### MAYOR'S CORNER

#### Redevelopment of Hospital Hill is happening your participation is critical!

I want to make sure that you are "in the room where it happens" and bringing ALL your neighbors! The University of Maryland Prince George's Hospital Center is scheduled to relocate this spring. The County is prioritizing the redevelopment of this property into a premier housing/hotel/retail site. People are often surprised to learn that the properties that make up the hospital complex are not actually within the Town of Cheverly! Yet, this is the mostcritical development matter to come before Cheverly in decades. With the development so close and prominent in our community, I believe that our town needs to annex the hospital hill site and work alongside the Redevelopment Authority (RDA) and any future developer from day one of the process to create something truly wonderful. The RDA and County Councilmember Ivey offered a broad community update on February 11 (see links below to review the presentation). I am committed to making sure that Cheverly residents are informed and have a voice and that the Town of Cheverly is a full partner in this process. I look forward to sharing the extraordinary opportunity that Cheverly offers with prospective developers and extending an invitation that we directly partner in the development process.

## **Special Meeting on Hospital Hill—mark your calendar for Thursday, March 4 at 6:30PM.** I have requested and appreciate the RDA's support in bringing the development of hospital hill directly to you, Cheverly residents. I am calling a Special Meeting for Cheverly residents to directly review and engage this development process for Thursday, March

4, beginning at 6:30 PM. We will walk through a presentation from the RDA during this meeting, and I will encourage you to share your ideas, questions, and concerns. I urge you to please be open to the development of this site as an expansion of Cheverly.

I believe that our community wants this development to be a full part of our town. If we are recognized as full partners in this process, there is every possibility to support the greater density necessary for drawing in the amenities many residents have been seeking for years, address the concerns of the most directly affected neighbors. and preserve, protect and, restore our green infrastructure that supports our health, wellness, and desirability of our

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community. I promise residents most directly affected by this development that I have requested additional meetings specific to your concerns. #### Please Vote or Run—Cheverly Elections for Town Council on Monday, May 3, 2021

Please save the date of Monday, May 3, 2021, and support the electoral process! You can vote in Cheverly as long as you can demonstrate that you are 18 years of age and have lived in town for at least 30 days. This applies to those who are not US citizens, military families on assignment, and other individuals who meet the above requirements. Also, residents can both register and vote on election day. Please see election and voting information details inside this month's newsletter.

The March 19 deadline to file as a candidate in the Cheverly 2021 election is quickly approaching! Have you ever considered running for office? Cheverly elected office is nonpartisan and can be an excellent way to serve your community. This year, all six council member seats are up for election. The Cheverly Mayoral election is in 2022. The Town

Council's primary function is to set the Town staff's policy and direction and provide an oversight function. Our Cheverly Town staff carries out the management and administrative functions of the town. Councilmembers are required to regularly attend two meetings a month, on the second and fourth Thursday evenings. Other meetings may be called as needed. Most Councilmembers make themselves accessible for constituent services. They may also support projects that require an additional investment of time, including serving as a liaison to our Green Infrastructure Committee or Planning Board. Each Councilmember is paid \$2,400 annually and receives \$50 each guarter to cover incidental expenses. There are no other benefits other than the joy of serving your community. I served as a Cheverly Councilmember for nine years before becoming Mayor, and I can confidently tell you that serving and representing Ward One brought me great joy.

### **BOARD OF ELECTIONS**

### <u>Cheverly Municipal Election</u> Monday, May 3, 2021 (7am-8pm)

Candidates for Town Council must be

- At least 21 years of age
- A citizen of the United States
- A registered voter of Cheverly
- A resident of Cheverly for not less than 6 months
- A resident of the ward from which they are elected (at least 45 days before the date of the election)

Filing instructions for candidates: Forms may be obtained at the Town Office on Tuesdays or Wednesdays between the hours of 10:00 am and 3:00 pm. These hours are for picking up candidate forms only. **No other Town business will be conducted with residents.** 

### Completed forms must be returned to Town Hall by the close of business Friday, March 19, 2021.

The State of Maryland is requiring a new financial disclosure form that MUST be completed by all candidates in order for their petition for candidacy to be considered. Completed forms must be turned in to Town Hall no later than close of business Friday, March 19, 2021. The form can be downloaded from the Town's website or picked up from Town Hall Tuesdays or Wednesdays March 19, 2021 between the hours of 10:00am and 3:00pm.

