Cheverly Receives Sustainable Maryland

Certification: On September 15th, David Kneipp received the Sustainable Maryland Certification on behalf of the Town of Cheverly at the Maryland Municipal League Fall Conference. Cheverly becomes one of only twenty two Maryland Municipalities to receive the award.

David Kneipp was the project leader of the Cheverly Green Team, which submitted the required documentation. In order to qualify for this award Cheverly needed to demonstrate that they had practices and policies in place that met or exceeded specific criteria.

Cheverly's submission was unique as it reflected not just the efforts of the Town Government (Green Purchasing Policy, Propane Powered vehicles, Windmill, Solid Waste Policies), but it primarily featured the efforts of our community organizations (Green Infrastructure Plan, Community Garden, Community Market). This award truly reflects the work of the citizens of our community.

Capital Plaza Concerts Continue to Plague

Cheverly: During September, many residents of Cheverly were affected by loud music originating from Capital Plaza. While the acoustics are difficult to understand, music from Capital Plaza can be heard in many parts of Cheverly as if it was next door.

There is one final concert planned for this year, scheduled for September 28th. Town Officials are working to either; 1) change the stage direction, 2) get baffles placed above the speakers or 3) get the concert cancelled. While the property owner and local officials have been sympathetic we have yet to come to a resolution

As I write this article (on September 21st) I am hopeful that we will have a resolution. I apologize to everyone who has been affected by this issue. I have been assured this contract will not be renewed in the future. I also want to thank everyone who stepped forward and agreed to have their name included as complainants.

Car Break-ins: Many residents in town have experienced the depressing feeling of opening their car doors in the morning only to find a mess caused by someone searching for change or other valuables. I too have had this occur.

Last month, we happily reported that we had apprehended a suspect and hoped that we would have a respite from this crime. Unfortunately, it still continues. There are two things the Chief and I ask you to do: 1) Lock your car! Few cars have had their windows broken; this really is a crime of convenience. 2) If you see someone looking in car windows as they walk down the street please call the Office On Duty @ 301-789-5090 and report suspicious activity.

Town Council to Review Pet Codes: The Town Council has been asked to review the section of Town Code dealing with Pets. Over the last few months some residents have voiced concern regarding the number of pets being walked without a leash, dogs on private property that are not confined, and of course the never ending discussion about picking up after your pet.

We have heard from neighbors who are afraid of unleashed dogs, but we also have heard from dog owners who walk their dogs on leashes and are concerned when unleashed dogs approach in an uncontrolled manner. While Cheverly is an extremely Pet Friendly town, and will continue to be, it is important that Pet Owners respect the rights of others who are using the streets and sidewalks.

Current Town Code requires Pets to be on a leash and requires them to be confined when on private property. The code was written prior to the use of electric fences, so there will be a discussion about the need to identify the existence of electric fences.

Please know that this discussion will occur over a 4 month period and everyone will have an opportunity to participate.

Invasive Bamboo: In September the Council began a discussion on how to contain the spread of Invasive Bamboo from private property onto neighboring public and private property. Some residents have planted Invasive Bamboo as a screening plant because it grows very quickly and creates a thick screen.

Unfortunately, it is very difficult to control the spread of Bamboo and residents have not created the necessary barriers to ensure it doesn't spread to other properties. Many other Municipalities have begun to address this problem by requiring residents to implement a proper barrier in order to contain the spread of Bamboo.

Please know that this discussion will occur over a four month period and everyone will have an opportunity to participate.

Maryland Park and Planning Discusses

Bike Paths: On September 11th, MNPCCP hosted a meeting at the Cheverly Town Hall to discuss the future of the Anacostia Bike Trail System. With the able assistance of our own RJ Eldridge the meeting explored the new bike trail that will connect to Bladensburg to Nationals Park as well as a discussion of options for connecting Cheverly to the new trails.

Thirty Eight new Rain Barrels in Cheverly:

The Green Infrastructure Committee hosted a Rain Barrel Workshop on September 20th in Town Hall. For a \$50 fee residents were able to build and learn about how to use rain barrels.

Rain Barrels are a great way to prevent rain water from rapidly entering our streams, and for storing water for future use in your gardens. The 38 new rain barrels that were built in this workshop will prevent 2,090 gallons of rain water from entering our streams every time it rains.

