Why Are We Doing Charter Amendments?

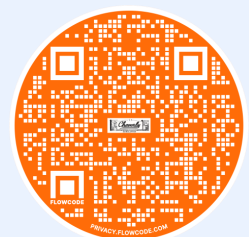
You may have seen the announcement for a public hearing about a proposed charter amendment regarding ward boundaries. Some of you may recall that I mentioned people were unable to vote for their candidate of choice in the last election. For some of our residents, it was the first time they learned that they did not live in the boundary they thought they lived in. Despite the charter being amended in 2012, the changes made were never registered with the county and also left some mistakes in the town charter's language describing the ward boundaries. These mistakes were found by the keen eyes of our Board of Elections. While the votes that were not cast, did not impact the final outcome of the election, it is important to correct these issues. The following are the proposed changes:

- The ward boundary description for Ward 4 skips the 2700 blocks of Cheverly Avenue and Belleview Avenue. Previously, voters cast their votes in Ward 4. (The proposed amendment will reflect this existing practice and ensure that the block is included in Ward 4's boundary description.
- Boundary descriptions for Ward 4 and Ward 6 include a random line that does indicate a road that rests entirely within Ward 4. The proposed amendment will remove it from the ward boundary descriptions.
- The ward 6 boundary description for "63rd Place" should read "63rd Avenue." The ward 6 Boundary should include the westside of 64th Avenue, south side of Inwood, and East side of 63rd place and those shouldn't be in ward 3 and 4. The language regarding Cheverly Station apartments in the southeast corner closest to 6521 puts those apartments in ward 6.
- Ward 5 boundary description said "west" where it should have said "east."

Is It Here Yet?

We have been waiting with bated breath for the American Rescue Plan funds and some of the money is finally here! When I think of all of the important work that we need to do for our town, I get excited about the opportunity to finally get some of it done! In the last work session, I asked Council to commit to having at least two special meetings to have community engagement about the funds we have received. I would like to hear your ideas about what we need as a town.

This is the skeletal budget that reflects a few priorities I see:

- Stormwater management projects (includes grant money for private property that has a negative impact on public property and groundwater issues)
- Potential purchase of parcel of land at the end of 64th Avenue.
- HVAC system being installed in Town Hall
- Begin the construction of the William Eley Jr. Public Works Building
- Purchase and renovation of building on Oak Street (potential location for residents to rent rooms for yoga classes, language classes, etc.)
- Street light repairs and installation. Should include lights in local parks.
- COVID Relief Assistance to residents.
- Landscaping and maintenance of potential temporary dog park (end of Arbor Street)
- Funding for sidewalks and bike trails.

These are some of the key issues I think are critical for our town, but residents always have more and better ideas. I can't wait to start hearing from you. SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE

Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.



VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/webforms/house-check-request> to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure your residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Valuables should be stored, preferably in a bank.
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Lights inside the house should be set on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Shades and drapes should be drawn.
- Cars left in the driveway should be locked.
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- All windows and doors should be locked.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

GRASS, WEEDS AND OVERGROWTH Obstructions

1. Residents are reminded that with the nice weather more and more residents are out walking. Please keep the walkways and sidewalks clear of overgrowth and obstructions.
2. Keep vegetation from obstruction of the view near intersections.

Lot Maintenance

1. Residents are reminded to make sure your grass is cut before it reaches 8 inches in height.
2. The planting strip between the sidewalk and the street is your responsibility to maintain.
3. If you are going on vacation, make sure to make arrangements to have your grass cut for you.
4. Be sure to take into consideration that the weather can be unpredictable, but the grass still needs to be cut.

