With 7,000 people as your boss, it is impossible to please everyone. Likewise, it can often be a challenge to work hand-in-hand with Councilmembers; I know, I have been one. The change in the dynamics for the mayor and staff sometimes can blur the lines between the legislative branch and executive branches of local government. Because of those inherent drawbacks in our political system, a mayor is often left to wonder how she is doing in the public eye. The only real feedback comes at election time. During those gaps of time, doubt can often creep into one's mind. There should be no doubt in anyone's mind that Cheverly owes a great debt to our former mayor, Laila Riazi. She served our community remarkably until her resignation in June 2021.

We should also acknowledge the contributions of Councilmember Jenny Garcia, who was a true advocate for the people of Ward 5. As the first Latina to serve on the Council, her commitment serves as representation for people from all walks of life to know they too can lead their communities.

I have been fortunate in my few weeks as mayor to have had an amazing support base of residents, and I thank you for that support and encouragement — many times when I needed it the most! My goal is always to be accessible to residents. Writing in the newsletter, posting on listservs, using social media, attending organizational meetings, and simply stopping at the market or on the street to chat are ways I feel I can hear from you. I will try to be responsive and accessible, especially when we start seeing each other in person again. I will be visiting schools and representing our town at many county and state meetings so that people get to know more about Cheverly. We have long been called the "best kept secret in Prince George's County". I want to show people just how wonderful our little town is.

In the coming days, Cheverly is going to experience an overhaul. You will see the traditions we hold so dear will remain, but many things will change for the better. We have already started with bringing our accounting system into the twenty first century so that we don't lose a full day of work on payroll and several of you have already seen that work and town sessions are now shorter, more manageable meetings. I have heard from so many of you regarding matters that have been ongoing for years. I will not promise to fix every problem, but I will commit to hearing every issue and working to find a solution that does not take several decades.

Some of these changes, I will specifically need you to help with. In a town with some of the most generous people in the world, I have had reports of people not feeling welcome or experiencing the "neighborliness" so many Cheverlians boast about. You will consistently see me, hear me, read me reminding everyone of my locus of control. What I can do. What I can't do. What you can do. My role includes having influence and negotiating with involved parties, but ultimately there will be some things I have little control over.

I want you to know that I am truly honored to serve you Cheverly. I love getting things done and look forward to working for our town.

Mosquito Spraying Update

I have had the opportunity to speak with MDA about continued spraying for mosquitoes. You should be aware that if a house in the middle of the street does not want to be sprayed, MDA cannot prevent the spray from traveling to the other properties, so their policy is not to spray at all. They have to turn off the machine 300 ft before a home that has applied for an exemption and 300 ft after the home. The only time the MDA can spray without consent is if there is a threat to public safety, i.e., a few years ago MDA stated they found mosquitos with West Nile Virus. If they encounter such issues, they will spray regardless of exemptions. This was not a decision made by Mayor and Council, this is MDA policy.

My understanding is that we have seen the last of sprayings of Cheverly. MDA explained that the truck may be running but the sprayer is not on for the addresses that requested the exemptions. The Mosquito Program will continue to treat larvae so we may continue to see the trucks from time to time. They will be treating standing water and other breeding grounds with a form of bacteria (not a chemical). The bacteria is ineffective on adult mosquitos so as previously mentioned, we must remain vigilant about preventing the breeding of mosquitos on our individual properties.

What I can do: Continue to keep you informed about the larvae treatment, report any continued spraying (should not take place), and maintain an open line of communication for all stakeholders. What I can't do: Change your neighbor's minds about being sprayed. Everyone is entitled to their beliefs and opinions about what is safe for their families.

What you can do: Engage your neighbors and have conversations with them about their concerns. We are all better served when we listen to each other.

TRASH COLLECTION REMINDER

Sec. 10-7 Except for household trash, which the town may collect from side or rear yards, all collectible trash shall be placed at the street side or curb, but shall not be placed there earlier than 7:00 p.m. on the day before it is scheduled to be collected. All containers or uncollected trash and waste must be removed from the street side or curb by 7:00 p.m. of the day it was scheduled for collection. Upon request of a resident to the town administrator and for good cause shown, the

town may collect recyclables from a side or rear yard of the property.

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <u>https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/</u> webforms/house-check-request to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Valuables should be stored, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Lights inside the house should be set on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Shades and drapes should be drawn.
- Cars left in the driveway should be locked.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- All windows and doors should be locked.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE

Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and

Council of the Town of Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.



