Shortest FYI Ever! Hey folks, there is a lot of good news out there. However, I am feeling pretty poorly so this FYI will be remarkably short. Enjoy your February; hope to see you around town. **Residential Re-Entry Center will not come to Cheverly:** Thanks to the efforts of Cheverly residents, the Town Council, our County Councilwoman Andrea Harrison and the County Executive the Volunteers of America Chesapeake (VOAC) has decided to look for a new site for their 142 bed facility.

Councilwoman Harrison reached out to the Prince George's Economic Development Corporation to assist them in identifying a new site that would better meet VOAC's need and the needs of local communities.

The Cheverly Town Council will continue to carefully monitor the situation and work with the county council to ensure that any legislation that allows a Re-Entry Center in an industrial zone, includes criteria that ensures that facilities of this type are prevented from existing within ½ mile of recreational areas .

CRIME IN 2016: The Town of Cheverly enjoyed a 12% reduction in crime in 2016 over 2015, which amounts to a total reduction in crime over the last 10 years of 26%. Crime was down in nearly every individual category*, as outlined below:

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Robbery (Including Carjacking's)	-25%
Assault	-6%
Burglary	-30%
Vandalism	-30%
Theft	-8%
Auto Theft	-40%

* There were two homicides in the Town in 2016, as opposed to none in 2015. Both murders occurred during the same incident and the suspect, who was known almost immediately, was apprehended within 24 hours.

More information on crime in 2016 will be available at the next C-PACT Meeting on February 8, 2017.

THE OTHER GOOD NEWS IS..... More than half of all reported crime could easily be reduced or deterred if everyone would follow the simple steps listed below:

- 1. Be L.E.W.D. and lock every window and door when your vehicle or home is
 - unattended.

2. Keep all valuables out of plain view, and that includes loose change in vehicles.

3. Light up the exterior of your home with LED bulbs and utilize photo-electric cells.

Better yet, sign up for a free home security survey. 4. Record the serial numbers of all valuables and/or inscribe your Maryland driver's

license number followed by the letters MD (Maryland) on expensive items. This

driver's license information can be accessed by any police officer in the United States.

5. Call the Police Department when you are going out of the area so that officers can

6. Join and attend C-PACT (Cheverly - Police and Citizens Together), our local

Neighborhood Watch Group. The next scheduled meeting is Wednesday, February 8, 2017.

C-PACT II, OR SOMETHING LIKE IT: When C-PACT (Cheverly – Police And Citizens Together), Cheverly's Neighborhood Watch Program, was first formed in 2005, it was designed to serve as a conduit to provide information and resources directly to residents. In many ways, it was great success because C-PACT sponsored Public Safety Days, held information meetings on home safety, the Metro, and crime prevention, and sponsored women's self-defense classes and other community policing events. During the last 11 years, however, resident participation has dropped off. Some of this drop off is the result of the full social calendar available in Cheverly, conflicting community and sporting events, and quite frankly, some is because C-PACT's message has become somewhat stale. To counter this staleness and open the C-PACT experience up to a greater number of residents, the Cheverly Police has designed an innovative format known as "Street Meets." In the case of Street Meets, the Department will pack up its vehicles, equipment, information boards, and handouts and hold open air meetings at various locations around the Town. Police officers, investigators, the code enforcement officer, the chief, and other Town officials will be available to answer questions, provide information, distribute forms, and display crime mapping. Notifications up upcoming Street Meets will be made via the Newsletter, the web (News and Announcements), and the electronic message board. More information will be forthcoming!

COLUMBIA PARK ROAD TRAFFIC

ENFORCEMENT UPDATE: Town and police department officials recently met with officials from the County's Department of Transportation regarding traffic and pedestrian issues on Columbia Park Road and the adjacent bridges abutting Cheverly Avenue. This meeting proved very productive, with the Town proposing new pedestrian signals, roadway improvements, changes to signage, and permanent channelization on Columbia Park Road for traffic turning left into the Metro Station. County officials were impressed with the Town's presentation and promised to work with the Town and SHA on improvements in the near future.

WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking

A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more. The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed.

PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
- On any courts,
- On the even-numbered side of all streets,
- (exception) On the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belleview Avenue.

<u>NOTE</u>: The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

PRIORITIES: The snow removal operations work under the following priorities: 1.) Cheverly Avenue 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valleyway, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive; 3.) all other streets.

TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day). Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.

REUSE-REDUCE-REPAIR-RECYCLE-COMPOST

Every year, the United States generates approximately 230 million tons of "trash"--about 4.6 pounds per person per day. Less than one-quarter of it is recycled; the rest is incinerated or buried in landfills. With a little forethought, we could reuse or recycle more than 70 percent of the landfill waste, which includes valuable materials such as glass, metal, and paper. This would reduce the demand on virgin sources of these materials and eliminate potentially severe environmental, economic, and public health problems. Have you considered what you can do to lower your trash generation per day?

SAFETY REMINDER: We ask residents to remember that your neighbors who walk to Metro, or children walking to school, and the hard working Mail Carriers are exposed to dangerous conditions when sidewalks are not cleared in a timely manner. Failure to comply with Town Code could result in fines.

After January 31st, cost will be \$350 for Prince George's County residents and \$450 for non-county residents. Costs includes the revised Master Gardeners Handbook, multiple handouts and booklets, and other administrative costs. Interns do 40 hours of voluntary service their first year and include the following required hours for certification:

- Clinton Demonstration Gardens (Required 4 hours)
- Plant clinics at Farmers Markets (Required 4 hours)
- Riverdale historic museum gardens (Required 2 hours)
- Youth gardening (2 Hours)
- Prince George's County fairs (2 hours)

- Administrative work (2 hours)
- Grow It Eat It (2 hours)
- Bay-Wise Activities (2 hours)

Attend at least 6 monthly meetings (Required) Master Gardener volunteers in their second year and thereafter will do 20 hours of voluntary service and 10 hours of education to maintain their certification.
