Anyone who missed the petitioning deadline still has the opportunity to run as a certified write-in candidate. Application forms to file as a write-in candidate for mayor or council may be obtained at Town Hall or downloaded from the Town's website at www.cheverly-md.gov/board-elections.

The submission deadline for this application is **Friday, April 29, 2022.** 

### Information for Voters

To be eligible to vote in the Town election, you must **register to vote** in one of two ways:

1. Register to vote with the state of Maryland **before April 2, 2022**. Already registered? Check here to make sure your registration reflects your current Cheverly address:

2. Register to vote with the Town of Cheverly. This option is available to any resident who cannot register in Maryland (e.g. non-US citizens or active military with active voter registrations in another state) and who meets the eligibility requirements. **Register to vote at one of our upcoming voter registration drives listed below or in person at** 

town hall during normal business hours or in person on election day.

## Mail-In Voting

Any registered voter in Cheverly may **request a ballot to be mailed to them** (or to be picked up In-person at Town Hall) if they choose not to vote in person. The request form may be picked up in-person at Town Hall or downloaded from the Town's website at <u>www.cheverly-md.gov/board-elections</u>.

The deadline to request a mail-in ballot is April 25, 2022.

So many of you found items that "sparked joy" and threw several others away. April 23, 2022 will be an opportunity to do it again. Clean out those basements and attics and throw it away! Our last attempt with this was well received but we did have some people step forward to offer suggestions for improvement. If you have ideas, please don't hesitate to contact the Town.

I want to encourage you to keep an eye out for budget meetings. However uneventful they may be, Mayor and Council are making decisions with your tax dollars, and you need to know about it. We are responsible fiduciary agents for the town but also have insight about the needs of the town from all angles. For example, we have operated with minimal staff doing the work of several people for decades. It is now time to adequately staff every department to meet the needs of our residents. There are additional areas in the budget that will demand a great deal of attention. Come out to the meetings or join us on Zoom to hear.

As you know I spent half of my career in law enforcement. Every April I am used to highlighting National Child Abuse Month and Sexual Assault Awareness Month. It is not a fun or exciting topic but extremely necessary. Use this newsletter to be a springboard for conversations in your home if you have minor children. The theme this year is "Building Safe Online Spaces Together". Look out for more offerings for survivors of abuse this month.

My Mayor's Mention this month is all of our coaches in town. So many parents rely on someone to offer guidance in a particular area in life. Whether it be a music lesson, soccer, or basketball, coaches show our children ways to achieve their goals and are a resource for families. Being able to know we can send our children to extra-curricular activities in town and feel safe they will not be harmed but shaped into the adults they will be is a true blessing. Hat's off!

Proud and happy to announce moving forward into the unforeseeable future we can plan together toward what National Highway Safety Administration titled a "Safe Community" (comprehensive plan to manage a crime and traffic safe community). Today, police departments have become increasingly aware that alert and proactive traffic law enforcement is also an excellent tool to detect and apprehend those who have committed criminal acts, as well as to deter crimes before they happen. In summary and communicating for the first time as newly selected Chief of Police, in my opinion, the "Safe Communities approach is intended to serve as a guide for both police and Cheverly residents. As Chief, I do recognize that staffing, equipment, legal and geographical considerations, as well as contemporary community standards, vary among the six wards and that no single policy will be appropriate for every ward (i.e., traffic heavier in one ward versus another, congestion, businesses, etc.) I will attempt to outline the most critical traffic safety factors that should be present in our "safe Communities" techniques and strategies. Most important, the primary goal will remain to Our focus to enhance the quality of life for our residents as well as building lifelong relationships, by professionally policing this wonderful community.

With more people opting to walk or bicycle as a healthy and economic transportation alternative, as the season trends toward increased outdoor activities, Cheverly Police Department (CPD) will increase our effort to foster a safer environment for outdoor activities, specifically pedestrians and bicyclists.

This month we will discuss bicycle safety and next month will focus on pedestrian safety, both deserving of equal importance.

A few things to keep in mind, pedestrians, bicyclists, motorcyclists, scooter riders and skate boarders are referred to as "vulnerable road users" and are most at risk of sustaining injury in the event of a crash. First and foremost, to keep in mind, as you might expect, when a crash occurs between a

vehicle and a pedestrian or bicycle. It's the cyclist who is most likely to be injured. A large percentage of crashes can be avoided if motorists, pedestrians, and cyclists follow the rules of the road and watch out for each other.

#### *Tips for Parents, guardians, and Kids (Safe Riding Tips) Before riding make sure you, your family, and the bicycle, scooter, skateboard is ready to ride.*

#### Remember to:

• Wear a Bicycle Helmet – Everyone – at every age – should wear bicycle helmets. For more guidance on fitting a helmet, see national highway Transportation safety Administration's (NHTSA) *Fitting Your Bike Helmet* 

• Adjust Your Bicycle to Fit – Stand over your bicycle. There should be 1 to 2 inches between the rider and the top tube (bar). If a road bike, 3-4 inches. Different styled bicycles use differing measuring, use NHTSA

• Check Your Equipment – Before riding, inflate tires properly and check to ensure the brakes work.

• See and Be Seen – Whether daytime, dawn or dusk, bad weather, or at night, make yourself visible to others. Wear neon, fluorescent o-r other bright colors when riding, wear reflective tape markings. Remember, just because you can see a driver doesn't mean the driver can see you.

