Town Residential Business Licenses are issued

Vehicles that have not moved for 72+ hours may be towed; all vehicles need to be operational &

legally operable on both private property and on the street.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited to park in front of residential properties.

NOISE ORDINANCE

During summer months, residents are asked to be especially considerate of their neighbors' rights to peace and quiet.

During the day (8:00 am to 9:00pm) 'continuous' noise that can be heard from 30' away, and 'intermittent' noise or 'impulsive' noise that can be heard from 50' away is generally prohibited.

Continuous Noise is defined by law as noise that does not vary for at least five minutes; Intermittent Noise is noise that changes over time, but which can be heard

for more than ten seconds at any one time; and Impulsive Noise is short bursts of sound.

During the night (9:00pm to 8:00am), any noise that can be heard from 30' away from the property from which the noise is coming is prohibited.

It is also unlawful to allow a house or vehicle alarm to sound, continuously or at intervals, for 30 minutes or more. For purposes of enforcement after the 30-minute period, the owner of the house or vehicle is presumed to be aware of the sounding alarm.

Exceptions for the rule: Construction, repair or demolition of structures or public roads is allowed during the daytime, except on Sundays and Christmas Day, and during nighttime emergencies.

Daytime use of lawnmowers and other power tools is allowed; church bells, and vehicles used by public safety, government, and public utility officials are exempt from the law.

Residents may register complaints about noise by calling the county police response number, 301-333-4000. In most cases, a Cheverly police officer will be dispatched to the scene.

CODE COMPLIANCE

SOLID ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE



Sec. 4-10 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person controlling an animal, except a seeing eye dog, to allow or permit solid waste of such animal to remain on the property of any other person without the

consent of the owner or occupant thereof; or on such public properties as are prohibited by order of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Cheverly. Prohibited areas are sidewalks, Gast Park, American Legion Park, Boyd Park, & play areas of all other parks.

VACATIONS & HOME SECURITY

Residents planning to be away for vacations should visit https://www.cheverly-md.gov/cheverly-police-department/ webforms/house-check-request to arrange to have their homes checked while they are gone.

The following items should also be checked to make sure vour residence is safe and looks as much as possible like someone is there:

- Cancel newspaper & mail delivery or have a neighbor pick it up for you.
- Arrange for lawn care.
- Store valuables, preferably in a bank. •
- Store lawn mowers, bicycles, and lawn furniture inside.
- Set lights inside the house on a timer.
- Set telephone bells as low as possible.
- Draw shades and drapes.
- Lock cars left in the driveway. •
- Make sure smoke detectors are working.
- Lock all windows and doors.
- Give your house key & itinerary to at least one friend or neighbor.

PLEASE USE THE SIDEWALKS

As the weather begins to get nicer and more and more residents are walking or jogging in town, we are taking this opportunity to remind you that it is illegal to walk or jog in the street when a sidewalk is available on a road. The State law reads: 21-506

Rules for pedestrians on roadways

- (a) Where a sidewalk is provided, a pedestrian may not walk along and or an adjacent roadway.
- (b) Where a sidewalk is provided, a pedestrian who walks along and on a highway may walk only on the left shoulder, if practicable, or on the left side of the roadway, as near as practicable to the edge of the roadway, facing any traffic that might approach from the opposite direction.

We want all our pedestrians and motorists to be safe. So, please use the sidewalks. Not adhering to the above noted law may result in a fine being issued.

OUTDOOR BURNING REMINDER:

Sec. 12-3.

- (a) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material on any improved street, gutter, parking strip, parkway, park, alley or any other town property within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly.
- (b) No person shall burn or cause to be burned any trash, lumber, leaves, straw, tree branches, trees, logs or other combustible material within the corporate limits of the Town of Cheverly, without first obtaining a permit from the Town of Cheverly, excluding outdoor cooking devices.



Electronics Pick-up

Electronic equipment will no longer be picked up with recycling on Wednesday's. They will be picked up with bulk trash on designated east or west side pick-up schedule on Thursday or Friday.

This includes flat screen TVs' (older model televisions that are not flat screens should be set out for bulk trash), computers, printers, etc.

DONATE FURNITURE, HOUSEHOLD GOODS, AND OTHER BULKY ITEMS STILL IN GOOD CONDITION INSTEAD OF PLACING CURBSIDE FOR TRASH.

Do those old broken-down trash cans and recycling bins have you in a dump?

If you would like to dispose of an old and/or damaged recycling bin or trash can, please call Public Works (301-773-2666) to schedule a pickup. Make sure that it is all plastic with no metal parts and that it is clearly labeled with a sign saying "Dispose of Bin or Can." Then put it at the curb for pickup.



New Tree Evaluation Program

The Town recently rolled out a private tree inspection program. Residents may request one tree inspection per year by the Town's Arborist, Dr. Tolbert Feather. We are limiting inspections to one per address as we formally roll out this program to help ensure every address has an equal opportunity. There are 100 inspections in the budget, so limiting each address to one inspection will help cover the Town.

In order to request this service, a resident must fill out the form on the webpage and attach a check for \$85 made out to *Town of Cheverly*. And then mail to or drop off at Town Hall Attn: Public Works. Each inspection costs \$85, and the resident will receive a report on their tree. Once the form is approved, the inspection will be scheduled.



Checks won't be deposited until after the inspection report is completed.

