


- Motion to adopt the Mayor and Council Training and Reimbursement Draft policy using allocation of 25% (\$5,000) for the mayor & 12.5% (\$2,500 each) for the council members from the budget line item made by CM Watson. 2nd by CM Bryner. CM Wade, Watson, Bryner, Garces voted yes. CM Fry abstained.
- Motion to adopt the Employee Auctions Policy as written, made by CM Bryner. 2nd by CM Garces. Approved unanimously.
- Motion to direct staff to prepare a public hearing for the beginning of Nov to solicit input on the installation of speed humps at the 3000 & 3100 blocks of Lake Ave & 5700 block of Forest Rd made by CM Watson. 2nd by CM Bryner. Approved unanimously.
- Motion to give the town administrator authority to design the space at 5701 Landover Rd and to purchase playground equipment made by CM Wade. 2nd by CM Garces. Approved unanimously.
- Motion to award the annual employee of the year bonus to Giselle Richards & Luis Cardenas in the amount of \$500 each made by CM Fry. 2nd by CM Garces. Approved unanimously.

RESIDENTIAL BUSINESS LICENSES

If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a Town Residential Business License.



Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George’s County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

The yearly business license fee is \$20.

Note: Bulk Trash is limited to 3 items and only on the days listed above.

Public works crews start pick ups at 7:30 AM. Regular Trash, Bulk Trash, Yard Waste and Recycling need to be at the curb before 7AM. Yard Waste and Recycling should not be put in plastic trash bags. **Electronics will no longer be picked up with Recycling on Wednesdays. They will be picked on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.**

Please help the Public Works crew out by **not** parking in front of the yard waste, trash, recycling, and bulk trash. The picture shows how difficult it can be for the crew when there's a vehicle parked.

RECYCLING & TRASH TOTALS

September Numbers

Curbside Recycling: 36.86 TNS (\$27/TN) = \$ 994.95

Compost: 21.19 TNS (\$25/TN) = \$ 529.75

Refuse: 129.69TNS (\$70/TN) = \$ 9,078.30



Recycling + Yard Waste / Total Tonnage = 58.05/187.74 = 30.2% (percentage diverted from landfill)
Total Landfill Tipping Fee Savings for Diverted Materials = \$ 2,538.80

TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION

Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

Report Street Light Problems to Pepco

If you are having any problems with street lights (they are out, blinking on and off, etc.) you can contact Pepco directly. Go to www.pepco.com, go to Outages, and click on Report a Street Light Outage. Enter either the address or pole number. A map showing the street lights in the area will appear. Click on the street light you wish to report. You will be directed to enter information about the light and your contact information.

TREE EVALUATION PROGRAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS



Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?



To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov, complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form, and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will be cashed upon receipt.

PUBLIC WORKS: LEAF SCHEDULE 2024-2025

No Vacuum Collections on Mondays, Wednesdays and Town Holidays.

Leaves must be at the curb no later than 7:00 AM on the day of collection.

Leaves not at the curb will not be collected and must be bagged or pushed back from the collection area

Do not block sidewalks or the streets with leaves.

Leaves with stones, branches, and other hard materials will damage the machine and result in delays to the schedule, please remove them.

Wet or damp leaves will not be collected and will cause delays to the schedule. Please follow the News and Announcements for updates.

Make sure that leaves are not obstructed and visible from the street.

If using a service for leaf collection, please circulate this list and clear instructions to the company.

Missed areas will be collected at the end of each cycle with no exceptions.

If delayed due to equipment failures, inclement weather, or other schedule changes, weekly updates will be provided on the Town's website under News and Announcements.

Please note that the schedule is in reverse order from previous year.

Message from the Chief and Assistant Chief of Police

The Cheverly Police Department Warns of Phone Scam by Police Impersonators

The Cheverly Police Department is warning the public of a phone scam in which impersonators pretend to be police officers to steal personal information.

Area Police Departments, including the Cheverly Police Department, are receiving reports from citizens about scammers who are fraudulently identifying themselves using the names of real Cheverly Police Officers, Prince George’s County Police Officers, Maryland State Troopers and others, or claiming to work for a Police Department. Sometimes the caller spoofs a phone number, and in these cases, they look like legitimate telephone numbers from local police agencies.

If you receive a phone call from someone claiming to be a law enforcement officer saying you owe money, missed a court date or jury duty, etc. **do not provide any personal information.** Hang up and call 911 to report the incident.

Helpful hints:

- Neither the Cheverly Police Department, nor any law enforcement agency, will ever request money or financial information over the phone.
- Don’t give in to pressure to take immediate action.
- Don’t engage in any conversation, as scammers may record your response.
- Don’t provide any personal information, date of birth, address, employment information, maiden name, etc., over the phone.
- Don’t provide your credit card number, bank account information, social security number, or

- other personal information to a caller.
- Don’t send money if a caller tells you to wire money or pay with a prepaid debit card or transfer any funds to a Bitcoin account.
- Don’t travel to any location the caller asks you to go to. This places your personal safety in danger.
- Don’t be intimidated by the threat of arrest or a warrant being issued. This is not how our judicial system operates. The elderly are particularly vulnerable to these types of scams.

