

Concurrent Jurisdictions Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

104.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

This policy provides guidelines for the Memorandum of Understanding between the jurisdictions of Cheverly Police Department (CPD) and Prince George's County Police Department (PGPD).

104.1.1 DEFINITIONS

Concurrent Jurisdiction: Two or more law enforcement agencies operating in the same geographic area and sharing authority and responsibility.

Emergency: A sudden or unexpected event that calls for immediate action to protect the health, safety, welfare, or property of a person from actual or threatened harm or from an unlawful event.

Home Jurisdiction: Jurisdiction where an officer is normally employed (i.e., Cheverly for a Cheverly police officer).

Host Jurisdiction: Jurisdiction where an incident physically occurs

Host Agency: The law enforcement agency responsible for providing police services in a host jurisdiction

Primary Jurisdiction: The law enforcement agency ultimately responsible for a geographic area and/or incident

Scheduled Transport: Routine deliveries of a prisoner from one facility to another

104.2 POLICY

It is the policy of the Cheverly Police Department (CPD) to provide police services in accordance with the current Memorandum of Understanding between Prince George's County and the Town of Cheverly.

104.3 TOWN BOUNDARIES

The Town of Cheverly is completely enclosed within Prince George's County and the exact boundaries are enumerated with Article II of the Town Code, entitled "Charter and Local Laws", which also includes various annexations enacted after the 1951 Charter.

104.4 ASSISTING OTHER AGENCIES

Officers of the Cheverly Police Department may assist other agencies, as permitted under the Memorandum of Understandings, Mutual Aid Agreements, and/or other agreements, addendum, and amendments, established with these agencies and organizations.

104.4.1 WASHINGTON METROPOLITAN AREA TRANSIT AUTHORITY POLICE (WMATA)

An agreement was established, between the Cheverly Police Department (CPD) and the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority Police (WMATA), with the cooperative objective of

providing maximum police service to the Metro Transit System, its patrons, employees, properties, and the citizens of Cheverly.

Established on June 6, 1978, this agreement governs the interactions between the CPD and the WMATA.

Members shall abide by the provisions outlined in this agreement for incidents of concurrent jurisdiction with WMATA.

104.4.2 PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Cheverly Police Department (CPD) has an established Memorandum of Understanding with the Prince George's County Police Department (PGPD), which governs the jurisdictional obligations and responsibilities of each agency.

Members shall abide by the provisions outlined in this Memorandum of Understanding for incidents of concurrent jurisdiction with PGPD.
