MAYOR'S CORNER

It's time to pre-register for COVID-19 vaccination appointments!

Please review the COVID-19 information below, drawn straight from the County site. I anticipate that our Maryland and Prince George's County vaccine rollout will continue to evolve. I would encourage you to follow this link for the most up-to-date information. If you or someone you know does not have internet access, please be sure to call me at 202-258-6167, and I will make sure you are able to pre-register. As I understand, the County plans to open a vaccination phone hotline in the last week of January. https://www.princegeorgescountymd.gov/3730/COVID-19-Vaccination



Prince George's County residents who are in Phase 1B are now eligible for vaccination appointments. There are some 270,000 Prince Georgians eligible for vaccination in Phase 1. Individuals who live or work in

the County must fill out the county pre-registration form (link and OR code below). As vaccine appointments become available, eligible individuals will receive an email from the Health Department with a link and instructions on making a vaccine appointment. At this time, COVID-19 vaccines are offered by appointment only.

- Adults, ages 75 and up
- Assisted living and other congregate settings (including staff and residents of homeless shelters)
- Education/Childcare Sector (teachers and support staff, higher education, childcare workers)
- Government continuity of operations

Individuals who were eligible to receive vaccinations in Phase 1A and still have not received the vaccine should fill out the pre-registration form as well.

Not in Phase 1A or 1B? Don't delay! You should also fill out the preregistration form today!

Anyone who lives or works in Prince George's County who does not fall into Phase 1A or Phase 1B should still fill out the pre-registration form. Based on your responses, you will be notified of eligibility when the County moves into future phases of vaccine distribution, and as appointments become available, you will receive a link with instructions on how to schedule your vaccine appointment.

Please take this virus seriously. Disturbing COVID-19 stats in Prince George's County!

Before we speak of statistics, I want to offer a reminder. If you or someone you know is in need, please do not stay silent! Reach out, and I will do my best to connect you with available resources and supports. Staying physically protected and

socially connected is what will keep us well until enough of us are vaccinated to keep us safe. In just one month, the COVID-19 death toll has increased by 100,000 to a horrifying 400,000 lives lost to this virus across our Nation. As I draft this Mayor's Corner, Prince George's County's rate of infection is disturbingly high, attributable to travel and gathering over the December holidays and New Year's celebrations. Too many of us are not listening, and it is costing lives and livelihoods. Since our numbers remain so high, the ban on indoor dining will continue through at least the end of January. Businesses and employees are genuinely suffering. Neither the most recent round of federal relief nor promised State relief can cover the degree of need. We have to lower our infection rate if we are to begin recovery as a County. Mask up, keep distanced, stay connected!

Good News! Cuts to Metro Rail and Bus service averted for 2021—work ahead.

Following a dedicated \$610M in federal funding through the COVID-19 stimulus package, WMATA has stepped back from its plans to close our Cheverly Metro Station in 2021. Our station was slated to close along with 18 other stations and bus routes across the system. This funding will allow WMATA to delay potential cuts through at least the end of this year. In that time, we need to work with the major industrial, residential, and commercial developers to make commitments to ridership of their employees and shuttle support to encourage increased ridership at our station.

Third and final reader of a Charter Amendment Resolution regarding elections.

Mayor and Council are considering a Charter Amendment that will expand the number of Board of Election Supervisors and allow for mail-in balloting, same-day registration, and an additional (early) day of voting. The Charter Amendment Resolution has been read in the December and January Town Meetings. Following public comment and the third reader the Charter Amendment Resolution will proceed to a vote in our February 11, 2021 Town Meeting.

Please Vote or Run—Cheverly Elections for Town Council on Monday, May 3, 2021

Please save the date of Monday, May 3, 2021, and support the electoral process! See important election information inside this newsletter and note the many ways that Cheverly is expanding opportunities to participate in Town elections! This year all six council member seats are up for election. The Cheverly Mayoral election is in 2022. The Town Council's primary function is to set policy and direction for Town staff and provide an oversight function. Our Cheverly Town staff carries out the

management and administrative functions of the Town. Councilmembers are required to regularly attend two meetings a month, on the second and fourth Thursday evenings. Other meetings may be called as needed. Most Councilmembers make themselves accessible for constituent services. They may also support projects that require an additional investment of time, including serving as a liaison to our Green Infrastructure Committee or Planning Board. Each Councilmember is paid \$2,400 annually and receives \$50 each guarter to cover incidental expenses. There are no other benefits other than the joy of serving your community. I served as a Cheverly Councilmember for nine years before becoming Mayor, and I can confidently tell you that serving and representing Ward One brought me great joy.