**NOTE: Pictures & Profiles of Candidates** are run in the <u>April Newsletter</u>. They should be submitted by **March 15, 2019.**

### **Cheverly Election Day 2021**

Elections for the Town Council will take place on

Monday May 3, 2021. Polls will be open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm. Due to the current health crisis, Election Day will look different from normal. Absentee ballots will be available to any registered voter in the Town of Cheverly, who wishes to request one. Additional information regarding the absentee ballot procedure may be found elsewhere in the Newsletter and will be delivered to Town residents via News and Announcements.

### Filing Requirements for Candidates

Candidates wishing to run for Town Council may download the Nominating Petition from the Town website. Candidates must also fill out the Financial Disclosure form, which may be downloaded from the Town website as well. Candidates for Council must be at least 21 years of age, registered to vote in the Town of Cheverly, and shall have been a resident of the Ward in which they wish to run for a period of at least six months prior to Election Day. Candidates for Council must submit their nominating petitions 45 days prior to Election Day – and should be received at Town Hall by the close of business on Friday March 19, 2021. The Board of Election Supervisors will review and approve all filing petitions in order for the candidate to appear on the ballot. Candidates wishing to be considered as a write-in candidate may submit a write-in petition from the Town website. Write-in petitions must be received at Town Hall by no later than Friday April 30, to be considered as an official writein candidate.

### Registration of Voters

If you are registered to vote in Prince George's County and/or the State of Maryland, you are registered to vote in the Town of Cheverly. If you are not registered with the County or the State, you may still be eligible to vote in Town elections, based on the recent adoption of the "Non-Citizen Voting" amendment to the Town Charter. Any resident of the Town of Cheverly may register with the Town provided they meet the basic requirements for voting: a minimum of 18 years of age, have resided in the Town for no less than 30 days prior to Election Day, and have not been convicted of a crime, as defined in the Maryland Code. Those individuals interested in being enrolled in the Cheverly Voter Registry may contact the Board of Election Supervisors at chyboes@gmail.com. The deadline for registering to vote is Saturday April 3, 2021. However, the Town of Cheverly will allow for same day registration of voters and same day voting, provided the individual meets the requirements noted above.

#### Election Day Volunteers

In order to assist with conducting the election for Town Council, the Board of Election Supervisors is seeking volunteers to help on Election Day. Tasks will include assisting with crowd flow, sanitizing election stations, and other tasks as assigned by the Board of Election Supervisors. Lunch and dinner will be provided. ### **Election Day**

On Election Day, voting will take place in the gym at Town Hall. At this time, there are capacity restrictions on individuals indoors and if the limited numbers are still in place, changes will be made to ensure the safety of voters, judges, and supervisors. The Board of Election Supervisors has proposed a unidirectional flow for voting in the gym. Voters will enter through the double doors in the lobby, proceed to their respective Ward table for check-in, receive their ballots, proceed to one of the election voting stations, drop their ballots in the ballot box and exit the gym via the rear doors to the left of the stage.

All COVID protocols will be in place, including all individuals will be required to wear masks or face coverings, maintaining social distancing – no congregating in the lobby or the gym will be allowed, and doors will be left open in the gym to allow for adequate ventilation. Pens, voting stations, and judges tables will be sanitized on a regular basis for safety. There will appropriate spacing throughout the gymnasium.

Once the polls close on Election Day, the canvassing of ballots will begin. Under normal circumstances the canvassing is open to the public, however due to capacity limits, only elected officials, candidates for office and one designee will be permitted in the gym to watch the counting in person. The Board of Election Supervisors is preparing to broadcast the canvassing via Zoom and/or through the Town of Cheverly Channel (Verizon channel 35). Additional details will be provided closer to Election Day.