ACTIONS TAKEN

Worksession - September 29th

- ☐ **Motion for the Ward 6 boundary to Change the wording where it ends with the corner of 6517 and would go north to the northwest corner of 6505 going east along the 6505 back north to the eastern border then that would include that into Ward 6 and that motion will also have to include making the amendment for the Ward 5 boundary so that it would also follow similar language and that from 6517 it would go north to the northeast corner east and then to the northern boundary. Then we would also need to make the amendment to change in the Ward 6 boundary from Inwood to 63rd Avenue, were 63rd Avenue going north were 63rd Avenue turns into 62nd Place so making sure that it's 63rd Avenue not 63rd Place in the language right there. Also, to include that bifurcation for both the Ward 6 and the Ward 4 boundaries to take out where it stops at 6424 and does not come down to 6422 from 6424 up to 2803 Hillside and continue on so we're removing that language where it bifurcates that area, but it would have to be for both 4 and 6. To keep what is in the original charter where it keeps it in Ward 4. So, the boundaries for Ward 4 from the corner of Forest at 6562 and then continue west across Cheverly Avenue to Belleview at the corner of Belleview and Forest Road then going southeast back to Cheverly Avenue and then going south. CM Fry, seconded by CM Watson.**

CM Dalaker the language for Ward 5 going south from Route 202 approximately a half a block along the boundary of the town; I thought I heard Mr. LeGloahec read west but it's actually east.

Mr. LeGloahec read the section again and it said west, but it should say east.

CM Fry amended her motion to include the correction. CM Watson maintained the seconded. Approved unanimously.

- ☐ **Motion to make the Communications Townwide for the Movement of the Boundaries via Electronic and the Newsletter:** CM McCann, seconded by CM Fry.

CM McCann amended his motion to include a **Townwide Mailer**. CM Fry expressed concern about resources.

CM Fry removed her second to the motion. CM Fry agreed that the expense is unnecessary as there is enough time before the election to notify residents.

CM McCann amended Motion to *not* have a Townwide Mailer. CM Fry maintained her second to the amended motion. Approved unanimously.

- ☐ **Motion to Move to Closed Session to Obtain Legal Advice and Discuss Personnel Matters:** CM Fry, seconded by CM Nettles. Approved unanimously.

RESIDENTIAL ZONE PARKING

Residential ZONE parking permits are now available. The price of the permit is \$5 per vehicle with 1 free guest pass per address. A second guest pass may be obtained for \$2. (Only two guest passes per address.)

Cheverly Residential Zone Parking Permit Application

Due to the Covid19 restrictions, applications for Zone Permits will only be accepted by US Mail or placed in the Permit Box located on the left-side wall of the main entrance at Townhall.

- Permits can only be issued to vehicles registered to a Cheverly Address.
- A copy of your vehicle registration must accompany the Application.
- Cost of the Permit is \$5 per vehicle | 1 Guest Parking Pass is allowed **per residence** at no cost.
- An additional Guest Parking Pass is available for \$2. (No More Than 2 Guest Parking Pass per Address)

If you live in one of the following areas, you will need a Parking Permit: Please check the zone that applies.

- ☐ Zone 1: State St, 61st & 62nd Ave, as well as the 1800 Block of 64th Ave
- ☐ Zone 2: Eliminated
- ☐ Zone 3: 22-2400 Block of Cheverly Ave
- ☐ Zone 4: Arbor St & Crestlawn Ave (22-2300 Block Parkway Eliminated)
- ☐ Zone 5: 2300 Block of Bellevue Ave
- ☐ Zone 6: Benton Rd & 23-25 Lake Ave
- ☐ Zone 7: 2400 Block of Valley Way
- ☐ Zone 8: 3300 Bellevue Ave; Medical Ter
- ☐ SR: This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age and older to Park in the Odd Side of the 2200 Block of Cheverly Ave in order to utilize the Metro

Residential Parking Permit are to be Displayed on the Back Left Bumper area.

If you have a regular and a SR permit, display them next to each other on the Back Left Bumper.

Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on the REARVIEW mirror with information facing outward.