• Control the Bicycle – Ride with two hands on the handlebars, except when signaling a turn. Place books and other items in a bicycle carrier or backpack.

• Watch For and Avoid Road Hazards – Look for hazards such as potholes, broken glass, gravel, puddles, leaves, dogs/ cats, and pedestrians. All these hazards can contribute towards a crash.

• Use Verbal and Non-Verbal Communication – This includes eye contact with drivers, turn signals, pointing to road hazards for other bicyclists.

Avoid Riding at Night – It's hard for road users to see bicyclists at dusk, dawn, and nighttime. Use reflectors on the front and rear of your bicycle. White lights and red rear reflectors or lights are required by law in all States.

## Rules of the Road – Bicycling on the Road

In all states (Cheverly) bicycles on the roadway are

considered vehicles, and bicyclists are the drivers, with the same rights and responsibilities as motorists to follow the rules of the road. When riding, always:

- Go With the Traffic Flow Ride on the right in the same direction as other vehicles. Go with the flow not against it.
- Obey All Traffic Laws A bicycle is a vehicle and you're the driver. When you ride in the street, obey all traffic laws and lane markings.
- Yield to Traffic Almost always, drivers on smaller roads must yield (wait) for traffic on larger roads. Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks.
- Be Predictable Ride in a straight line, not in and out of cars or on and off the sidewalks.
- Always stay Alert Use your eyes and ears. Watch for potholes, cracks, wet leaves, storm grates, or anything that could help you lose control. Listen for traffic and avoid dangerous situations; DO NOT USE PERSONAL ELECTRONICS WHEN YOU RIDE.
- Look Before Turning When turning always look (left, right, and left again) and look behind you for a break in traffic, and then signal before making the turn. IMPORTANT watch for left-right turning traffic.
- Watch for Parked Cars Ride far enough out from the curb to avoid the unexpected from parked cars (like doors opening, or cars pulling out)

#### Traffic Safety Facts (National Highway Traffic Safety Administration)

There are two main types of crashes: the most common (falls), and the most serious (the ones with cars). Regardless of the reason for the crash, prevention is the name of the game. There are things you can do to decrease your risk of a crash. First, know some bicycle safety facts:

- 1. Regardless of the season, bicyclist deaths occurred most often between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.
- 2. Bicyclist injuries are significantly higher for males than females
- 3. One in four serious injury crashes in 2019 involved a bicyclist who had been drinking.

#### Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration Laws:

1. Maryland Law (Motor Scooter Law) requires all motor scooters and mopeds to be titled and insured. All motor scooter and moped operators must hold a valid drivers

license or a moped operator's permit and wear a helmet and eye protection. All motor scooters must display a title decal on the rear of the vehicle.

#### Skateboard Safety:

- 1. Never ride in the street.
- 2. Never skateboard in wet weather
- 3. When learning to ride, try out skateboarding on a smooth driveway that's away from all traffic, the beginner section at a skate park or parking lot NOT being used.
- 4. At skate parks, obey all rules
- 5. Do not skateboard in crowded areas.

Additionally, there is much work to do. But I am confident we can be successful in this endeavor with our Summer Traffic Initiatives with our goal to raise awareness and prevent injuries/collisions within and around this wonderful community. The term "Safe Communities" is recognized by NHTSA and described as: vast majority of injuries and deaths are not acts of fate but are predictable and preventable. Injury patterns, including traffic-related injury patterns vary by age group, gender, and cultural group. There are also seasonal and geographic patterns to injury. Once the cause of injuries is identified interventions can be designed to address the cause and reduce the number of injuries. I wholeheartedly believe, based on my time spent with NHTSA (one-year officer leadership internship) "The Safe Communities" Approach will not only meet, help this community to maximize our federal partners help with successfully managing our day-to-day traffic safety concerns. Next month, I will touch on Pedestrian Safety. Lastly, as luck would have it, we have been able to increase the Cheverly Police Department labor force, with the addition of hiring THREE lateral police officers. Thus, while remaining open to new ideas and willing to help shape our "Safe Communities" ideology, we have made strides towards 24-hour Cheverly Police Department patrol coverage. The beginning of April the available hours for service are as follows 7:00 A.M to 3:00 A.M. daily. Thus leaving the hours between 3:01 A.M. to 6:59 A.M., covered by Prince George's County Police Department nonemergency number (301) 352-1200 and 911 emergency. To help with this trust-building process, I will continue to review and evaluate our past body of work, while incorporating proven methods of policing to ensure we grow and succeed together, one contact at a time.

The Town of Cheverly and its Green Infrastructure Committee are working in partnership with the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) and the University of Maryland to monitor and clean up air pollution. 22 monitoring sites are now spread throughout the Cheverly area (https://rb.gy/zfoptw). In 2021, using this information and public input, MDE ran a two-month intensive inspection effort in the area (https://rb.gy/y2beof) and is now beginning to implement three Cheverly-focused targeted enforcement initiatives. These are a focus on potentially illegal truck idling, one on fugitive dust, and one that continues the targeted inspection program that was started in 2021 with twice-monthly inspections in the Cheverly and surrounding areas.

You can help!! At the community meeting on the 21st, MDE will be providing an overview of this new effort, but more importantly, seeking the community's ideas and input on what the most important issues are. The meeting will also include a session on how residents can report problems that they see to help MDE take action to eliminate activities that create unhealthy air pollution.
