Mayor's Corner

Hello Cheverly Neighbors and Friends,

It's Time to Think Trees.

Help Cheverly reach a goal of planting 1000 trees in our Town in less than 10 years!

Join me in an exercise. Close your eyes and imagine Cheverly's private property and public space trees disappearing at an increasing rate. Open your eyes and it's happening.

Cheverly's tree canopy is suffering, and we are losing more trees than we can currently replace. This loss threatens the community we all love. Much of our losses are a result of private property tree removals—some as a result of an aging tree canopy, but, as of late, I too often hear of neighbors removing trees out of fear brought on by an overly aggressive "tree removal specialist," or even decisions to remove mature trees in order to gain more sun for solar and even to eliminate the recurring cost of pruning and raking.

Additionally, Cheverly lost 94 public right-of-way and Town trees that were dead, dying, or deemed a threat to reliable power delivery as a result of the 2019 Pepco Vegetative Management plan.

At the same time, we are reviewing our Town trees from a safety perspective and necessary tree maintenance. Enlisting the services of a well-respected consulting arborist, Dr. Feather, in evaluating the Town's street trees and many park trees, has prioritized tree maintenance that includes tree pruning and a significant number of necessary tree removals.

The measure of the loss of our tree canopy extends well beyond beauty! Research shows that the benefits of trees in our landscape extend into every aspect of our health and wellbeing. People identify our tree canopy as a reason for choosing to buy a home in Cheverly

Neighbors throughout Town are coming to realize that the loss of a mature tree from their landscape has translated to new or exacerbated water issues on their properties and in their homes. The reality of a changing climate has undeniably affected the amount and behavior of stormwater and ground water in our Town. Our trees are an important component of managing these effects.

As outlined in the EPA's Stormwater to Street Tree Report, "While trees have long been recognized for their ability to help clean the air, reduce energy needs, raise property values, and mitigate heat island effects, their innate ability to absorb and divert rainfall has been underutilized. Trees have proven value in reducing runoff and mitigating the costs of stormwater management. In fact, research by the United States Forest Service has shown the environmental and economical values trees contribute to the community."

Is there a solution? Can we turn the tide and enjoy a Green Treed Cheverly? The answer in Cheverly is always a "Yes! And"— it will take all of us to make it happen.

Help Cheverly reach a goal of planting 1000 trees in our Town in less than 10 years!

Accept and love and care for the trees being planted in the Town's right-of-way.

In the immediate, Pepco is planting 94 street trees to replace the trees that they removed last year. The tree planting strip in front of our houses, and within the Town's right-of-way, has been identified as a suitable site for planting. White dots identify planting spots and adjacent residents have received letters regarding the planting schedule. The tree that will be planted will be selected based upon the "right tree, right place" so that as the tree grows it is not expected to interfere with overhead utilities, if there are utilities overhead. Please work with us to love and care for these fledgling public trees, especially during any dry periods. The Town will attend to needed pruning and maintenance as they mature.

Sign up for Cheverly's Free Tree Planting Program—and do it again!

Find a place for a tree (or two or three) in your front and back yard. Our yards create the tree canopy here in Cheverly. I personally encourage you to take advantage of the Town's free private tree planting program. You have a tree menu from which to choose and I hope that you choose a canopy tree and give it a chance to get started and reserve the ornamentals for your next free tree request. Advocate for a robust tree planting and maintenance program in our upcoming budget!

We are entering budget discussions. Our community needs to make our trees a budget priority and support developing a treescape plan for our street trees throughout town, tree replacement for every tree removal, and additional tree planting focused on restoring our tree canopy. We also will need support in our budget for tree watering and maintenance, so that our tree investment survives and thrives. In addition, I would like to see us find a way to responsibly engage an "consulting arborist" pilot program that could offer residents the opportunity to consult an arborist about a private property tree concern, with the goal of reducing unnecessary or premature tree removals.



Report Street Light Problems to Pepco



As many of you know, department staff have been working diligently to fill the vacancies so that we can provide the best possible service to our community. In order to ensure that newly hired officers are not only qualified, but of sound judgement, and good fit for Cheverly, we spend a great deal of time evaluating every applicant. I mention all of this because I recognize that the department has not been as visible over the last few months. As staffing levels improve, you will notice much more community engagement. In the very near future, we will be announcing our 3rd Community Movie Night. We will be screening "The Lego Movie 2: The Second Part" and as usual, we will be providing free snacks!



As you know, prescription drug abuse is a real issue that has significantly increased in recent years, particularly among youth. According to the Office of National Drug Control Policy, one third of all new abusers of prescriptions drugs are between the ages of 12 and 17. In order to reduce teen access to prescription drugs, The Cheverly Police Department would like to remind our community that we have a permanent drug disposal drop box in the lobby of our police department. The lobby is open from 7 AM to 7 PM, Monday through Friday, and 8 AM to 4 PM on Saturdays. If you do not have the means to get to the department, contact our administrative offices at 301-341-1055 and we will arrange for an officer to pick up your medication. Needles are not accepted in this drop box.

Our investigators are constantly working to investigate criminal cases in which our residents have been victimized. In most cases, leads are obtained with the help of residents who reported something that just didn't feel right. If you feel that someone or something is out of place and have information, photographs, or video, and just don't want to call, please, send us an email.

Cheverly's Mass Notification System is here!

CodeRED allows residents to receive emergency alerts via text, email, or phone call. Upon signing up for the service, users can create a Managed Account, which allows the user to create a username and password and control the following:

Users can also perform a quick signup however, doing so would require the user to call CodeRED's customer service line in order to make any changes to the account.

Users are required to have either a residential or business address, within the Cheverly limits, in order to sign up for an account. The system supports multiple addresses, phone numbers, and emails.