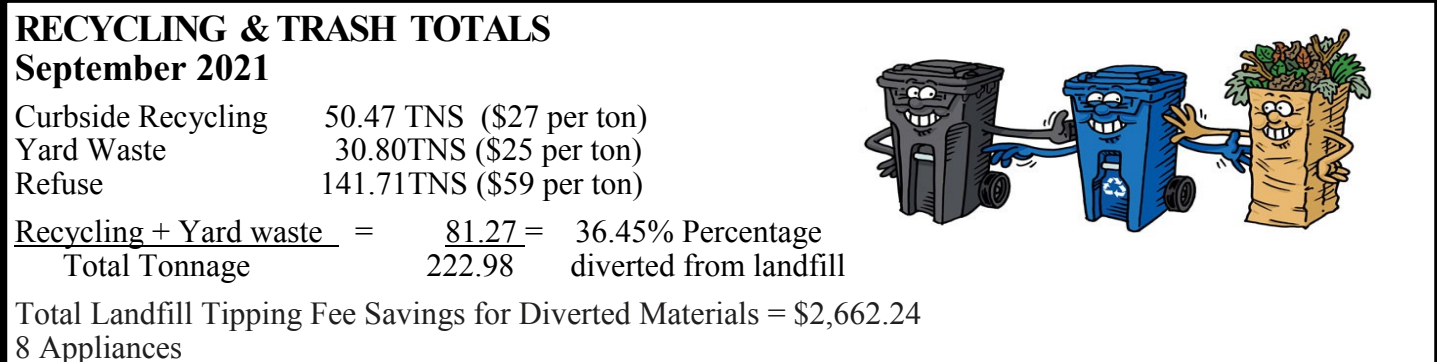

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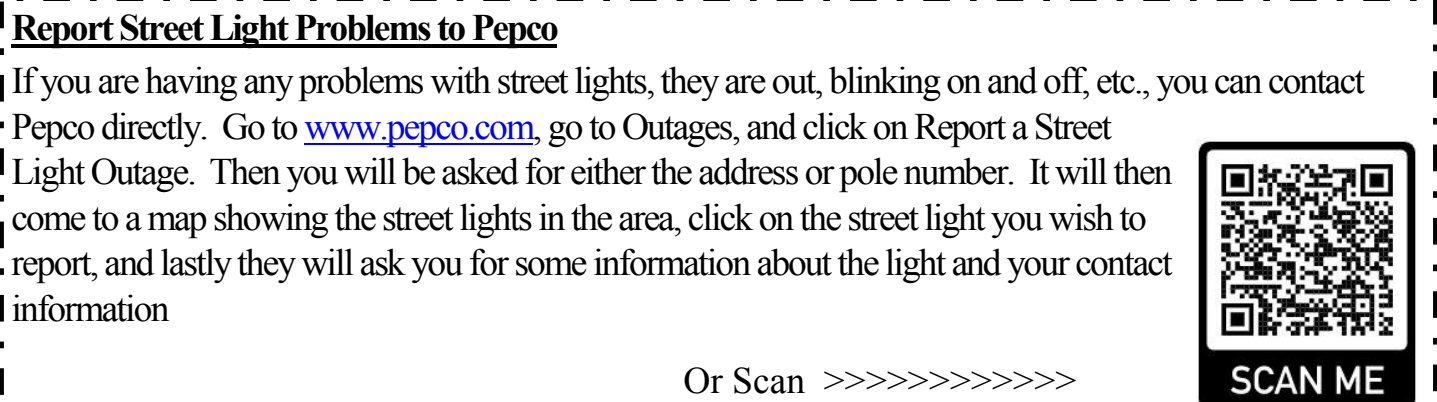

Town of Cheverly Receives Prestigious Sustainable Maryland Certified Award at Maryland Municipal League Conference



Environmental Finance Center at the University of Maryland announced that the Town of Cheverly was one of twelve Maryland municipalities honored at the Sustainable Maryland Awards Ceremony at the Maryland Municipal League's annual Fall Conference on Tuesday. This year marks the 10th anniversary of the Sustainable Maryland program.

Highlights of Cheverly's accomplishments include:

- Sourced all the Town's electricity from renewable wind power as of 2020.