Twelve residents purchased two rain barrels, qualifying them for a \$50 dollar storm water rebate from the county. If you are interested, please look for another workshop in the Spring.

REWARD MONEY – The CPD is committed to using every means necessary to close out open investigative cases. In line with this, the Town is offering rewards up to \$1,000.00 for information that leads to the identification of any person committing a crime in Cheverly, with particular attention to the crimes of robbery, burglary, and theft from auto. WOMEN'S SELF-DEFENSE CLASS - The Cheverly Police Department has sponsored several women's self-defense classes over the years that have been well attended and useful for community members. I have been asked several times lately about offering another such class and I am looking for community interest. If you are a woman and are interested in attending such a class, please contact the Cheverly Police Department at (301) 341-1055 and express your interest. We will take your name and telephone number and contact you directly with further details of a future class. Thanks ladies!

TIP OF THE DAY – Look at alarm systems more towards the perspective of a notification device rather than a deterrent device. Because alarm companies make every effort to notify the homeowner before notifying the police of a current alarm, most criminals who commit B&E's know that they have a certain window of opportunity before the arrival of the police. This window may be up to 10 minutes or so, giving these suspects plenty of time to remove items from the home. On the other hand, an alarm system is useful for residents on vacation or who are away from the home for long periods of time. The alarm notification ensures that the police will be notified in the absence of the owner and can take specific steps to protect the residence until the owner can be notified. Be sure to tell the CPD when you are away and request a house check. In addition to the other required information, make sure you tell the CPD whether you have an alarm and how you can be contacted in the event the alarm is activated while you are away.

ELDERWATCH – The CPD regularly visits the Town's elderly and infirmed in an effort to keep this important segment of the community up to date on crime issues and neighborhood events. These 10-15 minute visits are designed, not only for information sharing, but also to socialize. If any Cheverly resident knows of any elderly or infirmed persons living alone whom they believe would benefit from such contact, please notify the police station (301-341-1055).

What Is a "Cheverly Village? The concept of a Cheverly village started with an awareness that many Cheverly residents would like to call Cheverly "home" for a lifetime. Simply put, a Cheverly Village would coordinate volunteers and other supports so that our residents could "age in place" and have opportunities to continue as valued members of a vibrant Intergenerational Cheverly.

What Kinds of Services Might a Cheverly Village Provide? Several town organizations already provide supportive services and activities to help our residents "age in place". A Cheverly Village would not only encourage continued involvement of town organizations, but also coordinate additional supports to meet a variety of needs. Among these needs are the following:

- *More social involvement with all age groups in the community as well as among fellow seniors,
- *Transportation assistance,
- *Assistance with household tasks,
- *Volunteer opportunities to tap into seniors' knowledge, skills, and energy, and
- *Medical/health Supports.

So, What's Our Cheverly Village Going to Look Like and What Will It Do? The short answer here is "we don't know yet." We do know that we want a Cheverly village to help our people age in place. How it will help and how it will be organized is still very open. There are several established "villages" in the Washington area, and there is no single model or size that fits all. The existing villages vary in the services they offer and how they are run—some solely by volunteers and others by paid staff and volunteers. Some are incorporated as non-profits and some are not. Some include annual membership fees for those who want access to the services and some do not, offering limited free services and/or specific fee-based services. Some simply publicize the available private and government services and some also provide basic services to meet the needs cited above.

The Cheverly Village Planning Committee is continuing to do research on the various village models and, more importantly, continuing to talk with Cheverly residents to learn about seniors' needs and what a Cheverly Village could do to meet those needs.

LEAF COLLECTION PROCEDURES

Vacuuming Leaves: Every street in Cheverly is scheduled for at least 2 vacuuming sweeps.



Rake leaves **between** the curb and sidewalk - not on the street or sidewalk.

- Keep leaves free of twigs, branches, metal, concrete and other debris that can jam or damage the equipment.
- Please do not park cars on the street on the assigned collection day
- Be considerate of your neighbors. Only rake to curb when your pick up day is imminent. Raking too early, allows the leaves to blow into your neighbors yard.

Bag or Container Leaves: Yard waste is collected on <u>MONDAYS</u>. Put bags or containers at the curb on Sunday evening. Place your leaves in **Paper Bags or a Trash can only**. Yard waste includes leaves, grass, brush, twigs, etc. Do not put any dirt, rocks, or other trash/debris in these bags.
