We also got to see our youth engage with each other in a meaningful way with the implementation of the youth coordinator and planned activities for our tweens and teens. 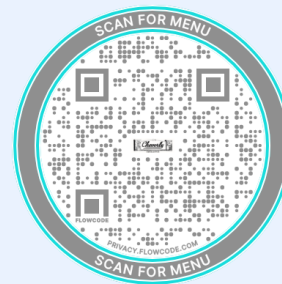
We also worked with you more to bring rich experiences and provide wellness resources to the community. With the help of CPRC, Cheverly Village, the Planning Board, Cheverly Rec Council, and the Green Infrastructure Committee, we were able to hold blood and vaccine drives, holiday parades, petting zoos, learn about upcoming development sites, and we got a win in getting the District of Columbia to agree to only bring electric vehicles to the Claybrick Road site.

I must brag a bit on our team. We accomplished a great deal last year. We went from storming, norming, to performing! It is now possible to walk Cheverly Avenue from end to end on...sidewalks! In fact, we put down almost a million dollars' worth of asphalt and concrete throughout town. We successfully tackled water and sewage issues on several problem streets and the fear of flooding has subsided. The infrastructure improvements have really been unmatched, and we received notable recognition and praise throughout Prince George's County for our efforts. Let's not forget the completion of Woodworth Park, our first accessible park for all in town. We are not just getting work done, we are being thoughtful and inclusive every step of the way. The most incredible part about our town improvements is that our staff managed to secure several grants to cover a large portion of the costs.

We also trekked through a budget cycle and allocated American Rescue Plan Act funds long before any of our neighboring municipalities did. A large part of being able to be nimble and quickly tackle projects is due to having done the work of formulating a Strategic Plan. The Strategic Plan helped us to identify competing interests and remind us of priorities. With community input, we know where to put our money and our minds for 2024.

We also completed the process to secure funds for the William Eley Public Works Building. We have a groundbreaking to look forward to! I want to thank Council for their cooperation in using some of the ARPA funds to offset the costs for this building. Typically, you save for a big project like this. Unfortunately, we haven't really saved as a town. We have had savings because of employment positions that have gone unfilled. Addressing the expenses of the new building has made us take a hard look at previous practices and town finances. I am so thankful that Mayor and Council were able to agree to budget for projects in the future and outline specific budget requirements for the future. These agreements led to the town receiving an excellent credit rating and securing a great interest rate for the future construction.

Now, everything has not been perfect in the last year. In life, you have to take the bitter with the sweet. We paid tribute to previous staff members we lost with tree plantings and unfortunately, we lost Officer Bakker who is still in all of hearts and minds. Still, I am grateful for the leadership in Chief Miller and Town Administrator Galloway in getting our staff access to the employee assistance program and ensuring each staff person knows that their health and safety is critical to the success of the town. It is important to me that we not just be mission focused, but people focused.

I never want you to forget how much our staff works for Cheverly and the pride they take in serving our town. It is truly remarkable, and I choose to start off every year in reflection and with gratitude. I hope you will join me in doing the same. Welcome to 2023!

Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

*The yearly business license fee is \$20.*

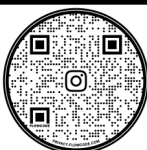

# CODE COMPLIANCE

## SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



**Sec. 4-10 (a)** It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

## VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

## OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

### **Sec. 12-3.**

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

## SIDEWALKS

### **TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS**

Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day).

Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.

# CODE COMPLIANCE

## WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS TOWN

### **CODE - Sec. 27-10—**

**Parking A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more.**

The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed.



**PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:**

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
- On any courts,
- On the even-numbered side of all streets,

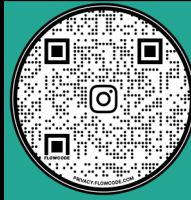
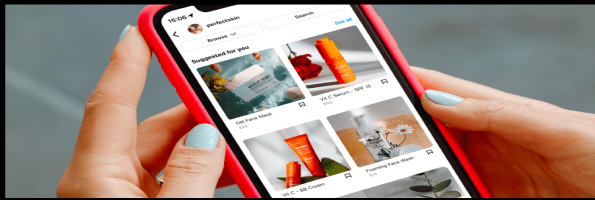
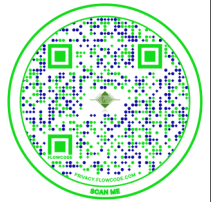
**(exception)** on the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belleview Avenue.

**NOTE:** The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

**PRIORITIES:** The snow removal operations work under the following priorities:

- 1.) Cheverly Avenue
- 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valley Way, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive;
- 3.) all other streets.

## PARKING COMPLIANCE

### **TOWN CODE - Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5**



Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

### **TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking**

**A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more.** The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed.



**PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:**

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
- On any courts,
- On the even-numbered side of all streets,

**(exception)** On the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belleview Avenue.

**PRIORITIES:** The snow removal operations work under the following priorities: 1.) Cheverly Avenue 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valleyway, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive; 3.) all other streets.



# CODE COMPLIANCE

## RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING



2023 Residential ZONE parking permits will be available December 15th. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle. There is a maximum of 2 guest passes per residence. The first guest pass is free and the second guest pass may be obtained for \$2 fee. (Note:

ONLY two guest passes per address.)