- Friends of Lower Beaverdam Creek holds monthly work parties to clean up a trail near Lower Beaverdam Creek.
- Assembled a stand-up raised vegetable bed in Cheverly Village, community-based nonprofit that helps seniors

TRASH COLLECTION REMINDER

Sec. 10-7 Except for household trash, which the town may collect from side or rear yards, all collectible trash shall be placed at the street side or curb, but shall not be placed there earlier than 7:00 p.m. on the day before it is scheduled to be collected. All containers or uncollected trash and waste must be removed from the street side or curb by 7:00 p.m. of the day it was scheduled for collection. Upon request of a resident to the town administrator and for good cause shown, the town may collect recyclables from a side or rear yard of the property.



CONTAINERS NOT TO EXCEED THIRTY-TWO (32) GALLON CAPACITY.

Just a reminder, and as stated on the Town's website, "Containers not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity."

Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

****In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.***

CAN'T PAY RENT BECAUSE OF COVID-19?

The Prince George's County 2021 Emergency Rental and Utilities Assistance Program (ERAP) helps eligible households who have been financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The program provides **payment assistance for renters who need help with rent and utilities.**

Applications will be accepted until funds are no longer available.

Who can apply?

- Tenants unable to pay their rent due to a loss of income because of COVID-19.
- Landlords with occupied rental units on behalf of their tenants.



What is required of the tenants?

- Income information to verify that the household's income does not exceed 80% of the area median income, as determined by HUD, and adjusted for household size.
- Written description of the direct or indirect hardship experienced due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Tenants will NOT need to provide Social Security Number, birth certificate or immigration status information in order to apply.



What can ERAP cover?

- **Delinquent** rental and utility payments beginning on or after April 1, 2020.
- Rent assistance will be paid directly to the landlord/management company on behalf of the tenant through ACH direct deposit. Utility payments will be paid directly to the utility companies.

Over the past few weeks, the department has seen some change. I want to ensure the community that, though there has been some change the department is still running and officers are still in the community assisting any way they can. The department has made strides over the past two months hiring five new officers in hopes to return to full coverage and full staffing numbers in the future. Though there has been changes the standards and quality of service for the department has and will not change. Our officers are out every day trying to make a difference and help this community any way they can.

As a safety note please remember to lock all doors, vehicle and residences. As the world slowly gets back to normal and schools being back in session, pedestrian safety is key. Please ensure that if you are walking, use cross walks, obey all traffic signals, and wear bright colored clothes while walking at night. Residents riding bikes, please ensure you follow all traffic laws and posted road signs. Drivers, please ensure you are maintaining all posted speed limits and following all traffic signals. Please ensure you are looking out for walkers, joggers, and cyclists. Working together we can all help prevent an accident.

CPD Hiring The department continues to seek the right officers for the positions Please check the Cheverly Website or PoliceApp for openings. Residents who refer a candidate who receives a final offer of employment will receive a check for \$500.00!

Online Reporting In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the department implemented an online reporting system for some non-emergency calls for service. These calls include auto tampering, destruction of property/property damage, lost property, theft from autos, and certain other thefts that don't rise to the level of burglary. Residents are encouraged to utilize this system, in lieu of the non-emergency number, for incidents that meet the requirements.

Report Requests All reports can be requested, via email, at reports@cheverlypolice.org. When submitting your request, please include as much information as possible, that pertains to the report. In addition, for identification purposes, a photocopy of the requesting party's ID will need to accompany the request. In response to the state of emergency, all fees associated with report requests have been waived.

Tips@cheverlypolice.org is an email address that residents can use to send non-emergency tips or information to the department. Our investigators are constantly working to investigate criminal cases in which our residents have been victimized. If you have, or believe you have, information, photographs, or video that could assist the department, and you don't want to call, please send us an email. If you see someone in immediate danger, or a crime being committed, dial 911.

Cheverly's Mass Notification System is here! CodeRED allows residents to receive emergency alerts via text, email, or phone call. Upon signing up for the service, users can create a Managed Account, which allows the user to create a username and password and control the following:

1. Types of alerts received:

- Emergency Alerts (Mandatory)
- General Alerts (Optional)
- Weather Alerts (Optional, as provided by the National Weather Service)

2. Method alerts are received:

- Via text message
- Via email
- Via phone call

Users can also perform a Quick signup however, doing so would require the user to call CodeRED's customer service line in order to make any changes to the account.

