PROFILES OF CANDIDATES FOR WARD 1



Marverly Nettles

Hi. I'm Marverly Nettles, your candidate for Town Councilmember for Ward 1. Since moving here, I've quickly emerged myself into various organizations here in Cheverly. Those organizations have been highlighted during the recent global pandemic and national civil unrest; and both have impacted our community. As the former Leader of Cheverly Com-

munity Emergency Response Team from June 2019 until January 2021, it was important to feed the community information pertaining to Preparedness. CERT became instrumental in April 2020 pulling together Food Drives and Food Distributions. In August 2020, I was elected President of Cheverly Police Chief's Advisory Board. As the call for police reform grew, Cheverly Police started rewriting policies, and PCAB took a leadership role in gathering input from the community.

Moving forward, Cheverly will be gaining neighbors in the middle of Ward 1 within 3 years with the redevelopment of Hospital Hill. It's important that we consider all possible avenues and their impact on our community. I look forward to hearing from you and working with the County to achieve Cheverly's vision. Secondly, as we've moved into interacting virtually, it is important for Cheverly to invest in technology, including increased WIFI capabilities. I will advocate for accessibility across the community to ensure "no neighbor is left behind". Thirdly, it is critical for Cheverly to take the lessons learned from the pandemic and the flood and focus on resiliency and sustainability for the community. I plan to lead Cheverly in developing an Emergency Operations Plan to prepare for future disasters and leverage resources available through the County and non-government partners to help our residents in times of trouble.

I ask for your vote on May 3. Together we can accomplish the hard work of building on what makes Cheverly amazing to ensure a bright future for all Cheverly residents.

In June 2019, at my first full meeting as a Councilmember, I asked if I could make a motion. It was a simple one: to move an agenda item so the residents who powerfully testified in support of the Pride Proclamation during Resident Input would not have to wait long before the Proclamation was voted

on. The Mayor said I could not make a motion. It took a whispered comment from Acting Town Administrator David Deutsch to understand that, as a Councilmember, I was indeed entitled to make a motion. So I did. The motion passed unanimously, as did the Proclamation. I'd like to say that advocating for Cheverly's residents, having my voice (and the voices of Ward 3) heard, has gotten easier in the past two years. It has not.

It should not be so difficult to make a helpful suggestion. It should not take so long to make progress happen. The pandemic has thrown into sharp focus the ways in which Cheverly's governing body has struggled to function. In spite of that we have done so much good—hired an excellent Town Administrator and Police Chief; removed a hurtful symbol from the Town Seal; adopted noncitizen voting and a Resolution in Support of Black Lives; established a relief fund for those most impacted by Covid.

Like many, the pandemic has stretched me thin. But through seemingly unending meetings, I have worked to advocate for town residents and town staff. Our staff has been incredible in reacting and adjusting to the pandemic, keeping services running and staff and residents safe. One of my top priorities has been and will continue to be giving them the space and support they need to do their jobs.

And my other priority will be to continue to advocate for residents who so often feel unheard or underrepresented. I hope that a set of meeting guidelines I coauthored will help to make meetings more functional and efficient, if not shorter. Either way, I will keep working for equitable representation and inclusion in all town matters. Thank you for trusting me with that role.

Mrs. Munyeneh matriculated from Columbia College with a Bachelor's in Political Science and Georgetown University with a Masters in Leadership (Organizational Development). She was in the Honors College and graduated cum laude, cum honore, garnering membership in academic honor societies such as Alpha Lambda Delta and Golden Key International Honor Society.

Mrs. Munyeneh started her career as a Grants Management Specialist for the South Carolina Attorney General's Office, working on Violence Against Women's Act grants and compliance. She also worked in concert with the South Carolina Coalition Against Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault (SCCADVASA) to support the Hope Lights Project for Sexual Assault Victims. After relocating to the District of Columbia, Mrs. Munyeneh was hired as the first domestic violence victim advocate for the Metropolitan Police Department. Determined to build the Victim Services Program to a full fledge resource for victims, she worked with a team to address all victimization in the District of Columbia. Instrumental in creating what is now known today as the Victim Services Branch, she held positions with the Metropolitan Police Department and the National Center for Victims of Crime in full-time and part-time positions respectively while also serving as an Adjunct Professor for the Department of Homeland Security's FLETC Domestic Violence Intervention Program. She acted as a liaison inter-departmentally, created public policy and education initiatives, as well as advocated on behalf of victims of violent crime and vulnerable adults. In her tenure, she has served over forty thousand victims of crime.

