New Stage to be Unveiled on Cheverly Day: Years ago, there was a permanent stage in Town Park made of wood. Unfortunately it was impossible to maintain and was torn down. This year, a new stage returns thanks to the assistance of Program Open Space Funds.

The newly designed stage will hopefully be used for multiple purposes. However, it's first use will be for the Music Stage for Cheverly Day.

FY16 Budget: The Town Administrator distributed the first draft of the FY16 Budget in the April 9th Town Meeting. As of now (April 20th) we have not had time to go through it, and more information will be forthcoming. However, here are the main points of the first draft:

- As planned Cheverly will have a \$900,000 deficit for FY2015. The Council had planned for this deficit level, due to the need to repave the roads disturbed by WSSC.
- Fortunately, WSSC paved most of the roads so we saved a significant amount of funds, However, The Council had the unplanned purchase of the property at 6301 Kilmer for \$300,000 (not in the budget).
- So preliminary results for FY2015 reflects a \$900,000 deficit, and a remaining fund balance of \$1,000,000.
- The initial FY2016 Budget calls for a deficit of \$200,000, which will be discussed over the next two months
- The initial FY2016 Budget keeps the tax rate at .58 / \$100. However keep in mind that because your assessments increased this means an increase in your total tax bill.

Operating expenses remain relatively flat at 4.8M. There are capital expenses for: a police vehicle, payments on debt for trash truck and police department, road projects, and park development.

Look for a mid month FYI on the progress of the budget.

Dog Park, Splash Park, Arboretum, Coffee House, Meeting Space: These are just a few of the ideas that have been expressed regarding the newly purchased property at 6301 Kilmer Ave. Not surprisingly these ideas were already expressed in the Envision Cheverly Plan that was conducted by the Cheverly Planning Board.

The Town Council has asked the Planning Board to facilitate the Public Input phase of the planning for this new property. We are asking the Planning Board to work with the Green Infrastructure and other citizens to assist us in ensuring that everyone has an opportunity to provide input, before decisions are made. They will make appearances at all Cheverly events in an effort to ensure all are heard. Any citizen wishing to participate in facilitating input is welcome to contact their Councilmember and ask to join in.

We anticipate this process to be done in three phases: Public Input: (May thru June), Conceptual Designs (July thru August), Community Review (Sept thru November).

Pepco is Coming to Town: This Spring, Cheverly will once again see Asplundh trucks throughout town. The Public Works Director and I sat down to discuss the upcoming process with representatives of Pepco. Pepco has a four year trimming schedule and this is Cheverly's year. Based on State Legislation, Pepco has specific guidelines regarding how trees are trimmed. In our conversation, we mentioned that during the last cycle the tree trimming was quite aggressive, and we expressed our desire that Pepco would be more conservative during this current cycle. However, it is important for all of us to realize that reliability is critical, and since Pepco performed their tree trimming and infrastructure improvements, Cheverly's electrical reliability has improved greatly.

Below is a list of tree categories and how Pepco handles the communication.

- Street Trees: All Street Trees and most trees that are within 11 feet of the curb are the property of the Town of Cheverly. Pepco will provide the Town of Cheverly a comprehensive plan for tree trimming and aquire the town's approval. While Pepco still has the regulatory authority to execute their plan, we will work closely with Pepco to ensure the plan is not too aggressive.
- **Private Property Trees:** Pepco coordinates directly with the property owner. Pepco must gain your authorization prior to any tree trimming on your property. This negotiation is between the property owner and Pepco.

- Right of Ways / Alleyways: Pepco has the authority to trim as they wish in "right of ways" where poles travel in alleyways behind our homes. Town officials and Pepco will review where these "right of ways" legally exist to ensure their is no confusion.

However, based on previous experience, these locations are frequently where controversy occurs. Some homeowners feel that these areas, are their private property. Unfortunately, while the Property Owner may utilize this land as their own, Pepco has the authority to keep these areas clear. If you have questions, please contact me.

WSSC is Coming to Cheverly Avenue: WSSC recently completed the bidding to replace the water mains along Cheverly Avenue and work is scheduled to begin in spring. Obviously, WSSC construction on Cheverly Avenue is going to cause more heartburn than their work has caused in other parts of the town. The Town Council asks for your patience during this process as I am sure there will be delays. Furthermore, we ask that you manage your speed as you look for alternative routes through town. WSSC attended the 3/12 Town Meeting and answered many questions posed by the Town Council regarding traffic control, construction, and communication to residents. Message from the Chief Buddy Robshaw (policechief@cheverly-md.gov)

ASK THE CHIEF: Question #1: Can I legally store an unregistered vehicle on my property? Answer #1: You can store an unreg-

istered vehicle on your property if the vehicle is contained entirely within a garage; otherwise, storing an unregistered vehicle (technically abandoned) on your property is a violation of the Town Code and the vehicle is subject to impound by the police at your expense. In addition, simply putting a cover over an abandoned vehicle does not change the fact that it is abandoned.

Question #2: I have heard that possession of marijuana is now a civil violation. What does that mean? Answer #2: Possession of less than 10 grams of marijuana is now a civil violation rather than a misdemeanor criminal violation. In other words, possession of less than 10 grams of marijuana does not result in an arrest and, therefore, only carries a civil fine rather than the potential for incarceration. In addition, because less than 10 grams is civil, it does not have to be reported to perspective employers as an arrest.

WHAT TYPES OF TRAINING DO CHEVERLY POLICE OFFICERS ATTEND OVER THE COURSE

OF A YEAR? Cheverly police officers spend hundreds of hours per year in training. PLEASE USE THE SIDE WALKS, IT IS THE LAW!

As the weather begins to get nicer and more and more residents are walking or jogging in town, we are taking this opportunity to remind you that it is illegal to walk or jog in the street when a sidewalk is available on a road. The State law reads:

21-506 Rules for pedestrians on roadways

- (a) Where a sidewalk is provided, a pedestrian may not walk along and on an adjacent roadway.
- (b) Where a sidewalk is not provided, a pedestrian who walks along and on a highway may walk only on the left shoulder, if applicable, or on the left side of the roadway, as near as practicable to the edge of the roadway, facing any traffic that might approach from the opposite direction.

The Cheverly Police have been receiving numerous complaints from residents fearing that they are going to hit a pedestrian or jogger as a result of those individuals not walking on the sidewalk.

We want all our pedestrians and motorists to be safe. So, please use the sidewalks. Not adhering to the above noted law will result in a fine being issued.

Cheverly Biodiversity Day

On Saturday, May 16th the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Science Committee will hold the town's second survey of living organisms found within our borders. The first "Bioblitz," held in 2012, documented hundreds of species, including several not previously known from Cheverly. The survey will draw attention to the diversity of life that exists locally and explain why it is so important that we preserve and maintain our green infrastructure of native plants and animals. Without them we would not exist.

A varied program for all ages will include hikes led by experts to discover, identify and document plants from trees to the smallest flower, ferns, or fungi, and animal life including mammals, birds, reptiles and amphibians, spiders, and insects, such as butterflies, beetles or bees, and micro-organisms. A special children's program will include hands on exhibits, displays and contests to test their knowledge. After dusk, before the fireworks, there will be a black light demonstration to capture nocturnal life that buzzes, whizzes, squeaks or goes bump in the night.