Users are required to have either a residential or business address, within the Cheverly limits, in order to sign up for an account. The system supports multiple addresses, phone numbers, and emails.

PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY MASK MANDATE EXPANSION

C^oVID-19
(Coronavirus)

Effective immediately, Prince George's County has expanded its indoor mask mandate to include children ages 2 to 5 years.

- All residents and visitors over the age of 2 are required to wear masks in all indoor public venues and businesses in Prince George's County, even if they are fully vaccinated.
- This includes, but is not limited to, restaurants, gyms, retail stores, entertainment venues, conference centers, and office settings.
- Requiring children ages 2-5 to wear a mask for extended periods of time may be challenging. In these circumstances, wearing a mask can be prioritized for times where social distancing of six feet or more is difficult.
- Similar to past mandates, some exceptions apply, such as:
 - When an individual is actively eating and drinking
 - Individuals with a bona fide disability that prevents them from wearing a mask

APPLICATION OPEN FOR NEW CHEVERLY CIVILIAN POLICE COMPLAINTS BOARD.

The Town of Cheverly adopted the Resolution In Support Of Black Lives. The Resolution pledged to create an independent police complaints board composed of Town residents. The independent police complaints board shall be a separate, apolitical, entity from any group or board currently active in the Town or associated with any Town function. The independent police complaints board's purpose will be to obtain and forward complaints to the Town of Cheverly Police Department's Chief of Police for community members who would otherwise not be comfortable submitting their complaints directly. The independent police complaints board will only have review authority of complaints in instances where a request for secondary review is initiated by community members. Upon request for secondary review, the independent police complaints board will review the completed report of investigation in order to advise the Cheverly Police Department's Chief of Police as to whether they believe the investigation was complete, thorough, and impartial.

Ideally, this board will be comprised of two members from each ward with one alternate. This is contingent on the pool of applications. Any Town resident is welcome to apply, unless you have a criminal conviction that is not expungeable under Maryland Law. This application will remain open for thirty (30) days after the posting and notice in the Town newsletter.

After the notice has been sent, the application will remain open for 30 days to ensure as many people as possible are made aware and can apply. Applicants

must be Town residents without criminal convictions that are not expungeable under Maryland law. Applications are available at <https://www.cheverly-md.gov/town-administrator/webforms/application-become-member-police-complaints-board>

Selection Process:

NOVEMBER 9, 2021 IS THE DEADLINE TO SUBMIT APPLICATION

After the close of the application, a panel will review the applications within 30 days, unless interest exceeds expectations and an extension is warranted to ensure all applications are properly reviewed. The selection criteria will be posted with the application.

The selection panel will be constituted as follows:

1. Town Administrator or designee
2. PCAB member (Selected by vote of their membership)
3. Civilian Oversight Expert
4. Member of the Ethics Commission (Selected by vote of their membership)
5. Ganesha Martin - in the case of any tie breaker

Ideally, 2 members from each ward will be appointed, with one alternate. Meeting this goal depends on resident participation from across the town.

Once the selection is made, the board will be announced. Meetings regarding board structure and governance along with training will happen throughout November.

In early December, a messaging campaign around the new board's role and the process for submitting complaints will be commenced by the Town. Ideally, by the end of December, the board should be able to take its first complaints.



