Financial success smiled upon us, with nearly \$4 million secured for various town projects. This included funding for the much-anticipated Public Works building and infrastructure projects supported through block grants for sidewalks and street paving.

Amid challenges with WSSC, we stood firm, holding them accountable as crucial stakeholders in our communities as well as did the same with the State Highway Administration. Monthly gatherings for residents and teens brought a sense of unity and vibrancy to our neighborhood. And the effort to get the Youth Council up and rolling pushed ahead. We finalized support in lowering the voting age while seeing a record number of teens come forward to share testimony about the importance of having a voice in local elections. These experiences have strengthened our community bonds.

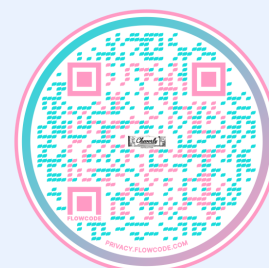
As we embrace the lessons of the past year, we eagerly look ahead to the opportunities that 2024 holds for us. Let's continue working together to build a

## **RESIDENTIAL BUSINESS LICENSES**

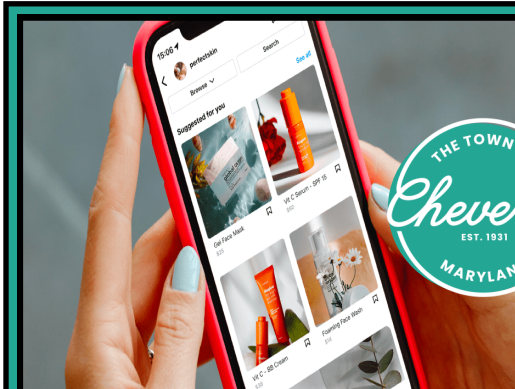
If you are currently operating a business out of your home, you are required to obtain a Town Residential Business License.



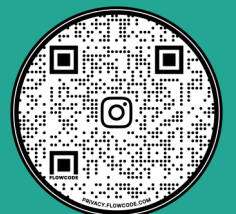
Home occupations are under (Chapter 9 of Town Code) and (subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code) and do not include any retail business or trade, etc.

### *Message from the Chief*

As we begin 2024, yes, 2024, with new opportunities, hopes, and resolutions, may the coming year be filled with happiness, success, and good health for all. New beginnings provide an opportunity to reflect on what matters most in our lives. For me, it's my family. I am blessed to have people in my life who love me for who I am. I carry that same message with me in my professional life, serving our community and recognizing the importance of meeting people where they are. These thoughts also remind me of the reasons why I entered law enforcement nearly four decades ago — to make a difference, a responsibility we all share.

So, as we enter a new year, history can serve as a reminder of the importance of good policing. One of the first lessons learned upon entering the police academy in 1985 was about Sir Robert Peel. One might ask, "So, who is Robert Peel?" In 1829, Sir Robert Peel established the London Metropolitan Police Force. He became known as the "Father of Modern Policing," and his commissioners established a list of policing principles that remain as crucial and urgent today as they were two centuries ago. They contain three core ideas:

1. The goal is preventing crime, not catching criminals. If the police stop crime before it happens, we don't have to punish citizens or suppress their rights. An effective police department doesn't have high arrest stats; its community has low crime rates.
2. The key to preventing crime is earning public support. Every community member must share the responsibility of preventing crime, as if they were all volunteer members of the force. They will only accept this responsibility if the community supports and trusts the police.

3. The police earn public support by respecting community principles. Winning public approval requires hard work to build a reputation: enforcing the laws impartially, hiring officers who represent and understand the community, and using force only as a last resort.

I share these core principles not only with our community but also with our police department staff, serving as a reminder of what our ultimate objectives should be: accountability, transparency, and upholding community trust. While easy to speak, these words are much more challenging to fulfill, but I remain confident in our profession and our department's ability to meet this challenge. We will falter; we will make mistakes; we will have missteps; we will experience shortcomings — after all, we're all human. However, I know that our officers police from the heart.

We recently recognized Officer Valencia, who used his own money to purchase food for a family in need. We acknowledged lifesaving efforts by our officers responding to critical incidents involving severe injuries. Our police staff, both sworn and civilian, are committed to your safety. We welcome constructive suggestions from our residents, offering ideas on how the Cheverly Police Service may improve to better serve and protect the citizens of Cheverly.