Be involved! Not just for parents! PGCPS—Comprehensive School Boundary Initiative.

Do you know that Cheverly school children who reside south of Route 50 and north of route 295 cannot attend the same schools as other Cheverly children? Boundary divisions in 2015 even unwittingly undid the historic hard-won efforts of African American families in the Old 4th Ward to have all Cheverly children attend what was then Tuxedo Elementary. Even starting at the elementary level, these few families in Ward 1 and Ward 4 are pulled away from the neighborhood family school supports most Cheverly families enjoy. How about having all our Cheverly children attend a rebuilt Kenmoor Middle School along with our middle school TAG students? PGCPS held initial hearings early in January, and comments and questions are still welcome (Important note! PGCPS will not include specialty schools, regional schools, charter schools, and special education centers in the boundary scenarios and options. I have enjoyed working with our newly elected District 4 School Board Member, Ms. Shavla Adams-Stafford, so that she can hear from our community. She was able to attend a recent 4th Ward Civic Association meeting. She will identify a February date for a virtual Cheverly-wide community session to hear our boundaryspecific and other PGCPS concerns. https://www.pgcps.org/boundary (link for

Cheverly successfully opposes VIP Stage application for Class B, Beer, Wine.


In their January 13 regular hearing, the Board of License Commissioners (BoLC) denied the application of Ofobuike N. Okeh, Member, for a Class B, Beer and Wine for the use of SOL Banquet Hall, LLC, t/a VIP Stage, 5005 Jackson Street, #B, Hyattsville, 20781. The Town first opposed an application from

VIP Stage in 2018, noting several significant concerns that questioned the applicant's plans for the establishment. The BoLC denied the 2018 application. VIP stage again sought a license in November 2020, this time under a different applicant. The applicant had not addressed the 2018 concerns, and a number of the applicant's sworn statements appeared contradicted by available facts. During a 30-day extension (requested by VIP Stage), the BoLC added an officer report from the Prince George's County Police Department Vice & Sex Trafficking Investigations Unit and JAG Unit to the record. The statement outlined details of an event held at VIP Stage. The officer noted failure to request ID, no masks worn, sale of alcohol, bottle service and hookah offered, and VIP areas available for \$250-\$300. VIP Stage was not permitted to operate, and VIP Stage sold alcohol without a liquor license. Town Administrator Galloway, Code Compliance, and I joined in submitting written testimony and testifying at each

hearing. We are grateful for the attention State Senator Augustine and County Councilmember Ivey gave to this matter. We will continue to monitor the situation.

Seniors: What You Need to Know

Phase 1B & 1C



- The COVID-19 vaccine for seniors will be provided in two phases:
 - Phase 1B: seniors 75 and older (began January 18, 2021)
 - Phase 1C: seniors 65-74 years old (begins January 25, 2021)
- You must have an appointment in order to receive the vaccine.
- You must fill out the Health Department's pre-registration form:

https://bit.ly/PGCVaccineForm

- As appointments become available, the Health Department will follow up with instructions on how to schedule a vaccine appointment.
- Seniors and others who cannot complete the form on their own are encouraged to have a friend or family member assist them (please do not use Internet Explorer).

The County is preparing to launch a hotline in the near future to assist those who have complications accessing the Internet.

Plan Ahead!



Make sure you have transportation to your vaccine appointment.

Make sure you have a form of photo identification to bring with you.

If you have insurance, please bring your insurance card with you.





Current COVID-19 vaccines require two doses. Make sure you schedule your appointment for the second dose right after your appointment for the first dose. Be sure to keep your appointment for the second dose of the vaccine.