Mrs. Munyeneh also extended her advocacy role to supporting her colleagues and staff when she was elected as Chief Shop Steward of the National Association for Government Employees. She served as a Certified EEO Counselor to all District of Columbia employees which laid the groundwork for labor management partnerships with the Metropolitan Police Department and the Department of Forensic Science. Mrs. Munyeneh ultimately transitioned into conducting investigations as an Employee Labor Relations Manager and contract EEO Investigator/Reviewer. Ready for a new challenge, she joined the federal government and serves as a Program Manager for the Office of Civil Rights and Diversity and liaison for the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion team.

In her "spare" time, Mrs. Munyeneh serves as a Mount Hope Commission Board Member, Ward 4 Councilmember, and Vice Mayor for the Town of Cheverly. Some of her notable accomplishments have included:

- Forging a partnership with Prologis to preserve tree canopy and the integrity of the neighborhood while addressing development near Ward 4.
- Securing the installation of new sidewalks in Ward 4 and beyond.
- Providing community training on "Radical Listening" with the Mount Hope Commission.
- Authoring and passing the In Defense of Black Lives Resolution.
- Proposing and passing the COVID Relief Fund to help some of our neighbors in need.

Lastly, Mrs. Munyeneh also volunteers in her respective sororities, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Incorporated and Order of the Eastern Star. She is the proud wife of Alonzo and mom of her rambunctious son, Justice.



you are not able to register online or if you cannot leave your home to get your vaccine, you can call 3-1-1, and someone will help you register or sign up for an in-home vaccine. If you need any help with this process, please don't hesitate to call me anytime at 202-258-6167.



The State of Maryland has greatly improved their vaccination process. You can preregister online www.covidvax.maryland.gov or by phone at 1-855-MD-GOVAX (1-855-634-6829). There is an aggressively timed phasing of vaccines. By the time you read this newsletter, vaccines should be available for anyone over 60 and those over 16 with underlying medical conditions that increase risk for severe COVID-19 illness. By April 27, the vaccine should be available for all Marylanders, age 16 and above.

Redevelopment of Hospital Hill – the March 4 meeting and what's next in the process.

Our March 4 Special Cheverly Meeting Hospital Hill Redevelopment addressed some of our concerns (the focus of traffic is through north and south entrances, not through Cheverly, the helicopter pad will go, voiced commitment to sustainability, stormwater management, protection of the environment, commitment to listening and incorporating what we most want in community amenities, etc.). To take the pulse of residents who joined the Zoom and increase the opportunity for input, I assembled some inwebinar polls and followed up with the survey. We preserved all questions for RDA follow-up. I have requested that we set up space on our website dedicated to the redevelopment of hospital hill. Until that happens, I am gathering all information in a folder that you can access here <u>http://bit.ly/3r1v0Ah</u>, including the presentation slides, poll results, survey results, and questions submitted in the presentation.

In the immediate, residents in Wards One and Two will have an initial focus meeting early in April to talk through their concerns as homeowners who have lived with the hospital as a neighbor for decades and who stand to be most affected by numerous aspects of the redevelopment plans. We also need to have additional community-wide focused discussions with the Redevelopment Authority focused on environment, Walkability/bikeability and connection to public transportation, public/community amenities, and more. We should

have the first round of these breakout sessions before the end of April. Please call or email me if you are not connected to the various listservs or social media and would like a personal direct notice of next steps and upcoming meetings. I am committed to making sure that we have enough space in meetings for anyone interested to join and that residents can receive guidance on how to join via computer or smart phone or to join and participate by phone. This remains the most-critical development matter to come before Cheverly in decades. We want the developer of this site to come into the process valuing Cheverly and eager to work with us to create something lasting and wonderful.