I encourage our community to remain engaged with your police department, bearing in mind that the first word in community policing is community.

All the best in 2024.

- \* Is your car ready for winter travel? It's not too late to winterize your car. Check out these car care tips to prepare you for winter driving:
- \* Check your tires and replace them with all-weather or snow tires, if necessary.
- \* Keep your gas tank full to prevent ice from getting in the tank and fuel lines.
- \* Use a wintertime fluid in your windshield washer.
- \* Make an emergency kit to keep in your car. Include water, snacks, first-aid kit, blankets, flashlight, extra batteries, portable cell phone charger, and emergency flares.

#### Prepare Your Home

- \* Winterize your home to help protect yourself and your family from any potential damage the cold temperatures and snow may bring.
- \* Follow these tips to keep your home safe and warm:
- \* Check your heating systems.
- \* Clean out chimneys and fireplaces.
- \* Closely monitor any burning fires or candles.
- \* Check your carbon monoxide and smoke detectors.
- \* Remove ice and snow from walkways to prevent slips and falls.
- \* Keep an emergency kit in your home that includes flashlights, extra batteries, a first-aid kit, extra medicine, and baby items.
- \* If you lose power, your kit should also include food and water for three days for each family member, warm clothing if you have to evacuate, and toys and games for children.

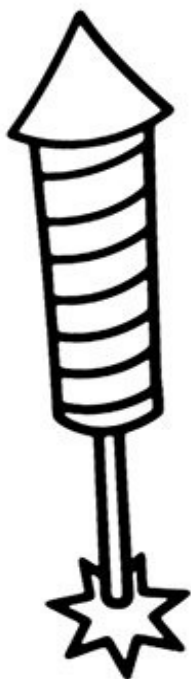

Yard Waste and Recycling should not be put in plastic trash bags. **Electronics will no longer be picked up with Recycling on Wednesdays. They will be picked on Thursdays or Fridays with Bulk Trash.**

**Did you know you can request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist?**

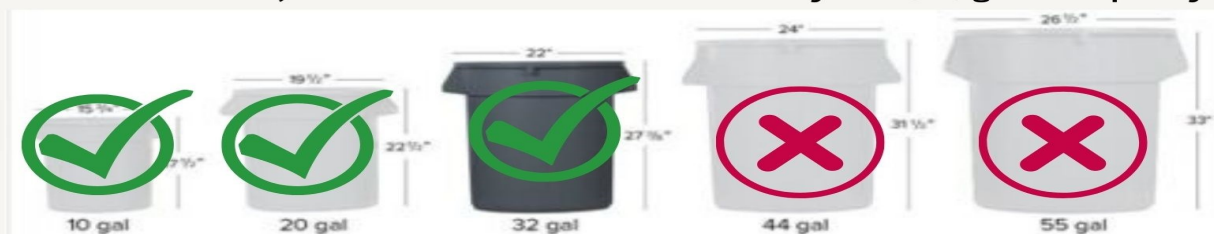


To request a private tree inspection visit the Town website at [www.cheverly-md.gov](http://www.cheverly-md.gov), complete and return the Tree Evaluation Agreement form and submit the \$85 inspection fee.

Fees can be made online or via mail by check. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Cheverly and mailed or dropped off at: Town Hall, Attention Public Works, 6401 Forest Road, Cheverly, MD 20785. Once the inspection is completed the resident will receive a report on their tree. Please note: checks will be cashed upon receipt.

## TRASH CAN SIZE FOR COLLECTION

**Just a reminder, containers are not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity.**



Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

\*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

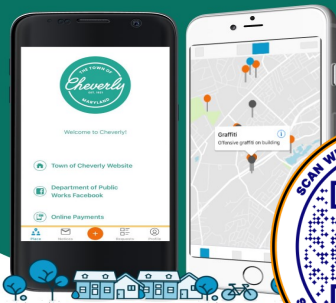
## William Eley Jr. Public Works Building Construction

# CODE COMPLIANCE

## PARKING COMPLIANCE

According to Code Sec. 18-4.2 and Sec. 27.5

Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational & legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.



### **TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking**

**A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more.** The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed.



**PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:**

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
- On any courts,
- On the even-numbered side of all streets, **(exception)** On the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Bellevue Avenue.

