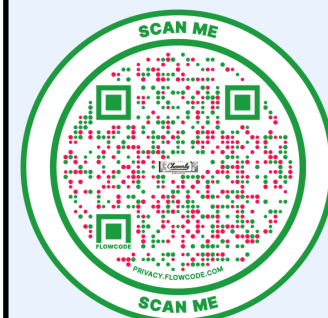
Upcoming Votes

RESIDENTIAL BUSINESS LICENSES

If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a Town Residential Business License.

Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

Town Residential Business Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Please call the Town Clerk at 301-773-8360 or stop by the Town Office to pick up an application form.

The yearly business license fee is \$20.

CODE COMPLIANCE

PARKING COMPLIANCE

TOWN CODE - Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5

Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.



Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking

A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more. The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed.



PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
 - On any courts,
 - On the even-numbered side of all streets,
- (exception)** On the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belview Avenue.

NOTE: The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

PRIORITIES: The snow removal operations work under the following priorities: 1.) Cheverly Avenue 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valleyway, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive; 3.) all other streets.

CODE COMPLIANCE

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

SIDEWALKS

TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS

Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day).

Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.

DEAD TREES

RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING



2023 Residential ZONE parking permits will be available December 15th. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle. There is a maximum of 2 guest passes per residence. The first guest pass is free and the second guest pass may be obtained for \$2 fee. (Note:

ONLY two guest passes per address.)

Applications can be downloaded from the Town website at www.cheverly-md.gov under the Form and File tab.

Please drop completed applications in the Permits Box located at Town Hall or mail to: Code Enforcement, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785.



Cheverly Residential Zone Parking Permit Application

Applications can be submitted at Town Hall, online, via US Mail, or placed in the permit box located on the left-side wall of the main entrance at Townhall

- Permits can only be issued to vehicles registered to a Cheverly address
- A copy of your vehicle registration must accompany the application
- Cost of the Permit is \$5 per vehicle | 1 guest parking pass is allowed **per address** at no cost
- The maximum number of guest passes is 2 per address. This includes one free pass and ONE guest for a \$2 fee.

If you live in one of the following areas, you will need a Parking Permit: Please check the zone that applies.

- ☐ Zone 1: State St, 61st & 62nd Ave, as well as the 1800 block of 64th Ave
- ☐ Zone 3: 22-2400 block of Cheverly Avenue
- ☐ Zone 4: Arbor Street & Crestlawn Avenue (22-2300 block Parkway Eliminated)
- ☐ Zone 5: 2300 block of Bellevue Avenue
- ☐ Zone 6: Benton Rd & 23-25 Lake Avenue
- ☐ Zone 7: 2400 block of Valley Way
- ☐ Zone 8: 3300 Bellevue Avenue; Medical Terrace (Eliminated)
- ☐ RO: 6500 & 6600 blocks Oak Street, 6500 block Maureen Court, 3132 & 3200 block Hillside Avenue
- ☐ SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to park on the odd side of the 2200 block of Cheverly Avenue in order to utilize the METRO



- Residential Parking Permits are to be displayed on the back Left Bumper area.
- If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.
- Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.
- Citation may be Issued to ANY Vehicle not in compliance with Town Code 27-5.1 Residential Zone Parking
- If you have any questions, please contact the Office of Code Compliance at 240-770-7647

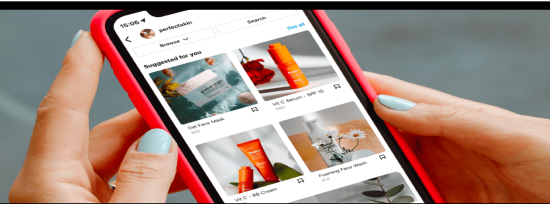
Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.



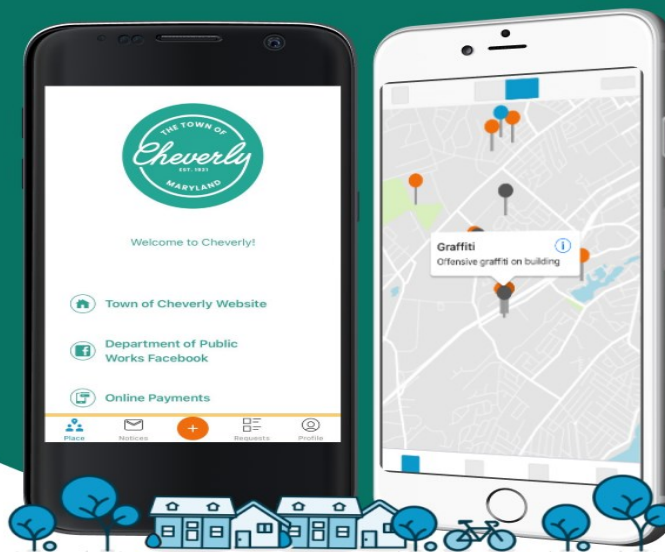
Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

Avoid becoming a victim of "Jugging"

The crime is called "Jugging" is a type of robbery where thieves (juggers) work in teams of two or more to take your money while you out shopping, going to the ATM to withdraw money or filling up your gas tank at station. Juggers look for distracted victims to rob. They are known to run up to victims and strip their purses, bags, or expensive belongings right out of their hands or off their person. The team of juggers usually consist of a spotter, the person who first targets the victim to be attacked, and a driver, who will help the spotter make his or her getaway once the theft has been accomplished.