TRASH COLLECTION REMINDER

Sec. 10-7 Except for household trash, which the town may collect from side or rear yards, all collectible trash shall be placed at the street side or curb, but shall not be placed there earlier than 7:00 p.m. on the day before it is scheduled to be collected. All containers or uncollected trash and waste must be removed from the street side or curb by 7:00 p.m. of the day it was scheduled for collection. Upon request of a resident to the town administrator and for good cause shown, the town may collect recyclables from a side or rear yard of the property.



<u>CONTAINERS NOT TO EXCEED</u> THIRTY-TWO (32) GALLON CAPACITY.

Just a reminder, and as stated on the Town's website, "Containers not to exceed thirty-two (32) gallon capacity."

Public Works will not pick up nor empty trash containers larger than 32-gallons. This is for the safety of our Public Works employees who manually lift each and every trash can.

*In the interim, until you purchase a 32-gallon trash can with a tight-fitting lid, please remove all trash bags from cans larger than 32-gallons and place them on the curb prior to trash collection.

Message from the Chief

Telemarketing Schemes, illegal robocalls, and caller I.D. spoofing all constitute forms of theft which criminals use to steal money and indirectly damage your psyche by claiming you can gain something by paying money or giving access to personal information.

Many legitimate companies and charities use telemarketing techniques to sell their products and services or advertise their number for c onsumers. Unfortunately, resulting in the rise of telephone related fraud, affecting one out of every six American citizens and the loss of over \$40 billion annually (Federal Trade Commission). In August alone, Americans received just under 2.3 billion unwanted robocalls, 24% of which were scams (PRNNewswire).

As we approach what is commonly known as the holiday season, I'd like to bring attention to how to identify fraudulent phone calls and what to look for to protect yourself from scams:

1. Know who you're dealing with. If the company or charity is unfamiliar, check it out with your local Consumer Protection Division – Maryland Attorney General Office at (410) 528-8662 and/or Better Business Bureau of Greater Maryland at (410) 347-3990. If the charity involves law enforcement call the Cheverly Police Department at (301) 341-1055.

2. Be aware that "No Complaint" is no guarantee. Fraudulent operators open and close quickly, so the fact that no one has made a complaint doesn't mean the company or charity is legitimate. You still need to look for other danger signs of fraud.

3. Don't believe promises of easy money. If someone claims that you can earn money with little or no work, get a loan or credit card, even if you have bad credit or make money on an investment with little to no risk, it's probably a scam. One should always remember that an offer that sounds too good to be true, probably is.

4. Think twice before entering contests operated by unfamiliar companies. Fraudulent marketers sometimes use contest entry forms to identify victims.

5. Never pay to play. It's illegal for a company to

require you to buy something or pay a fee to win or claim a prize. Buying something doesn't improve your chances of winning.

6. Resist pressure. Legitimate companies will be happy to send you detailed information and give you time to decide. If the marketer demands that you act immediately or will not take "No" for an answer, it is probably a scam.

7. Guard your personal information. Only provide your credit card or bank account number when you are paying for something. NEVER share your social security number with a telemarketer.

8. Senior citizens are particularly vulnerable to scams that take advantage of people living alone. Seniors need to be wary when dealing with a salespersons, particularly over the phone.

9. A common scam to be aware of is the "Canadian Lottery Scam". The potential victims are contacted over the phone and are told they have won millions of dollars in the Canadian lottery however, to receive their winnings victims are told they need to pay taxes on the winning money, usually several thousand dollars. The victims are instructed to send cashier's checks to post office locations in the United States or Canada, defrauding the victims of their money.

10. Finally, use common sense. Ask names, addresses, and call back numbers. If you feel suspicious, simply hang-up. If you are or have been victimized, contact the local NON-EMERGENCY police line at (301) 352-1200.

Victims of fraud come from a variety of age, gender, racial, religious, socioeconomic, and educational backgrounds. Some swindlers deliberately seek out families that may have limited means or financial difficulties, figuring such persons may be particularly receptive to a proposal that offers fast and large profits. Once again, your first step as a victim should be to report the incident to your local police department. Note: Real Estate fraud is another deliberate and complex scheme, which is quite prevalent and can be researched online (Real Estate Fraud).

CHEVERLY NATIVE PLANTING PROJECT

One thing we have learned in the Cheverly Native Planting Project is that we have a lot of unlearning to do. For instance, while many of us were taught that it is good get rid of all our leaves, stems, and seedhead in the fall, it turns out that all that cleaning up is detrimental to a healthy yard and ecosystem.

Not only do the leaves feed the soil and help break up the clay in so many of our yards, but it also provides winter habitat for our native pollinators. Flower stems also are used as nests for a several small native bees. So, when we rake up our yard and cut down our plants, we destroy over-wintering habitat for pollinators that help our gardens grow.

And, by leaving the seedheads instead of deadheading when blooms are gone, we provide a vital food source for birds. Native seeds have a lot of fat in them which birds need to stay healthy through the cold months.

We invite you to join us this fall doing LESS work to make MORE habitat! If you want to help your neighbors understand what you are doing, CNPP has yard signs to help spread the word.

The clinic will be held Saturday, October 15, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., at the Cheverly Community Center. Shots for influenza (flu), shingles, and pneumonia will be given, as well as the DTAP vaccine. We can now confirm that the Pfizer Covalent COVID-19 Booster will also be available, and that the flu and the bivalent booster can safely be administered in the same visit! Medicare and *most* insurance will cover vaccinations through the clinic.