**NOTE:** The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

**PRIORITIES:** The snow removal operations work under the following priorities: 1.) Cheverly Avenue 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valleyway, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive; 3.) all other streets.

## WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS TOWN

**CODE - Sec. 27-10—**

**Parking A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more.**

The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when

snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed.



### **PARKING RESTRICTIONS:**

**During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:**

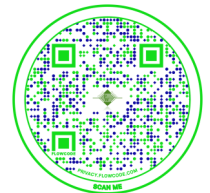

- 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valley Way, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive;
- 3.) all other streets.

## SIDEWALKS

### **TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS**



Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks. When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day).

Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.

## VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

## OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER

### Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.

## SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



**Sec. 4-10 (a)** It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of

Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

## CHEVERLY RENTAL LICENSES

All single-family, multi-family, and roomer rental dwellings in Cheverly are required by Chapter 5 of the Town Code to obtain a Cheverly Rental Housing License.



Licenses are issued annually for the Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30). Call the Code Compliance Officer at 240-770-7647 for an application.

The yearly rental license fee is \$100.00.

**Note: Failure to comply with Town Code licensing laws can result in a fine of \$500.**

## RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING

2023 Residential ZONE parking permits will be available December 15th. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle. There is a maximum of 2 guest passes per residence. The first guest pass is free and the second guest pass may be obtained for \$2 fee. (Note: ONLY two guest passes per address.)

## CHEVERLY NATIVE PLANTING PROJECT

As we ring in a new year, CNPP is ringing in a new name. We are now COMMUNITY Native Planting Project and we have our own nonprofit status! We're excited because these changes will help us expand our work improving the ecological health of our public and private green spaces.

One thing we can do to that end now is tackling invasives, like English ivy (*Hedera helix*). It's shiny green leaves stand out in the winter. Unfortunately, that's a green that we don't want to see.

English ivy is a threat to all vegetation from the ground to the tree canopy. In our yards, not only does it out-compete native plants, but it is also a breeding ground for mosquitos. As it grows up trees, it gradually kills them by enveloping branches, blocking sunlight and photosynthesis. The weight of the vines also creates hazardous trees that fall on roads and cars, as we have seen this past year. How its rootlets attach can also damage homes, retaining walls, and fences.

Getting rid of English ivy will protect you and your property, save your trees, improve your yard, and enhance our public spaces.

To free your trees, use clippers or a small hand saw to cut the vines at a comfortable height all the way around the tree. For thicker vines, carefully saw through the stems, stopping when you get to the tree bark to avoid damaging it. A flathead screwdriver can be used to pry the vines away from the tree. Pull the cut stems down to the ground, taking care to avoid damaging the tree. \*Do not try to remove the vines above your cut line.\* The cut ivy will soon die and eventually fall. Pull cut ivy vines out of the ground around the base of the tree, making a two-foot "lifesaver ring" around the tree.

Ground infestations can be removed by hand, with help from pruning snips to cut stems, or a heavy-duty rake to help gather the vines.

CNPP will be posting about volunteer sessions to remove English ivy on public land around Cheverly. ## **GREEN @ HOME – AIR QUALITY MONITORING NETWORK EXPANDS**

Concerned about your health and air quality? You're about to go outdoors and want to know about the air quality in town. See the air quality measured by monitors throughout Cheverly and surrounding communities.

You can find the Purple Air map at <https://map.purpleair.com/1/mAQI/a10/p604800/cC4#14.08/38.92999/-76.91459> and at [www.greencheverly.org](http://www.greencheverly.org).

This map is part of the hyperlocal air quality monitoring network set up in 2019 by the Town of Cheverly and the University of Maryland. Cheverly's network includes Purple Air sensors collecting data about particulate matter, a key metric for air pollution. Black carbon monitors are being added to the network under an EPA grant.

The results of the monitoring help provide a baseline for gauging the immediate and cumulative effects of additional industrial development and road traffic. Just last month the network registered higher than usual readings. The Maryland Department of the Environment will look into the correlation of those spikes with the explosions or "booms" reported by residents during the same period.