BOARD OF ELECTIONS

Cheverly Municipal Election Monday, May 3, 2021 (7am-8pm)

Candidates for Town Council must be

- ◆ At least 21 years of age
- ◆ A citizen of the United States
- ◆ A registered voter of Cheverly
- A resident of Cheverly for not less than 6 months
- ◆ A resident of the ward from which they are elected (at least 45 days before the date of the election)

Filing instructions for candidates: Forms may be obtained at the Town Office on Tuesdays and Wednesdays between the hours of 10:00 am and 3:00 pm. These hours are for picking up candidate forms only. No other Town business will be conducted with residents.

Completed forms must be returned to the Town Office no later than 3:00 pm, Friday, March 19, 2021.

Note: Pictures & Profiles of the candidates are run in the April Newsletter. They should be submitted with the nominating petition by Friday, March 19, 2021. Additional information regarding profiles and pictures will be available on the Cheverly website: www.cheverly-md.gov.

What will voting look like in 2021?

The Cheverly Board of Election Supervisors is informing all citizens of Cheverly that the Town will hold an election on Monday, May 3, 2021. This election will be for the entire Town Council – the Mayoral election will take place in 2022.

We will have in-person voting in Town Hall from 7:00 am – 8:00 pm on Monday, May 3. All COVID-19 protocols will be in place, including masks, social distancing, and spacing throughout the gymnasium.

The Board is planning to allow for any registered voter in Cheverly to request a ballot, if they choose not to vote in person, without providing a reason for an absentee ballot. The Town is also seeking to acquire a ballot box that will be installed in front of Town Hall – and any voter may drop their ballot in the box instead of sending the ballot back via the US Mail.

Announcing the Cheverly Voter Registry

Recently, the Town of Cheverly enacted a Charter amendment allowing for "Non-Citizen" voting in Town of Cheverly elections. This amendment allows for any resident of Cheverly who meets the basic qualifications for voting: the individual shall have resided in the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly for at least thirty (30) days prior to the day of any general or special election; shall be eighteen (18) years old on or before the day of any general or special election; and shall not have been convicted of a disqualifying crime or be under the guardianship for mental disability. In addition, the Town of Cheverly anticipates allowing voters who are registered to vote in another location to vote in Cheverly local elections, the primary example being military families who are stationed in the area and are living in Cheverly.

The Board hopes to hold several registration sessions during the month of March and April to allow for any resident who would like to vote in the upcoming elections to register for the Cheverly Voter Registry. In addition, the Board has reached out to several nearby municipalities that have implemented similar ordinances to find out the best ways to implement this new policy.

TOWN OF CHEVERLY CHARTER AMENDMENT RESOLUTION R-06-20

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CHEVERLY, MARYLAND, adopted pursuant to the authority of Article XI-E of the Constitution of Maryland and Title 4, Subtitle 3 of the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland (2013 Edition, as amended), to amend the Charter of the said Town, said Charter being a part of the public local laws of Maryland (1963 Edition, as amended), which Article contains in whole or in part the Charter of the Town of Cheverly, Maryland, whereby the Mayor and Town Council increase the number of the Board of Supervisors of Elections from Three (3) to Five (5), permit early voting, same day voter registration and voting, and mail-in voting.

WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking
A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more. The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is

PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
- On any courts,

plowed.

- On the even-numbered side of all streets,
- **(exception)** On the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belleview Avenue.

NOTE: The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

PRIORITIES: The snow removal operations work under the following priorities: 1.) Cheverly Avenue 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valleyway, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive; 3.) all other streets.

TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS

Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day).

Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.

Soliciting in the Town of Cheverly is prohibited without a Town permit. Hand delivered advertisement is not considered a solicitation. If an unpermitted solicitor is in your neighborhood or you need a Town soliciting permit contact Code Compliance at 240-770-7647. During the COVID-19 pandemic you may call Town Hall if you are unable to reach someone in Code Compliance.

