2022 has already proven to be a fast-paced year. We have accomplished quite a bit in less than three weeks. For starters, we had the pleasure of going from 60 degrees to 20 degrees in twenty-four hours and managed two snowstorms. I am excited to say that we have the strategic planning process and ARP budgeting underway. By the time you read this, we will have had one more meeting regarding Hospital Hill and a decision will be made for the developer. Thank you all for your feedback. Your input is shaping the future of Cheverly.

We also selected Our Board of Elections supervisors and judges. I personally want to thank the Board of Elections for the tremendous work done in serving our community. We identified several long-standing problems with the charter and passed the charter amendment. Going through wards and addresses is truly a labor of love but the right to vote is so crucial, it had to be done.

In our first town session, we tackled a great deal of issues coming before the town. We reviewed and voted on the design build contract for the William Eley Jr. Public Works Building. While it is a painful check to write, we cannot kick this can down the road any further. Just as many residents experience flooding when it rains, the Public Works building floods every rain as well. I know Mayor and Council are looking forward to reviewing the final designs with community in the coming months and getting started with construction. Remember the wait for our long-desired dog park is closely connected to this building as well. I can't wait to see it all come together.

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of

any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more.

The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed.

PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
- On any courts,
- On the even-numbered side of all streets.
- **(exception)** On the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belleview Avenue.

NOTE: The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

PRIORITIES: The snow removal operations work

under the following priorities: 1.) Cheverly Avenue 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valley Way, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive; 3.) all other streets.

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/ webforms/house-check-request to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Strore valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

SAFETY REMINDER:

We ask residents to remember that your neighbors who walk to Metro, or children walking to school, and the hard working Mail Carriers are exposed to dangerous



conditions when sidewalks are not cleared in a timely manner. Failure to comply with Town Code could result in fines.

TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day).

Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.

RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING

Residential ZONE parking permits are now available. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle with 1 free guest pass per address. A second guest pass may be obtained for \$2. (Only two guest passes per address.)

in the Permit Box located on the left-side wall of the main entrance at Townhall.

- Permits can only be issued to vehicles registered to a Cheverly Address.
- A copy of your vehicle registration must accompany the Application.
- Cost of the Permit is \$5 per vehicle | 1 Guest Parking Pass is allowed per residence at no cost.
- An additional Guest Parking Pass is available for \$2. (No More Than 2 Guest Parking Pass per Address)

BOARD OF ELECTIONS

Cheverly Municipal Election Monday, May 2, 2022 7 am – 8 pm

This year Cheverly will be holding elections for Mayor as well as special elections for Council members from Wards 4 and 5.

Information for Candidates

Candidates for Mayor must be:

- At least 25 years of age on or before election day
- · A citizen of the United States
- · A registered voter of Cheverly
- A resident of Cheverly for not less than 6 months preceding the election

Candidates for Town Council must be:

- · At least 21 years of age on or before election day
- · A citizen of the United States
- · A registered voter of Cheverly
- A resident of Cheverly for not less than 6 months preceding the election
- · A resident of the ward from which they are elected

Forms to file for candidacy may be obtained from the Cheverly website at www.cheverly-md.gov/board-elections or from the Town Hall office by appointment (call 301-773-8360). Completed forms must be returned to the Town Office no later than 5:00 pm on Friday, March 18, 2022. Candidate photos and profiles must also be submitted by March 18,

2022 for publication in the April newsletter.

Information for Voters

To be eligible to vote in the Town election, you must **register to vote** in one of two ways:

- 1. Register to vote with the state of Maryland **before April 2, 2022**. Already registered? Make sure your registration reflects your current Cheverly address. Check here: voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/votersearch
- 2. Register to vote with the Town of Cheverly. This option is available to any resident who cannot / will not register in Maryland (examples, non-US citizens or active military with active voter registrations in another state) and who meets the eligibility requirements. Registering to vote with the Town may be done at any time, including on election day.

Any registered voter in Cheverly may **request a ballot to be mailed to them** (or to be picked up in-person at Town Hall) if they choose not to vote in-person. Ballots may be returned by mail or in-person at a ballot drop box which will be installed in front of Town Hall for the 30 days prior to and including election day.

