

## TREE AGREEMENT REQUEST FORM

The Town of Cheverly is planting trees at no cost to its residents on their private property provided that the owners of the property agree to such planting and; The undersigned property owner(s) hereby agree(s) to allow a tree (or trees) to be planted on their property and to allow the Town to come onto their private property for purposes of planting the tree.

NOTE THEREFORE in consideration of the above premises the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Undersigned hereby certify that he/she/they is/are the owners of the above described property.
2. Undersigned property owner(s) agree(s) that for one (1) year after the date of this Agreement, the Town of Cheverly employees may enter onto the above property to plant a tree (or trees) at a location on the property that is mutually agreeable to both the Town and the undersigned.
3. The undersigned property owner(s) agrees to cooperate with Town employees and to refrain from removing the tree or the supporting stakes, as applicable, for the one (1) year duration of this Agreement.
4. The Town agrees to restore promptly any disturbance of the land caused by the Town activity in planting the tree(s).
5. At the end of one (1) year from the date of this agreement the tree(s) shall become the sole responsibility of the property owner(s).
6. This Agreement represents the entire agreement of the parties hereto:

## LOWER VALUE

Fringe Tree - Bald Cypress - Red Bud - Tulip Poplar