### **Absentee Voting in Cheverly Elections**

Absentee voting will be available to all Cheverly reg-

istered voters, who do not wish to vote in person on Election Day, scheduled for Monday May 3,2021. Any registered voter who wishes to vote by absentee ballot may do so by downloading the absentee ballot application, available on the Town website. Please note that no reason is required for requesting an absentee ballot. Completed applications may be mailed to or dropped off at Town Hall. There will be a blue mailbox mounted outside of Town Hall for the return of Absentee Ballot Applications. Once the ballots have been finalized, ballots will be mailed to those individuals who requested an absentee ballot. Ballots will also be available for pickup at Town Hall on Tuesdays or Wednesdays between the hours of 10:00 am and 3:00 pm.

Additional instructions will be provided to individuals requesting absentee ballots on how to properly complete the ballot and return it to Town Hall. Completed absentee ballots may be returned to Town Hall via USPS, however, the Board of Election Supervisors is aware of problems with mail delivery and recommends that ballots be returned in person to a ballot box, which will be installed in front of Town Hall. If individuals choose to return their ballots by mail, ballots must be received by the close of polls on Election Day. Ballots received after the polls close will not be counted. If a Cheverly resident requests and absentee ballot, they will not be allowed to vote in person on Election Day. Records will be maintained of those Cheverly residents requesting absentee ballots. The register of absentee voters will be available for review upon request of any registered voter.

### What will voting look like in 2021?

The Cheverly Board of Election Supervisors is informing all citizens of Cheverly that the Town will hold an election on Monday, May 3, 2021. This election will be for the entire Town Council – the Mayoral election will take place in 2022.

We have in-person voting in Town Hall from 7:00 am – 8:00 pm on Monday, May 3. All COVID-19 protocols will be in place, including masks, social distancing, and spacing throughout the gymnasium. The Board is planning to allow for any registered voter in Cheverly to request a ballot, if they choose not to vote in person, without providing a reason for an absentee ballot. The Town is also seeking to acquire a ballot box that will be installed in front of Town Hall – and any voter may drop their ballot in the box instead of sending the ballot back via the US Mail.

### Announcing the Cheverly Voter Registry

Recently, the Town of Cheverly enacted a Charter amendment allowing for "Non-Citizen" voting in Town of Cheverly elections. This amendment allows for any resident of Cheverly who meets the basic qualifications for voting: the individual shall have resided in the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly for at least thirty (30) days prior to the day of any general or special election; shall be eighteen (18) years old on or before the day of any general or special election; and shall not have been convicted of a disqualifying crime or be under the guardianship for mental disability. In addition, the Town of Cheverly anticipates allowing voters who are registered to vote

in another location to vote in Cheverly local elections, the primary example being military families who are stationed in the area and are living in Cheverly.

The Board hopes to hold several registration sessions during the month of March and April to allow for any resident who would like to vote in the upcoming elections to register for the Cheverly Voter Registry. In addition, the Board has reached out to several nearby municipalities that have implemented similar ordinances to find out the best ways to implement this new policy.

**TOWN OF CHEVERLY CHARTER AMENDMENT RESOLUTION R-06-20** A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CHEVERLY, MARYLAND, adopted pursuant to the authority of Article XI-E of the Constitution of Maryland and Title 4. Subtitle 3 of the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland (2013 Edition, as amended), to amend the Charter of the said Town, said Charter being a part of the public local laws of Maryland (1963 Edition, as amended), which Article contains in whole or in part the Charter of the Town of Cheverly, Maryland, whereby the Mayor and Town Council increase the number of the Board of Supervisors of Elections from Three (3) to Five (5), permit early voting, same day voter registration and voting, and mail-in voting.

### WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

### TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking

A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more. The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed.

### PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
- On any courts,
- On the even-numbered side of all streets,
- (exception) On the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belleview Avenue.

NOTE: The snow emergency parking restrictions do not

override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a noparking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

**PRIORITIES:** The snow removal operations work under the following priorities: 1.) Cheverly Avenue 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valleyway, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive; 3.) all other streets.

*TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1*—SIDEWALKS Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day).

Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.

### **RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING**

Residential ZONE parking permits are now available. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle with 1 free guest pass per address. A second guest pass may be obtained for \$2. (Only two guest passes per address.)

