As the year ends, I often find December to be a time of reflection—a mix of full-speed-ahead momentum and slow-motion moments of gratitude. It's my pleasure to share updates, celebrate our accomplishments, and express my heartfelt thanks for this incredible community we've built together.

#### **Thanksgiving Reflections**

I want to start by thanking everyone who joined me for Thanksgiving dinners. The holidays can be a difficult time for those with small support systems, those unable to travel, or those grieving the loss of loved ones. I wanted to be a resource for those who needed it, and I'm so grateful to have spent the day with you. Special thanks to the organizers of the Tofurkey Trot—it's events like these that keep me motivated to stay active and thankful for the limbs God has given me.

#### **Public Safety Milestones**

Cheverly remains one of the safest places to live in the County, and I am thrilled to share some incredible milestones from our Police Department.

We challenged ourselves to rebuild the department, and the results have been nothing short of miraculous. Last December, we had a team of only four officers, including the chief. As of now, we've sworn in our 14th officer, and by January, we will officially return to 24-hour policing.

This kind of growth is remarkable, especially during a time when police departments across the nation are seeing decreases in staffing. What sets Cheverly apart is the incredible leadership within our department—leaders who foster an environment where people want to stay and learn. I am so proud of the department's growth and deeply grateful to the faithful few who stayed with us through challenging times.

#### **Financial Stewardship**

This year, I want to highlight the incredible grant funding and resources our administration has secured since we started applying for grants and bond bills. Every dollar we bring in through grants is a dollar we don't need to charge in taxes.

As we approach January and tax season, I want you to know we are constantly working to find outside funding to invest in our town while reducing the burden on residents. These funds have supported infrastructure projects, public safety programs, and community initiatives that directly benefit you. Here are just a few awards we have received: Flood Mitigation: \$1,688,000, Community Parks and Playground: \$214,729, DHCD \$ \$219,000, CDBG \$ 267,066, Bond Bill/Capital Grant \$1.400,000, POS \$ 165,000, Beaver Creek Watershed: \$500,000, Project Restore: \$132,000, and the Chesapeake Bay Grant: \$50,000.

As we celebrate the season, please remember to prioritize fire safety. Double-check decorations, avoid overloading outlets, and ensure your smoke alarms and extinguishers are in working order. Let’s protect the homes and people we cherish.




## **RESIDENTIAL BUSINESS LICENSES**

If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a Town Residential Business License.



Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George’s County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

*The yearly business license fee is \$20.*

## HOLIDAY DECOR

Be sure to properly secure outdoor lights and decorations.

## TRASH SCHEDULE

- Mondays (Town Wide) Yard Waste Pick Up
  - Mondays (East Side) Trash Pick Up
  - Tuesdays (West Side) Trash Pick Up
  - Wednesdays (Town Wide) Recycling Pick Up
  - Thursdays (East Side) Trash Pick Up, including Bulk Trash Pick Up (**3 Items Limit**)
  - Fridays (West Side) Trash Pick Up, including Bulk Trash Pick Up (**3 Items Limit**)
- Note: Bulk Trash is limited to 3 items and only on the days listed above.



Public works crews start pick ups at 7:30 AM. Regular Trash, Bulk Trash, Yard Waste and Recycling need to be at the curb before 7AM. Yard Waste and Recycling should not be put in plastic trash bags. **Electronics will no longer be picked up with Recycling on Wednesdays. They will be picked on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.**

Please help the Public Works crew out by **not** parking in front of the yard waste, trash, recycling, and bulk trash. The picture shows how difficult it can be for the crew when there's a vehicle parked.

## RECYCLING & TRASH TOTALS

### October Numbers

Curbside Recycling: 44.97 TNS (\$27/TN) = \$ 1,214.19

Compost: 27.89 TNS (\$25/TN) = \$ 697.25

Refuse: 135.33 TNS (\$70/TN) = \$ 9,473.10



Recycling + Yard Waste / Total Tonnage = 72.86/208.19 = 34.9% (percentage diverted from landfill)  
Total Landfill Tipping Fee Savings for Diverted Materials = \$ 3,188.76

## TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION

Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

\*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

## TREE EVALUATION PROGRAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS



Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?