We are entering the fiscal year 2022 process!

Talk to me about your budget concerns and what you would like to see if we can afford to accomplish in this next fiscal year. I have stepped out early with a request to Council and Town Staff that we make every attempt to lower our tax rate for this next fiscal year. This means that the Town commits to staying at constant yield—taking no more in Cheverly property taxes than we did last year—out of a recognition that it has been a financially unstable year for so many.

Stay engaged and keep in touch.

As always, and especially during this time, please reach out. I am almost always available by text or call at 202-258-6167, and you can email me at mayor@cheverly-md.gov. I welcome your call and will do my best to address your concerns or get back to you with information. If you are ever in a situation where you do not hear back from me, please do reach out again or call the Town office, 301-773-8360, so that I can ensure that we connect. Thank you to those who join us at work sessions and meetings. I encourage your continued involvement by video and phone. It feels good to have community in the room, even if it is virtual. **Be Cheverly inspired.**

Cheverly Municipal Election Monday, May 3, 2021 (7am-8pm)

Candidates for Town Council must be

- ◆ At least 21 years of age
- ◆ A citizen of the United States
- ◆ A registered voter of Cheverly
- A resident of Cheverly for not less than 6 months
- ◆ A resident of the ward from which they are elected (at least 45 days before the date of the election)

Filing instructions for candidates: Forms may be obtained at the Town Office on Tuesdays and Wednesdays between the hours of 10:00 am and 3:00 pm. These hours are for picking up candidate forms only. No other Town business will be conducted with residents.

Completed forms must be returned to the Town Office no later than 3:00 pm, Friday, March 19, 2021.

The State of Maryland is requiring a new financial disclosure form that MUST be completed by all candidates in order for their petition for candidacy to be considered. Completed forms must be turned in to Town Hall no later than close of business Friday, March 19, 2021. The form can be downloaded from the Town's website or picked up from Town Hall Tuesday's and Wednesday's March 19, 2021 between the hours of 10:00am and 3:00pm.

NOTE: Pictures & Profiles of Candidates are run in the <u>April Newsletter</u>. They should be submitted by **March 15, 2019.**

- ⇒ Candidate Profiles must be brief (no longer than 350 words). Profiles will appear as written. They will not be edited or corrected; however, if the profile is too long, staff will have to shorten it by cutting it off at the paragraph closest to the limit.

Cheverly Election Day 2021

Elections for the Town Council will take place on Monday May 3, 2021. Polls will be open from 7:00

am to 8:00 pm. Due to the current health crisis, Election Day will look different from normal. Absentee ballots will be available to any registered voter in the Town of Cheverly, who wishes to request one. Additional information regarding the absentee ballot procedure may be found elsewhere in the Newsletter and will be delivered to Town residents via News and Announcements.

All forms can be accessed via the Online File Center at https://www.cheverly-md.gov/files/.

Filing Requirements for Candidates Candidates wishing to run for Town Council may download the Nominating Petition from the Town website. Candidates must also fill out the Financial Disclosure form, which may be downloaded from the Town website as well. Candidates for Council must be at least 21 years of age, registered to vote in the Town of Cheverly, and shall have been a resident of the Ward in which they wish to run for a period of at least six months prior to Election Day. Candidates for Council must submit their nominating petitions 45 days prior to Election Day – and should be received at Town Hall by the close of business on Friday March 19, 2021. The Board of Election Supervisors will review and approve all filing petitions in order for the candidate to appear on the ballot. Candidates wishing to be considered as a write-in candidate may submit a write-in petition from the Town website. Write-in petitions must be received at Town Hall by no later than Friday April 30, to be considered as an official writein candidate.

Registration of Voters

If you are registered to vote in Prince George's County and/or the State of Maryland, you are registered to vote in the Town of Cheverly. If you are not registered with the County or the State, you may still be eligible to vote in Town elections, based on the recent adoption of the "Non-Citizen Voting" amendment to the Town Charter. Any resident of the Town of Cheverly may register with the Town provided they meet the basic requirements for voting: a minimum of 18 years of age, have resided in the Town for no less than 30 days prior to Election Day, and have not been convicted of a crime, as defined in the Maryland Code. Those individuals interested in being enrolled in the Cheverly Voter Registry may contact the Board of Election Supervisors at chyboes@gmail.com. The deadline for registering to vote is Saturday April 3, 2021. However, the Town of Cheverly will allow for

same day registration of voters and same day voting, provided the individual meets the requirements noted above.

