Cheverly Sector Plan: As always, I am writing this prior to the October 28th meeting at Bladensburg High School. Hopefully everyone attended the meeting to give their input regarding the future of our area.

The single biggest driver of the future is "what will happen on Hospital Hill when the hospital moves?" Yes, this is three to five years out, but now is the time to start discussing this. I expect that the goal would be to have high quality, more dense housing on the hill. If that is the outcome then the density should drive other amenities for our area, including the Tuxedo Road and Landover Road areas.

So if you missed the meeting on the 28th, please stay tuned for future meetings. Also keep an eye on our website where we will continue to post information.

Columbia Park Bridge: This is the bridge that goes over Route 50 near the 7/11. Oh, you mean the bridge with the lousy lights, difficult pedestrian crossing, bad pavement and way too many trucks for a residential road? Oh yeah, that bridge!

Town Staff and the Town Council have long advocated for improvements to this bridge. Unfortunately, road construction funds are limited and the original plans for improvements wipe out the Lower Beaverdam Park area. However, improvements or replacements are needed to truly unleash any kind of development improvements in the area. Imagine adding hundreds of more housing units without addressing this problem. Some thoughts have been to: build a truck traffic route closer to Kenilworth Ave, create a pedestrian bridge to off load the pedestrian traffic, or simply to expand and improve this bridge.

Fixing the traffic issues in the Tuxedo area is a key piece of the Cheverly Sector Plan, so please consider this as you give your input.

6301 Kilmer Street Property: A special thank you to everyone that came out to visit the property and drop off their ideas. It was a great day, and I'm sure more than 100 people came to visit. Public Works spent hours clearing the property of both garbage and low lying brush. The effort they put in showed, and virtually everyone who came was impressed by the size of the space and its beauty. Thanks to the Planning Board who hosted the event and received input from everyone. Of course the big question is, "what's it gonna become?" Well we don't really know the answer to that yet. Best guess is that like many of our parks it will have a little bit of everything. We are in the process of asking Neighborhood Design Center and MNCPPC to assist us in filtering through the input and developing some concept plans. This process should take a couple of months. So we will see you in the early spring with conceptual designs for your input. While there are still more questions than answers, two issues are at the forefront:

- What to do with the building?: The existing home is well constructed and relatively small. It has a very nice living room with a fireplace that looks out onto the yard. However, the remaining rooms are choppy and the home is likely not ADA accessible. There seems to be equal sentiment for taking the home down as there is for identifying a use for the space. We need to identify what actual use would occur at the space and then identify cost associated with the options. Another consideration is, while Town residents clearly articulated a need for additional space, is this location and configuration of space appropriate.
- Parking for the site? The residents in the area have been very gracious and open to any of the uses identified. However, they have expressed concern regarding parking and traffic congestion. Today, many homes in the area have no driveway and little street parking, additionally this is one of the few egresses from town. No matter what the use we eventually decide on, it should have the needed parking on site.

Pepco Tree Trimming: The Town Council hosted representatives from Pepco at their October 22nd work session. (This meeting happened after I wrote this). The purpose of the meeting was to finalize tree trimming plans for public property trees and to allow residents to ask questions regarding Pepco's tree trimming policies. The Town Council is attempting to minimize the impact of the Tree Trimming, while ensuring that electrical reliability remains high. We all remember the significant power outages that we use to experience prior to the line upgrades and vegetation management Pepco performed 4 years ago. We have no desire to return to those experiences.

Please be mindful that Pepco does NOT trim trees for beauty. This has been a long discussion that has occurred across the state. Pepco trims trees according to state laws and Department of Natural Resources regulations. If they are trimming your private trees, you may attempt to influence them as much as feasible.

FREE Trees Available, Planted in your Yard: I

simply can not emphasize enough that the future of Cheverly's tree canopy relies on you!! The town plants hundreds of trees along the streets and in parks, however there are so many limitations that prevent strong and healthy street trees. Small tree boxes that limit root systems and electrical wires that limit the heights of trees are the two major problems.

However, trees planted in yards do not have these issues and can grow to be hundreds of years old. Yes, that means you won't be around to have to cut it down. Instead you will benefit from the shade in summer and the growth in your property values.

So please take advantage of the best deal in town. Call Public Works at 301-773-2666 and have them plant a beautiful new tree in your front or back yard.

Leaf Collection: Look inside the newsletter for the Cheverly Leaf Collection schedule for this Fall. Public Works does a great job of collecting un-bagged leaves at the curb; however it is important that you bring your leaves to the curb during the proper time for your street. Many times I get complaints that Public Works has asked residents to bring their leaves back from the curb, because it is not their scheduled time. Public Works does this because the leaves will blow into streets and neighbors yards causing more work for others. So please take advantage of the curb side service, but make sure to bring your leaves to the curb at the right time.

Of course, you can always bag your leaves and take them out for Monday Yard Waste Pick-Up. Please Remember: No Plastic Bags Allowed. Your leaves will not be picked up if they are in plastic bags.

Fall Clean-Up; Bundled in four foot segments:

During the Fall many folks take the opportunity to clean their yards, sticks, branches, and shrubs all come to the curb side. Please remember to cut all awkwardly shaped vegetation into four foot segments and bundle them with twine or rope. While this may seem a tedious task it improves the service of our Public Works Staff and prevents them from many unnecessary cuts and scratches.

SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS AND BAIT

CARS – In an effort to combat what has become the #1 crime in Cheverly, theft from auto, the Cheverly Police Department has purchased a

multi-lensed camera system that can easily be mounted in or on a number of objects, including vehicles. This system has both night and day capability, and can be rapidly deployed or moved as necessary. When mounted inside a vehicle, the vehicle can be moved at will dependent on crime mapping or intelligence information. This vehicle capability will be deployed throughout Cheverly in the coming months. Thieves beware!

DID YOU KNOW THAT THE CHEVERLY POLICE DEPARTMENT WILL DISPOSE OF, FREE OF CHARGE, THE FOLLOWING:

1. All unwanted firearms, magazines, ammunition, or other weapons. Please call the station first to ensure a police officer is available to receive the unloaded weapon. In cases where a resident is unable or unwilling to unload any firearm, please call the station and an officer will be dispatched to take the weapon. This applies to all handguns, rifles, shotguns, BB or pellet guns, or any other dangerous weapon. It is the policy of the Department that all such weapons will be utilized by the Department or destroyed, and not traded in for discounted law enforcement weapons or purchases.

2. All unwanted prescription medicines with the exception of syringes. The station maintains a prescription medicine container in the lobby and residents may utilize this service unattended. Please cross out any names or addresses on the prescription container and ensure all lids are tightly fastened. All such medicines are destroyed.

3. All controlled dangerous substances (marijuana, cocaine, etc.). Resident who find such substances are encouraged to call the station first to ensure a police officer is available to receive the substance. In cases where a resident is unable or unwilling to collect the substance, please call the station and an officer will be dispatched to take such substances. Confidentiality will always be employed in these circumstances. Again, all such substances will be destroyed.

4. Other found property. The Department makes an attempt to identify the owner of all found or recovered property. All unclaimed property is auctioned or sold, if possible, with the funds used to purchase police equipment.

NEW! Rain barrels. Slow down the rain water coming off your roof, cool it off, spread it out, soak it in. Buy your rain barrel from the town for \$50, get your rebate from Prince George's County, total cost, \$0. Call Cheverly Public Works, 301-773-2666.

Compost bins -Turn your yard waste & vegetable scraps into black gold for your gardens. Available from Public Works for \$20.

Free trees. Save air conditioning costs, filter stormwater, prevent erosion. The town will plant native trees in your yard. Cost, \$0. Contact Public Works.

Recycling. Keep recyclables out of our landscape and our landfills. The town collects plastic, paper, glass, newspaper, cardboard, and even electronic devices every Wednesday.

Used motor oil collection. Keep pollutants out of our streams. Our storm drains empty directly into Cheverly's streams. Never pour oil into our storm drains. The Town of Cheverly provides a tank for residents' used motor oil near the Public Works building.

RAIN BARRELS – ONLY \$50

Plus Full Rebate From PG County

The Town of Cheverly purchased 100 rain barrels and subsidized them so the cost to residents is only \$50 each (retail price \$100 to \$120).

Even better, the PG RainCheck Rebate Program will rebate residents 100% of the cost once you've installed them and completed the CB Trust online application at (or search PG RainCheck): http://tinyurl.com/kkb2qxb

After getting quotes from multiple vendors, we found this great EarthMinded 50-gallon rain barrel. It's easy to install and comes with all the hardware needed. No need to cut your downspout. Just drill a small hole with the cutter provided. Then install the diverter. That makes it easy to turn off and on when winter comes. See the rain barrel and details at: http://tinyurl.com/pjjn9td

To purchase rain barrels go to the Community Center to make payment & then take your receipt to Public Work to pick up your rain barrels between 9am to 4pm. Make sure to keep the receipt. It'll be needed for the rebate. Most households will need at least two and possibly up to six rain barrels depending on the number of downspouts you have. The PG RainCheck Rebate Program also offers rebates on cisterns, rain gardens, permeable pavers, removal of pavement, tree canopy (in Cheverly the Town provides trees), and green roofs.

Homeowners can receive up to \$4,000 in rebates per home to implement any combination of the seven stormwater best management practices (BMP's) with \$3 million available this year. These BMP's can add value to your home at little or no cost to you. After installing a BMP you can request a reduction of your Clean Water fee that is paid as part of your PG property tax.

LEAF COLLECTION PROCEDURES

Vacuuming Leaves: Every street in Cheverly is scheduled for at least 2 vacuuming sweeps.

Rake leaves **between** the curb and sidewalk - not on the street or sidewalk.

- Keep leaves free of twigs, branches, metal, concrete and other debris that can jam or damage the equipment.
- Please do not park cars on the street on the assigned collection day
- Be considerate of your neighbors. Only rake to curb when your pick up day is imminent. Raking too early, allows the leaves to blow into your neighbors yard.

Bag Leaves: Yard waste is collected on <u>MONDAYS</u>. Put bags at the curb on Sunday evening. Use **Paper Bags or Trash cans only.** Yard waste includes leaves, grass, brush, twigs, etc. Do not put any dirt, rocks, or other trash/debris in these bags. Sticks, branches and twigs are to be tied up or placed in trash cans.
