This year Cheverly will be holding elections for all six Town Council seats. Visit www.cheverly-md.gov/board-elections for more info.

Information for Candidates

Candidates for Town Council must be:

- At least 21 years of age on or before election day
- A citizen of the United States
- A registered voter of Cheverly
- A resident of Cheverly for not less than 6 months preceding the election
- A resident of the ward from which they are elected

Forms to file for candidacy may be obtained from the Town website or from Town Hall. Candidate profiles may also be submitted as a Word document no longer than 350 words and may include a close-up photo cropped to 2"x2" as a JPEG file. Please submit all required materials as separate attachments to election@cheverly-md.gov. **Completed forms and candidate profiles must be submitted by 5:00 pm on Friday, March 17, 2023.**

Information for Voters

To be eligible to vote in the Town election, you

must register to vote in one of two ways:

- Register to vote with the state of Maryland **before April 1, 2023**. Already registered? Make sure your registration reflects your current Cheverly address. Check here: voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/votersearch

OR

- Register to vote with the Town of Cheverly. This option is available to any resident who cannot register in Maryland (examples, non-US citizens or active military with active voter registrations in another state) and who meets the eligibility requirements. Registering to vote with the Town may be done at any time, including on election day.

Any registered voter in Cheverly may **request a ballot to be mailed to them** or to be picked up in-person at Town Hall if they choose not to vote in-person. The request form may be found in this newsletter, picked up in-person at Town Hall, or on the Town website. **The deadline to request a mail-in ballot is April 24, 2023.**

If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a Town Residential Business License.



Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

The yearly business license fee is \$20.

CODE COMPLIANCE

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices and fire pits.

SIDEWALK AND ROAD OVERGROWTH

Spring is here and the days are getting nice. With the nice weather, and rising gas prices, more and more residents are out walking. Whether they are out for a weekend stroll or headed down to the Metro for a train ride to work, they are using our sidewalks and walking paths.

The warmer weather also marks the start of the growing season. As trees and other vegetation grow, they tend to encroach upon the public right-of-way (sidewalks, streets, or alleys). This overgrowth of vegetation or low hanging branches can obstruct view, creates tripping hazards or otherwise impede the public's ability to use the streets and sidewalks. This encroachment has been deemed a public nuisance in the Town Code and constitutes a hazard, which impedes the free movement of pedestrians or vehicles. As such, residents are required to ensure that public right-of-way abutting their property are kept free of overgrowth and intersections are obstruction free.

Trees located within the first (11) feet of the curb are the responsibility of the Town. Please call if you have a question or notice any condition that may pose a hazard to the community.

CODE COMPLIANCE

RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING



2023 Residential ZONE parking permits will be available December 15th. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle. There is a maximum of 2 guest passes per residence. The first guest pass is free and the second guest pass may be obtained for \$2 fee. (Note:

ONLY two guest passes per address.)

Applications can be downloaded from the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov under the Form and File tab.

Please drop completed applications in the Permits Box located at Town Hall or mail to: Code Enforcement, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785.



Cheverly Residential Zone Parking Permit Application

Applications can be submitted at Town Hall, online, via US Mail, or placed in the permit box located on the left-side wall of the main entrance at Townhall

- Permits can only be issued to vehicles registered to a Cheverly address
- A copy of your vehicle registration must accompany the application
- Cost of the Permit is \$5 per vehicle | 1 guest parking pass is allowed **per address** at no cost
- The maximum number of guest passes is 2 per address. This includes one free pass and ONE guest for a \$2 fee.

If you live in one of the following areas, you will need a Parking Permit: Please check the zone that applies.

- Zone 1: State St, 61st & 62nd Ave, as well as the 1800 block of 64th Ave
- Zone 3: 22-2400 block of Cheverly Avenue
- Zone 4: Arbor Street & Crestlawn Avenue **(22-2300 block Parkway Eliminated)**
- Zone 5: 2300 block of Belleview Avenue
- Zone 6: Benton Rd & 23-25 Lake Avenue
- Zone 7: 2400 block of Valley Way
- Zone 8: 3300 Belleview Avenue; Medical Terrace **(Eliminated)**
- RO: 6500 & 6600 blocks Oak Street, 6500 block Maureen Court, 3132 & 3200 block Hillside Avenue
- SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to park on the odd side of the 2200 block of Cheverly Avenue in order to utilize the METRO



- Residential Parking Permits are to be displayed on the back Left Bumper area.
- If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.
- Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.
- Citation may be Issued to ANY Vehicle not in compliance with Town Code 27-5.1 Residential Zone Parking
- If you have any questions, please contact the Office of Code Compliance at 240-770-7647

To apply for a Residential Zone Parking Permit by mail, please provide the following information **AND a copy of your *vehicle's registration**. Return this form to Residential Parking at the Town of Cheverly with the payment.