Please do not block sidewalks or the streets with your leaves. Also, it is important that stones, branches and other hard materials are not mixed in with the leaves

If delayed due to equipment failures, inclement weather, or other schedule changes, weekly up dates will be provided on the Town's website under News and Announcements.

Please note that the schedule is in reverse order from previous years.

TRASH COLLECTION REMINDER

Sec. 10-7 Except for household trash, which the town may collect from side or rear yards, all collectible trash shall be placed at the street side or curb, but shall not be placed there earlier than 7:00 p.m. on the day before it is scheduled to be collected. All containers or uncollected trash and waste must be removed from the street side or curb by 7:00 p.m. of the day it was scheduled for collection. Upon request of a resident to the town administrator and for good cause shown, the town may collect recyclables from a side or rear yard of the property.

CONTAINERS NOT TO EXCEED THIRTY-TWO (32) GALLON CAPACITY.

Just a reminder, and as stated on the Town's website, "Containers not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity."



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

Message from the Chief

Preparing your Car for the Winter

In addition to annual maintenance, here are some tips to winterize your car:

- If using all-season tires, check the tread on your tires and replace if less than 2/32 of an inch
- Check the tire pressure; tire pressure drops as the temperature drops
- Keep your gas tank at least half full to avoid gas line freeze

Online Reporting

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the department implemented an online reporting system for some non-emergency calls for service. These calls include auto tampering, destruction of property/property damage, lost property, theft from autos, and certain other thefts that don't rise to the level of burglary. Residents are encouraged to utilize this system, in lieu of the non-emergency number, for incidents that meet the requirements.

Report Requests

All reports can be requested, via email, at reports@cheverlypolice.org. When submitting your request, please include as much information as possible, that pertains to the report. In addition, a photocopy of the requesting party's ID will need to accompany the request for identification purposes. In response to the state of emergency, all fees associated with report requests have been waived.

Tips@cheverlypolice.org is the email address that residents can use to send non-emergency tips or information to the department. Our investigators are constantly working to investigate criminal

cases in which our residents have been victimized. If you have or believe you have information, photographs, or video that could assist the department, and you don't want to call, please send us an email. If you see someone in immediate danger or a crime being committed, dial 911.

Cheverly's Mass Notification System is Here!

CodeRED allows residents to receive emergency alerts via text, email, or phone call. Upon signing up for the service, users can create a Managed Account, which allows the user to create a username and password and control the following:

- 1. Types of alerts received:
 - a. Emergency Alerts (Mandatory)
 - b. General Alerts (Optional)
 - c. Weather Alerts (Optional, as provided by the National Weather Service)
- 2. Method alerts are received:
 - a. Via text message
 - b. Via email
 - c. Via phone call

Users can also perform a Quick signup however, doing so would require the user to call CodeRED's customer service line in order to make any changes to the account.

Users are required to have either a residential or business address, within the Cheverly limits, in order to sign up for an account. The system supports multiple addresses, phone numbers, and emails.

Weathering Winter Storms

If the weather outside is frightful, make sure you're prepared to safely brave snow, ice, and other winter weather hazards.

Here are some tips to help you stay safe:

- Avoid carbon monoxide poisoning. Only use generators and grills outdoors and away from windows. Never heat your home with a gas stovetop or oven.
- Stay off roads if at all possible. If trapped in your car, then stay inside.
- Limit your time outside. If you need to go outside, then wear layers of warm clothing. Watch for signs of frostbite and hypothermia.
- Reduce the risk of a heart attack by avoiding overexertion when shoveling snow and walking in the snow.

Learn the signs of, and basic treatments for, frostbite and hypothermia.

-Frostbite causes loss of feeling and color around the face, fingers and toes.

- Signs: Numbness, white or grayish-yellow skin, firm or waxy skin.
- Actions: Go to a warm room. Soak in warm water.
 Use body heat to warm. Do not massage or use a heating pad.

-Hypothermia is an unusually low body temperature. A temperature below 95 degrees is an emergency.

- Signs: Shivering, exhaustion, confusion, fumbling hands, memory loss, slurred speech or drowsiness.
- Actions: Go to a warm room. Warm the center of the body first—chest, neck, head and groin. Keep dry and wrapped up in warm blankets, including the head and neck.

