Message from the Mayor

Administrative Staff Accomplishments

Applied for and received the following grants:

- \$10,000 for the US Census, \$60,000 for Rain Gardens, \$315,000 for COVID Relief, \$80,000 in Block Grants funds for side walks, \$100,000 Sustainable Grant, and \$2.5 million dollars for American Rescue Plan Funds.
- Instituted Quarterly Meetings for the Budget and Audit Process
- Instituted transparency during the procurement process.
- Community Outreach-Food Drives, Blood Drives, Managed the Cheverly COVID Relief Fund and paid over \$17,000 in back rent and bills.
- Realigned insurance policies to save the town over \$100,000.

2021 Department of Public Works Accomplishments

Storm Water:

- Hosted Storm Water Flood Tour with State, County, and Town Officials
- Commenced Prince George's County Storm Drain Municipal Acceptance Program project for Crestlawn/ Arbor/Parkway area including identifying engineer to design and oversee project
- Engaged Low Impact Development Center and grant funding for initial triage of Water Woes

Urban Forest Management:

- Regularly monitored, inspected, and maintained public trees within allocated funding
 - o Trees Planted 126 (Public 76) (Private 50)
 - o Public Trees Pruned 94
 - o Public Trees Removed 48
 - o Public Stumps Removed 29
 - o Resident Requested Tree Maintenance of Public Trees 88
 - o Continued to develop a Master Street Tree Planting Plan combined with a digital GPS tree inventory

Rain Garden:

Completed installation of Rain Garden at Town Hall

Roads and Sidewalks:

• Closed out approximately \$500K of road projects and completed extensive sidewalk improvements which reduced tripping hazards throughout the Town

Playgrounds:

- Developed final design of new inclusive Woodworth Park incorporating numerous opportunities for resident input
- Refreshed playground surfaces

2021 Police Department Accomplishments

Chief Miller went straight to work and has already created new policies.

CPD met with PCAB, the Women's Club, and other town organizations.

Continued recruitment to finally have a fully staffed police department twenty-four hours a day by June of 2022.

CPD has enhanced accountability and security.

This is the longest Mayor's Corner I will ever do because I want you to know our folks work hard for you. It may be difficult for us as residents to see how hard our staff is working for our everyday comforts, but I want to start our year off with gratitude and reflection.

As we rounded the corner of 2021, it seemed like Omicron was coming to steal what little joy we were getting used to. Fight back the urge to be verklempt. We've made it another year! Now what are you going to do with it?

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the

property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more



The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed.

PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
- On any courts,
- On the even-numbered side of all streets,
- **(exception)** On the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belleview Avenue.

NOTE: The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

PRIORITIES: The snow removal operations work under the following priorities: 1.) Cheverly Avenue 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valley Way, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive; 3.) all other streets.

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Strore valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

SAFETY REMINDER:

We ask residents to remember that your neighbors who walk to Metro, or children walking to school, and the hard working Mail Carriers are exposed to dangerous conditions when sidewalks are not



cleared in a timely manner. Failure to comply with Town Code could result in fines.

TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day).

Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.

Due to the Covid19 restrictions, applications for Zone Permits will only be accepted by US Mail or placed in the Permit Box located on the left-side wall of the main entrance at Townhall.

- Report Street Light Problems to Pepco

If you are having any problems with street lights (they are out, blinking on and off, etc.) you can contact Pepco directly. Go to www.pepco.com, go to Outages, and click on Report a Street Light Outage. Enter either the address or pole number. A map showing the street lights in the area will appear. Click on the street light you wish to report. You will be directed to enter information about the light and your contact information.

TRASH COLLECTION REMINDER

Sec. 10-7 Except for household trash, which the town may collect from side or rear yards, all collectible trash shall be placed at the street side or curb, but shall not be placed there earlier than 7:00 p.m. on the day before it is scheduled to be collected. All containers or uncollected trash and waste must be removed from the street side or curb by 7:00 p.m. of the day it was scheduled for collection. Upon request of a resident to the town administrator and for good cause shown, the town may collect recyclables from a side or rear yard of the property.



CONTAINERS NOT TO EXCEED THIRTY-TWO (32) GALLON CAPACITY.


Just a reminder, and as stated on the Town's website, "Containers not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity."

Online Reporting

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the department implemented an online reporting system for some non -emergency calls for service. These calls include auto tampering, destruction of property/property damage, lost property, theft from autos, and certain other thefts that don't rise to the level of burglary. Residents are encouraged to utilize this system, in lieu of the non-emergency number, for incidents that meet the requirements.

Once completed, the reports can be obtained by request via reports@cheverlypolice.org. You will receive a call from one of our officers to either gather further information or to provide the respective case number. Report Requests

All reports can be requested, via email, at reports@cheverlypolice.org. When submitting your request, please include as much information as possible, that pertains to the report. In addition, a photocopy of the requesting party's ID will need to accompany the request for identification purposes. In response to the state of emergency, all fees associated with report requests have been waived.

Tips@cheverlypolice.org is the email address that residents can use to send non-emergency tips or information to the department. Our investigators are constantly working to investigate criminal cases in which our residents have been victimized. If you have or believe you have information, photographs, or video that could assist the department, and you don't want to call, please send us an email. If you see someone in immediate danger or a crime being committed, dial 911.

Cheverly's Mass Notification System is Here!

CodeRED allows residents to receive emergency alerts via text, email, or phone call. Upon signing up for the service, users can create a Managed Account, which allows the user to create a username and password and control the following:

- 1. Types of alerts received:
 - a. Emergency Alerts (Mandatory)
 - b. General Alerts (Optional)
 - c. Weather Alerts (Optional, as provided by the National Weather Service)
- 2. Method alerts are received:
 - a. Via text message
 - b. Via email
 - c. Via phone call

Users can also perform a Quick signup however, doing so would require the user to call CodeRED's customer service line in order to make any changes to the account.

Users are required to have either a residential or business address, within the Cheverly limits, in order to sign up for an account. The system supports multiple addresses, phone numbers, and emails.



GREEN @ HOME -- Nature Research in Cheverly

We may be used to learning about research into our natural world happening in far-away, exotic, places. But did you know that research is taking place right here in Cheverly, right in our own back yards?

Cheverly residents participating in the Smithsonian's Nestwatch program contributed to research documenting that native plants are far better than non-natives in providing resources that birds and other wildlife need to survive. A four-year study focusing on Carolina Chickadees in Nestwatch yards in our region found that chickadees strongly preferred to forage in native plants. Those native plants supported the most caterpillars for food for the nestlings. Chickadees were more likely to breed in yards that had more native plants.

Cheverly Nestwatch participants contributed to a Smithsonian study of the relation of 17-year cicada sounds and bird behavior.

Cheverly yards are also contributing to a study of American Robin migration undertaken by Emily Williams, a PhD student at Georgetown University. These very common and successful birds seem to be expanding their range in North America. They have been little studied, and their migratory behavior is not yet well understood. Emily hopes to expand the study to Cheverly Nature Park next season.

She will present her plans at the next meeting of the Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee, Monday, January 3rd, 7:30 PM. Zoom details will be posted on the town website and through News and Announcements. Everyone, of course, is welcome!