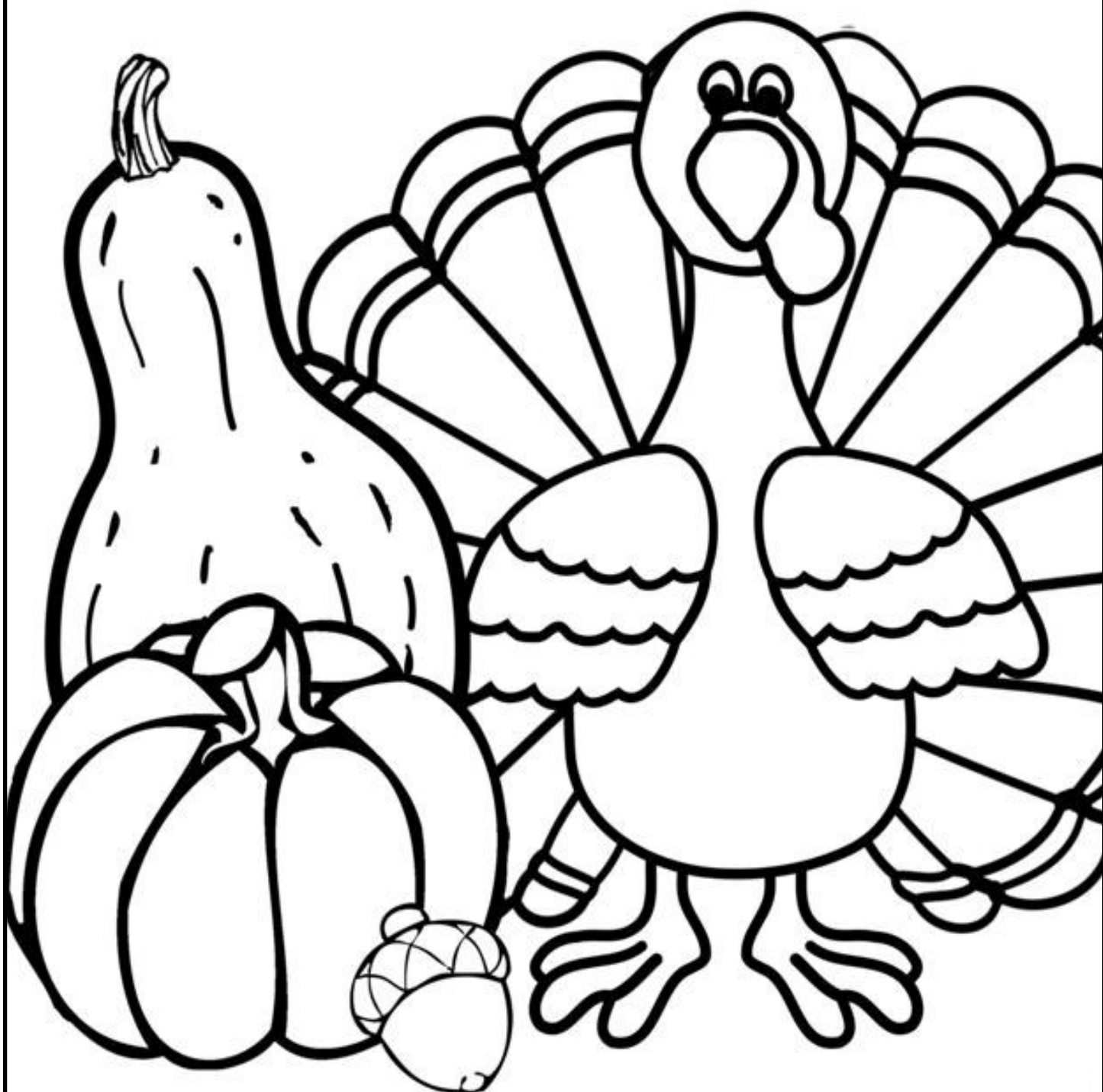

CHEVERLY NATIVE PLANTING PROJECT

FALL is the best time to plant your native shrubs and trees. Getting them in the ground now lets them focus their energy toward establishing their roots instead of working on their above ground show. The fall's cooler temperatures are less stressful than the summer's heat which quickly follows spring planting. And, the plants require less watering to get going this time of year. Planting now gives your natives a head start and the equivalent of an extra growing season.

With the help of the Cheverly Native Planting Project, a total of 177 native shrubs and trees went into the ground over the past few weeks! In addition to the 52 shrubs, we gave to the 26 Cheverlians who each removed one invasive bush, we helped our 2-for-1 participants order an additional 93 native shrubs and trees! CNPP also gave out 32 redbuds and sassafras saplings to those who stopped by our table at the Cheverly Community Market. As the leaves started to change color, Cheverly got a lot greener!