Applications can be downloaded from the Town website at [www.cheverly-md.gov](http://www.cheverly-md.gov) under the Form and File tab.

Please drop completed applications in the Permits Box located at Town Hall or mail to: Code Enforcement, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785.



## Cheverly Residential Zone Parking Permit Application

**Applications can be submitted at Town Hall, online, via US Mail, or placed in the permit box located on the left-side wall of the main entrance at Townhall**

- Permits can only be issued to vehicles registered to a Cheverly address
- A copy of your vehicle registration must accompany the application
- Cost of the Permit is \$5 per vehicle | 1 guest parking pass is allowed **per address** at no cost
- The maximum number of guest passes is 2 per address. This includes one free pass and ONE guest for a \$2 fee.

**If you live in one of the following areas, you will need a Parking Permit: Please check the zone that applies.**

- ☐ Zone 1: State St, 61st & 62nd Ave, as well as the 1800 block of 64th Ave
- ☐ Zone 3: 22-2400 block of Cheverly Avenue
- ☐ Zone 4: Arbor Street & Crestlawn Avenue (22-2300 block Parkway Eliminated)
- ☐ Zone 5: 2300 block of Bellevue Avenue
- ☐ Zone 6: Benton Rd & 23-25 Lake Avenue
- ☐ Zone 7: 2400 block of Valley Way
- ☐ Zone 8: 3300 Bellevue Avenue; Medical Terrace (Eliminated)
- ☐ RO: 6500 & 6600 blocks Oak Street, 6500 block Maureen Court, 3132 & 3200 block Hillside Avenue
- ☐ SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to park on the odd side of the 2200 block of Cheverly Avenue in order to utilize the METRO



- Residential Parking Permits are to be displayed on the back Left Bumper area.
- If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.
- Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.
- Citation may be Issued to ANY Vehicle not in compliance with Town Code 27-5.1 Residential Zone Parking

Yard Waste and Recycling should not be put in plastic trash bags. **Electronics will no longer be picked up with Recycling on Wednesdays. They will be picked up on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.**

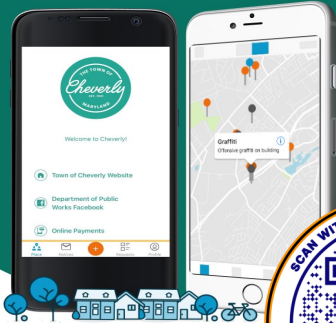

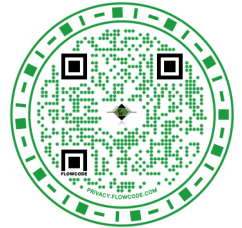
## TREE EVALUATION PROGRAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS

### *Message from the Chief*

Happy New Year and well wishes for 2023. This month's message will focus on driving during the winter season. Snow, sleet, ice and below freezing temperatures all influence driving conditions. During hazardous winter weather, safety depends on the drivers performance and good vehicle maintenance. The below tips will help you and your car weather the winter.

#### **Prepare Your Car-and-Yourself-for winter driving conditions**

- Understand how your car behaves in the snow. While features like anti-lock brakes and all weather tires can be advantageous, every car performs differently. If possible practice stopping, starting and turning in a big, empty, snowy parking lot to get the feel of your wheels in the snow.
- Make sure your battery is charged and working optimally
- Be sure to keep your gas tank full
- Change your oil filter and maybe your oil
- Make sure your wiper fluid contains anti-freeze
- Keep windshield and windows clear
- Make sure that your tires have good tread and keep them properly inflated
- Check your exhaust pipe to make sure it is clear
- Pack your trunk for emergencies

### **Plan Your Trip with Common Sense**

- Allow extra time to arrive at your destination.
- Don't warm up your car/vehicle in an enclosed area, such as a garage
- Fully charge your mobile devices.
- Monitor the weather conditions before beginning your trip.

### **Drive Extra Carefully**

- Drive slowly.
- Leave more distance than usual between your vehicle and the one just ahead of you.
- Be careful when driving over bridges.
- Know your route and be especially alert.
- Be alert to pedestrians/animals.
- Don't activate your cruise control.
- Stay tuned to weather reports and weather reports and weather-related accidents.
- Don't try to drive your way out of it. Seek shelter for both yourself and your car and wait for the storm to pass
- If possible do not stop on hills

Whether it's snow, sleet or ice, winter weather can cause extremely dangerous road conditions. Preparing yourself and your vehicle for winter weather is key.

### **WHAT IS THE CHEVERLY GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE COMMITTEE? WHAT DOES IT DO?**

Following Cheverly's adoption of the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Plan in 2011, the Mayor and Town Council established the Green Infrastructure Committee to work on implementation of the plan. The committee continues to be committed to supporting the community and our environment.

The committee's most important value to the community and the Council lies in its independence. At their best the Mayor and Council work with the Green Infrastructure Committee by supporting that independence.

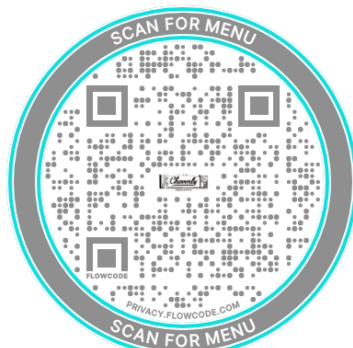