### **Cheverly Residential Zone Parking Permit Application**

Due to the Covid19 restrictions applications for Zone Permits will only be accepted by US Mail or placed in the mailbox located on the left-side wall of the main entrance at townhall.

- Permits can only be issued to vehicles registered in a Cheverly Address.
- A copy of your vehicle registration must accompany the Application.
- Cost of the Permit is \$5 per vehicle | 1 Guest Parking Pass is allowed <u>per residence</u> at no cost.
- An additional Guest Parking Pass is available for \$2. (No More Than 2 Guest Parking Pass per Address)

If you live in one of the following areas, you will need a Parking Permit:

Zone 1: State St, 61st & 62nd Ave, as well as the 1800 Block of 64th Ave

Zone 2: Eliminated

Zone 3: 22-2400 Block of Cheverly Ave

Zone 4: Arbor St & Crestlawn Ave (22-2300 Block Parkway Eliminated)

Zone 5: 2300 Block of Belleview Ave

Zone 6: Benton Rd & 23-25 Lake Ake

Zone 7: 2400 Block of Valley Way

Zone 8: 3300 Belleview Ave; Medical Ter

<u>SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to Park in the Odd Side of the 2200 Block of Cheverly Ave in</u> <u>order to utilize the Metro</u>

Residential Parking Permit are to be Displayed on the Back Left Bumper area.

If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.

Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.

Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks.

When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day).

### Online Reporting

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the department implemented an online reporting system for some non-emergency calls for service. These calls include auto tampering, destruction of property/property damage, lost property, theft from autos, and certain other thefts that don't rise to the level of burglary. Residents are encouraged to utilize this system, in lieu of the non-emergency number, for incidents that meet the requirements

In addition, for identification purposes, a photocopy of the requesting party's ID will need to accompany the request. In response to the state of emergency, all fees associated with report requests have been waived.

#### Tips@cheverlypolice.org

Tips@cheverlypolice.org is an email address that residents can use to send non-emergency tips or information to the department. Our investigators are constantly working to investigate criminal cases in which our residents have been victimized. If you have, or believe you have, information, photographs, or video that could assist the department, and you don't want to call, please send us an email. If you see someone in immediate danger, or a crime being committed, dial 911.

**Cheverly's Mass Notification System is here!** CodeRED allows residents to receive emergency alerts via text, email, or phone call. Upon signing up for the service, users can create a Managed Account, which allows the user to create a username and password and control the following:

- 1. Types of alerts received:
  - a. Emergency Alerts (Mandatory)
  - b. General Alerts (Optional)
  - c. Weather Alerts (Optional, as provided by the National Weather Service)
- 2. Method alerts are received:
  - a. Via text message
  - b. Via email
  - c. Via phone call

Users can also perform a Quick signup, however, doing so would require the user to call CodeRED's customer service line in order to make any changes to the account.

Users are required to have either a residential or business address within the Cheverly limits in order to sign up for an account. The system supports multiple addresses, phone numbers, and emails.

### **GREEN @ HOME -- SPRING EPHEMERALS**

What are spring ephemerals? A spring ephemeral is a plant that flowers in early Spring, while the forest floor is still sunlit before the tree leaves shade it. These beautiful wildflowers make a showy appearance in Spring and then become inconspicuous or dormant the rest of the year. It's a stunning display, and a surefire way to show that Spring has arrived. These native plants are threatened by invasive Lesser Celandine, which leaves no room nor nutrition for the delicate ephemerals.

Here in Cheverly March and April bring spring ephemerals to our natural areas and yards whose owners have planted these flowers. Look for Spring Beauty, Toothwort, and Trout Lily, the latter two especially in the Boyd Park woods. May Apple, Cheverly's town flower, covers a hillside and follows the trail in Woodworth Park. To find Bloodroot, Dutchman's Breeches, and Virginia Bluebells in public areas, you will have to venture out of Cheverly, but only as far as Watkins Regional Park.

Early spring bloomers among the woody plants are Spicebush, Carolina Allspice, and Pinxter Azalea, which you can find in Woodworth Park or Euclid Woods.

So boot up, mask up, and explore Cheverly's natural areas!