Election Day Volunteers

In order to assist with conducting the election for Town Council, the Board of Election Supervisors is seeking volunteers to help on Election Day. Tasks will include assisting with crowd flow, sanitizing election stations, and other tasks as assigned by the Board of Election Supervisors. Lunch and dinner will be provided. Election Day

This election will be for the entire Town Council – the Mayoral election will take place in 2022.

On Election Day, voting will take place in the gym at Town Hall. At this time, there are capacity restrictions on individuals indoors and if the limited numbers are still in place, changes will be made to ensure the safety of voters, judges, and supervisors. The Board of Election Supervisors has proposed a unidirectional flow for voting in the gym. Voters will enter through the double doors in the lobby, proceed to their respective Ward table for check-in, receive their ballots, proceed to one of the election voting stations, drop their ballots in the ballot box and exit the gym via the rear doors to the left of the stage.

All COVID protocols will be in place, including all individuals will be required to wear masks or face coverings, maintaining social distancing – no congregating in the lobby or the gym will be allowed, and doors will be left open in the gym to allow for adequate ventilation. Pens, voting stations, and judges tables will be sanitized on a regular basis for safety. There will be appropriate spacing throughout the gymnasium.

Once the polls close on Election Day, the canvassing of ballots will begin. Under normal circumstances the canvassing is open to the public, however due to capacity limits, only elected officials, candidates for office and one designee will be permitted in the gym to watch the counting in person. The Board of Election Supervisors is preparing to broadcast the canvassing via Zoom and/or through the Town of Cheverly Channel (Verizon channel 35). Additional details will be provided closer to Election Day.

Absentee Voting in Cheverly Elections

Absentee voting will be available to all Cheverly registered voters, who do not wish to vote in person on Election Day, scheduled for Monday May 3. 2021. Any registered voter who wishes to vote by absentee ballot may do so by downloading the absentee ballot application, available on the Town website. Please note that no reason is required for requesting an absentee ballot. Completed applications may be mailed to or dropped off at Town Hall. There will be a blue mailbox mounted outside of Town Hall for the return of Absentee Ballot Applications. Once the ballots have been finalized, ballots will be mailed to those individuals who requested an absentee ballot. Ballots will also be available for pickup at Town Hall on Tuesdays or Wednesdays between the hours of 10:00 am and 3:00 pm. Additional instructions will be provided to individuals requesting absentee ballots on how to properly complete the ballot and return it to Town Hall. Completed absentee ballots may be returned to Town Hall via USPS, however, the Board of Election Supervisors is aware of problems with mail delivery and recommends that ballots be returned in person to a ballot box, which will be installed in front of Town Hall. If individuals choose to return their ballots by mail, ballots must be received by the close of polls on Election Day. Ballots received after the polls close will not be counted. If a Cheverly resident requests and absentee ballot, they will not be allowed to vote in person on Election Day. Records will be maintained of those Cheverly residents requesting absentee ballots. The register of absentee voters will be available for review upon request of any registered voter.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CHEVERLY, MARYLAND, adopted pursuant to the authority of Article XI-E of the Constitution of Maryland and Title 4, Subtitle 3 of the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland (2013 Edition, as amended), to amend the Charter of the said Town, said Charter being a part of the public local laws of Maryland (1963 Edition, as amended), which Article contains in whole or in part the Charter of the Town of Cheverly, Maryland, whereby the Mayor and Town Council increase the number of the Board of Supervisors of Elections from Three (3) to Five (5), permit early voting, same day voter registration and voting, and mail-in voting.