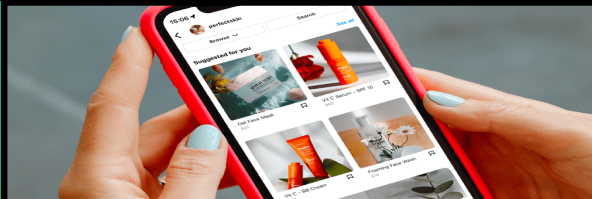

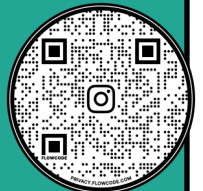

To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov, complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will not be deposited until after the inspection report is completed.

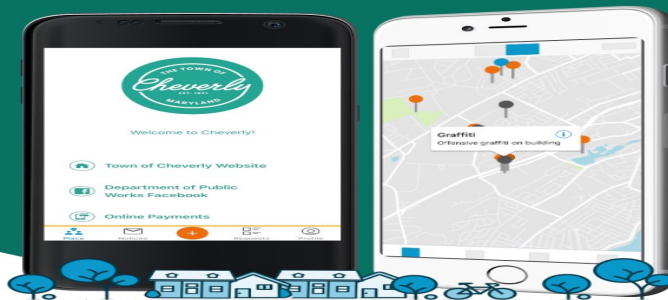

Message from the Chief

The best way I have found to stay connected with the community is to recognize and address the prevailing issues. After reading a quarterly Maryland State Police Alumni Association newsletter and receiving permission (President Retired F/Sgt. Jeannie Mastronardi) to share, this month I want to address porch pirate prevention.

Porch Pirate Prevention and How to Prevent Your Packages from Being Stolen.

If you order online (and who doesn't) you undoubtedly want to protect your packages once they arrive. Here's some good advice to avoid porch piracy:

1. Use delivery alerts. Most retailers or shipping companies let you opt into tracking alerts. Traffic alerts notify you as soon as your package has arrived.
2. Have your package delivered to your neighbor's house if you will not be home to receive it immediately or ship it to your office if that's easier.
3. Require a signature for delivery. It's not very convenient, but this ensures your packages, especially valuable ones, can't be left on the front porch unattended.
4. Use an AMAZON locker. AMAZON handles more than half of the on-line purchases in America and has some ways to keep your packages safe. Customers can have items shipped to secure AMAZON lockers in 900 cities. These are kiosks located near grocery stores, apartment buildings and other heavily travelled areas, where packages can be securely left unattended. Once your package has been

delivered, you can pick up from a locker using a special security code. (You don't have to be an AMAZON PRIME member, for this service.)
5. Use AMAZON Key. This electronic lock system allows AMAZON delivery people to drop-off packages inside your garage, gate, or house. This is a service for AMAZON PRIME customers only (please use at your own risk).

6. Use a SMART home security system like Ring or Nest, which has a doorbell camera and alerts you when someone is at your door. Having a system like this can be a deterrent to thieves, however it is not a sure thing.

Check the services offered by the delivery companies. UPS offers a service that allows you to pick the date and time a package is delivered. This allows you to choose a time when you are home for packages to be delivered. An additional fee may apply. Packages can also be held at UPS Stores and other locations. FedEx allows you to have a package held at a local FedEx Office, a Walgreens Store, or other locations. The United States Postal Service can also hold your packages or redirect deliveries.

As a reminder, the forementioned is information that can help minimize the risk of Porch Piracy. The Cheverly Police Department will continue to deliver related ancillary services to the community. If would like to call to discuss this or any other matter related to public safety, feel free to call (301) 341-1055 during normal business hours , 9 am—5 pm Monday thru Friday.

GREEN@HOME -- What is a Native Plant?

Simply put, a native plant is one that occurs naturally in the place where it evolved. Or you can say that it is one that occurs naturally in a particular region, state, ecosystem, and habitat without direct or indirect human actions. So we look for plants native to Maryland, and in particular to the Piedmont/Coastal Plain region. Plants native to our area support local food webs. They feed the insects that feed our baby birds. They produce seeds that feed birds and other wildlife. In total, we can say they support us!