-Emergency Kit for the Car: In case you are stranded, keep an emergency supply kit in your car with these automobile extras: Water (one gallon per person per day for several days, for drinking and sanitation), Food (at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food), Jumper cables, Flares or reflective triangle, Ice scraper, Car cell phone charger, Blanket, Map, Cat litter or sand (for better

tire traction).

-Prepare Your Car for Emergencies: Have a mechanic check the following on your car before an emergency: Antifreeze levels, Battery and ignition system, Brakes, Exhaust system, Fuel and air filters, Heater and defroster, Lights and flashing hazard lights, Oil, Thermostat, Windshield wiper equipment and washer fluid level.

The Cheverly Green Infrastructure Science Committee is again sponsoring nature hikes, coupled with the annual Great Backyard Bird Count of local birds on four days (Friday through Monday) from February 18th to the 22nd, 2022. Two public hikes are planned for Saturday and Sunday, February 19th and 20th at the Woodworth and Cheverly Euclid Parks respectively, and for more experienced birders, by invitation or request on Friday and Monday. The hikes will be guided by experienced naturalists. In addition to birds, we will also be identifying trees, shrubs and any other items of natural interest we come across. This is a great chance to get outdoors, learn about birds, trees and other plants, and enjoy what nature has to offer this time of the year.

Woodworth Park, 6401 Forest Rd, Cheverly, MD. Free parking is available on left side of Town Hall. Meet at the far end of the parking area closest to the woods.

Cheverly Euclid Park (Euclid Woods), accessed from western end of Greenleaf Rd. Park anywhere on Greenleaf Rd, but make sure that you are not blocking anyone's driveway.

Bring: You will need a pair of binoculars; bird or plant guides and snacks are optional but be sure to dress appropriately for the weather. Also bring your common sense: we will be observing the recommended social distance of 6 feet minimum for Covid. Please bring and wear your masks as advised by CDC.

Take care of your houseplants - Some plants are sensitive to the fluorine and chlorine in tap water. Water containers should stand overnight to allow these gases to dissipate before using on plants. Wash the dust off houseplant leaves on a regular basis. This allows the leaves to gather light more efficiently and will result in better growth. Set the pots of humidity-loving houseplants on trays filled with pebbles and water. Pots should sit on the pebbles, not in the water. Allow tap water to warm to room temperature before using on houseplants. Fluffy, white mealy bugs on houseplants are easily killed by touching them with a cotton swab soaked in rubbing alcohol. Insecticidal soap sprays can be safely applied to most houseplants for the control of many insect pests. The Cheverly Garden Club's Life-Long **Learning Grant** is still taking applications. If you are interested in gardening, flowers, environmental issues, programs, and workshops to further your education, apply for one of our Lifelong Learning Grants. The maximum award is \$500. You can apply if you are 18 years old or older, reside in Cheverly or are a full-time employee of the Town. Grant applications are available by email. Fixing Things Before They Break

A failing home heating system can be a serious matter. If you suspect

a problem, it might be wise to talk with a few HVAC

repair and service companies soon. Here are some tips from *Washington Consumer Checkbook* (WCC) that you can use to vet potential providers. Kevin Braiser, staff writer for WCC, explains, "If you know what's wrong, ask at least three highly rated outfits for their prices to do the work. There is a wide range of price differences among DC-area HVAC contractors."

He goes on to say, "If you don't know why your system isn't working, the company will need to come out to diagnose the problem. Most companies charge hefty minimum fees for this. In addition to relying on (WCC) comparison scores,* ask companies for their minimum fees and hourly labor rates. Because most repair work is performed on a time-and-materials basis, you can use this information to get an idea which companies are likely to be least expensive. But know that hourly labor rates don't reflect differences in charges for parts and materials, or the speed at which different companies work."

"Once a company has diagnosed your problem, ask for a price to fix it. If the repair estimate is no more than a few hundred dollars, you may as well go ahead and do it. If that company has a low price comparison score...the price is likely to at least be reasonable. If the estimate exceeds \$500 or so, consider getting additional quotes."