The air quality monitoring project is now expanding to cover the entire Route 50-Sheriff Road-Kenilworth Avenue Quadrant. A workshop was held on

**This survey is designed to gather resident feedback.**

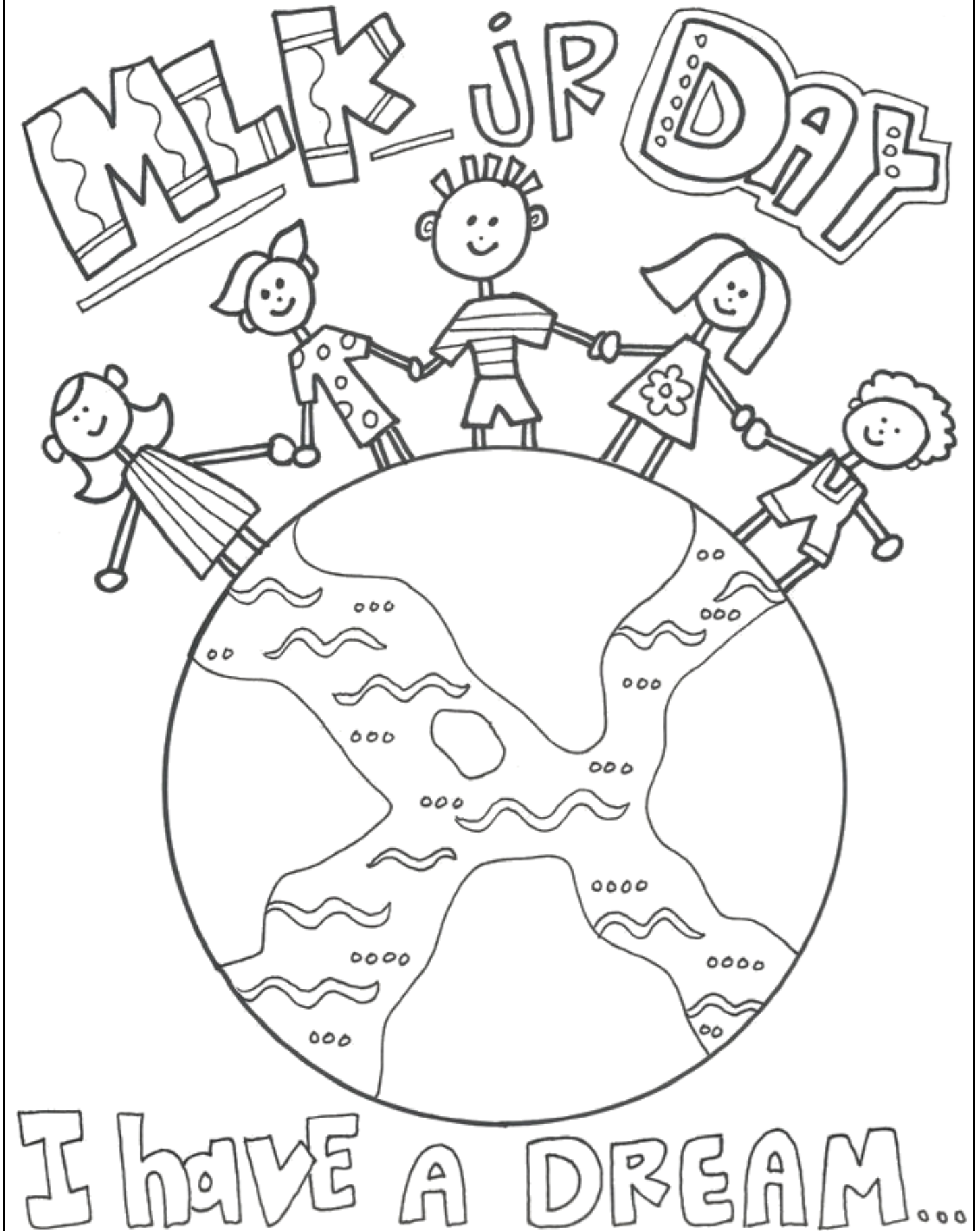
The survey *is not*:

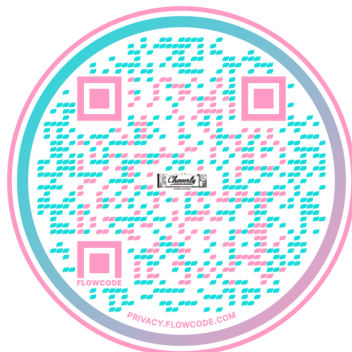