GRASS, WEEDS AND OVERGROWTH

Obstructions

- 1. Residents are reminded that with the nice weather more and more residents are out walking. Please keep the walkways and sidewalks clear of over-growth and obstructions.
- 2. Keep vegetation from obstruction of the view near intersections.

Lot Maintenance

- 1. Residents are reminded to make sure your grass is cut before it reaches 8 inches in height.
- 2. The planting strip between the sidewalk and the street is your responsibility to maintain.
- 3. If you are going on vacation, make sure to make arrangements to have your grass cut for you.
- 4. Be sure to take into consideration that the weather can be unpredictable, but the grass still needs to be cut.

<u>Reimagining Cheverly Town Seal</u> <u>Community Survey – Coming Soon!</u>

Cheverly's Town Seal, which featured an image of Mt. Hope Plantation was discarded by the Town in 2020 in favor of a redesign that better reflected Town ideals. In May 2021, the Town Council hired the Neighborhood Design Center (NDC) to lead a community engagement and design process to create a new Town Seal. Council appointed a Town Seal Commission, made up of residents from each of the six wards, to work with NDC and their design team on the Seal redesign. Young people and artists from each ward were also selected for the committee as these groups offer critical perspectives for the redesign. The first phase of this process is engagement and outreach to the town. On July 26th we will launch a community wide survey, it will be available in English and Spanish. It will be shared on social media, emailed to local organizations and through other town channels. It will primarily be online but paper copies will be available on request as well as the option of taking a phone survey. We invite all residents to complete this survey to ensure the new design captures the values and spirit of the town, and tell us why a new seal is important!

<u>Town Council Will Consider a</u> <u>Replacement for Ward 4 Councilmember:</u>

On June 24, 2021, Ward 4 Councilmember Kayce Munyeneh was sworn in as Mayor and the Ward 4 councilmember seat was vacated.

Cheverly's charter calls for a vacant council seat to be filled. The Mayor and Council agreed to the following schedule for filling the Ward 4 Councilmember vacancy:

1) Publish Vacancy Announcement in News & Announcements and the Town Facebook Page on July 23, 2021; Resending on August 2, 2021, and August 11, 2021.

2) Vacancy announcement will be posted in the August newsletter.

3) Each Ward 4 resident will receive a flyer with the vacancy announcement and application information.

4) Accept Applications for Ward 4 Vacancy; deadline Wednesday, August 11, 2021 by 5:00 pm.

5) Consideration by Council in the August 12, 2021 Town Meeting.

6) Selected Candidate will be seated at the August 12, 2021 Town Meeting.

The Town Council will select a replacement for the Ward 4 council seat vacancy at the August 12 council meeting. The Council will follow the procedures that have been used previously when other openings have occurred. The Council will review submitted docu-

The selected candidate must receive a majority of the votes.

Any resident of Ward 4 is encouraged to participate in this process. Residents of Ward 4 who are interested in filling the vacancy should submit a letter of interest outlining the reasons they are interested in joining council, a resume, and fill out a Financial Disclosure Form. (The Financial Disclosure Form is required by state ethics rules and will be kept on file in the office. According to state ethics rules these documents can be accessed by anyone upon request.) These documents should be submitted to the Town Clerk at tchegeman@cheverly-md.gov or inserted in the blue mailbox located at the front of Town Hall (6401 Forest Rd, Cheverly, MD 20785) prior to close of business on August 11 so that councilmembers can review materials prior to the August 12 council meeting.

Qualification to be a councilmember:

- Must be 21 years old on or before the date of election;

- A citizen of the United States;

- A registered voter; and

- A resident of Cheverly for not less than six months.

- A resident of the Ward for which they are running, prior either to the date of filing, or 45 days immediately preceding the date of the Election in the case of a write-in candidate

RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING

Residential ZONE parking permits are now available. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle with 1 free guest pass per address. A second guest pass may be obtained for \$2. (Only two guest passes per address.) Applications can be downloaded from the Town website at <u>www.cheverly-md.gov</u> under the Form and File tab.

Cheverly Residential Zone Parking Permit Application

Due to the Covid19 restrictions, applications for Zone Permits will only be accepted by US Mail or placed in the Permit Box located on the left-side wall of the main entrance at Townhall.

Permits can only be issued to vehicles registered to a Cheverly Address.

A copy of your vehicle registration must accompany the Application.

Cost of the Permit is \$5 per vehicle | 1 Guest Parking Pass is allowed per residence at no cost.

