Looking Forward to Spring: Hopefully by the time the Newsletter arrives at your door, Spring will be in the air. We've had a long winter and as of March 23rd, winter is still with us. However, May is right around the corner and when May comes Cheverly jumps into action. So get ready for Truck Touch, The Garden Club Plant Sale, the Community Market, Peace Month, and of course Cheverly Day.

The Newsletter is a great resource for information about Town events, so please take a moment to skim through and see what is happening in town. Our community organizations give so much of their time to make every event special. Please take a moment to attend some of these events, I'm willing to bet you'll have a great time and make new friends.

The Budget is coming, the Budget is coming: The Town Administrator is busy putting the last touches on Cheverly's 2015 Annual Budget, and he will be presenting the first draft to the Town Council on April 10th. (A desk copy will be available for review at Town Hall.)

Once the budget is presented to the Town Council the budget process moves rapidly. The Town Council will consider the budget in their April 24th, May 8th, and May 22nd Town Council Meetings. Every resident is welcome to attend these sessions and provide input.

Last year I provided a detailed overview of Cheverly's revenues and expenses. Rather than use a lot of newsletter space, I invite you to go on-line and re-read the newsletters from March and April of last year to find out where the

How does the Budget look so far? As reported in previous newsletters, the town is in excellent financial condition. Our year ending FY2013 Fund Balance is slightly more than \$2M. While we don't have a complete picture of the results from FY2014, we expect that we will continue to have a strong fund balance heading into FY2015.

While I know this may sound repetitive, this is the result of a three year financial plan the Town Council put into place in FY2013. At that time we raised the Town's Tax Rate, which due to significant drops in home assessments effectively froze tax revenues at FY2012 levels. The Town Council also put in place measures to limit spending during this three year period, while attempting to find new sources of revenue. FY2015 is the last year of this three year plan and it looks like we will be successful exceeding the goals laid out in FY2013.

However, in FY2015 we anticipate needing to spend more money on Capital Improvements in the town. The major expenditure will be re-paving roads. If you recall, we allocated \$300K on road projects in last year budget. This money has not been spent, and most likely won't be spent until FY2015 (July) because WSSC has not completed their work. The Town Council plans to add approximately \$250K to this fund in FY2015.

What Capital Projects are being Considered? Below is a list of projects that the Town Council reviewed in the February Worksession, and will be discussed throughout the budget process. Please don't be overly concerned about the estimates associated with the line items below. The estimates will be fine-tuned as we progress in the process. The Capital items are listed in a draft priority order.

We will not be able to fund all of these items in the coming year, so some will be moved to other fiscal years, some will be pared down and others simply eliminated.

Guess Who's Coming to Town? Ledo's Pizza will soon be coming to the Aldi Shopping Center. Current plans (which seemingly always get delayed) call for the Ledo's to open by late summer. The shopping center management company indicated that the Nail Shop has closed, the Chinese Restaurant will move to the Nail Shop space and Ledo's will move into the space where the Chinese Space was. While details are few, Ledo's does expect to have sit down area inside.

Why is that Large Lot Empty East of Route 50 on Route 202? Just east of the Landover Metro Center a multi acre lot has remained vacant for over 7 years. Recently Stanley-Martin a development company purchased the rights to develop the lot and is planning to build a community of townhomes and two over two condos. Floor plans for the Condos will range from 1,400 to 2,200 SF and the Townhomes will be larger.

The Town Council and the Cheverly Planning Board have long advocated for more mixed use taller development as the site is so near to Metro. However, the site was initially approved through the Preliminary Site Plan (PSP) and Detailed Site Plan (DSP) process as it is currently designed. Due to minor changes in the layout of the development, the builder will need to once again go through the PSP and DSP process. Construction is not expected until at least summer of 2015.

Well, What about the Old Tuxedo / Cheverly Fire Station? New Horizons, is an organization dedicated to the training of developmentally disabled individuals for the purpose of providing meaningful employment and assisting workers to enter the mainstream workforce. New Horizons has experienced significant success in fulfilling this mission. Prince George's County gave them a 20 year lease for the building, in an effort to help them achieve this mission.

This will be New Horizon's third location. Their primary location is in the Trade Zone area off Route 301. The Fire Station location will house 45 people, 20 staff and 25 developmentally disabled workers. Their hours of operation are primarily 8:00am to 5:00pm. The primary work function performed at the Fire Station will be document shredding.

I had the opportunity to discuss the facility with Peter Holden the leader of the organization this month. He indicated he wanted very much for his business to become part of the fabric of Cheverly. All recycling will happen inside the building and all storage will happen in the building. Peter indicated a willingness to work with community organizations and potentially identify opportunities for utilizing meeting rooms in the building after hours. More later...

WARNING: HOAX SUSPECTED IN "FIRE INSPECTION SCHEME" - The Prince

George's County Fire/Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Department has been made aware of a possible scheme to defraud County residents of money. The Office of the Fire Marshal has received several inquiries and a copy of a flyer that is being distributed seeking a \$25 payment for a "fire inspection." The flyer carries a title of FIRE PREVENTION OFFICE and their address.

If you have received one of these flyers, do not pay any money and contact the Fire/EMS Department Office of the Fire Marshal at 301-583-1830 or the Cheverly Police directly. If someone passing out these flyers confronts you, call 9-1-1 immediately and report the incident. The Fire/EMS Department does charge fire inspection fees in certain circumstances, however, they have indicated they would never solicit inspections or fees in this method.

All true Fire Inspectors will display a badge and credentials identifying themselves as a member of the Fire/EMS Department. If you have a question or concern about the ID of a Fire/EMS Department employee call 301-583-2200. The Fire/EMS Department 24-hour Watch Office maintains an updated roster with all employees names and will be able to verify identify of anyone in question. If you feel threatened at any time, call 911.

PEPCO WARNS CUSTOMERS OF FAKE INVOICES

- PEPCO is warning its customers that scammers posing as third-party energy suppliers are sending fake utility bills via email to some utility customers around the County. The email asks that customers click on a link contained within the email. It is suspected that, by clicking the link, the customer's computer could become infected with a virus or malware.

Pepco asks customers to only pay their utility bill by visiting pepco.com or by sending the hard copy of the remittance portion of the invoice through the mail. Customers should not open any email asking that payment be made on their utility bill unless sent by PEPCO or by the customers' respective third party energy supplier.

Many companies, including Pepco, contact customers in person or via phone for various reasons. If someone claims to represent a company, whether the company is PEPCO or another entity, it is important that customers take precautions to verify that the person is affiliated with the company, especially if that person is requesting an immediate monetary payment. When addressing past due accounts,

PEPCO never endorses a specific form of payment. Instead, multiple payment options are always given to the customer.

PEPCO advises customers to ask for official photo identification from any person who shows up at their door. Employees from reputable companies, such as PEPCO, will carry official company identification cards. If proper identification cannot be produced, customers should notify the Cheverly Police and the company with whom the individual claims to be associated.

Similarly, if someone calls saying they represent a certain company, customers should ask them to verify their identity and affiliation. If customers have any doubt about the validity of a person's claim to represent PEPCO, they should call the company immediately at 202-833-7500.

SPEED TRAILER DATA FOR THE 5800 BLOCK OF DEWEY STREET – During the month of February, 2014, a total of 2,458 vehicles utilized the 5800 block of Dewey Street. Of that total, 94% of the vehicles were detected doing less than 19 mph. In addition, 149 vehicles were detected doing less than 24 mph, 10 vehicles were detected doing greater than 30 mph, and only 1 vehicle was detected doing in excess of 39 mph.
