITH NO METAL PARTS AND THAT IT IS CLEARLY LABELED WITH A SIGN SAYING "DISPOSE OF BIN OR CAN." THEN PUT IT AT THE CURB FOR PICKUP.

## **TREE EVALUATION PROGRAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS**

**Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?**



To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at [www.cheverly-md.gov](http://www.cheverly-md.gov), complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form, and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will be cashed upon receipt.

## **TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION**

**Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.**



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

\*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

# PUBLIC WORKS: LEAF SCHEDULE 2024-2025

No Vacuum Collections on Mondays, Wednesdays and Town Holidays.

Leaves must be at the curb no later than 7:00 AM on the day of collection. Leaves not at the curb will not be collected and must be bagged or pushed back from the collection area

Do not block sidewalks or the streets with leaves. Leaves with stones, branches, and other hard materials will damage the machine and result in delays to the schedule, please remove them.

Wet or damp leaves will not be collected and will cause delays to the schedule. Please follow the News and Announcements for updates.

Make sure that leaves are not obstructed and visible from the street.

If using a service for leaf collection, please circulate this list and clear instructions to the company.

Missed areas will be collected at the end of

each cycle with no exceptions.

If delayed due to equipment failures, inclement weather, or other schedule changes, weekly updates will be provided on the Town's website under News and Announcements.

Please note that the schedule is in reverse order from previous year.

*Message from the Chief and Assistant Chief of Police*

Dear Cheverly Community,

It gives us great pride to recognize the prestigious accomplishments of two of Cheverly Police Department's outstanding employees, both recently honored during the Maryland Chiefs of Police Association (MCPA) and Maryland Sheriffs' Association annual Professional Development Seminar (PDS) held during the week of September 8<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup>, in Ocean City, Maryland.

The MCPA and MSA are comprised of Executive-level Law Enforcement officers from State, Local and Federal Agencies, prosecutors and police legal advisors, members of the Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission, private sector security directors and interested citizens. The associations work serves in several critical areas: Legislative and Legal Advocacy, Training, and Member Services. Engagement on issues of public safety policy has allowed the associations to effectively work with State Senators and Delegates on legislation that impacts legal, social, and budgetary issues. The MCPA/MSA are recognized as the voice of law enforcement advocacy on behalf of local law enforcement in Maryland.

On Monday, September 9<sup>th</sup>, the MCPA recognized Sergeant Spencer White with an award for Exceptional Police Performance. This state-wide recognition acknowledged the critical role he played in maintaining police services during a time when departmental resignations resulting in severe staffing shortages plagued the Cheverly Police Department. In her nomination of Sergeant White, Assistant Chief Jennifer Krauss wrote,

Facing insurmountable hurdles including budget deadlines, MPT&SC (Commission) certification renewals, lack of internal Commission certified instructors, ongoing attrition, and morale decimated by the tragic suicide of an officer, the Cheverly Police Department's atmosphere was even described by our current mayor as "traumatized." With the agency on the brink of collapse, this officer [Sergeant White] persevered and set a course, laying the foundation to restore and rebuild an agency which once had a proud and

historic reputation for excellence.

Sergeant Spencer White, a corporal at the time, barely 30 years old with less than nine years law enforcement experience, yet possessing unparalleled dedication, assumed a leadership role, well beyond his years. Without hesitation or trepidation, he took on the duties of a supervisor, administrator, educator, liaison, mentor, disciplinarian, trainer, recruiter et al., all while continuing his assigned duties as a patrol officer. He remained loyal to the residents and businesses that call the Town of Cheverly their home. His passion for the agency, the profession and the people proved unequal among even the most dedicated of those who serve in this noble profession.

As the Cheverly Police Department stabilized... Sergeant White continues his steadfast commitment to the revitalization of a professional and proud police department. It is said adversity reveals character. In this case, Sergeant White's true character revealed itself in his innate ability to take charge, problem solve, develop critical thinking, and assume responsibilities of a natural born leader, and I am proud to nominate him for the Maryland Chiefs of Police Association, Exceptional Performance Award.

Not to be outdone, during the same time, Sergeant Orhan Biler attended and successfully completed the Associations' Aspiring Leaders Program. The MCPA/MSA Aspiring Leaders program is designed as a parallel tract with the Associations' PDS. The purpose of the Aspiring Leaders Program is to prepare future generations of leaders as they ascend to the next step in their law enforcement careers. The program provides a strong foundation of leadership strategies and core principles essential to any agency head or executive level leader. Participation and attendance in the Aspiring Leaders Program require personal nomination and approval by the attendee's Chief or Sheriff. The objectives of the program include:

- Educate participants regarding statewide legislation on matters of disciplinary processes, use of force

standards, and the State Attorney General’s Independent Investigative Division’s responsibilities involving police-involved incidents that result in the death of an individual or injuries that are likely to result in the death of an individual occurring in the State of Maryland.

- Familiarize participants with high-level overview of the duties, responsibilities and statutory requirements associated with the Police Training and Standards Commission’s certification, training, and compliance auditing processes.
- Discuss and demonstrate the challenges of budgeting in both large and small police agencies, including strategies, myths, realities and “politics” of creating and maintaining a fiscally sound budget to ensure officers and staff have the resources necessary to protect our communities.
- Providing an overview of the Maryland Coordination and Analysis Center (MCAC) role and responsibilities. Attendees will gain a thorough understanding that MCAC was established as a model facility for the analysis and dissemination of information in statewide support of law enforcement, public health and welfare, public safety, and homeland security. Attendees receive an overview of the agency’s mission, and the services provided to support

Maryland law enforcement.