An additional Guest Parking Pass is available for \$2. (No More Than 2 Guest Parking Pass per Address)

If you live in one of the following areas, you will need a Parking Permit:

Zone 1: State St, 61st & 62nd Ave, as well as the 1800 Block of 64th Ave

Zone 2: Eliminated

Zone 3: 22-2400 Block of Cheverly Ave

Zone 4: Arbor St & Crestlawn Ave (22-2300 Block Parkway Eliminated)

Zone 5: 2300 Block of Belleview Ave

Zone 6: Benton Rd & 23-25 Lake Ake

Zone 7: 2400 Block of Valley Way

Zone 8: 3300 Belleview Ave; Medical Ter

<u>SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to Park in the Odd Side of the 2200 Block of Cheverly Ave in</u> order to utilize the Metro

Residential Parking Permit are to be Displayed on the Back Left Bumper area.

If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.

Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.



In response to the State of Emergency, all fees associated with report requests have been waived.

Tips@cheverlypolice.org

Tips@cheverlypolice.org is an email address that residents can use to send non-emergency tips or information to the department. Our investigators are constantly working to investigate criminal cases in which

our residents have been victimized. If you have, or believe you have, information, photographs, or video that could assist the department, and you don't want to call, please send us an email. If you see someone in immediate danger, or a crime being committed, dial 911.

Cheverly's Mass Notification System is here! CodeRED allows residents to receive emergency alerts via text, email, or phone call. Upon signing up for the service, users can create a Managed Account, which allows the user to create a username and password and control the following:

- 1. Types of alerts received:
 - a. Emergency Alerts (Mandatory)
 - b. General Alerts (Optional)

- c. Weather Alerts (Optional, as provided by the National Weather Service)
- 2. Method alerts are received:
 - a. Via text message
 - b. Via email
 - c. Via phone call

Users can also perform a Quick signup however, doing so would require the user to call CodeRED's customer service line in order to make any changes to the account.

Users are required to have either a residential or business address, within the Cheverly limits, in order to sign up for an account. The system supports multiple addresses, phone numbers, and emails.

GREEN(a)**HOME** – What is a Native Plant?

Simply put, a native plant is one that occurs naturally in the place where it evolved. Or you can say that it is one that occurs naturally in a particular region, state, ecosystem, and habitat without direct or indirect human actions. So we look for plants native to Maryland, and in particular to the Piedmont/Coastal Plain region. Plants native to our area support local food webs. They feed the insects that feed our baby birds. They produce seeds that feed birds and other wildlife. In total, we can say they support us!

That's why we are encouraged to add more native plants to our vards. Woody, structural plants support a high level of biodiversity. Replacing lawn grass with native plants reduces maintenance with its potential for air and water pollution.

Did you know? You can learn more about using native plants and trees and converting your lawn to a conservation landscape through the University of Maryland Extension's Bay-Wise Program. And the Prince George's chapter of the National Audubon Society's Habitat Advisors program will help you evaluate your yard through on-site visits; contact kathvk9@gmail.com.

Which native plants are right for your yard? A good guide is Native Plants for Wildlife Habitat and Conservation Landscaping, an online database managed by the Alliance for the Bay and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. See also the Maryland Native Plant Society's Landscaping with Native Plants.

Where can you find native plants for your yard? Unfortunately we can't count on Lowe's and Home Depot to fill our native plant needs. Chesapeake Natives in Rosarvville, Maryland grows Piedmont/Coastal Plain ecotype plants from seed. Earth Sangha's wild plant nursery in Virginia propagates native plants directly from local forests and meadows. Find more tips on buying native plants at How to Shop for Native Plants.

Together we can provide a healthier habitat for wildlife and for ourselves!

The Cheverly Native Planting Project is offering a 2-for-1 Native for Invasive Shrubs Trade to 25 town residents. If you remove one Amur honeysuckle bush (Lonicera maackii), Nandina (Nandina domestica), or Japanese barberry (Berberis thunbergia) from your yard, we will provide you with TWO free native shrubs to replace it! We will ask for before and after photos and can provide identification and removal/ planting assistance to those who need help. The trade will be on a first come, first served basis and a limit of one 2-for-1 Trade per residence. There will be a variety of native shrubs from which to choose.

The shrubs we are targeting for removal are on the State of Maryland's Invasive Plant Lists because of the problems they cause to the environment and local agriculture. In fact, Amur honeysuckle is so problematic, it can no longer be sold in the state. Although Nandina or Japanese barberry still can be sold, warning signs of their environmental hazards must be displayed next to the plants at any store that carries them.

Native shrubs, on the other hand, provide a variety environmental benefits including increasing biodiversity, improving the health of our green spaces, and requiring less resources to maintain.