REPORT STREET LIGHT PROBLEMS TO PEPCO

If you are having any problems with street lights, they are out, blinking on and off, etc., you can contact Pepco directly. Go to www.pepco.com, go to Outages, and click on Report a Street Light Outage. Then you will be asked for either the address or pole number. It will then come to a map showing the street lights in the area, click on the street light you wish to report, and lastly they will

light you wish to report, and lastly they will ask you for some information about the light and your contact information.

REMINDER: COVID-19 Scams related to Vaccines

The coronavirus vaccine is now available in the U.S. and as the wearily long for a path back to normal life, criminals are waiting, too, ready to use that desperation to their advantage. Homeland Security investigators are working with dozens of drug companies to identify scams. Over the last year, law enforcement has seen plenty of scams ranging from phony personal protective equipment, false cures and extortion schemes. With the Vaccine now available, it is important that we are aware of the potential scams that come with it. Keep an eye out for scam calls, text messages, and solicitors offering you quick or easy access to the vaccine. Please do not purchase any kind of coronavirus vaccine or treatment on the internet or from any online pharmacy.

This is an extremely important policy that guides and restricts how our police department operates in Cheverly. We ask that residents please take the time to review the policy and provide Ms. Martin with feedback. One of the goals of our department is to ensure that its Use of Force Policy is indicative of Cheverly's values while providing our officers the necessary framework to protect the community and themselves.

CPD's General Orders are on our website

Anyone who is interested in viewing the department's General Orders and Policy Manual can easily view them on our website at CheverlyPolice.org and clicking on "General Orders" and "Policy Manual" on the left-hand side of the screen. Our General Orders are now broken out by chapter and key word searchable. Just to clarify, over the next year, maybe two, we will be working to replace all our current General Orders. As we do, new policies will become available in the Policy Manual and the old ones will be removed from "General Orders."

Online Reporting

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the department implemented an online reporting system for some non-emergency calls for service. These calls include auto tampering, destruction of property/property damage, lost property, theft from autos, and certain other thefts that don't rise to the level of burglary. Residents are encouraged to utilize this system, in lieu of the non-emergency number, for incidents that meet the requirements.

Our investigators are constantly working to investigate criminal cases in which our residents have been victimized. If you have, or believe you have, information, photographs, or video that could assist the department, and you don't want to call, please send us an email. If you see someone in immediate danger, or a crime being committed, dial 911.

Cheverly's Mass Notification System is here! CodeRED allows residents to receive emergency alerts via text, email, or phone call. Upon signing up for the service, users can create a Managed Account, which allows the user to create a username and password and control the following:

- 1. Types of alerts received:
 - a. Emergency Alerts (Mandatory)
 - b. General Alerts (Optional)
 - c. Weather Alerts (Optional, as provided by the National Weather Service)
- 2. Method alerts are received:
 - a. Via text message
 - b. Via email
 - c. Via phone call


Users can also perform a Quick signup however, doing so would require the user to call CodeRED's customer service line in order to make any changes to the account.

Users are required to have either a residential or business address, within the Cheverly limits, in order to sign up for an account. The system supports multiple addresses, phone numbers, and emails.



GREEN @ HOME -- Birds in Winter

It's time to think about keeping your yard bird-friendly through the winter.

Finding food can be especially challenging for birds during days with extreme cold temperatures. Setting up a backyard bird feeder makes their lives easier and ours more enjoyable as we can observe the birds up close and in comfort.

Take a look at your property from a bird's perspective. Does it provide the three basic things that all birds need from their habitats?

- FOOD: In winter, set up your bird feeder. If you don't tidy up your yard and flowerbeds in fall, birds will love you for the seeds. Rake fallen leaves under your shrubs to act as mulch -- that encourages beneficial insects which will be bird food. Throughout the year your bird-friendly landscaping will provide fruit, seeds, beneficial insects, and other small animals that birds feed upon.
- WATER: Even in winter, birds need water for drinking and bathing.
- SHELTER: Whether it's a safe place for sleeping, a protected haven from the elements, a hiding place to elude predators, or a secure nesting spot, providing shelter is an important way to make your property bird-friendly. Leave dead limbs and trees in place. Recycle dead branches to start a brush pile; add your old Christmas tree if you have one.





PROTECTS THOSE AROUND YOU