- Educate attendees regarding their role as executive leadership on national use of force standards, current trends, and duty of care. Participants discuss the challenges associated with training, maintaining updated policies and procedures, and associated departmental and individual liability.
- To develop core principles of leadership through discussion, exercises and group dynamics designed to expose participants to the myriad challenges facing today’s law enforcement executive. Attendees hear from subject matter experts in the fields of Section 1983 of the U.S. Code, 42 U.S.C. § 1983, the civil rights law that allows people to sue state and local government officials who violate their constitutional rights, qualified immunity, tort claims, and the associated risks of exposure for failure to act.

Sergeant White’s and Sergeant Biler’s commitment to their chosen profession and to serving the Town of Cheverly is undeniable. We are fortunate to have this level of expertise within our ranks. Please join me and Assistant Chief Krauss in congratulating Sgt. White and Sgt. Biler on these significant career accomplishments.

**CODE COMPLIANCE**

**PARKING COMPLIANCE**

According to Code Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5



Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

**LEAF COMPLIANCE**

- Burning of leaves and yard waste is prohibited
- Leaves should be placed out in "Paper" yard waste bags
  - Yard waste is picked up in Mondays
  - If you intend to rake them out for the leaf collection crew:
  - Please refer to the schedule in the newsletter or town website

Be mindful of not blocking the street, gutter or sidewalk.

**SNOW COMPLIANCE**

**TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS** Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day). Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at 301-773-2666.

**TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking**

A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more. The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in

effect until the street is plowed.

**PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:**

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
- On any courts,
- On the even-numbered side of all streets,
- (exception)** On the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belleview Avenue.

**NOTE:** The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

**REMINDERS FOR SPECIAL EVENT NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTY**

- 1. Canvas everyone in the neighborhood to find a date that works best.** Visit each neighbor to inform them of your plans and get feedback from them at least before you are tentatively scheduled to host the event. Complete a block party survey. Keep your neighbors informed as the event date approaches and make sure they understand they are a part of celebration. A block party letter and neighbor survey can be obtained at the Town office.
- 2. Obtain necessary permits if you block off your street.** Permits must be obtained 30 days in advance for block parties. A Block Party Permit is required to block off any of a residential street for neighborhood block party purposes,
- 3. Remind your neighbors 1 week before the party that the street will be closed.** It is important to keep your neighbors informed.
- 4. Place the "No Parking" signs 24-48 hours prior to the party at each end of the street with the date and time of the street closure.** Town Hall can supply "No Parking" signs once the event is permitted.
- 5. We recommend that you communicate with your neighbors a week prior to the Block Party.** Communicating with your neighbors help to ensure all are notified and remember not to park on the street.
- 6. Your street must be clean and open to traffic no later than 10 PM.**

## VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

## OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

## SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of

Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

## CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00.

**Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.**



- Zone 8: 3300 Belleview Avenue; Medical Terrace **(Eliminated)**
- RO: 6500 & 6600 blocks Oak Street, 6500 block Maureen Court, 3132 & 3200 block Hillside Avenue
- SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to park on the odd side of the 2200 block of Cheverly Avenue in order to utilize the METRO



- Residential Parking Permits are to be displayed on the back Left Bumper area.
- If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.
- Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.
- Citation may be Issued to ANY Vehicle not in compliance with Town Code 27-5.1 Residential Zone Parking

### Is Litter the New Normal?

Litter Patrol volunteers picked up 13 bags of trash from the Rt. 50 ramps to Cheverly on Sept 10. This is in addition to the 200 bags picked up on President's Day 2023 and 100 bags on MLK Day 2024. In addition to helpful town and state highway's support, this has taken more than 300 volunteer hours!

The 18-month total is 380 bags of beer and water bottles, fast food packaging and some tires. We continue to find bottles of pee, a disgusting addition to roadside trash common around highway truck stops.

Why so much? The concentration of warehouses around Cheverly has greatly expanded in recent decades, supported by the county even as the community warned of the consequences for traffic, tree loss and increased pollution. A recent effort to reduce congestion -- specifically the massive and chronic illegal parking of semi-trucks on Cabin Branch Road -- will add some off-road parking, but it comes with an *additional* warehouse that will further *increase* overall truck and car traffic. Clearly, more action is required.

Road and street trash is more than a blight. Any that washes into storm drains goes *straight* to our streams. And our streams and rivers have enough trash, toxics and polluted stormwater runoff without adding more.

*Some good news:* the Council of Governments, Anacostia Riverkeeper and partners will be receiving \$1 million from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to remove auto parts, appliances, tires and other large debris from Lower Beaverdam Creek below



Kenilworth Ave. and the nearby Anacostia River. FLBC will assist with identifying debris sites and outreach to prevent further dumping.

The Revolutionaries won with help from France. Thus, our America was born.

Some years later, France sent a gift to us of "The Statue of Liberty", which stands in New York Harbor. "Miss Liberty" holds a poem written by Emma Lazarus high on her torch. Growing up in Brooklyn, New York, one of our members had to memorize the poem and can still recite it after many, many years...

"Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free. The wretched refuge of your teeming shore. Send these, the homeless tempest tossed to me. I light my lamp beyond your teeming shore."

The eight grandparents of this member and her husband came to America in the early 1900's through the harbor of NY. They saw Miss Liberty though they could not read Emma's poem. The current members of the family appreciate and thank Emma and the people of France, knowing that without their efforts their family would be different.