That's why we are encouraged to add more native plants to our yards. Woody plants support a high level of biodiversity. Replacing lawn grass with native plants reduces maintenance with its potential for air and water pollution.

Learn more about using native plants and trees and converting your lawn to a conservation landscape through the University of Maryland Extension's [Bay-Wise Program](#). The National Audubon Society offers on-site visits; contact audubonwildlifehabitat@gmail.com. The Cheverly Native Planting Project (<https://www.cheverlynativeplantingproject.org/>) provides similar advice.

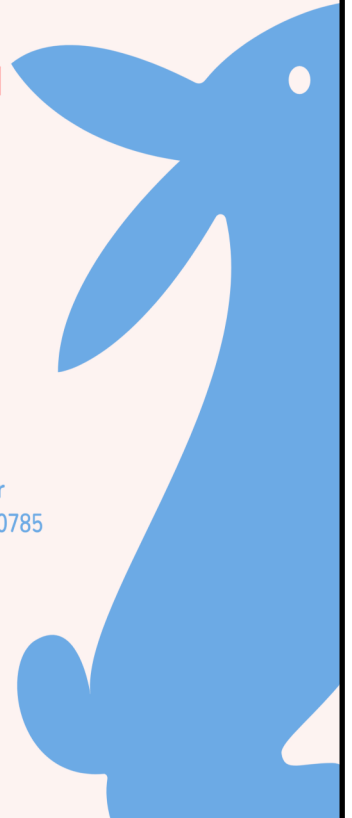

CHEVERLY NATIVE PLANTING PROJECT

It's easy to forget that while people may have heard of Cheverly Native Planting Project, many may not know exactly what it is we do and why. Since we're gearing up for spring and our thoughts are turning to getting outside again, we thought this would be a good time to re-introduce ourselves.

Hi, there! CNPP is a group of volunteers committed to increasing the number of native plants in yards and greenspaces. Native plants and the removal of invasive species are necessary for restoring ecological balance, creating healthier habitats, increasing biodiversity, managing storm water, and for fighting climate change. Best yet is that landscaping and natural spaces can be filled with native plants, environmentally sound, AND beautiful and inviting!

Community Bulletin Board

We take a multi-pronged approach to promoting the use of native plants and eliminating invasives plant species.

1. **SEVEN SITES:** We have seven sites on public land throughout town ranging from four landscaped beds filled with natives at Town Center and Cheverly Police Station to the wooded 11-acres of the Cheverly Nature Park. CNPP volunteers work at these sites removing invasives, planting natives, and doing whatever else is needed to create ecologically-sound habitats suited to each site.
2. **YARD VISITS:** We have a group of trained volunteers who do yard and property visits to help identify plants, figure out which landscaping problems to tackle, and help choose native plants that will work with the specific conditions of the space.
3. **2-FOR-1 TRADE:** Each year we hold a 2-for-1 Trade where we provide two free native shrubs in exchange for removing one invasive shrub from your yard or property.
4. **FREE PLANTS:** We divide and share our native flowers and grasses with neighbors to help make converting yards to native plant habitats more affordable.
5. **INFO SHARING:** We share research and information on environmentally-sound landscaping to help each other learn best practices in creating ecologically beneficial landscapes.
6. **COLLABORATIONS:** Most importantly, we collaborate with other local groups that share our goals.

It's a lot of work, but we love it. It's incredibly rewarding to see your hard work bloom - which we literally get to see! We can always use more help so hope you will join us!

You absolutely do not need to be a "techie" to help your Cheverly neighbors to expand their digital literacy! Please join us to be trained to be a "tech coach." With just ninety minutes of expert training and some well-organized tech guides, you'll learn how to work systematically with a village member who is a "late adopter" of today's technology, enabling them slowly to master and become confident doing the routine "tech" tasks that you are already so familiar with.

A second way in which you can help Cheverly Village technology "late adopters" break through their digital barriers is to learn how to help them **inventory their digital access**—the services they receive from their internet carrier and the other digital services they pay for. Based on this inventory, Village members will receive expert assistance from a Cheverly Village volunteer in how to save money and get the digital access they need.

Third, you can occasionally help host Cheverly Village's **monthly "Tech Time,"**—a light-hearted two-hour session, held at the Community Center, in which members and volunteers find answers to their technical puzzlements.

Finally, you can help your neighbors by **telling them about** Cheverly Village's *Expanding Digital Literacy* program!