If you believe you have provided information to a scammer, please immediately notify your financial institutions.

Following contact with your police department, complaints should also be filed through the Federal Bureau of Investigation’s Internet Crime Complaint Center at www.ic3.gov.

CODE COMPLIANCE

PARKING COMPLIANCE

According to Code Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5



Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

LEAF COMPLIANCE

- Burning of leaves and yard waste is prohibited
- Leaves should be placed out in “Paper” yard waste bags
 - Yard waste is picked up in Mondays
 - If you intend to rake them out for the leaf collection crew:
 - Please refer to the schedule in the newsletter or town website

Be mindful of not blocking the street, gutter or sidewalk.

SNOW COMPLIANCE

TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day). Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at 301-773-2666.

TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking

A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more. The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in

effect until the street is plowed.

PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:

On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,

On any courts,

On the even-numbered side of all streets,

(exception) On the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belleview Avenue.

NOTE: The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

REMINDERS FOR SPECIAL EVENT NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTY

- 1. Canvas everyone in the neighborhood to find a date that works best.** Visit each neighbor to inform them of your plans and get feedback from them at least before you are tentatively scheduled to host the event. Complete a block party survey. Keep your neighbors informed as the event date approaches and make sure they understand they are a part of celebration. A block party letter and neighbor survey can be obtained at the Town office.
- 2. Obtain necessary permits if you block off your street.** Permits must be obtained 30 days in advance for block parties. A Block Party Permit is required to block off any of a residential street for neighborhood block party purposes,
- 3. Remind your neighbors 1 week before the party that the street will be closed.** It is important to keep your neighbors informed.
- 4. Place the “No Parking” signs 24-48 hours prior to the party at each end of the street with the date and time of the street closure.** Town Hall can supply “No Parking” signs once the event is permitted.
- 5. We recommend that you communicate with your neighbors a week prior to the Block Party.** Communicating with your neighbors help to ensure all are notified and remember not to park on the street.
- 6. Your street must be clean and open to traffic no later than 10 PM.**

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of

Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00.

Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.



RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING

2024 Residential ZONE parking permits are available. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle. There is a maximum of two guest passes per residence.

The first guest pass is free and the second guest pass may be obtained for a \$2 fee. (Note: ONLY two guest passes per address.)

- SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to park on the odd side of the 2200 block of Cheverly Avenue in order to utilize the METRO



- Residential Parking Permits are to be displayed on the back Left Bumper area.
- If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.
- Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.
- Citation may be Issued to ANY Vehicle not in compliance with Town Code 27-5.1 Residential Zone Parking

WHY ARE BATS NECESSARY FOR A HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT?

Bats are the only flying mammals in the world. They are nocturnal creatures and use echolocation to find their food. They play a huge role in our ecosystems, being what is known as a keystone species. This means the whole ecosystem would change drastically if they were to be removed. Their primary function is to act as population control for insects like mosquitoes, moths, gnats, and other flying insects. Bats eat around 1000 mosquitoes an hour! These insects often spread disease or eat away at the forest and the crops we grow which is why it's so important that the population stays in check. Their poop, also known as guano, is really fertile and it helps the forest grow. Maryland has ten species of bat, all of which are on the critically endangered list. The biggest issues affecting bats currently are habitat loss and a disease known as white-nose syndrome that only affects bats. My Eagle Scout Project focuses on creating more bat habitat in Cheverly so that our town can have a healthy bat population. I've placed twelve bat houses around Cheverly Euclid Park along with an educational sign near the playground to hopefully

teach more people why the bats are so important.

Trim perennial stems about 12 inches from the ground. Stem centers provide places for native bees to overwinter.

The grant is one of ten awarded across the District of Columbia and Maryland this year by Pepco and Sustainable Maryland’s Sustainable Communities Grants Program, an initiative to preserve the environment and improve parks by restoring native pollinator species and increasing access to essential resources.

FLBC will use the funds for equipment and supplies for volunteers and contractors to remove or suppress invasive plants from a three-acre area from Magruder Spring to Ken’s Corner and for plants and seed to replace them with native shrubs and perennials.

The project, long identified in Cheverly's Green Infrastructure Plan, will complement and extend the native vegetation, wildlife habitat and natural stormwater management projects that FLBC volunteers have undertaken since the organization's founding 20 years ago. The effort is also intended to reduce the need for Pepco to bring large equipment into this off-road area to clear trees that encroach on the power lines and reduce the reliability of service, especially during increasingly powerful and frequent storms due to global warming.

Creating a large meadow across variable soil and moisture conditions is a substantial undertaking that will require community involvement and support. Proper planning and implementation is important to reduce ongoing maintenance, especially watering and weeding. The better we can balance strategies to suppress non-natives with efforts to foster the expansion of native vegetation already there, the more effective the effort. Even so, the project will require work and funding beyond this initial one-year grant.

Fortunately, the project has received extensive support and encouragement. Collaborators and grant supporters to date include the town of Cheverly, the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee, CNPP, Casey Trees, Scout Troop 257, Pepco's vegetation management team, Joe's GreenWorks, and more. We are reaching out to them and anyone interested for input on project planning and to organize volunteer opportunities. 