To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at [www.cheverly-md.gov](http://www.cheverly-md.gov), complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form, and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will be cashed upon receipt.

DO THOSE OLD BROKEN-DOWN TRASH CANS AND RECYCLING BINS HAVE YOU IN A DUMP?



IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO DISPOSE OF AN OLD AND/OR DAMAGED RECYCLING BIN OR TRASH CAN, REQUEST A PICKUP USING SEECLICKFIX ON THE TOWN WEBSITE OR DOWNLOAD THE APP. YOU CAN ALSO CALL THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AT (301) 773-2666 TO SCHEDULE A PICKUP.

MAKE SURE THAT THE BROKEN CAN/BIN IS ALL PLASTIC WITH NO METAL PARTS AND THAT IT IS CLEARLY LABELED WITH A SIGN SAYING "DISPOSE OF BIN OR CAN." THEN PUT IT AT THE CURB FOR PICKUP.

## Holiday Tree Disposal Information

Curbside live tree pick up will begin Monday, January 6, 2025, and run through Friday, February 7, 2025.

Please do NOT dispose of live trees as yard waste

Artificial trees should be disposed of on bulk trash days.

Please note that 'Bulk Trash' is limited to three (3) items, including any artificial Christmas Trees.

During construction of the new William Eley, Jr. Public Works Building, there is very limited space, and Public Works cannot store live or artificial Christmas trees that are discarded on the incorrect days.

# PUBLIC WORKS: LEAF SCHEDULE 2024-2025

No Vacuum Collections on Mondays, Wednesdays and Town Holidays.

Leaves must be at the curb no later than 7:00 AM on the day of collection.

Leaves not at the curb will not be collected and must be bagged or pushed back from the collection area

Do not block sidewalks or the streets with leaves.

Leaves with stones, branches, and other hard materials will damage the machine and result in delays to the schedule, please remove them.

Wet or damp leaves will not be collected and will cause delays to the schedule. Please follow the News and Announcements for updates.

Make sure that leaves are not obstructed and visible from the street.

If using a service for leaf collection, please circulate this list and clear instructions to the company

Missed areas will be collected at the end of each cycle with no exceptions.

If delayed due to equipment failures, inclement weather, or other schedule changes, weekly updates will be provided on the Town's website under News and Announcements.

Please note that the schedule is in reverse order from previous year.



# CODE COMPLIANCE

## PARKING COMPLIANCE

According to Code Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5



Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

## LEAF COMPLIANCE

- Burning of leaves and yard waste is prohibited
- Leaves should be placed out in “Paper” yard waste bags
  - o Yard waste is picked up in Mondays
  - o If you intend to rake them out for the leaf collection crew:
  - o Please refer to the schedule in the newsletter or town website

Be mindful of not blocking the street, gutter or sidewalk.

## SNOW COMPLIANCE

### **TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS**



Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day).

Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.

### **CODE - Sec. 27-10—**

**Parking A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more.**



**WINTER** The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed.

**PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:**

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
- On any courts,
- On the even-numbered side of all streets, (**exception**) on the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belleview Avenue.

**NOTE:** The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

**PRIORITIES:** The snow removal operations work under the following priorities:

- 1.) Cheverly Avenue
- 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valley Way, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive;
- 3.) all other streets.

## REMINDERS FOR SPECIAL EVENT NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTY

**1. Canvas everyone in the neighborhood to find a date that works best.** Visit each neighbor to inform them of your plans and get feedback from them at least before you are tentatively scheduled to host the event. Complete a block party survey. Keep your neighbors informed as the event date approaches and make sure they understand they are a part of celebration. A block party letter and neighbor survey can be obtained at the Town office.

**2. Obtain necessary permits if you block off your street.** Permits must be obtained 30 days in advance for block parties. A Block Party Permit is required to block off any of a residential street for neighborhood block party purposes,

**3. Remind your neighbors 1 week before the party that the street will be closed.** It is important to keep your neighbors informed.

**4. Place the “No Parking” signs 24-48 hours prior to the party at each end of the street with the date and time of the street closure.** Town Hall can supply “No Parking” signs once the event is permitted.

**5. We recommend that you communicate with your neighbors a week prior to the Block Party.**

Communicating with your neighbors help to ensure all are notified and remember not to park on the street.