There is still plenty of time to plant this year. The goal is to get your plants in the ground before the first frost. Please bring your own scissors and a container for the arrangement. Remember to **Leave your Leaves**. Leaves left in garden beds provide habitat for caterpillars and other insects over the winter. Don't leave your leaves on the grass as they will cut off sunlight and smother the grass blades. You can always shred them with your lawnmower to add nutrients to the lawn. Trim perennial stems about 12 inches from the ground. Stem centers provide places for native bees to overwinter.

Mow Your Lawn Leaves Instead of Town Curb Pickup or Bagging

Most Cheverly residents either bag their leaves or rake them to the curb for the Town to pick up.

An easier way that takes less energy and time than raking and bagging is to just mow the leaves into your lawn. It also reduces the amount of time and money the Town has to invest in leaf pickup (at least 3 employees with a huge number of man-hours and it's a high carbon footprint activity).

Grass and leaves when cut together makes a perfect combination that composts quickly right into your lawn. This provides nutrients promoting lawn growth in the spring and acts as mulch to help keep moisture in the soil.

If you have a modest volume of leaves (you can see the grass through the leaves), you can use your mulching lawnmower to cut the leaves and grass together and just let them compost into the lawn.

If you have a medium amount of leaves (2-3 inches), you can mow as above a couple times over a 2 to 3 week period as the leaves are falling before they get too deep (second cut early Dec. when all leaves are down).

If you have a large volume of leaves (3-5 inches), you can use your mower with the side chute open. Start in the middle of your lawn and mow out toward the edges with the leaves being blown toward the edges of your yard. As you mow the leaves several times, as they are being blown toward the edges, the pieces get smaller and smaller. Some will stay on the lawn and compost in place with the grass. The rest will make a small pile along the whole edge of your yard that will compost by early spring. It can be left in place or used in your garden or as mulch under bushes. This keeps all the leaf nutrients in your yard.

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One last option is to make a pile of leaves in a corner of your yard. Use your lawnmower to cut the leaves into small pieces that will compost faster. To increase the speed of composting the leaves sprinkle/mix urea, fertilizer, or other high nitrogen compound into the pile. This will activate rapid composting in the pile with leaves composted by mid-spring. You'll also produce a superior compost to use as a fertilizer for your garden.

CHEVERLY VILLAGE Village Is Part of a Wider Circle of Villages!

Cheverly Village is happy to collaborate and share ideas with other villages. These include the five other Prince George's County

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villages in the Washington area (Washington Area Villages Exchange), and the several hundred villages across the United States that are members of the Village to Village Network, or VtV.

Cheverly Village learned a lot at this year's VtV annual conference, which was held virtually over three days in October. Presentations that we found especially helpful this year included sessions on fundraising and grant writing, as well as a presentation inviting villages to adopt a common vocabulary to describe the services we provide our members. This would enable us to describe the impact of our villages in aggregate terms. For example, instead of saying that "we transport members to medical appointments," we could tell funders and state policy makers that "xxx village volunteers in Maryland transported xxxx village members to medical appointments in 2021."

We also learned from and were inspired by the diverse ways that villages help members to live fully in community. We learned of a large analysis that brought together the results of 148 studies and showed that individuals with adequate social relationships, such as those formed in a village, have a 50% greater likelihood of survival compared to those who lack such relationships. This effect is comparable to the health benefit of quitting smoking!

Help share the word that joining Cheverly Village is all about living fully now! Together, our members, volunteers and supporters make it possible to stay in our beloved Cheverly community and age in motion.

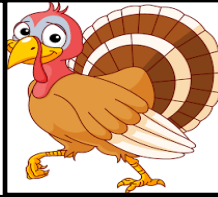

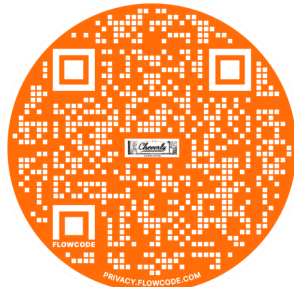
