



#### **Town Meeting – September 14, 2023**

- Motion to authorize the town administrator to use the existing budgeted line item to purchase a server up to \$40,000 from Dataprise made by CM Watson. 2nd by CM Bryner. Approved unanimously.
- Motion to retitle the vacant police clerk position to police records manager and reclassify it from 8A to 11D per the town's salary schedule made by CM Watson. 2nd by CM Bryner. Approved unanimously.
- Motion to authorize the Town Administrator to create a security plan proposed by Director Brayman at Hospital Hill site for storing public works equipment in the amount of \$250,000 from funds already allocated to the Public Works Building made by CM Bryner. 2<sup>nd</sup> by CM Fry. Approved unanimously.

#### RESIDENTIAL BUSINESS LICENSES

If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a Town Residential Business License.



Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

The yearly business license fee is \$20.

#### Message from the Chief

#### **Trick-or-Treating Reminders**

Each year, eager children and adults alike celebrate Halloween. However, amidst the excitement and festivities, it is crucial to prioritize safety for trick-or-treaters and drivers. Parents must accompany young children while they go trick-or-treating. This helps to ensure their safety as they navigate neighborhoods searching for candy-filled adventures. Additionally, costumes should be visible at night by incorporating reflective materials or opting for bright colors, allowing drivers to spot trick-or-treaters on the roads quickly.

- 1. Walk on a sidewalk if one is available and use crosswalks.
- 2. Before the Halloween festivities, create a "buddy system" to get each other home safely and prevent walking alone.

#### **Drivers, be cautious!**

Drivers should exercise extra caution on Halloween night. Slowing down in residential areas and being vigilant for children crossing streets can prevent accidents from occurring. Avoiding distractions such as cell phones or loud music also helps maintain focus on the road.

- 1. Continue to scan the road in areas where they are likely to be or where sight distances are limited.
- 2. Stay alert for pedestrians who may come out from between parked cars or behind shrubbery. Stop and wait for them to pass.
- 3. If you see a drunk driver on the road, contact law enforcement.

#### **General Safety**

Safety in your neighborhood extends beyond

Halloween. Here are some general safety tips to promote a secure environment throughout the year:

- 1. Know Your Neighbors: Get to know your neighbors and establish a sense of community. Look out for one another and report any suspicious activity promptly.
- 2. Home Security: Ensure your home is secure with good locks, well-lit entrances, and perhaps a security system. Don't advertise vacations on social media.
- 3. Emergency Contacts: Keep a list of emergency contacts, including local law enforcement, nearby hospitals, and neighbors you can trust.
- 4. Street Lighting: Advocate for better street lighting in your neighborhood to deter criminal activity and improve overall safety.
- 5. Children's Safety: Educate children about safe routes to school, the importance of not talking to strangers, and what to do in emergency situations.
- 6. Bike Safety: Encourage bike safety in your neighborhood by wearing helmets and obeying traffic rules while riding.

#### **Daylight Saving Time Reminder**

The fall season is often a reminder that the end of daylight-saving time is approaching. "Fall Back" is a common term to denote the fall time change. It is also a reminder that we move our clocks back one hour. On Sunday, November 5, 2023, at 2:00:00 a.m., clocks are turned backward 1 hour to 1:00:00 a.m. local standard time instead. Don't forget to adjust your clocks to stay on schedule and enjoy the benefits of the time change.

leaves. It is important that stones, branches and other hard materials are not mixed in with the leaves. Please make clear pathways to the leaves so our vehicles can access them. Leaves not visible from the street or blocked by cars may not be collected at the time of pick-up.

If delayed due to equipment failures, inclement weather, or other schedule changes, weekly updates will be provided on the Town's website under News and Announcements and the Public Works social media pages.

Please note that the schedule is in reverse order from previous years.

Public works crews start pick ups at 7:30 AM. Regular Trash, Bulk Trash, Yard Waste and Recycling need to be at the curb before 7AM. Yard Waste and Recycling should not be put in plastic trash bags. Electronics will no longer be picked up with Recycling on Wednesdays. They will be picked on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.

Please help the Public Works crew out by <u>not</u> parking in front of the yard waste, trash, recycling, and bulk trash. The picture shows how difficult it can be for the crew when there's a vehicle parked.

#### RECYCLING & TRASH TOTALS August 2023

Curbside Recycling: 46.74 TNS (\$27/TN) = \$1,261.98

Yard Waste: TNS 28.68 (\$25/TN) = \$679.75 Refuse: 148.07 TNS (\$70/TN) = \$10,364.90

#### TREE EVALUATION PROGAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS

Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?



To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov, complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will not be deposited until after the inspection report is completed.

#### TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION

Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

\*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

#### **PARKING COMPLIANCE**



According to Code Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5

Vehicles that have not moved for 72+hours may be towed; all

vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

### REMINDERS FOR SPECIAL EVENT NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTY

- 1. Canvass everyone in the neighborhood to find a date that works best. Visit each neighbor to inform them of your plans and get feedback from them at least before you are tentatively scheduled to host the event. Complete a block party survey. Keep your neighbors informed as the event date approaches and make sure they understand they are a part of celebration. A block party letter and neighbor survey can be obtained at the Town office.
- 2. Obtain necessary permits if you block off your street. Permits must be obtained 30 days in advance for block parties. A Block Party Permit is

- required to block off any of a residential street for neighborhood block party purposes,
- 3. Remind your neighbors 1 week before the party that the street will be closed. It is important to keep your neighbors informed.
- 4. Place the "No Parking" signs 24-48 hours prior to the party at each end of the street with the date and time of the street closure. Town Hall can supply "No Parking" signs once the event is permitted.
- 5. We recommend that you communicate with your neighbors a week prior to the Block Party. Communicating with your neighbors help to ensure all are notified and remember not to park on the street. 6. Your street must be clean and open to traffic no later than 10 PM.

### **CODE COMPLIANCE**

#### **CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES**

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00

Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.

#### SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to

remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

• Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

#### **OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER**

#### Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

#### VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.