**6. Your street must be clean and open to traffic no later than 10 PM.**

# CODE COMPLIANCE

## VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

## OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

## SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of

Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

## CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00.

**Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.**



## RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING

2024 Residential ZONE parking permits are available. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle. There is a maximum of two guest passes per residence.

The first guest pass is free and the second guest pass may be obtained for a \$2 fee. (Note: ONLY two guest passes per address.)

## Cheverly Residential Zone Parking Permit Application

**Applications can be submitted at Town Hall, online, via US Mail, or placed in the permit box located on the left-side wall of the main entrance at Townhall**

- Permits can only be issued to vehicles registered to a Cheverly address
- A copy of your vehicle registration must accompany the application
- Cost of the Permit is \$5 per vehicle | 1 guest parking pass is allowed **per address** at no cost
- The maximum number of guest passes is 2 per address. This includes one free pass and ONE guest for a \$2 fee.

*If you live in one of the following areas, you will need a Parking Permit: Please check the zone that applies.*

- Zone 1: State St, 61st & 62nd Ave, as well as the 1800 block of 64th Ave
- Zone 3: 22-2400 block of Cheverly Avenue
- Zone 4: Arbor Street & Crestlawn Avenue **(22-2300 block Parkway Eliminated)**
- Zone 5: 2300 block of Belleview Avenue
- Zone 6: Benton Rd & 23-25 Lake Avenue
- Zone 7: 2400 block of Valley Way
- Zone 8: 3300 Belleview Avenue; Medical Terrace **(Eliminated)**
- RO: 6500 & 6600 blocks Oak Street, 6500 block Maureen Court, 3132 & 3200 block Hillside Avenue
- SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to park on the odd side of the 2200 block of Cheverly Avenue in order to utilize the METRO



- Residential Parking Permits are to be displayed on the back Left Bumper area.
- If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.
- Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.
- Citation may be Issued to ANY Vehicle not in compliance with Town Code 27-5.1 Residential Zone Parking

**Leave your Leaves.** Leaves left in garden beds provide habitat for caterpillars and other insects over the winter. Don't leave your leaves on the grass as they will cut off sunlight and smother the grass blades. Avoid bagging leaves on grass by shredding them with your lawnmower to add nutrients to the lawn. Trim perennial stems about 12 inches from the ground. Stem centers provide places for native bees to overwinter.

## **SUSTAINABILITY TOURS**

Cheverly has been certified by Sustainable Maryland Certified since 2011 for its activities in protecting the environment. In October Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee members joined SMC tours exploring what four other communities have been doing for the environment.

With a population of just over 550, under a square mile in area, of which 37% is designated as undeveloped forest preserve, Washington Grove, in Montgomery County, demonstrates both modest and ambitious sustainability efforts. We visited a town-owned forest preserve with a proposed storm management project; a 12-acre conservation meadow and bike path; a pollinator and edible garden; a leaf composting project; EV chargers; and a childrens' library featuring sustainability books. The town's sustainability efforts are managed by volunteer-initiated and resident-led committees.

Takoma Park is a small city of 17,725, 2.4 square miles in area. Its public works department manages its sustainability projects. Our tour took us to an EV charging station converted from a gas station, a green roof installation, a stream renovation site, multi-family housing retrofitted as all-electric, and an ecological restoration site. Takoma Park's public works building is LEED-certified with rooftop solar panels, and features native plantings. The department uses an electric-powered street sweeper. The city offers its residents mulch, wood chips, and a corn grain silo for those heating with that alternative fuel.

## CHEVERLY CATS

On the afternoon of December 16<sup>th</sup> (Sunday) Cheverly Cats in association with A Cat's Life Rescue (ACLR) will be performing a **Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) service for feral and stray cats** in the **Cheverly Station Apartments**. During this program, unowned free-roaming community cats will be humanely trapped and taken to the veterinary clinic for neuter/spay surgeries and rabies vaccinations. In 24-48 hours, the cats will be returned to the place of trapping and released, thus ending their population growth and improving their quality of life. These TNR-ed cats will be easily distinguishable from the non-treated cats by a clipped tip of the left ear. Additionally, kittens under 3 months of age may be taken into ACLR's foster program to be socialized and placed for adoptions.