Here are 3 things you can do to protect yourself:

1. If you see anyone watching you and following you through a store, contact the store personnel, management, or security personnel

immediately. Tell store personnel you would like someone to walk you to your car. If necessary, you might have to insist.

2. If someone is attempting to steal your purse and shopping bags out of your hands or off your person, try to let go of the purse or bag and let the thief have it.
3. Stay alert. Keep your eyes open and scan all around you as you leave the store, gas station, or bank.
 - a. Don't stare at your cell phone.
 - b. Don't fumble with your keys or wallet.
 - c. Look all around as moving toward your car.
 - d. If possible, avoid ATM withdrawals beyond normal banking business hours.

Remain vigilant during the holiday season and beyond "be aware of your surroundings.

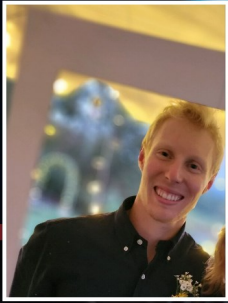

BIRDS AND THEIR HABITATS -- WINTER HIKES IN CHEVERLY

The Cheverly Green Infrastructure Science Committee is sponsoring a combined nature hike and Christmas bird count to coincide with the annual Audubon counts taking place over a two-week period from December to January.

We will do a comprehensive survey of any birds remaining with us in December, as well as identifying trees, shrubs and even some remaining herbaceous species. Two public hikes are planned. The first, led by Elaine Friebele, will be held on Saturday, December 17 at Woodworth Park. Parking for this hike will be on the lot at the east side of the Town Hall/Community Center. The hike will start from the former basketball court immediately behind the parking lot; look for the Woodworth Trail sign.

The second hike, led by Matt Salo on Sunday, December 18 at Euclid Woods, will start at Matt's house, 5607 Greenleaf Rd. Parking is available along the street at the west dead end of Greenleaf Rd; please make sure you are not blocking anyone's driveway.

Both hikes will be between one to two hours' duration, starting at 9 am and finishing up before 11 am. If you are interested, please sign up at mattsalo@gmail.com or call 301-341-1261. Provide your name and contact information (e-mail or telephone) and we will provide directions and further information.

The hikes will be guided by leaders familiar with local flora and fauna. This is a great chance to get out, learn about winter plants and birds and enjoy what nature has to offer this time of the year.

We're Not Afraid to Talk Straight About Memory

It can be embarrassing, or even scary, to acknowledge that we're having trouble remembering things. One of the beautiful aspects of Cheverly Village is that topics like memory—or any of the challenges we experience as we age—are not taboo. We can chat and laugh about them. And we actively support each other in addressing them.

For example, right now Cheverly Village is preparing to implement a "Stronger Memory" program that will include a Memory Support Group meeting twice a month, with staff to lead participants in exercises that are proven to help build memory strength. We will be implementing this program in partnership with the Maryland Umbrella Group (MUG), which has for years been assisting in the education of students of all ages and their families. While the Memory Support program originated in northern Virginia, we are committed to working with MUG to bring this program to our greater Cheverly community.

For this and other programs, Cheverly Village draws on the experience of other villages. For example, Village leaders were inspired by a presentation about

memory given in October at the annual meeting of the national Village to Village Network. We learned that research shows that effective ways to reinforce one's memory include spending ten minutes a day reading out loud, or writing in longhand script, or doing simple math problems quickly.

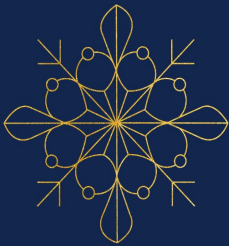

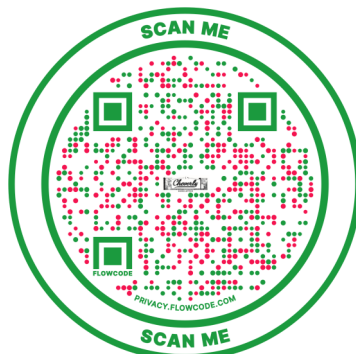