The Cicadas are Coming, The Cicadas are Coming: The Truth About the Brood X Periodical Cicada

Information from the Town Arborist Dr. Tolbert Feather

The periodical cicada in this area, Brood X, will emerge this year and is one of many broods that reappear every 17 years. The periodical cicadas have black bodies and red eyes and emerge in mid-May (when ground temperatures reach >64°F) completing their life cycle by the end of June.

Although the adults do feed on woody plants, potential damage to trees and shrubs occurs when the female cicadas insert eggs into the tips of twigs. Sufficient damage can cause the loss of the tips of branches. On large trees, this loss is not noticeable. On smaller trees, it can significantly reduce the canopy, but even smaller trees do recover.

Residents can isolate young trees with screening in May (netting with 1-cm or 3/8-inch mesh) to prevent damage, but there are no treatments to manage the cicadas. Cicadas have little interest in annuals and perennials. Newly emerged cicadas may be seen resting or emerging on non-woody plants, but they will soon thereafter move up into the trees.

The distinctive "singing" or mating call is the first sign that the little wide-eyed creatures are active. Although their appearance may seem ominous, cicadas do not bite people or carry or transmit any diseases. They are a true wonder of nature and a great food source for birds and small mammals.



Online Reporting

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the department implemented an online reporting system for some non-emergency calls for service. These calls include auto tampering, destruction of property/property damage, lost property, theft from autos, and certain other thefts that don't rise to the level of burglary. Residents are encouraged to utilize this system, in lieu of the non-emergency number, for incidents that meet the requirements

In addition, for identification purposes, a photocopy of the requesting party's ID will need to accompany the request. In response to the state of emergency, all fees associated with report requests have been waived.

Tips@cheverlypolice.org

Tips@cheverlypolice.org is an email address that residents can use to send non-emergency tips or information to the department. Our investigators are constantly working to investigate criminal cases in which our residents have been victimized. If you have, or believe you have, information, photographs, or video that could assist the department, and you don't want to call, please send us an email. If you see someone in immediate danger, or a crime being committed, dial 911.

Cheverly's Mass Notification System is here! CodeRED allows residents to receive emergency alerts via text, email, or phone call. Upon signing up for the service, users can create a Managed Account, which allows the user to create a username and password and control the following:

- 1. Types of alerts received:
 - a. Emergency Alerts (Mandatory)
 - b. General Alerts (Optional)
 - c. Weather Alerts (Optional, as provided by the National Weather Service)
- 2. Method alerts are received:
 - a. Via text message
 - b. Via email
 - c. Via phone call

Users can also perform a Quick signup however, doing so would require the user to call CodeRED's customer service line in order to make any changes to the account.

Users are required to have either a residential or business address, within the Cheverly limits, in order to sign up for an account. The system supports multiple addresses, phone numbers, and emails.





Kilmer Street Park

The Town of Cheverly entered into an agreement with the Neighborhood Design Center for planning of a park at 6301 Kilmer. Following the terms of the agreement, the Neighborhood Design Center conducted surveys of town residents to learn their hopes for the park, and presented the Final Concept plan to the Mayor and Town Council. The Mayor and Council will soon consider adoption of the park plan.

In its advisory capacity, the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee met with the NDC over several months and worked closely with them in every stage of the planning. In addition to providing opportunities for low-impact recreation, the park will help implement the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Plan. It will add to Cheverly's network of natural areas, increase tree canopy, give preference to native plants, manage stormwater, and provide educational opportunities..

The concept, to be implemented in stages, combines plans for instructive exhibits with opportunities for active recreation.

Active recreation

ADA accessible trail

Fitness trail

Open space for free play

Exhibits, where park goers can learn more about native plants and their habitats

Food Forest, featuring edible fruits Arboretum of native trees and shrubs, identified with labels Pollinator meadow, combined with stormwater management

Magnolia grove, indicative of magnolia bogs formerly found in the region

The entire site would be included in the arboretum, following the certification program of ArbNet; there is no charge for certification.

The park has its own group of champions, a working group of the Green Infrastructure Committee, Friends of Kilmer Street Park. The Friends will work on detailed planning for the park and will organize hands-on volunteer work. By the time you read this, three invasive-plant removals will have taken place. The Friends have already completed the arboretum certification application.
