#### Message from the Mayor

History is more than the study of what happened. It is an opportunity to learn and grow from those who came before us. It is also a change to remember and honor heroes and heroines who paved the way.

In September, we always remember those first responders and service people who gave their lives and those whose lives were taken in the September 11<sup>th</sup> attacks. This history has shaped the way we live and how we navigate our country. It is both a sorrowful memory and one filled with pride as we think back on the many volunteers in both the nation's Capital and New York who worked to save as many lives as possible.



We also have a bit of local history to consider during this time. A quick reminder from a ward one resident, highlighted the marker that sits in an area that is known as Crawford's Adventure Spring. The Burning of Washington was a British invasion of Washington, D.C., the capital of the United States, during the Battle of Bladensburg in the War of 1812. On August 24, 1814, after the Battle of Bladensburg, a British force led by Major General Robert Ross burned down multiple buildings, including the White House, the Capitol building, as well as other facilities of the U.S. government.

There are assertions that the former town historian, Mr. Raymond Bellamy, performed research that revealed the wooded area behind the marker, also referred to as Nature Park was used by the British in 1814 during their retreat from Washington, DC. The area was identified by the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission and in 1980 designated as a "Prince George's County Maryland Historic Resource".

This should be heartbreaking for all of us to learn. There are resources you can share with folks considering suicide. Anyone in need of assistance with mental health or substance use-related needs can contact 988. What can people expect when calling 988? A live person who answers the phone, listens, provides support, and shares resources if needed. If you cannot remember anything else, remember to encourage your friends or loved ones to call 988.

Now, if you are reading this in the month of September, I have some really sad news. Summer is over. Our chickadees have returned to school and whatever hopes you had to sip coconut inspired beverages by any body of water is slowly fading until next year. There are some fun things to keep you inspired during this time as well.

First up is Cheverly Public Safety Day! Most municipalities celebrate National Night Out throughout the country. National Night Out is an annual community-building campaign that promotes police-community partnerships. The goal is to create more caring places to live. Cheverly has historically used Public Safety Day as the conduit to establish and create relationships between the community and

police. This year, our incredible Cheverly Police Department has doubled down on their commitment to engage with the community. #### Message from the Chief

One of the most rewarding moments for a Chief of Police is the occasion to recognize the outstanding efforts of the officers with whom one works. On August 10<sup>th</sup> Mayor Munyeneh and I had the opportunity to do just that when we presented Cheverly Police Officer Malakai Curtis #1731 with a Life Saving Award.

On Tuesday, July 25th, 2023, at approximately 2045 hours, Officer Curtis responded to the 5500 Block of Newton Street for a reported contact shooting. Officer Curtis was the first officer on the scene, arriving before Prince George's County's Emergency Medical Services (EMS). Officer Curtis located an adult male suffering from multiple gunshot wounds to the upper torso, leg, and arm. After quickly assessing that an active threat no longer existed, Officer Curtis, recognizing the severity of the wounds, immediately initiated lifesaving measures. Officer Curtis applied a chest seal and tourniquet to control the bleeding while reassuring the victim. As paramedics and other officers

arrived, Officer Curtis transitioned from caregiver to police officer, securing the crime scene and preserving evidence to maintain scene integrity for arriving investigators.

The actions Officer Curtis demonstrated that evening saved a man's life, or to use the words of our Mayor, Officer Curtis saved a mother from the grief of losing her son.

Please join me, Mayor Munyeneh, our Council, Town Administrator Galloway, and the fine officers of the Cheverly Police Department in commending Officer Curtis. His actions reflect great credit upon himself, our department, the law enforcement profession, and the community we serve. It was an honor to stand alongside our mayor and present Officer Curtis with such a distinguished award. We could not be prouder of him, and we are fortunate to have professionals like Officer Malakai Curtis serving our community.



MAKE SURE THAT THE BROKEN CAN/BIN IS ALL PLASTIC WITH NO METAL PARTS AND THAT IT IS CLEARLY LABELED WITH A SIGN SAYING "DISPOSE OF BIN OR CAN." THEN PUT IT AT THE CURB FOR PICKUP.

#### TREE EVALUATION PROGAM FOR TOWN RESIDENTS

Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?



To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov, complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will not be deposited until after the inspection report is completed.

#### TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION

Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

\*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

### CODE COMPLIANCE

#### SIDEWALK AND ROAD OVERGROWTH

With the nice weather, and rising gas prices, more and more residents are out walking. Whether they are out for a weekend stroll or headed down to the Metro for a train ride to work, they are using our sidewalks and walking paths.

As trees and other vegetation grow, they tend to encroach upon the public right-of-way (sidewalks, streets, or alleys). This overgrowth of vegetation or low hanging branches can obstruct view, creates tripping hazards or otherwise impede the public's ability to use the streets and sidewalks. This encroachment has been deemed a public nuisance in the Town Code and constitutes a hazard, which impedes the free movement of pedestrians or vehicles. As such, residents are required to ensure that public right-of-way abutting their property are kept free of overgrowth and intersections are obstruction free. Trees located within the first (11) feet of the curb are the responsibility of the Town. Please call if you have a question or notice any condition that may pose a hazard to the community.

# REMINDERS FOR SPECIAL EVENT NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTY

1. Canvass everyone in the neighborhood to find a date that works best. Visit each neighbor to

inform them of your plans and get feedback from them at least before you are tentatively scheduled to host the event. Complete a block party survey. Keep your neighbors informed as the event date approaches and make sure they understand they are a part of celebration. A block party letter and neighbor survey can be obtained at the Town office.

- 2. Obtain necessary permits if you block off your street. Permits must be obtained 30 days in advance for block parties. A Block Party Permit is required to block off any of a residential street for neighborhood block party purposes,
- 3. Remind your neighbors 1 week before the party that the street will be closed. It is important to keep your neighbors informed.
- 4. Place the "No Parking" signs 24-48 hours prior to the party at each end of the street with the date and time of the street closure. Town Hall can supply "No Parking" signs once the event is permitted.
- 5. We recommend that you communicate with your neighbors a week prior to the Block Party. Communicating with your neighbors help to ensure all are notified and remember not to park on the street. 6. Your street must be clean and open to traffic no later than 10 PM.

### **CODE COMPLIANCE**

#### **CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES**

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00

Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.

#### SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



**Sec. 4-10** (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to

remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

#### **VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY**

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <a href="https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request">https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request</a> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

#### GRASS, WEEDS, AND OVERGROWTH



Obstructions:

- 1. Residents are reminded that with the nice weather more and more residents are out walking. Please keep the walkways and sidewalks clear of overgrowth, obstructions and hanging limbs.
- 2. If the tree obstructing the sidewalk or roadway is in the planting box, please contact the Department of Public Works.
- 3. Keep vegetation from obstructing the view near intersections.

Lot Maintenance:

- 1. Residents are reminded to make sure your grass is cut before it reaches 8 inches in height.
- 2. Also, the planting strip between the sidewalk and the street is your responsibility to maintain
- 3. If you are going on vacation, make sure you make arrangements to have your grass cut for you.

Be sure to take into consideration that the weather can be unpredictable, but the grass still needs to be cut.
